AN OFF DAY AT LEXINGTON

GENTLEMEN RIDERS FURNISH THE LEADING ATTRACTION OF THE AFTERNOON.

Favorites Have a Bad Experience—Roscoe Goose Defeats Dr. Larick—Father Riley Springs the Surprise of the Day.

Lexington, Ky., September 16.—Today's card was somewhat off one, the mile race in which gentlemen riders had mounts, being classed as the feature attraction and adding additional interest to the sport on the part of the society element. Mr. W. A. Gordon, who had the mount on Fitzgerald, was the winner, with Wunder, ridden by Mr. W. S. Baker, in second place and Mr. S. L. Van Meter on Joe Stein third. The winning rider was given a handsome silver cup by the association.

Roscoe Goose added another purse to W. H. Baker's account when he accounted for the \$600 Hinata Handicap over Dr. Larick, with the favorite, Little Nephew, third. The last-named showed a good order of speed for the first half mile, but thereafter he was done and barely saved third place from the fast coming Liberator.

Favorites again failed conspicuously during the afternoon, the exception being Cardome, which landed the second race. Bare riding accounted for Mex's failure in the opener. The Weir starter was backed into odds-on, but any winning chances he had were effectively destroyed when Stirling took him back at the start and continued these tactics repeatedly during the running. His handling of Argument, another Weir representative, was on a par with his efforts on Mex. Both horses were backed extensively by the stable.

A miscellaneous-owned band of racers was transferred to Louisville during the day and the real exodus of racers from here will begin in earnest tomorrow, when several of the more pretentious stables will leave, including the horses owned by W. H. Baker.

Frank Clarkson, well known to many owners, is progressing favorably after his long illness and is expected to be about again next week.

Trainer S. J. Lawlor of the Quinley Stable, who has been attending the yearling sales, returned to New York this afternoon, after having made an engagement with superintendent J. P. Ross for reservations for the big band of racers he intends to bring here next spring.

The computers purchased by Mrs. Godfrey Preese, R. J. Miller and H. H. Hewitt will be shipped tomorrow to Gravesend, where they will be broken and wintered.

The big upset of the afternoon developed in the sixth race when Father Riley, under a terrific drive, wore Othello down, with the favorite, Huntress, in third place. Huntress was a big favorite, but seemed to sulk and retired completely after going a half mile.

Cardome and Water K., the two-horse combination, yielded \$51.60 for each \$2. Father Riley's success in the sixth race threw the three-horse combination pool to the field at \$25.50. The three horse combination was made up of the fifth, sixth and seventh races.

COQUETTE'S MOUNT ROYAL HANDICAP.

Corbett's Speedy Filly Easily Defeats Etruscan—Col. Vennie Wins from Adroit.

Baltimore, Md., September 16.—The Mount Royal Handicap, a dash of three-quarters with \$1,000 added, was offered as the feature at the Havre de Grace course this afternoon. The winner turned up in the speedy Coquette, which races in the silks of Matthew Corbett. Ten of the twelve carded accepted weights and faced the starter. The beginning of the race was marred by the fractious behavior of Robert Bradley, which, when the barrier was released, whirled and was left. In whirling he slightly interfered with Iron Duke. Etruscan was the one to show the way for the first half, but the winner easily took the lead on the stretch turn and drew away at the end. Etruscan held on to be second, while Hester Pryne got up in time for third place.

The second day of the meeting showed no abatement of the intense heat that has been sweeping over this section of the country and which rendered conditions at the course almost uncomfortable for the large crowd in attendance.

The public had a good line on the merits of the different starters. Apart from the running of the stake race, a well-balanced card was down for decision and stirring sport resulted therefrom. Col. Vennie accounted for the second race of the day, a dash for two-year-olds. He easily raced his opponents into defeat and drew away into a long lead, with Adroit second. It marked his first victory since he beat White Hackle at Saratoga, the day after the sale of that Madden star at a fancy price.

The program books of the Maryland State Fair meeting at Laurel Park arrived today and were distributed among the horsemen. The events called for in the book exceed those of previous meetings held at that course.

Trainer Goldsborough worked Roamer a mile and an eighth this morning in preparation for his engagement in the Havre de Grace Handicap on Saturday. Roamer is asked to shoulder top weight and worked the distance today in 1:53, covering the first mile in 1:38%.

Word was received this morning that J. Butters, an English trainer, had purchased two more yearlings at the Newmarket sales in England this morning for Jefferson Livingston. The total number bought by him up to date is six.

Gene Moyné, James Campion and several others arrived today from the San Francisco exposition, where they attended the revival of racing. All are enthusiastic over the probabilities of a permanent return of the sport.

W. R. Mizell is seeking to secure the services of jockey Smyth for the meeting at Laurel. Smyth is at present in Canada under call to the Seagram stable. Mike Daly received the information today from W. F. Presgrave that the good timber-topper Garter had gone lame. Presgrave had Garter at Blue Bonnets for Daly.

After the running of the fourth race the stewards decided to refuse the entry of Robert Bradley in the future, for fractions acting at the post.
