James B. Haggin, who was a patient at the Good Samaritan Hospital at Lexington for several days, was able to leave that institution yesterday in a much improved condition.

When the good colt Oliver Lodge next appears under colors he will carry the jacket of Mr. C. S. Campbell, K. C., of Montreal, for whom he was bought by Capt. W. F. Pressgrave.

Stephen J. Lawlor has purchased a good-looking two-year-old black colt, the son of the mount on from Charles Kohler. Mr. Lawlor will train the youngster at the Gravesend track.

Vincent Powers, who headed the list of American jockeys in 1908 and 1909, is riding with success over the jumps in France. Powers went to Germany two years ago to ride for Baron Oppenheim, but increasing weight induced him to join the ranks of steeplechase jockeys.

The James B. Haggin private barns at Sheephead Bay have recently been reshingled and generally put in order. Rumor has it that a number of Elmendorf-bred colts and fillies will soon be shipped from Kentucky to occupy the establishments at the Bay, which is presided over by the veteran horseman, Charles Littlefield.

The Prix de France, a steeplechase of 20,000 francs at Auteuil, in France, Sunday, was won by the Duc de Caze's Or du Rhin. Harry La Montagne's Sultan was second. The race was for gentlemen riders. The fournes had the mount on the winner and M. Westernhagen rode the American-owned horse. There were nine starters.

The White Sign, a brown filly by Kelston—Drowsy, won the initial running of the Centennial Futurity of \$1,000, open to three-year-old thoroughbreds owned and foaled west of the Great Lakes, at the Winnipeg Exhibition July 10. She ran in the colors of L. E. Standefor, who recently figured as a purchaser of thoroughbreds in Kentucky. The Duke of Connaught presented Mr. Standefor with the purse and a silver trophy. The White Sign was bred by R. M. Dale of Qu'Appelle, and is a sister to Kel d'Or, the colt that Mr. Dale sent to England to run in last year's Epsom Derby.

CHIEF WINNING OWNERS IN FRANCE.

The list of winning owners under Jockey Club rules is naturally headed by M. Achille Fould, whose total has been brought up to the large sum of \$92,815 by the victory of Houli in the Grand Prix de Paris. In the published statistics Baron Edouard de Rothschild comes second with \$60,120, thanks principally to the victories of Florissant, but the success of De Viris in the Prix du President de la Republique on Sunday at Maisons Laiffite will give a big lift to Baron Gougraud, whose total now reaches \$74,325, entitling him to second place. Other owners who have done well this season are Prince Murat, \$41,710; W. K. Vanderbilt, \$39,000; August Belmont, \$34,200; Edmond Blanc, \$34,129; H. B. Duray, \$29,970; A. Vly-Picard, \$28,670; A.umont, \$26,945; L. Oly-Roederer, \$25,800; and L. de Romanet, \$25,250. There are fifty other owners who have won between \$25,000 and \$5,000, while there are another fifty entitled to mention on the role of honor, among them being J. D. Cohn, \$5,165. Among the breeders, Achille Fould, Baron Edouard de Rothschild and Prince Murat occupy the foremost positions. The most successful stallions are Libanos, Simonian and Le Sagittaire; stallions imported from England that have done well are Rabelais, Rock Sand, Plum Centre, Grey Plum, Airlie and Chaucer. Of the jockeys, Johnny Reiff is at the top of the tree with fifty-nine successful mounts. O'Neill is next with fifty-three and Sharpe third with forty-six.

GOSSIP OF THE TURF ABROAD.

The German Derby winner, Gulliver II., pulled up lame recently after a gallop with some stable company. It is considered unlikely that he will be able to run again this season.

John Liveock, who attained the age of eighty-two years last November, has carried out the duties of clerk of the course at every race meeting held on the Casterton (Australia) race course during the past fifty years.

J. B. Joel has named his two-year-olds as follows: Filly by Sundridge—Absurdity, Jest; filly by Sundridge—Marian Hood, Wilful Maid; filly by Sundridge—Waterbury, Sweet Maiden; and colt by Sundridge—Little Primrose, Sunplant.

The Australian jockey, B. Carslake, now holds a commanding lead in the list of winning jockeys in Austria-Hungary, having ridden thirty-eight winners. M. Gulyas stands second with twenty-two successes. Baluska third with twenty, G. Janek fourth with eighteen, and Schuster and Korb next with seventeen wins apiece, followed by Ferguson, sixteen, and L. Varga, fifteen.

There is hope that the famous German brood mare, Festa (own sister to Desmond, and dam of Salute, Festino, Fels, Fabula, Faust and Fervor), is once more in foal, after being barren since 1906. She was mated in spring with Gouverneur, at Napagedl, and the opinion of the studmaster there is shared by the people at the Messrs. von Weiberg's stud at Waldfried, to which she recently returned.

Herbert Jones, when at Alexandra Park recently, was wearing a beautiful pin, presented to him by his majesty at Newmarket the day after he won the Duke of Cambridge Handicap on Dorando. It takes the shape of a crown in diamonds, with the monogram "G. R. I." underneath in the king's racing colors. The pin given by his majesty to his trainer, R. Marsh, consists of a hoop of diamonds, with the letter "G." also in diamonds, in the center.

Long pending proposed amendments to English racing rules have been adopted by the Jockey Club. The most radical is one doing away with half-mile races for two-year-olds. Hereafter five-eighths of a mile will be the shortest distance for youngsters. Another new rule is that no horse three years old or over shall be allowed to start without having been named. Two-year-olds may still race unnamed. The new rules go into effect with the beginning of flat racing next year.

Horses by American-bred stallions, or out of American-bred mares, are doing well on the turf in Germany. A. von Schmieder's three-year-old, Colleen, which won the Ard Patrick Rennen of \$3,250 at Hoppgarten, is by Waterboy (son of Watercross), and Metastasio, winner of the Galtee More Rennen of \$3,000 for two-year-olds for the Messrs. von Weiberg, is by Festino out of Meta II., by Sensation. Meta II. won races in England for the late Lord W. Beresford and Mr. Lorillard.

The Bishop of Hereford's bill to prohibit publications, newspapers and otherwise of betting advertisements, came up for discussion in the House of Lords Thursday, July 11, on a motion for its second reading. In the course of the debate that followed, so much opposition developed as to render it obvious the bill was doomed to rejection, whereupon leave was asked and granted for its withdrawal. This ended a bitter and covert assault on English racing, that being the cover purpose of the bill.
