SUSPENSION FOR MUSGRAVE

UNSATISFACTORY HANDLING OF FREDERICK L. LEADS TO OFFICIAL ACTION.

Hallenbeck Three-Year-Old Should Have Won Race That Goes to Sir John Johnson's Credit, It Is Maintained—Laurel Track Drying Out.

Baltimore, Md., October 21.—Old Sir John Johnson won another race at Laurel this afternoon. It was his second victory of the meeting and was accomplished in a handicap at five and a half furlongs. Naturally enough, he was the public choice, but he should have finished second. H. C. Hallenbeck's Frederick L., making his first appearance since last spring at Havre de Grace, would undoubtedly have won with judicious handling. Sir John Johnson and Marjorie A. went out to make the pace from the outset and ran lapped on each other, with Frederick L. in third place, to the stretch turn. Then Frederick L. closed up on the pacesetters and looked all over the probable winner until Musgrave got him between the two leaders. Frederick L. was beaten a neck. There was much criticism of Musgrave's ride and at the conclusion of the afternoon's sport came an announcement that Musgrave had been suspended for the rest of the meeting on account of his handling of the colt.

The races were run over a track that was slowly drying out under the influence of a high wind, but still lumpy and holding. The weather was not as comfortable as yesterday, even though the clouds were giving way to sunshine, for the wind had a touch of winter in it and overcoats were comfortable. The attendance was again large.

J. B. Gray (Uncle Jimmie) has decided to go into winter quarters at the close of the present meeting. Godelus and the others in his useful string will be shipped to his farm in Oklahoma. Next year it is Mr. Gray's intention to begin his eastern racing season in Canada and he has made his plans to move from there to Saratoga. He has an abiding faith in his western-bred youngsters, as well he might after what Godelus has shown, and he proposes to go after the best of them in 1914.

James Butler left for his New York home tonight. Next week his big string of yearlings will be tried out over the excellent training track at Eastview Farm, Tarrytown. Those who have had the good fortune to see these youngsters have proclaimed them a particularly promising lot.

Harry Breivogel returned from Louisville today. He went to Kentucky to attend to his duties in connection with the racing at Churchill Downs and will now remain at Laurel until the close of the meeting. Shortly thereafter he will leave for Juarez for the winter meeting that opens there next month.

Capt. P. M. Walker returned from Kentucky with his horses today. The string was sent to Pimlico and will be raced there during the meeting of the Maryland Jockey Club that is to open November 1.

Thomas Cook, who brought Peter Pan back from Europe for the Keene establishment sale, will return to France, sailing on Saturday next. He left for New York tonight. He will take over fourteen horses belonging to John Sanford, who plans an extensive campaign over the French courses next season. Thirteen of these that will be taken over will be converted into steeplechasers and the fourteenth will be the stallion Voter, which will stand in France. Mr. Sanford has laid his plans for an extensive breeding farm abroad in order that he may have native bred horses for the flat races. This, with the addition of his American jumping string, should make his foreign racing venture a most notable one.

Old Rosebud, Pennant and Rudolfo in order are still the principal money winning horses of the year, but all have been retired active participation in racing until 1914. The convention's chief work was the adoption of a resolution calling upon Governor Samuel V. Stewart to summon the legislature in special session for the purpose of enacting legislation to suppress race track betting.

J. Simon Healy has returned to Laurel with Capt. E. B. Cassatt's Flying Fairy and Humiliation, with which he won at Piping Rock. In the same week with the Cassatt horses were Ray of Arrington, which J. P. Mayberry raced at Piping Rock for Frederick Johnson. Arrington was also taken back to Laurel from Piping Rock by James Fitzsimmons.

At Newmarket, England, October 17, the Middle Park Plate of \$150 each, with \$5,000 added, for two-year-olds at three-quarters of a mile was won by Lord Londonderry's chestnut colt, Corey, by Polymelus—Pearmain; E. Hulton's bay colt, Stormoway, by Desmond—Sisterlike, was second, and Sir John Thurstby's bay colt, Kennymore, by John O'Gaunt—Crocum, third. Sternoway was the favorite at 5 to 4, while it was 11 to 8 against Corey and 50 to 1 on Kennymore. In succession Corey had previously won the Redcar Produce Stakes at Redcar, Wynyard Plate at Stockton and the Rous Plate at Doncaster. The Middle Park Plate is often called the "Two-Year-Old Derby" and is usually contested by the best youngsters of each year.

RACING RECORD OF FRED MULHOLLAND.

The career of a sturdy campaigner came to an end when Fred Mulholland dashed into the fence at Laurel Tuesday and was killed. Fred Mulholland gave great promise as a young horse, but the development of a ringbone prevented him from living up to the expectations of his breeder, Barney Schreiber. It was not until he was five years old that he made a respectable showing, but in each season since he has been a consistent and frequent winner. He changed hands several times during the two or three years preceding his death, his latest owner having been J. O. Talbot. His racing record is recapitulated in the following tabulation:

WILL REBUILD AT HAVRE DE GRACE.

New York, October 21.—Edward Burke, general manager of the Havre de Grace track in Maryland, says that the burning of the grandstand, clubhouse and stables Saturday night, will entail a loss of about \$100,000.

"We will rebuild the structures on more expensive lines," declared Burke, "for we have held three successful meetings at the track and are assured of public patronage that warrants another outlay."

The track and property are owned by Burke, John G. Cavanaugh and John Walters of this city, and leading citizens of Philadelphia and Baltimore. Secretary Fred Beriberger of the Harford Agricultural and Breeders' Association lost some valuable papers in the blaze. His office was on the first floor of the clubhouse and the papers had to do with the meeting that closed there recently.

LIVINGSTON YEARLINGS A LIKELY LOT.

Lexington, Ky., October 21.—Living thoroughbred yearlings, the property of Jefferson Livingston, representing an outlay of approximately \$20,000 were shipped from here this afternoon to Latonia to be turned over to trainer Mose Goldblatt, who will later ship them to Juarez. They were broken at the Kentucky Association track by Theodore L. Pierce, and are a promising collection of youngsters.

LATONIA RACING FORMFUL

FAVORITES ARE WINNING LION'S SHARE OF THE PURSES AT KENTUCKY TRACK.

Patronage Continues of Pleasing Proportions in Spite of Unfavorable Climatic Conditions—Inquiry Into Big Spirit's Showing.

Cincinnati, O., October 21.—Disagreeable weather conditions continued at Latonia this afternoon and detracted much from the racing. The attendance that braved the wintry weather was really remarkable. The betting, while dropping considerably from yesterday's total, was still of fair volume, considering the poor medium for speculation that this afternoon's ordinary card furnished. The track was in bad shape and it required a sturdy racer to run in the going with any degree of success. The public had a profitable day, as they managed to land on four of the winners. Isabelle Valle and Font were the beaten favorites. Both were sharp factors in the racing.

Just Red's victory in the fourth race was of the sensational order. He ruled an overwhelming favorite and his many backers were a chagrined lot during the running of the first quarter when Just Red was a distant trailer and apparently hopelessly out of it. He came with a tremendous rush when fully settled in his stride and, in spite of being forced to go extremely wide into the stretch, he gradually got to the leaders and finally drew out decisively. Jockey Loftus' energetic handling of Bac in the second race was primarily the cause of his victory over The Idol and Candy Box. The trio terminated the six-furlong journey noses apart. Bac seemed beaten a furlong out, but Loftus managed to keep him on even terms with The Idol and literally lifted him to the finish a nose in advance of that horse. Candy Box, which had saved considerable ground in turning into the stretch, was going fastest of all at the end and would have won had he been able to get clear sailing earlier. Jockey Goose's handling of Big Spirit, the second choice, was unsatisfactory to Presiding Steward Price and, after interrogating the rider, Patrol Judge Campbell and trainer Chinn, the judge decided to continue his investigation. Goose claimed that the reason Big Spirit dropped out of it was because of being sharply cut off by Martin on Candy Box.

Jockey Loftus almost tossed off the purse when he eased Marty Lou up in the last seventy yards of the opening race and came near being beaten by Isabelle Valle. Marty Lou had been the leader for the entire trip and had the race well in hand when Loftus began to ease her up. Although firing badly, she managed to pass the finish a neck in advance. Lather proved much the best in the third race and won as his rider pleased, with Jimmie Gill beating U Steppa in the final stride for second money. Coppertown, after many attempts, finally managed to connect with the long end of a purse when he led all the way in the closing dash. Pierre Dumas furnished an upset in the fifth when he beat to the finish in advance of Ocean Queen and Garneau.

The two-horse combination, consisting of Bac and Lather, paid \$16.60 for \$2, and the three-horse, made up of Just Red, Pierre Dumas and Coppertown, yielded its backers a return of \$266.95 for each investment of \$2.

John Hogan, who officiated as starter during the last Mineral Springs meeting, was among today's visitors. Since the close of the Indiana track Hogan has been doing the starting at various Illinois fair tracks.

John C. Ferris arrived today from Victoria, B. C., where he has been campaigning his horses. He reports the fifteen carloads of horses that took part in the far northwestern racing have been shipped to Juarez, to await the opening of that track for its long winter session. Among those who have signified an intention of shipping from here to Juarez and who have engaged cars on the special train leaving here at the close of the Latonia meeting are: Jefferson Livingston, three cars; P. T. Chinn, two cars; Kay Spence, A. L. Kirby, Earl Linell, F. D. Weir, S. Veiller, W. C. Clancy, Doerhoefer & West and A. B. Spreckels, one car each.

Jockey Goose was suspended for five days by the starter for disobedience at the post.

John W. Schorr reached a decision today to follow his former custom of wintering his horses at Douglas Park and will ship those he brought here and some he has at Lexington to Louisville. Birdie Williams, Fred Stone and one or two others will be disposed of, leaving about 25 horses in the establishment to go into winter retirement.

Francis J. Pons has sold Grosvenor and Counterpart to Weber & Ward for a reported price of \$4,000. Mose Goldblatt, trainer of Jefferson Livingston, was trying to add the horses to his establishment, but made up his mind to get them a trifle later. Mr. Pons has ten others that he intends to dispose of before shipping to Charleston.
