HAWKINS HORSES IN LUCK

HANK O'DAY DEFEATS PIF JR. AND MAKES A NEW TRACK RECORD.

Chalmers Outraces Kathleen and Bringhurst—E. R. Bradley Wins a Race—More Owners Engage Quarters at Hawthorne.

Cincinnati, O., June 27.—Representatives of the J. S. Hawkins' stable figured prominently in the result of today's racing, by accounting for the feature races, two handicaps of \$800 added.

The mile and a quarter race, which Hank O'Day won after a furious drive with Pif Jr., resulted in a new track record, the former mark of 2:05½ being reduced to 2:03%. Hank O'Day's showing this afternoon represented a vast improvement over many of his recent essays, in about the same kind of company he met this afternoon. He showed great speed from the start, held on with rare gameness in the stretch and ultimately outstayed Pif Jr., after the latter seemed to have the race won.

Chalmers was the other member of the Hawkins establishment to win when he scored impressively in the sprinting handicap, with Kathleen in second place and Bringhurst third. Like Hank O'Day, Chalmers showed a high order of speed and led Kathleen throughout.

Today's good card, coupled with splendid weather, was instrumental in bringing out another large crowd. The racing was keen and hard fought from the start, but in spots was unsatisfactory, due to form reversals. In addition to the improvement shown by Hank O'Day, that of Vogue caused some comment. In her preceding race she was a distant trailer, but this afternoon she followed J. J. Murdoch at a fast pace and wore him down under hard urging.

E. R. Bradley took his first purse in some time, when Believe Me Boys led all the way in the opening dash and won handily over Kagura. W. H. Baker's Hot Toddie again earned a bracket when he wound up in a race of a fairly good band of youngsters, the third.

Ed Jasper who served as secretary at the Worth, Empire City, Churchill Downs and Juarez tracks, has been engaged to assist at Hawthorne and began preliminary work here today in the interest of the Illinois Jockey Club. Mr. Jasper will also act as handicapper here, beginning next Monday when secretary J. B. Campbell of the Niagara Racing Association departs for the Fort Erie track.

Martin Nathanson continues to receive a gratifying list of entries to the stakes offered by the Illinois Jockey Club. Numerous additional owners today signified their intention of racing at Chicago and made application for stall room. Of the 535 stalls now in readiness at the Hawthorne track, fully 400 will be assigned to horsemen here.

Thomas Carey, owner of Hawthorne, and president Frank Froehling of the Illinois Jockey Club, will arrive tomorrow and remain several days.

C. R. Anderson today shipped several of his racers to Fort Erie to engage in the racing there. Others contemplating shipment shortly to Fort Erie include A. L. Kirby, W. H. Frey and E. Cook.

Jockey Guy, who rode Pearl L. in the first race, was suspended for ten days by the starter for disobedience at the post.

Jockey L. Gentry was given a sharp caution by the stewards for his interference with Milbrey in the stretch running.

Jockey Lapaille was suspended for five days by the stewards for interference with Bringhurst in the fifth race.

Jockey Meehan was suspended for five days by the starter for disobedience at the post in the last race.

EXTENSIVE PIMLICO IMPROVEMENTS.

Baltimore, Md., June 27.—Upwards of \$60,000 is being spent in improvements at Pimlico. The first big move is to set the grandstand back on an angle and to build new concrete bleachers. The old clubhouse will be enlarged, as the offices and jockeys' rooms will be located in a new building at the lower end of the paddock. The club will be at the disposal of members of the club, their families and guests, with tea rooms and all the comforts of club life. The new jockey quarters will have everything necessary for the convenience of the riders, including shower baths, lockers, a temporary hospital and all other appurtenances. On the top of the jockey's room and offices will be a glass cupola from which the jockeys can view the races while not riding.

The Pimlico management is also planning some new and rich stakes, including a \$2,000 added steeplechase for three-year-olds, framed on the lines of the Harbor Hill Cup. There will also be a new selling stake with \$1,500 added. It also has been decided to increase the added money for the Bowie Handicap to \$3,500. All the improvements, including two sets of new stables, will be ready for the autumn meeting.

BAYBERRY CANDLE A WEIGHT CARRIER.

Runs a Mile at Aqueduct in 1:38% with 126 Pounds Up—Canarsie Stakes to Genesis.

New York, June 27.—Bayberry Candle endeared herself to the public when she won the overnight handicap at Aqueduct after a strenuous struggle from beginning to end. Notwithstanding her heavy impost of 126 pounds, she was well fancied among horsemen who recognize a good mare when they see one. It was rumored early in the day that Harry Shaw would run one of his good races and this fact caused him to be installed favorite. While he ran well, at no time did he threaten the winner. The one to cause the mare trouble for a while was Sandman II., but Bayberry Candle made him retire and then took a good lead. The weight and early pace, however, caused her to tire on the way home and Grumpy challenged her in the last sixteenth and put Loftus to a hard ride to get her home. It is doubtful if any other rider would have won with Bayberry Candle. The race will no doubt do Harry Shaw good. Unfortunately Gainer bungled at the start and was last off, never having a chance afterwards.

The crowd easily numbered 5,000 and was treated to good sport. The Canarsie Selling Stakes, for two-year-olds, resulted in another victory for the speedy Genesis, from G. A. Cochran's stable. This filly won her last start at Jamaica over practically the same opposition, but in that race she was away forwardly and just lasted long enough to win. Today the distance was a little shorter and, after beginning fast from her inside position and dominating the running throughout, she scored with speed to spare. Artemis outdistanced Straight Forward for second place. The Canarsie was worth \$1,060 net.

Jockey T. McTaggart has returned from Hamilton and signalized his return by winning with Monocacy in the second race.

Jockey E. Taplin, at the request of his contract employer George Odum, has taken a brief vacation and will not be seen in the saddle for several days. The lay-off was occasioned by the extra bad stretch in which the boy was riding.

That the going was fast was shown when Bayberry Candle ran a mile in 1:38% in winning the handicap.

The popularity of the American thoroughbred as officers' mounts is shown by the demand at the race courses for thoroughbreds. Jule and Abe Garson have orders for five thoroughbreds for officers of the Seventh Regiment, First Field Artillery.

SOME EXCELLENT RACING AT HAMILTON.

Commonada Defeats All Smiles in the Grimsby Handicap in Fast Time—Track Talk.

Hamilton, Ont., June 27.—Three handicaps were on the program at Hamilton this afternoon. Besides the Dundas Handicap, a steeplechase over the two-mile course, there were the Valedictor Handicap at three-quarters and the Grimsby Handicap at a mile and an eighth. Tropacolom, which won in his initial effort at the recent Ottawa meeting, repeated his winning performance this afternoon, by making a runaway affair of the steeplechase and scoring by a head in a driving finish with Morpheth. Commonada showed a return to his best form, when he won the Grimsby Handicap, in which he led from the start and beat All Smiles by a length.

In the absence of George Walker, who is confined to his home, Pax was saddled by his brother, John Walker.

Jockey Metcalf has been engaged to ride Achievement in the Derby tomorrow. G. Byrne will have the mount on King Neptune.

Jack Adkins has arranged to ship the R. J. MacKenzie horses to Fort Erie, where they will remain for a couple of months. It is Adkins' plan to keep the string at that course and to ship what horses he wishes to start at Windsor so that track to fill their engagements and immediately return to Fort Erie.

W. Stormont will send his stable from Fort Erie to Chicago at the conclusion of the Niagara Racing Association's meeting.

W. O. Farmer announced that the Edenwold yearlings would be disposed of at Saratoga August 5, and that eighteen of J. E. Madden's would be sold at the same time. In the Edenwold band is the oldest Star Shoot yearling foaled in 1916. He is out of Ohlyesa and was foaled in January.

E. J. Crawford, who is training that consistent two-year-old, Golden Bantam, has turned Paymaster and Greenwood over to H. Marman, who will train them himself in the future. Crawford has arranged to ship Marman to Saratoga. In her twenty starts this year Golden Bantam has won six times, finished second four times and third five times. Her winnings total over \$4,000.

William Garth has arranged to ship the jumpers, Emerald Gem and Shannon River, to Saratoga at the conclusion of the Hamilton meeting.

In cog, winner of the opening race of the meeting, is a gift colt. He was presented to the Davies boys by John E. Madden.

Allie Gates has taken over the string of Canadian-breds owned by E. A. Campbell. There are eight in the band.

Undaunted was badly cut down in her race on Saturday and will be out of commission for some time.

Arthur N. Elrod has been engaged to take charge of the betting rings at Mount Royal Park and King Edward Park at Montreal and Essex Park at Hot Springs. The last-named meeting will be held in December. Accommodation for 500 horses will be provided on the grounds.

The Canadian branch of the Thoroughbred Horse Association will hold a meeting at the Royal Connaught Hotel tomorrow night. The meeting is an informal one and action taken by some of the members recently will be discussed.

C. R. Anderson has wired jockey Oberth engaging him to ride the gelding, Marc Cassidy in the Fort Erie Selling Stakes. Anderson will ship his horses from Kentucky to Fort Erie this week.

At the recent meeting of the Canadian Racing Association the suspension against steeplechase jockey R. Crawford was continued. Jockeys W. Ward and H. Lafferty were restored to good standing.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF.

There are about 900 horses at Latonia.

John W. Schorr is reported to have paid \$2,500 for the yearling brother to Lady Lightning.

Admission for men to the Hamilton races, including the war tax, is \$1.60 and for ladies \$1.05.

Charles W. Moore has sold to A. L. Austin the yearling brother to Horron, by McGee—Josie L.

E. R. Bradley purchased Black Coffee from Frank E. Brown for \$2,000. Last fall Mr. Bradley sold Belgian Trooper and Black Coffee to Brown.

The management of the Mansonneuve track is considering the abandonment of its second meeting scheduled for next month, in view of the demand of the horsemen for \$400 purses. There is some talk of conducting a meeting for trotters, instead.

Trainer Jerry Carroll reports that W. R. Coe's good colt Mustard recently picked up what is believed to be a splinter of glass, which has given a lot of trouble. It was found necessary to cut away the troublesome sliver.

Twenty yearlings were shipped from Hamburg Place Thursday to Saratoga. They all are by Plaudit, and will be offered at auction at the Spa early in August. Mr. Madden said that none of the Star Shoots or Ogdens would be offered at auction, but that any that are not sold by private sale will be trained and sold next year as two-year-olds.

M. F. R. Hitchcock has introduced an amendment to the rules of the Jockey Club providing that in estimating the winnings of imported horses the equivalent values in dollars shall be as follows: Pound, \$5; franc, 20 cents; lire, 20 cents; mark, 25 cents; rouble, 50 cents; Austrian crown, 21 cents, and a la peseta, 17 cents. This grows out of the

recent importation of so many thoroughbreds from abroad.

Sol Joel's famous Pommeren ran his last race in the June Stakes in England recently and has been retired to the Maiden Erleigh Stud. With such horses as Polymelus and Sander, Mr. Joel can now boast of some of the best blood in England. Pommeren carried everything before him last year when he won three of the big English classics—the Two Thousand Guineas, the substituted Derby and the St. Leger.

An apprentice named Wheatley was responsible for an exceptional riding feat at the Durban (South Africa) Turf Club's meeting on April 1. He rode in seven races, of which he won six, and though in his first race, which he won on a 10 to 1 chance, there were only five starters, the runners for the other five ranged from 10 to 17. The smallest amount of prize money for any of the races was \$575. The lad named is quite light, seeing that in one race he rode at 84 pounds.

The Warren Hill Handicap, which is a substitute for the famous Ascot Stakes, was run at Newmarket, England, Thursday, and resulted in a win for Sir Abe Bailey's Son-in-Law, with Bullock in the saddle, by a neck over Captain Homfray's Chelsho, ridden by Smyth. W. Raphael's Aboukir, with S. Donoghue up, was two lengths behind at third place. Twelve horses went to the post with Sir Abe Bailey's entry the favorite. The betting was: Son-in-Law, 5 to 2; Chelsho, 100 to 8, and Aboukir, 20 to 1.

Before leaving Montreal Saturday morning William Walker issued a statement denying that there was any dissatisfaction on the part of the horsemen with the purses given at Blue Bonnets. It had been stated in published report of the conference of horsemen and half-mile track owners, that Blue Bonnets would be asked by the horsemen to increase its purses, but Mr. Walker declared that no such statement had been made by him, and that no one connected with the horsemen's association had authority to make any such statement. "We are perfectly satisfied with the liberal purses given at Blue Bonnets, and with the manner in which the meeting was conducted there in every detail," said Mr. Walker.
