IMPROVING AT LOUISVILLE

Better Track Conditions Bring Lively Work by the Horses.

Patches Again Attracts Attention at Douglas Park—Some Fast Gallops Expected Today.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., April 17.—Track conditions showed improvement at Churchill Downs today, and as a result a large number of horses were out for gallops, including quite a few Kentucky Derby entries.

At Douglas Park Patches was again the center of attraction, and he ran a mile in 1:43 1/2. He covered an additional eighth in 1:50 1/2, eased up. The colt showed fast fractions, 25, 49 1/2 and 1:15, and at no stage of his work-out was he urged to any great extent.

Grand Slam's trial was the fastest here to date, as he ran a quarter in 23 1/2, three-eighths in 53, half mile in 1:22. He ran alone for the first quarter of a mile, where East Indian joined him and finished out the journey with him.

Danamonga demonstrated that he is pretty well equipped with early speed when he ran a half mile in 49 1/2, the first quarter in 24 1/2. He did not have a pacemaker. On Watch was sent the same distance and his time was 51 1/2. Trainer Max Hirsch plans a longer work-out for the G. W. Loft Derby horses tomorrow morning.

Black Hackle, from the Monfort Jones stable, and with W. Sims in the saddle, covered a mile in 1:51, pulled up almost to a trot at the finish. He only ran the first half mile, going the quarter in 24 1/2 and the half in 50 1/2. Rouleau, from the same stable, was galloped a mile in 1:55 1/2. He was in the middle of the track all the way.

Simpleton showed good form in running a mile in 1:47 1/2. He ran the half in 51 1/2, and his rider slowed him down after that.

The diminutive Alta Boy II, this morning galloped a half mile in 48, five-eighths in 1:01 and three-quarters in 1:15.

Captions, three-year-old filly by Ormondale—Caprice, was sent to T. M. Murphy's farm just outside of the city this morning to be mated with Golden Maxim. A half interest in her has been acquired by James T. Clark, local business man and sportsman, and she will later be transferred to his new Nestleton Stud, near St. Matthews, Ky. The filly went wrong yesterday and Van Meter decided that it would be useless to try to train her any more.

GOOD NEWS FROM HOT SPRINGS.

Perry Anderson was an arrival from Hot Springs, Ark., where he put in the time since the Jefferson Park meeting closed. He said that the most prominent business men in the Vapor City are confident that racing will be resumed there next year.

Joe Umensetter's stable has been further thinned out for the coming spring racing season, as Texas Special, Bigtogo and J. J. Murdoch had the firing irons applied to them yesterday. They, with Sam Freedman, which was recently gelded, will be turned out until autumn. None of the remaining Umensetter horses will be sent to Lexington to race this spring.

J. W. Parrish, Midway, Ky., banker and owner of several thoroughbreds trained by John S. Ward, was a visitor at Churchill Downs this morning. He saw Midway, his stake horse, work a mile in company with Dodge in 1:47 1/2.

John T. Ireland stopped off here today en route to his home in Lexington from Havana. His horses were sent direct to Lexington.

Charles E. Grainger is the racing manager at Churchill Downs and Hamilton C. Applegate is performing the duties of auditor of the Kentucky Jockey Club. Harry Breivogel will be chief assistant to general manager Matt J. Winn at Lexington this spring, as well as at Latonia. Mr. Winn left for Covington, Ky., this afternoon to spend Sunday with his family.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

Saint's Bridge, the five-year-old English-bred gelding in the stable of C. Hawk at Lexington, Ky., is dead. This was the fifth horse shipped from New Orleans to the old Kentucky Association track to die within the past two weeks.

The Spanish Derby d'Aranjuez, to be run for the first Sunday in May, is open to three-year-olds of all countries. According to all customs, the Infanta Isabella will put a blue ribbon around the winner's neck on his return to the paddocks.

The get of Prince Palatine has shown well abroad to date this spring. Tervie Babacool and Iron Hand having been returned winners. Donnacona and Prince Pal, by the son of Persimmon, are prominently mentioned in Kentucky Derby discussions.

DISTINCTION'S FAST TRAINING GALLOP

Shows the Best Work of This Spring at Three-quarters on Friday Morning.

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—Carrying about 110 pounds, Major T. C. McDowell's three-year-old filly Distinction, candidate for the Ashland Oaks and Kentucky Derby, on Friday morning ran three-quarters of a mile over the Kentucky Jockey Club track in 1:14 1/2. The work watchers said: "It was the best move here this spring." She ran the first quarter in 23 1/2, the three-eighths in 55 1/2, the half in 48 1/2, and the five-eighths in 1:01.

Senator Johnson N. Camden's Lorraine, candidate also for the Oaks and Derby, worked a mile in 1:47 1/2. J. S. Hawkins sent W. F. Polson's Peace Pennant a mile and an eighth for the first time this year and, instead of Stockwell, he worked Cotton Blossom with him. Their fractional time was: 24 1/2, 49 1/2, 1:15 1/2, 1:42 1/2, 1:56 1/2. Cotton Blossom was extended fully and driving, but Peace Pennant did it easily with Cecil Howard as his pilot.

Pyx and Rapidan, from the same stable, worked a mile in 1:45 1/2. Mose Goldblatt sent Damask, with Ambrose up, a half mile in 54, accompanied by the maiden Servitor.

James Evans sent the Cochran pair, Bersaglieri and Ardito, a half in 50, both driving. Booneville and Lord Hamilton, the H. P. Hendley pair, worked three-quarters in 1:19, while Hal Price Headley's Convoys cantered a half in 53, and his Eyes of Youth ran seven-eighths in 1:33, and the mile, pulling up, in 1:49.

T. F. Henry's The Swimmer, and Linden from Will Perkin's string, worked a mile and a quarter the Kentucky Derby distance, in 2:18, the first mile in 1:46 1/2. Mickey Moore, from the same stable, worked a mile in 1:48.

Other moves of moment were: One mile and an eighth—Delico and Stockwell, together, in 1:57 1/2. One mile—Kiku, 1:45; Lady Mountjoy and Wadsworth's Last, 1:45; Refuse and Claude Brown, 1:44 1/2; Alula, 1:42 1/2 (fastest today); Duke of Lancaster, 1:44.

Three-quarters—Viva America, 1:16; Tom Logan, 1:16 1/2.

Good starters noted among the two-year-olds schooling at the barrier today were: Southern Gentleman, Miss Fountain, Pretty Peggy, Palmetta and Senator Camden's Light Brigade—One Step filly. Hellum and Petuna are slow beginners. J. B. Elwell, owner of The Beach Stable, now being trained at the local track by Lloyd Gentry, is here and will remain until after the Kentucky Derby.

PROTEST AGAINST PADDOCK JUDGE

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—Objection to Dr. S. A. Bradley's selection to be paddock judge on the Kentucky race tracks has been lodged with the State Racing Commission by the State Board of Veterinary Examiners. The commission in writing by Secretary Westmoreland has been informed that Dr. Bradley, whose home is at Louisville, is not eligible to practice veterinary surgery in Kentucky and that should he undertake to perform duties required of him under the rules of the State Racing Commission he would violate a state law. It is required by the State Racing Commission's rules that "the paddock judge shall be a graduate veterinary surgeon."

Inasmuch as the commission has named two paddock judges, one of whom is Dr. J. T. Clauwk of Louisville, against whom no objection has been received, it may, if it desired to do so, designate Dr. Clauwk as "the paddock judge," and instruct him to make all of the necessary examinations of horses that are to race, and designate Dr. Bradley as "assistant to the paddock judge," with instructions to make no examinations, but to direct the saddling, mounting and parading from the paddock. It is not necessary that the assistant be a graduate veterinary surgeon. Such service was performed at Latonia by the late Mickey Shannon during the administration of Dr. M. M. Leach as paddock judge. No complaint was made by the state board of veterinary examiners, because they had no right to register a complaint against the employment of an assistant whose duties do not call for the practice of veterinary operations.

UNUSUAL PRECAUTION AT LEXINGTON

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—Gene Elrod, chief of the pari-mutuel forces on the Kentucky Jockey Club tracks, was here today to pass upon the extension and rearrangement of the space for ticket sellers and cashiers and to look after other matters preliminary to the opening next Saturday. He is in receipt of a message from the Chicago house which prints the pari-mutuel tickets in which it is stated that it may be necessary, on account of the railroad transportation situation, to send the tickets here by motor truck.

For the protection of the money room at the local track extra precautions are being taken. The room has been screened with heavy wire and special guards have been appointed. In addition to this the Jockey Club has arranged for hold-up insurance.

Gallops other than Derby eligible moves today were: Convoys, three-quarters in 1:20; Captain Mac, five-eighths in 1:13; Kinburn, five-eighths in 1:13; The Swimmer, three-eighths in 41. Nothing else of consequence was noted in the gallops.

The stables of A. L. Kirby and J. H. Tevis arrived from New Orleans yesterday evening. Julius G. Reeder arrived this morning from New Orleans and took up his duties in the office of racing secretary William H. Shelley.

THE EDUCATION OF TWO-YEAR-OLDS

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—"Perhaps I do not know as much about horse training as I should know, or as I think I know, but I'd never permit one of my two-year-olds to be brought back to the barrier for a second try in one afternoon," said Goldblatt after he witnessed such a performance at the Kentucky Jockey Club track yesterday afternoon during the schooling hour. "If a two-year-old begins faultily at the first attempt, there is no insurance that he will not do likewise at the second attempt, but if the second attempt is deferred until the succeeding day the chances are greater that he will start better than if he is brought back to the barrier within a few minutes for second attempt."

"What young horses learn about starting in one afternoon is often what they retain, so if the beginning is bad it is well to give them every opportunity to forget it. To impress by repetition is apt to be costly on racing days."

LATEST NEWS FROM BREEDING FARMS

Sisters to Mad Hatter and Blazes Among Latest Aristocratic Arrivals.

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—Among the foals of recent days at the Kentucky farms are near relatives to several turf celebrities. At Major August Belmont's Nursery Stud there is a sister to Mad Hatter, by Fair Play—Madcap, by Rock Sand, and at the Nursery also Dragnet has a bay colt by Fair Play. Both mares have been bred back to the sire of Man of War.

At Arthur B. Hancock's Claiborne Stud Amy Day, sister to Caiman, has a bay colt by Wrack, while at J. B. Respass' Highland Farm Floral Day, a daughter of Amy Day, has a chestnut colt by Dick Welles, making the youngster a brother to Perfect Lady. At Highland Farm also Jefferson Livingston's Wondawby has a brown colt by Col. Vennie. Incidentally, Mr. Hancock, who returned yesterday morning from his Ellerslie Stud in Virginia, reports that Blazing Star on Thursday foaled a sister to Blazes and is to be again mated with Wrack.

At Claiborne Stud Prossanella, one of the three mares Hancock bought last fall from Col. E. R. Bradley, foaled a filly by North Star III, and each of the others, Bit of a Devil and Breathing Spell, have also produced for him.

At Edward F. Simms' Xalapa Farm the four recent foals are colts, one being by Ballot—Piston's Pride, one by Theo. Cook—Madam Herrmann, one by Star Shoot—Coat, and the other by Ogden—Scenery. The last-named two mares he bought at John E. Madden's sale in February.

At Thomas Platt's Brookdale Farm Fantail has a brown colt by Sir John Johnson—Lady McGee, a bay filly by Rock View; Stareadla, a chestnut filly by Delhi and Pokey O'Malley; a bay colt by Dick Finnell, the last-named being the property of W. K. Harrington of St. Louis.

Howard Oot's Pamela has a chestnut colt by Atwell, son of St. Amant. H. H. Hewitt's Avis dropped a chestnut filly by Ballot, Ave Russell, owned by Breckinridge Wiley & Sons, has a brown colt by Vandergrift at Stonewall Farm, where also George M. Hendrie's Sunny has a chestnut colt by Great Britain. At Balgowan Stud Metzje has a bay colt by Great Britain; Hull Gull a bay colt by Jim Gaffney and Gold Elsie a bay filly by Jack Atkin.

CHESAPEAKE STAKES POSSIBILITIES

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., April 17.—Nearly every good eastern owned three-year-old training for the impending renewal at Pimlico of the Preakness Stakes and for the Kentucky Derby that is any where near racing condition can appear under silks at Havre de Grace next Saturday in the Chesapeake Stakes. The Chesapeake, a \$5,000 race of one mile and seventy yards, for three-year-olds, the weights to be fixed by a scale of penalties and allowances, will be this year a sort of Preakness preliminary. It will attract many three-year-olds of either sex training for the Preakness, because owners and trainers alike realize that there is nothing so good for a horse preparing for such a hard gallop, as the impending event at Pimlico, as a real struggle for blood under colors. It rarely happens that the opportunity to give a Preakness or a Kentucky Derby candidate a public trial in a race that will pay \$5,000 in added money offers.

Man of War, the champion two-year-old of 1919 and the prospective favorite for the Preakness, will probably be one of the starters in the Chesapeake. Ral Parr of Baltimore will be represented by Blazes, also by Paul Jones. Other probable starters are Commander Ross' Constancy and either King Thrush or Irish Dancer; A. H. Diaz's Blue Wrack, the winner in Cuba of the \$10,000 National Handicap; Richard F. Carman's Carmandale; James W. McClelland's Hasten On and The Trout; Walter J. Salmon's Hobey Baker and My Laddie; Major Robert L. Gerry's Feodor; Thomas Clyde's Fairway; Daniel Cunningham's St. Allan and Abner Clouton's Bullet Proof.

James Rowe has not yet sent word which of the Whitney three-year-olds he is training at Brookdale Farm will come down for the Chesapeake. But Rowe holds a strong three-year-old hand and his horses have been going well at Brookdale these five weeks. His potential Chesapeake and Preakness stars are Upset, Leviathan, Wildair and John P. Grier. Upset and Wildair are going particularly well.

HIGH COMMAND NOT TO GO IN DERBY

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—After her fast work-out Friday it is a ten to one chance, for that is what some local folks are willing to take, that Major Thomas C. McDowell's easy gliding, low running filly Distinction, by The Manager—Alankarka, wins the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs on May 8. It has been eighteen years since Major McDowell won the Derby and he did it with Allan-Dale, the sire of Distinction's dam.

"I had not intended to start Distinction in the Derby, but now it looks much as if I would make a mistake to pass up such an opportunity," said Major McDowell last night. "It was my purpose only to point her for the three Oaks races at Lexington, Louisville and Latonia, but she has shown and is showing me so much this spring that tonight it looks like she can be counted as among the number that will go to the post for the Derby."

"She won her only race last year, but she displayed a little soreness and I decided to let up on her training until this year and I am happy to say that she has shown no soreness whatever and that every move she has made has been refreshingly better than the previous work. She is, as we on the turf say of our good ones, a sweet filly."

Major McDowell further stated that he had decided that High Command will not start in the Kentucky Derby and that he is not to be rushed in his preparation. He is galloping regularly, but as yet nothing of a serious nature has been asked of him.

GOLDEN BROOM GALLOPS A GOOD MILE

LEXINGTON, Ky., April 17.—The Kentucky Jockey Club track this morning was very muddy as the result of last night's rain, so Superintendent John Keegan was forced to put up the "dogs," and steeple horses as were exercised on the mile course were forced to go wide. The best move of the morning was Golden Broom's mile in 1:47 in company with Kinnool. Enzor had the mount on Golden Broom. They ran the first half in 50 1/2. The next best move was that of Rafferty, three-quarters in 1:18 1/2. Damask was galloped a mile in 2:00.

BLAZES IN WINNING FORM

He Defeats Faison Dore in Real Race Horse Fashion.

Ross Stable Wins With Boniface, but Loses With Motor Cop and Donegan Is Cut Down.

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., April 17.—Ral Parr's Kentucky Derby candidate Blazes made his first appearance with the colors up this year in the Classic Handicap, the feature race of the Havre de Grace program this afternoon and showed an impressive performance. Blazes, while he did not meet any great three-year-olds this afternoon, carried big weight, 126 pounds. He was ridden by A. Schuttlinger, made all the pace and won with speed in reserve, with his rider looking back at the finish. Blazes ran the three-quarters in 1:15 1/2, good time considering the track conditions. At no stage of the running was the result in doubt and at the end Blazes was pricking his ears. Trainer William Garth was well pleased with the showing of the colt and announced that immediately following the close of the Havre de Grace meeting he would ship Blazes to Churchill Downs, where he would receive his final "prep" for the big race.

There was a big increase in the attendance at Havre de Grace this afternoon, due to improvement in the transportation facilities. The volume of business was on a par with the big days of last year. There was a steady drizzle all afternoon, but race goers apparently did not mind the unfavorable conditions and crowded the lawns to witness the running of the various races.

The Ross stable accounted for the Edgewood Purse when Boniface beat Bullet Proof out a neck, coming from behind and outstaying the Clouton candidate. In the early running Bullet Proof raced into a long lead and at one time it seemed he would make a runaway affair of the race. Rounding the far turn, when Sande shook Boniface up a bit, the latter responded with a good burst of speed and when entering the homestretch was on even terms with the pacemaker. At the finish the winner was inclined to bear in a bit and Sande took hold of him in an effort to keep him straight.

The Ross stable was not as fortunate in the other races as in the opener. The imported colt Donegan came out of the race with one of his hind tendons almost cut in two. He was jumped on during the running and it is doubtful if he faces the barrier again, at all events not during the present racing season. Motor Cop and War Pennant proved disappointments in the Aero Purse, for which they were an odds-on favorite. Motor Cop showed a keen turn of speed to the stretch turn, but in the final eighth tired and Pickwick caught and passed him in the last hundred yards and won going away.

Penelope, winner of the second race, changed hands after she won. It was a selling race and W. A. McKinney and Paul Connelly were the bidders, the latter securing her for \$3,100. During the Bowie meeting Connelly lost the filly in a claiming race. According to the rule recently passed by the Jockey Club Connelly will be unable to race the filly until the expiration of thirty days after purchasing her back. Ting-a-Ling was claimed out of the same race by P. L. Short for \$2,017.

JOCKEY NOLAN'S SEVERE INJURIES

Reports from the local hospital where jockey T. Nolan is confined are that the lad is suffering from several broken ribs besides the loss of a couple of teeth. Nolan had a miraculous escape and it is doubtful if he will be seen in the saddle again this year.

There are some horsemen who attribute the accident to the fact that the horses ran in smooth plates, which is undoubtedly true. The matter was discussed pro and con and the consensus of opinion was that the stewards representing the Jockey Club should be empowered to use discretion in the matter of plates. On a track like Bowie, for instance, where the soil is of a sandy nature, the absence of toes cuts no figure, but on a clay track like Havre de Grace, when it rains smooth plates are positively dangerous and invite accidents. Several horses that raced here yesterday kept slipping and padding and ran as though they were on roller skates. When the track here—or any other clay track, for that matter—is firm or fast, smooth plates are all right, but when the going is slippery the officials in charge should be permitted to use some sort of discretion.

Among today's visitors at Havre de Grace was Newton Bennington, who a few years back raced a powerful stable in the East, which included that good mare Beldame. Mr. Bennington was connected with the British war board for eighteen months and since the close of hostilities has been busy looking after his interests in Wall Street. It is possible that he may re-enter racing some time next summer.

The race specials from Baltimore and Philadelphia were resumed today, to the great comfort and convenience of racegoers from both points.

Seventeen carloads of horses which were shipped by freight from Bowie arrived last night, which completes the shipments from that point.

T. J. Elward, who raced a string of two-year-olds at the New Orleans winter meetings, was an arrival from Canada. He reports that more than 100 horses are in training at the Woodbine course, Toronto, but owing to the backward spring the trainers have not been able to do much with them.

Jockey Guy Burns was another arrival from Canada, where he spent most of the winter months. Burns will ride as a free lance at the Maryland meetings.

Two additional foals were dropped at Commander J. K. L. Ross' stock farm in Howard county during the past week. A handsome filly by Marathon—Golden Wedding, and another filly by Fitzwarren—The Lark.

The twenty horses left by Mr. Bedwell at the Laurel track will be shipped to Louisville and campaigned on the Kentucky tracks by F. Schelke, one of the younger school of trainers.

Edward Soule, who wintered in California, was an arrival today. Charles Booker was another visitor.
