## "FAIR LATONIA" AT LAST

MUD AND BAD WEATHER GIVE WAY TO FAST GOING AND A CLEAR SKY.

Pif Jr. Wins the Feature Race and Makes a New Track Record—Ellison Triumphs Over King Gorin and Capt. Rees.

Cincinnati, O., June 23.—Improved weather and track conditions and a good card served to attract record-breaking mid-week crowd to Latonia today. The betting was of immense volume. The racing was in keeping with other conditions, for the sport was closely contested and wholesome. The highly tried Peachie, which T. C. McNeill owned early in the year and later disposed of, practically for a song, managed to break out of the maiden class when she let ten other youngsters to the finish in the opening dash. Her inner post position, coupled with the boring out of Kaguira in the stretch, were factors in her victory. Impressive, a pronounced feature, won in the second. She led for the entire race, with Julia L. her closest follower all the way. The latter will doubtless benefit by this race.

Hot Toddly, under a good ride, made a show of his opponents in the third race and won easily to a canter, with Clare just getting up to outstay the badly-swinging Katahdin.

Pif Jr. accounted for the Laughrey Club Handicap of one mile and a quarter, which featured this afternoon's card in sensational style, getting up in the final stride to overhaul Fels. Incidentally a new track record of 2:05½ for the distance was made. The superior riding skill of jockey Roscoe Goose was the determining factor in the result, for, with a bit stronger riding, Fels at the finish would have been the victor. The latter, racing to his best form, followed The Grader closely and, after heading off the leader in the stretch, Lapaille was content to take matters a bit easier than the situation warranted, and when Pif Jr. loomed up, the latter gradually gained and managed to get his head in front in the last stride. Money Maker was pocketed repeatedly.

The secondary feature, an allowance race at a mile and seventy yards, furnished an upset by the victory of Ellison over King Gorin and Capt. Rees. The latter was a pronounced choice and might have won but for interference, in addition to the restraining tactics employed on him in the early stages of the race.

An item of interest among the horsemen here was the report that the bill legalizing racing in Louisiana with pari-mutuel betting had been reported favorably by the legislature committee, despite strong opposition brought to bear. There is a general hope that the bill will find enough supporters in both branches of the legislature to insure its passage.

Jockey Olin Gentry will be allowed to ride here, his contract trouble having been satisfactorily adjusted.

Jockey Fuerst was suspended for five days by the starter for disobedience at the post in the sixth race.

Jockey Goose piloted three of the winners.

There will be a meeting of the Kentucky State Racing Commission tomorrow in the Latonia clubhouse. Gen. W. B. Haldeman, member of the commission, was an arrival this afternoon.

## MANY HORSES ARRIVING AT RENO.

Reno, Nev., June 23.—"I do not anticipate any serious trouble in Mexico, nor the closing of the Lower California Jockey Club's meeting at Tijuana, following the president's recent precautionary war order," said Frank Reinhart, California horseman, who has arrived here from Tijuana, with a string of seven horses to participate in the summer meeting, which will open July 1.

"Governor Cantu, the Carranza representative of Lower California, had not made any preparations for war up to the time I left the Mexican town, nor was there any fear among the racing men that trouble would occur. Conditions appeared normal and the Mexican soldiers seemed to conduct themselves as usual—in a lazy, care-free manner—smoking their cigarettes with the ease and comfort of a millionaire riding in the soft, comfortable tones of a motor car."

"The worst that can be expected, if the worst comes to the worst, is an order preventing Americans crossing the line, likewise an order for all to leave Tijuana. This, of course, would mean the closing of the track there. However, no immediate trouble is anticipated."

Reinhart, who was one of the big winners at the Mexican races, brought with him seven of his stable, including the speedy Gull, Orange Blossom, holder of the Tijuana track record for five and one-half furlongs of 1:05¾, The Chapman, Dick Benson, Singleton, The Feller and Innovation. Other horses in the cars were John Kane's So Long and Frank Patterson, and the Kissinger stable, including Canto, Sweet Sam, Velle Forty and Lady Pender.

Ranking among the most valuable stables in the country and ready for the call of the bugle is the Charles W. Clark string, which arrived Saturday night in charge of John Bogan and J. Lowe, trainer. This stable came from Latonia, after a successful campaign on the Kentucky tracks.

In the car were Rose Marian, Aunt Liz, Verde, Doctor Max, Gunpowder, Treasnor, Florence Roberts, David Clegg, Pleasantville, Brimlin and Fathen.

The officials of the Reno Fair and Racing Association have announced that entries for the stakes races will be accepted until Monday, June 26, thus allowing many horsemen an opportunity to determine upon their future course in case of trouble in Mexico.

## HORSEMEN WIN AT DELORMIER PARK.

Montreal, Que., June 23.—Following a meeting last night of a committee appointed by the Canadian branch of the Thoroughbred Horse Association and the local half-mile track owners, which ended in a deadlock, there was another deadlock at Delormier Park this morning. The horsemen declared at the meeting that they would not race for less than \$400 purses and the local clubs declared they could not afford to give such purses. Neither would give way and a settlement was not reached until this morning. The horsemen refused to make entries until the management of the track, shortly before one o'clock, decided to make the desired increase in the purses. Then entries were made. The Delormier Park meeting is scheduled to open to morrow and there was no alternative for the club as the horsemen held the upper hand.

This is the first move of the horsemen against any Canadian track. William Walker, chairman of the Horsemen's committee stated that none would be overlooked and declared that because of the successful meeting at Blue Bonnets the Montreal Jockey Club would be asked to give larger purses for the fall meeting, as would all of the other tracks on the Major circuit, that have not already done so.

The owners of King Edward Park and the Maisonneuve track announced that they would have to close their tracks if the horsemen insisted on \$400 purses.

## QUITE CHEERFUL PROSPECT AT HAMILTON.

Meeting Opens Today with No Essential to a Successful Racing Reunion Lacking.

Hamilton, Ont., June 23.—The Hamilton Jockey Club's first meeting for the season of 1916 will begin tomorrow. Hamilton racegoers will be introduced to an innovation in the way of a new system of speculation. The mutuels will be substituted for the bookmakers and, taking the wonderful success of the iron men at Ottawa as a guide, it is no idle prediction to make, that they

## JAMAICA MEETING COMES TO AN END.

An Exciting Race and Finish Marks the Running of Friars Handicap—Brooklyn Handicap Today.

New York, June 23.—The Friars Handicap proved one of those races calculated to bring the spectators to their feet. The start had hardly been made when Marse Henry, Comely and Startling singled out and raced heads apart for a quarter of a mile. Then Marse Henry forged to the front followed by Comely and Startling. It then seemed that Marse Henry would make a runaway race of it. He gained a long lead on Comely with Old Koenig third a couple of lengths off. Marse Henry turned for home with a three lengths lead and Comely began to tire. Taplin went to the whip on Marse Henry when also he began to tire perceptibly when a sixteenth from the goal, while Old Koenig coming fast, passed Comely, challenged the leader and got up in time to win in a hard drive. Comely retired and Startling accounted for third money. The others were trailers spread out all over the track. George Odom, who trains Marse Henry thought he would have won had not Taplin resorted to the whip. The time, 1:12½, was the fastest of the meeting. Old Koenig kicked Comely while at the post, but the injury could hardly have been serious, as she showed much speed for a half mile.

Today, the final day of racing at Jamaica, was notable for the success of short-priced favorites in most of the races.

Racing shifts to the Aqueduct course tomorrow, where an excellent program, featured by the running of the Brooklyn Handicap, is down for decision. The latter has attracted a big field of the best horses in training in the east and a great contest is looked for. The fact that Roamer is to be a starter is alone a feature, as the Miller gelding is always a powerful drawing card.

Cheer, quoted at a short price, won the opener easily from Solyveig, the early pacemaker. When called on in the stretch Cheer raced past Solyveig without difficulty.

The defeat of Pandean, quoted at a short price, for the second, was a surprise, as the horse seemed to have the race at his mercy. He was in close quarters at the head of the stretch, however, and was unable to extricate himself until too late.

Monocacy, from the same stable as Pandean, made good at prohibitive odds. It was an easy victory for the horse, he leading throughout.

Republican, heavily backed, showed a good performance in the fifth, which he won as his rider pleased. The Brighton Stable furnished another short-priced favorite in the sixth in Priscilla, quoted at odds-on, and she made good with ease.

The horse Saratoga was awarded to J. W. Hedrick yesterday, the stewards deciding in his favor after secretary Edwards had refused to accept his personal check for the horse. The stewards decided that the sum of money he had on deposit was sufficient.

After Cheer had won the opener, she was bid up from \$800 to \$1,400 by G. Alexandra, but failed to get her.

L. H. Baxter purchased Schoolboy from P. S. Randolph and the horse ran in his new owner's colors today.

Larry Carey purchased Old Koenig from H. T. Oxnard for the Beverwyck Stable, together with Lena Misha and Henry Jr., paying \$2,100 for the three as yearlings.

Secretary London has provided patrons of the club with a high-class program. The fields in a majority of cases are good and the card is one of the best of the season in Canada. Quentin Price probably will not ride again this year.

George Smith probably will be a starter in the Brooklyn Derby at Aqueduct June 28.

John Whalen will retire Pawhuska to the stud, the horse having broken down in training.

Horace Paul and George Glydon have arrived at Latonia from California, to remain throughout the meeting.

R. T. Wilson has sold to J. W. Pangle the two-year-old chestnut gelding Mesmer and the horse will race in Canada.

Capt. E. B. Cassatt's fast sprinter Spring Board, by Aeronaut—Bettie Bounce, is now a gelding. He has been broken to saddle, and he is an especial favorite with Captain Cassatt, who rides him frequently.

The five imported English thoroughbreds consigned to S. L. Frank at New York brought \$450 when offered at sale by the collector of customs in default of the payment of duty amounting to \$2,900. The nine-year-old stallion, The Battler, brought \$250 of the \$450.

Bunchy, an imported filly in the Oscar Lewisohn racing establishment, has gone amiss and will be retired for the year. She is a three-year-old daughter of Liangwin and Bunch Grass. She raced only twice in this country and was unplaced on both occasions.

Of twenty-four foals of this year at Mr. Wingfield's Nevada Stock farm five colts and four fillies are by Deutschland, one colt by Ossary, one colt and four fillies by Montgomery, four colts and four fillies by Starbottle and one filly by Rey del Sierra. Nineteen of the farm's broodmares were mated with Honeywood last spring.

The Newmarket Stewards' Handicap of \$2,500, substituted for the Wokingham Stakes, was run off in England Wednesday and resulted in Lord Saville's All Secure, with Hulse in the saddle, just beating E. Hilton's Torolisk, ridden by C. Childs, by a neck. J. Potter's Caldervale, with Gardner up, was third, two lengths behind. Eleven horses went to the post. The betting was: All Secure, 10 to 1, Torolisk, 7 to 2 and Caldervale, 10 to 1.

Trainer Thomas H. McCreery has shipped Frederick H. Prince's steeplechaser Fatafata, winner of the Middlesex Hunt Cup at Brookline last week to Prides Crossing, Mass., to be turned out for the present. He will be reserved for the autumn hunt meetings. He was one of the first of the imported steeplechasers to win this season, and his trainer predicts that he will make a top-notcher. Mr. Prince has bought from H. H. Humes of St. Louis, the six-year-old bay gelding Monsieur Perci, by Monsieur Beaucaire—Percita, and it is expected that this good plater will be racing over the jumps in the near future.

## JOCKEY CLUB ACTION ON MANY CASES.

New York, June 23.—The application of H. Woods for a jockey's license was granted yesterday at a meeting of the stewards of the Jockey Club. The application of J. Wilson to be reinstated, was denied, as was that of G. M. Johnson to be restored to good standing as a trainer.

Joseph Knight presented a statement from the Cuba-American Jockey Club, showing he had been reinstated by that body. The assistant secretary was instructed to notify all association that Knight

is now in good standing and that their resolution of April 1915 is rescinded.

The applications of C. Borel and M. Nathan for jockeys' licenses were laid on the table. Many jockeys' and trainers' licenses were granted.

The assistant secretary was instructed to notify all associations that the following resolution has been adopted:

"That in selling races the auctioneer has full power and control of the horse and must in all cases order the removal of the bandages upon the request being made to him by any responsible persons attending the sale."

## LOOKS LIKE BUSINESS IN LOUISIANA.

Baton Rouge, La., June 23.—By a vote of four to two, the House Judiciary Committee yesterday reported favorably on the Schaff-Ashford racing bill, providing for the establishment of the pari-mutuel system of wagering on races. Charles F. Labarre, Edward Rightor, Edward Schaff and Nat W. Bond spoke for the bill. Mr. Rightor said the bill was to correct existing conditions, that a system of individual betting had been found that was admissible under the Locke law and that the bill for a racing commission would place the governor in supreme charge and make some one responsible.
