



**HAMILTON FAVORITES FAIL**

Verity the Surprise of the Day and at Long Odds.

Owners at Hamilton Compromise Their Controversy with the Fort Erie Management.

HAMILTON, Ont., August 5.—The program at Hamilton this afternoon was made up of a series of claiming races in which the fields were composed of the poorer class of horses. Surprises were the order, a majority of the favorites being beaten. The biggest upset of the afternoon came when Verity won the fourth race, beating Bond and Buckboard out in a driving finish. Verity paid \$71.40 in the \$2 mutuels.

Keltie, a product of the Hendrie stud outside of Hamilton, made an exhibition of her opponents in the opening race, a dash of three quarters for Canadian bred maidens.

The controversy between the horsemen and the Niagara Jockey Club regarding the purse offerings at Fort Erie has been adjusted. The management submitted two fair propositions to the horsemen and the latter will hold a meeting in the paddock at the Hamilton track tomorrow to ratify the agreement.

W. J. Rawlson has taken over Jockey F. Bryson's book and will make his engagements at Fort Erie.

W. P. Fraser, secretary of the Ontario Jockey Club, was a visitor this afternoon.

Lazy Lon was claimed out of the fourth race by W. M. Cain for \$1,900.

At the conclusion of the Hamilton meeting Fred Gerhardt will leave for Saratoga to distribute the blanks for the stakes to be run at the Windsor meeting the latter part of August. The Windsor Jockey Club is offering an attractive array of stakes for its meeting, two with \$7,500 added and three with \$5,000 added. The smallest amount added to any of the overnight purses will be \$1,500.

Skye Ball was cut down so badly in his race yesterday that he will be destroyed.

The stake blanks for the races to close to be run at the Blue Bonnets meeting at Montreal and the stakes to be run at the Woodbine Park meeting at Toronto have been distributed among the horsemen by Joseph McLennan. Both of these associations will feature steeplechases and an extra effort will be made to induce owners of cross-country horses to participate at both; \$111,500 will be distributed by the Ontario Jockey Club during the seven days' racing at its course.

Slim Ownbey, accompanied by jockey Heinisch, came over from Fort Erie this morning. The W. F. Knebelkamp, R. D. Williams, Rome Respass and Edward F. Whitney racers have arrived at Fort Erie from Windsor. R. F. Carman, with eight, including Carmandale, and J. Wagon with eight of the Pelican Stable horses, including Panaman and The Boy, are arrivals at Fort Erie from New York.

Owen Pons has obtained a contract on Brooks, a Hamilton lad, who was seen with the colors up recently.

Wildair and several other of the Harry Payne Whitney horses are expected at Fort Erie. Wildair is a candidate for the \$10,000 Dominion Handicap to be run on the opening day of the meeting.

The mutual department at Fort Erie has been rearranged since the previous meeting, and an equal number of machines have been set aside to handle both American and Canadian money. This should prove a great convenience to the club's patrons.

Peter Scheffel, a Cincinnati lad under contract to W. F. Knebelkamp, had his first mount this afternoon.

John J. Farrell, whose horses are racing at this meeting, was an arrival from Montreal.

**THIRTY LEADING WINNING OWNERS**

**H. P. WHITNEY STILL IN FRONT IN AN INTERESTING COMPETITION WITH J. K. L. ROSS FOR THE LEADERSHIP OF THE PRESENT YEAR**

Only H. P. Whitney and J. K. L. Ross have a look-in for the primacy of leading winning owners in our racing of this year. Nothing but an improbable series of successes in the richest stake races yet to be run could give any other owner a chance to overhaul the two. Just now Mr. Whitney has \$18,560 the best of Commander Ross. No matter what imposing things Sir Barton may do for the latter, Mr. Whitney is incomparably better equipped with high-class three-year-olds and two-year-olds, and to those ages fall the richest prizes of the turf. However it may turn out, the struggle between the two most powerful stables of the day will be followed with interest by the racing public. So much money is being distributed in stakes and purses that other winning owners can well view their stable returns with sentiments of deep satisfaction. Ral Parr is third in the list with more money than was ever before to his credit in racing. Glen Riddle Farm comes next, and, having serviceable horses besides the champion Man o' War, is thriving and probably destined to garner more than \$100,000 before snow flies. Bob Smith's Sunnyland Stable has its full share of good fortune, and the Canadian stable of G. M. Hendrie is doing quite well. **AMERICAN CHAMPION'S SPEED**

**Man o' War Seems to Have the Best of Sir Barton on the Basis of Time Made in Races**

NEW YORK, N. Y., August 5.—Sir Barton's one mile and a quarter in 2:01½ in the Saratoga Handicap Tuesday is considered by the large majority of turfmen as an American record for the distance, as there has been doubt for years as to the correctness of the time of 2:00 for the same distance recorded by Whisk Broom II, which officially holds the American record for one mile and a quarter. The record of Whisk Broom II, of 2:00, made under 139 pounds at Belmont Park June 28, 1913, has always been questioned as one of the queer errors of a fast watch or a false eye. But it is the record. Sir Barton's 2:01½ comes next. The fractions of the two races are:

The Whisk Broom II record is one for the racing world, so far as figures are kept, though the French have some speed marks which are not generally recorded.

Whisk Broom II was a speed marvel in 1913, with the record of 2:00 for a mile and a quarter, another record mile and a quarter in 2:03½ and a mile in 1:39. Whisk Broom II, only ran three races that year, all at Belmont Park, the track which he evidently fancied, and all wins. Labor, G. M. Miller and Meridian, good horses at that time, were the contenders closest to Whisk Broom II in his record performances.

The records for the distance which are extant show four marks around 2:02 for the English courses. They were made by:

The Australian record—horses loaf early in long distance races in that country—is Magpie's 2:04, made at Caulfield, Melbourne, Victoria, November 2, 1918, under 126 pounds.

The Canadian mark is that of Boots, 2:02½, made under 114 pounds, at Fort Erie, August 5, 1916.

Sir Barton, like Man o' War, can maintain his speed over a short or long route, as the past performances of these two champions show. The comparative speed of the two colts in their three-year-old form indicates that Man o' War is possessed of greater speed than the Ross colt. These comparisons by fraction follow:

**NEXT EPSOM DERBY CHOICE**

**Alan Breck, Son of Sunstar and Joie de Vivre, Accounted Best English Colt.**

English racing experts have already selected the favorite for the 1921 Epsom Derby in Sir J. Buchanan's Alan Breck, the chestnut son of Sunstar—Joie de Vivre, which recently won the Chesterfield Stakes at Newmarket, easily beating Monarch, the half-brother to Royal Bucks—a top-notch himself—in face style.

Alan Breck and Milesius, an Irish colt of rather sour disposition, are accounted to be by far the best of the year.

**ANSWERS TO QUERIES**

E. J. J., Chicago, Ill. Local San Diego papers publish charts of Tijuana racing.

C. L., San Francisco, Cal. Under the terms of the stipulation the conditional wager on horse C did not go on.

F. S. B., Kansas City, Mo. The two parlays were different affairs, having no relation to each other and should have been treated accordingly.

J. M. Z., Louisville, Ky. They are required to file their selections in advance. If they are discovered cheating in any way they are barred out at once. Do not guarantee their wares.

J. T. H., Dayton, O. When one makes a parlay he contracts that every horse he names shall do a certain named thing and if any one of them fails it loses. A limit has no bearing on the matter.

A. D. F., Chicago, Ill. In practice now, when a wager is made on a horse of a coupled entry, as in the case of Royalite and King Albert, it is taken on the entry and wins if both run and one wins.

Jos. H., Chicago, Ill. If a layer should inform a backer that a certain horse was scratched and the backer should then wager on another horse, at a price laid and accepted at the time, he would win if his selection should finish second to the horse erroneously declared to have been scratched. If the wager was at track prices it would lose.

**CAREFUL'S SCHUYLerville**

Takes the Saratoga Feature Race Despite Her Heavy Impost.

Bellsolar Wins for the West—Krewer Takes His First Race of the Year.

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 5.—W. J. Salmon's diminutive but frequently winning filly Careful figured in a brilliant victory in the Schuylerville Stakes, but only after she had been forced to record the best performance of her fine career. Nancy Lee landed in second place and Charity, one of the pair representing Harry Payne Whitney in the race, landed third. The net value of the stakes to the winner was \$2,950. Careful, because of being a stake winner, had to shoulder an impost of 127 pounds, the E. R. Bradley filly Believe Idle Hour also carrying the same weight, due to her Latonia Clipsetta Stakes victory. The pair were conceding weight to all the others. Because of the uncertainty of Careful's ability to maintain her speed over the five and a half furlongs route, it being the first time that she had been asked to go this distance, support for her was lukewarm, backing for Nancy Lee and the Whitney pair being on a par.

Delay was occasioned at the start, due to Believe Idle Hour's action in getting away from Jockey Lyke when reaching the barrier and running a quarter at top speed before she could be brought under control. When the start was effected it found Believe Idle Hour and Careful in front of the others and they made a killing pace for the first three-eighths. At this juncture the runaway told on Believe Idle Hour and she gave way to Careful. On the stretch turn it appeared that the Salmon filly would win easily, but Nancy Lee began a swift challenge in the last eighth that promised success for her, but Careful held to her task gamely and succeeded in passing the finish a nose in advance. Had Keogh not brought Nancy Lee wide on the stretch turn she would have won, and brought up in back of the others. To what extent her runaway affected her race is problematic, but she demonstrated that she can outrun Careful in the early stages.

Today's racing brought about the closest contests of the meeting. All the winners were forced to hard drives, with the results in doubt until the finish. The steeplechase, in which maidens started, was one of the best of its kind, War Togs and Surf being on almost equal strides in front of the others, and in the final drive on the flat Blighty II, succeeded in downing the pair to win by a head from War Togs, with Surf a short distance off. Valspar, which was considered to have an excellent chance, fell while in a forward position.

Backers of favorites again enjoyed a field day and began auspiciously when George Bovee, coupled with Mary Erb as the George Peterson entry, won after a hard drive with Sunny Days. The latter probably was best, but Turner blundered when he brought him wide on the stretch turn.

Bellsolar furnished an upset by outstaying Sundial II, and Recount in the high-priced selling race, in which Recount and Natural Bridge were thought to be best. Bellsolar had to be ridden hard through the last eighth and gained steadily to get up in the last few strides.

**WINS EASILY FOR HIS NEW OWNER**

Tenons Bon, which in his last race was transferred to the stable of Ral Parr via the claiming route, won for his new owner when he scampered home in advance in the fifth race, Round Robin landing in second place and Matinee Idol leading the others. Round Robin and Matinee Idol were both entered for \$1,500 and each was claimed for \$3,500, the former going to C. A. Stoneham and Matinee Idol to Sam Louis.

A crack band met in the Luzerne Handicap, which closed the day's proceedings and Krewer, a supposed good thing, won after a brief brush with Blazes and Crank. It was Blazes' first start since his start in the Preakness Handicap and he should improve with this race.

George Barnes, in charge of the horses owned by C. W. Clark, arrived yesterday with his charges, including United Verdy, Captain Mac, Pictor and others. They will be raced here and then returned to Kentucky, to engage in the autumn racing there.

J. C. Milam, whose horses are resting at Lexington, was an arrival today and will remain until the conclusion of the yearling sales.

Major August Belmont, chairman of The Jockey Club, paid his initial visit of the meeting here and will remain for some time.

Lloyd Gentry's St. Donard was a target for the claiming brigade, no less than four claims being made for the youngster. He went to S. Appel's stable on his bid of \$2,405. St. Donard automatically became ineligible to start after he was claimed under the French claiming conditions.

S. A. Clopton has repurchased from R. T. McKeever the filly Joiquina, which McKeever claimed during the Empire City racing.

Trainer H. G. Bedwell is contemplating having a starter in the \$10,000 added Dominion Handicap, to be run over the Fort Erie track, but has not fully decided whether Sir Barton or Boniface will carry the J. K. L. Ross silks in the race. Jockey Sande will have the mount on whichever one starts.

Prodigy, which was carded to start in the Schuylerville Stakes, had to be an absentee, on account of an injury which she sustained while at exercise this morning. Trainer Fitzsimmons stated that she would be out of racing for at least six weeks as a result of the injury.

Jockey Carmody has received a good riding offer from an owner in France and is intending to accept the contract.

A sum of over \$2,500 has been raised for former Jockey John Bullman, who is in bad health. He will be sent to Saranac Lake shortly in an effort to have his health restored.

Sam C. Hildreth is desirous of owning Priddy, but Trainer James Rowe refused to set a price on the filly when requested to do so by Hildreth.

Several owners have sought to purchase the good colt Pluribus from T. W. O'Brien without success. He is holding the colt at a high figure.

THIS YEAR'S EPSOM DERBY HERO

SOMEWHAT REMARKABLE LINEAGE OF SPION KOP IN REGARD TO GREAT STAYERS CLOSE UP ON BOTH SIDES OF HIS PEDIGREE

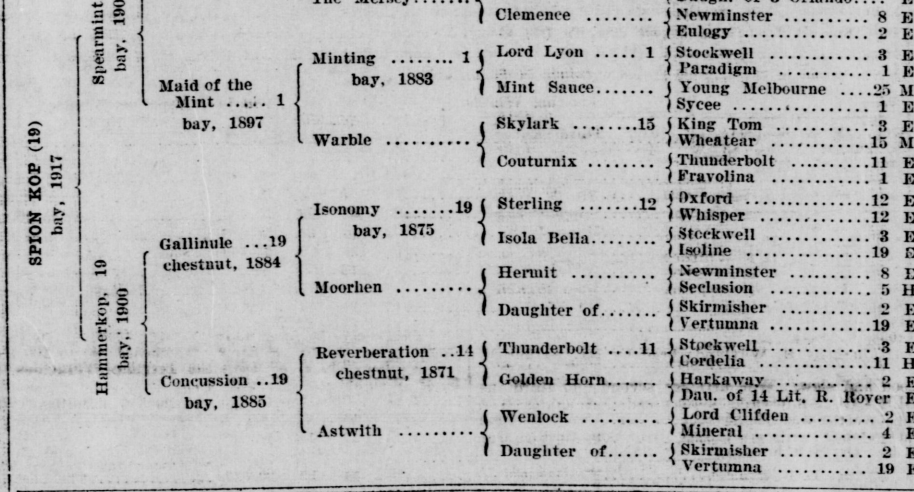
The Derby winner Spion Kop, the property of Major G. Loder, is a bay by Spearmint-Hammerkop, by Gallinule. Spion Kop was bred by Major Eustace Loder and, although he took part in six races as a two-year-old, failed to register brackets.

This year, however, there is an entirely different story to tell, for Spion Kop, to begin with, won the Spelthorne Three-Year-Old Plate of one and one-half miles on "Jubilee Day" at Kempton Park in irreproachable style, being out by himself after the first mile had been run.

Spion Kop's sire, Spearmint, won the Derby and, on crossing to France, proved too much for Maintenance and others in the running of the Grand Prix, but after his French win the son of Carbine did not again face the starter.

Hammerkop is a twenty-year-old daughter of the champion brood mare sire Gallinule and, perhaps, the best race nag the son of Isonomy ever sired, winning, as she did as a three-year-old, the May Plate at Kempton Park and Yorkshire Oaks, but, unlike many of the progeny of Gallinule, Hammerkop showed marked improvement with increasing years.

Spion Kop is a member of the No. 19 Bruce Lowe family, and from this same Vertumna by Stockwell branch come Gallinule, the Oaks winner Snow Marten, Siberia, Electra, that good French race horse and sire Upas, Pioneer, St. Victrix, Liangibby, etc.
