STAKES TO HELEN BARBEE

PEEP O'DAY FILLY BREAKS LONG STREAK OF NON-SUCCESS FOR J. W. BURTTSCHELL.

Beats Altamaha by Narrow Margin in Pontchartrain Stakes at Windsor—Layers Get Breaks in Their Favor and Partially Recoup Previous Losses.

Detroit, Mich., July 17.—The Pontchartrain Selling Stakes, carded as the feature race at Windsor this afternoon, brought out a field of useful sprinters.

Well balanced fields went to the post in a majority of the races and interesting contests resulted. Those who accepted an exceedingly short price about Heron in the fifth race were given a few exciting moments when in the final furlong Heron tired and began swerving from the middle of the track to the inside and then to the outside.

Spellbound upset calculations by spread-eagling his opposition in the third race, which he won by almost a dozen lengths, pulled up. A short price was accepted about Ozana in this race, but she failed to run to expectations, tiring badly in the homestretch and being beaten a couple of lengths by Judge Monck for second place.

The warm weather and bright sunshine brought out a large crowd, the attendance being equal to that of the opening day. Forty layers were in line, and as the books received several breaks during the afternoon, they recouped some of the losses sustained earlier in the meeting.

Jack Lorey, an enthusiastic race-goer, and one of the old Western and Southern guard, was a visitor at Windsor this afternoon. He motored from Channahon in company with W. T. Ramsey and will remain until the close of the meeting before returning to Ohio.

Otto Stifel of St. Louis was another newcomer in former years the Stifel colors were prominent on the St. Louis tracks.

Stanley H. Kunz of Chicago was another newcomer. The latter still maintains a small racing establishment.

Bob Levy, manager of the track at Norfolk, Va., has written Fred Gerhardt that he will be at Hamilton during the meeting there. He reports the addition of 300 new stalls at the Jamestown Jockey Club course.

The stake blanks of the Montreal Jockey Club reached Windsor today and were distributed among the horsemen by Joseph McLennan.

Judge C. F. Price is interesting some of the Eastern horsemen in the Kentucky Endurance Stakes to be run during the fall meeting at Churchill Downs, and several have promised to make entries.

Larry Carey arrived this morning from Saratoga, where the Beverwyck Stable horses are being rested. He brings the news that Sir John Johnson is doing famously, and will be ready for racing at the fall meetings in Maryland. In all there are about sixty horses resting at Saratoga, including the horses under the care of W. H. Karrick, Frank Taylor, Paul Fox and Dave Woodford. R. T. Wilson also has half a dozen horses there.

Silver Knight is reported to have broken down in his race of yesterday, and will be on the shelf for some time.

LOCHIEL REFUSES TO LEAVE BARRIER.

Bedwell Racer Spoils Start of Handicap at Lagoon—Amateur Riders Sport Silk.

Salt Lake City, Utah, July 17.—Lochiel spoiled the start in a horse race at Lagoon today by refusing to leave the barrier. He could not be whipped away, even after the others had gone. Meadow ran one of the gamest races of her career in wearing Cheryola down in a hard struggle.

Jack Atkin left today for Los Angeles to attend to his base ball interests. He will return here later in the week.

The transfer of several horses took place this morning when J. O. & G. H. Keene disposed of Brown, Evelyn, and Frank. The latter three, owned by Boss, who will race in future under the name of the Chicago Stable.

The society folk of Salt Lake and Ogden held sway at Lagoon this afternoon, turning out in large numbers to cheer for their favorite riders in the gentlemen's race, the first of its kind programmed hereabouts. All of the gentlemen are expert local polo players and rode their mounts with plenty of vim and snap.

The Haras Fould is situated near the Government Station Depot at Tarbes, in the Pyrenees. Here he has seven broodmares, all of them French bred. La Nette, by Reverend, is eighteen years old, and she has a yearling colt by Mark Time named Lecco; Anabere (1896) is by Little Duck; Clochette (1897), by Grandmaster, has foaled this year to Plum Tree; Fortia (1897), by Flavio, has a yearling foal by Libaros; Louloue (1901), by Grandmaster, was covered by the Pilsener (1893), by Grandmaster; other mares here are Delphine (1901), by Le Pompon, and Lokanda (1904), by Regret. The only stallion M. Fould possesses is Libaros, now seventeen years of age. At his Chateau de Vervaine, near Alencon, in the Department of Orne, he has five other mares, these being Rodogone (1899), by Tristan or Grandmaster; Riposte (1893), by Grandmaster; Heisone (1895), by Cambray; Combraille (1905), by Jacobite; and Combronde (1907), by Lauzun.

Clochette is the dam of Clerambault, a high-class handicap horse that has won many races in France and Belgium. Louloue is the dam of Lucknow, a three-year-old that has been running prominently this season, and won a race last week; Riposte is the dam of Reimette, a good winner, and Hesione is the dam of Houli.

M. Achille Fould's horses are trained by Georges Cunningham, senior, at Lamorlaye, near Chartilly. At the present moment they number a dozen, all being home-bred. The only four year old is Forio, by Regret—Fortia, who started the season well by winning the Prix de la Croix du Roy, at St. Cloud, and ran forward since. The three-year-olds are Houli, Lucknow, Chitral, Nappour, and Romagny. Last season Romagny won the Prix de la Roche, a little behind Montrose II., the crack two-year-old, and it was on account of the promise shown by this colt that M. Fould retained the services of F. Woodton for the French classic races. Romagny was badly beaten in the Epsom last April, whereas Houli carried off the Prix de la Roche at Combrailles, with flying colors. He then started at 34 to 1, but his performance was so good that it was resolved to make him the champion of the stable. He won the colt's heat of the Prix La Roche at Paris on the last Sunday in May. Woodton then being in the saddle, the horse had run in five previous occasions this year, being beaten in the Prix de St. Cloud, by Le Sid III., in the Prix Hocquet by Zenith II., and in the French Derby by Frant II.

M. Fould's two-year-olds under Mr. Cunningham's care are Limeron, by Gouvernail—Louloue; Lombwa, by Alambra III.—Lokanda; Nappour, by Libaros—La Nette; Dami, by Royal Dream—Delphine; Houbbi, by Simonon—Hesione, and Riverain, by Libaros—Royale.—London Sporting Life.
