



FORT ERIE OPENS TODAY

Inaugural Program One of Best Ever Offered in Canada.

Record Crowd Expected to See Sir Barton Carry Ross Colors in Dominion Handicap.

FORT ERIE, Ontario, August 10.—The Niagara Racing Association offers its patrons a splendid program for the opening day of its second meeting at Fort Erie tomorrow. Quality is quite noticeable in a number of the races, and the card is one of the most attractive ever given by the club. The bright particular feature is, of course, the \$10,000 added Dominion Handicap, a dash of a mile and a quarter, in which Sir Barton, The Porter, Bondage and King's Champion are the overnight acceptances. The presence of Commander J. K. L. Ross' great colt, Sir Barton, in the big race has added prestige to this popular fixture of the Niagara Racing Association, and it is expected that the largest crowd in the history of the Fort Erie track will be present tomorrow. Sir Barton's recent victory in the Saratoga Handicap, in which he established a new track record of 2:01 1/2 for a mile and a quarter, is still fresh in the minds of racegoers hereabouts and all are anxious to see this mighty thoroughbred in action.

The Buffalo Express Handicap will divide interest with the feature race. This race is a dash of three-quarters of a mile, and the best field of sprinters that has gone to the post on a Canadian course this summer is carded to start. Lion d'Or is top weight at 132 pounds. Others in the race are St. Quentin, Carmandale, Ticklish, The Boy and St. Germain.

The field in the two-year-old race includes By Jimmy, Ikey T., John S. Reardon and Baby Grand. A special made up of twenty box cars arrived from Hamilton yesterday. These cars were routed back and brought down another big consignment today.

The number of mutuel machines handling Canadian money has been doubled since the previous meeting and the total number of machines now in operation is sixty-five. There are eighty-five cashiers, and this is probably the largest force employed at any track in Canada.

In the event of no more rain falling the track should be in good condition tomorrow. A force of men was at work on the track all day and it was drying out fast.

SIR BARTON IN WINDSOR STAKES.

Carroll Shilling came up with the Commander J. K. L. Ross horses from Saratoga. Guy Bedwell will be here to saddle Sir Barton for the big race and while here he will decide whether Sir Barton shall remain in Canada to fill his engagements at Windsor. He has been nominated in both the Windsor Jockey Club Handicap, a \$10,000 stake, at a mile and an eighth, and the George Hendrie Memorial Handicap, \$7,500 added, at a mile and a sixteenth. In the event of Sir Barton remaining here, Lion d'Or and Baby Grand will also be sent over to Windsor.

J. G. Bussey shipped the plater Tom Saunders in the same car that brought up the Ross horses from Saratoga. Bussey will add a couple of more racers to his string and campaign them on the Canadian circuit.

J. G. Wagoner will leave for Kentucky shortly to arrange for the shipment of the yearlings purchased by W. H. Rowe to the track at Shreveport, Louisiana, where they will be broken and tried out. The plans are to send half a dozen of the youngsters to New Orleans, but the best of the band will remain at Shreveport until spring, when they will be shipped to New York.

Jockey G. Walls came up from Saratoga with the Pelican stable.

Before leaving Hamilton, Harry Giddings disposed of the Canadian bred Bencher to George Elliott. The latter shipped the horse to the Cox training grounds on the Hamilton-Toronto highway, where he will be schooled through the field with the idea of making a steeplechaser out of him. Mr. Elliott plans to race Bencher at Ottawa, Blue Bonnets and Woodbine. He will also do his own riding. The Canadian bred Ostara has been sent back to the Giddings farm at Oakville, where she will be turned out for the year.

Jockey Claver was restored to good standing by the stewards on the closing day at Hamilton and will resume riding at Fort Erie.

Jockey T. Nolan left for Saratoga this morning to join the eastern division of Commander Ross' stable. Saude will be here in the morning and will ride Sir Barton in the big race.

GARTH-BEDWELL SPORTING WAGER

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 10.—Optimism with respect to possessing the best yearling is as keen as of yore, and out of good-natured banter between Louis Garth and H. G. Bedwell has come a match which will have its decision at Pimlico May 10 next year. The contestants-to-be are the colt by Sweep—Highflown that Garth has in his charge and the colt by Ultim—Narco which Bedwell has charge of. The conditions call for \$10,000 a side, \$500 forfeit.

PREPARE FOR BLUE GRASS FAIR RACES

LEXINGTON, Ky., August 10.—Judge William H. Shelley, who will again fill the post of racing secretary for the Blue Grass Fair, which is to open August 30, was in Lexington today in conference with Sewell S. Combs, chairman of the committee having charge of the races to be held in connection with the fair. At the conclusion of the conference Judge Shelley ordered the program book for the week to be printed. Good racing is promised, since there are many horses at the local track to participate in the conditions of the races being sufficiently alluring to attract them.

KILMER YEARLINGS SELL WELL

TWENTY-TWO YOUNGSTERS BRING \$42,600 AT AUCTION---J. K. L. ROSS PAYS TOP PRICE OF \$6,000 FOR ASSAGAI-ST. FEY COLT

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 10.—Twenty-two yearlings sold for the account of W. S. Kilmer by the Fasig-Tipton Company at its sales mart Monday night aggregated a total of \$42,600—an average of \$1,936.36. As at the previous sales here, the choicer appearing specimens were in demand and elicited spirited bidding. The star of the sale was the Assagai—St. Fey colt, which H. G. Bedwell, acting for Commander J. K. L. Ross, secured at a cost of \$6,000. G. W. Loft had to contend with many others for possession of the colt by Magic—Royal Quest, but ultimately got him for \$5,100. The colt by Assagai—Contessina was secured by S. D. Riddle for \$3,700. After his sale, Mr. Kilmer stated that he had turned down an offer of \$15,000 for him last spring.

The youngsters were all good lookers, built on substantial lines, and of pronounced English lineage. Their sires included Allumeur, a stake winner in France; Assagai, Magic and Cock o' the Walk. They were bred at Sun Briar Court and after weaning time were shipped to Remlik Hall in Virginia.

In addition to the yearlings, Mr. Kilmer disposed of several brood mares, including Carisbrooke Castle and Anecdote. Both mares had weanling colts at side, the dam and weanling constituting one offering.

Anecdote is twenty-one years old, and there was some hesitancy about bidding for her. Mr. Kilmer then announced that he had donated the mare and foal to the hospital here and bid \$500 for her, which was advanced to \$600 by Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark. The \$600 will be turned over to the Saratoga Hospital.

STEEPLECHASE STEWARDS' MEETING

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 10.—At the last meeting of the stewards of the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association the following licenses were granted: Jockeys, Sidney Veitch, J. J. Russell; trainers, John J. Casey, J. Beamish, James Fitzsimmons.

An application for a jockey license from L. Meripole was tabled pending further investigation. A certificate as a gentleman rider was granted to Mr. Morgan Dewitt Blair, subject to the approval of the Hunts committee.

Sanction was granted to the Maryland State Fair to give steeplechases during its meeting at Laurel Park October 1 to 30, inclusive. Frank J. Bryant was appointed steward to represent the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association at the meeting.

HITTING AT INDEPENDENT TRACKS

MONTREAL, Quebec, August 10.—A number of horsemen stabling at Blue Bonnets and others now seeking accommodations at the Montreal Jockey Club course have been notified that all horsemen racing any horses at the Mount Royal meeting next week, which track adjoins Blue Bonnets, will be refused stabling on the Montreal Jockey Club grounds. The horsemen at Mount Royal Park and the other local tracks are indignant about the decision of the Blue Bonnets management, and a petition, signed by horsemen, will be presented to Secretary William Northey, notifying him that unless his association decides to change its decision in this matter they will positively refuse to race at the Blue Bonnets second meeting.

MUDDY TRACK AT SARATOGA

Heavy Rain Spoils the Going and Affects the Attendance.

Boniface Defeats Naturalist in the Delaware Handicap—Minata Wins the Jumping Race.

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 10.—J. K. L. Ross' Boniface and J. E. Widener's Naturalist, both superb mud racers, engaged in an interesting duel over a course that was entirely to their liking, the track having been subjected to a severe drenching by hard rains. The pair met in the Delaware Handicap at one mile, having a net value of \$3,800. As a result of the changed track conditions only three went to the post, Royce Rools being the other one. But as far as being a real factor was concerned, he might just as well not have been in the race. Naturalist, though conceding Boniface six pounds, was given preference, and his backers were jubilant when he took command in the rise of the barrier and showed the way to the others. Boniface, however, kept in close pursuit, and at the half-mile point drew almost level with the leader, but Naturalist again drew out, and when approaching the stretch turn seemed to have the race won. Boniface was not to be denied and he again challenged in stubborn style and slowly but surely won Naturalist down to ultimately win drawing away.

The hard rain, which came down with intensity, began at a time when the racegoers were making ready to journey to the course and it resulted in many staying at home, causing the poorest attendance of the meeting. There was a cessation of downpour after the second race, but the air continued sultry, with every prospect of more rain.

The heavy track was responsible for numerous scratches from the different races, but interesting sport was the order in most instances. The steeplechase fell to the favorite, Minata, carrying Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark's colors, with Midas II, second and Syrdarya third. Surf, the early leader, came to grief after he had completed the first round of the field, but McCleary, his rider, escaped injury.

Western owned horses again figured during the afternoon and they began auspiciously with the victory of Repeater in the initial dash, which he won after a hard drive from Great Gull and Frank Waters. The latter was the favorite, but Repeater led from the start.

WESTERN-OWNED ABLAZE A WINNER.

Ablaze, another western owned one, took a band of platers into camp in the second race, after having shown the way for the entire three-quarters. The going was favorable to her, and showing the most speed, she never left the result in doubt, winning in a canter from Liberty Girl and Betty J. Ablaze was in to be sold for \$1,500, but was bid up to \$2,205 and bought in by her owner.

The superior mud running Oriole, carrying Jefferson Livingston's colors, made a show of the good colts that tried conclusions in the final race and won by a good margin from Sedgfield, with Last Rose heading the others. The high-priced Hildur attempted to race with Oriole and at one point led by a small margin, but after going three-eighths retired fast. Pagan Pan made his initial eastern start here, but failed badly in the stretch after having enjoyed prominence for a half mile.

W. R. Coe's colors scored their first victory of the meeting when his Wyoming-bred Wapiti showed his heels to a big band of youngsters that tried conclusions with him in the third race. Thornhedge and Toreador, both outsiders in the betting, followed the Coe youngster to the finish. General Average, which raced in the Hildreth colors, was claimed from the race by Paul Connelly at a cost of \$4,100.

There are forty nominations to the Grab Bag Handicap, which will have its running August 18, the latest additions being Eternity and Light Rose, representing J. W. McClelland.

Hasten On and The Trout have been turned over to Jerry Carroll by J. W. McClelland and the horses hereafter will confine their racing to the field. Both horses are showing aptitude at jumping and may develop into top-notch steeplechasers.

There will be a sale of horses in training next week miscellaneous owned, and among the consignees is J. W. McClelland. The sale will be held at the Fasig-Tipton mart.

Jockey Tommy McTaggart arrived this morning from New York. He is making an effort to secure a hearing by the license committee with a view to procuring a riding license. McTaggart has been out of the saddle for over three years, but is still able to ride at a light weight.

E. G. Stoll, secretary of the Kentucky State Racing Commission, was among the newcomers and intends making a lengthy stay.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

The fillies Cobwebs, Truly Rural, Sky Blue, Cointreau and Champagne have been sent to the H. P. Whitney farm, near Lexington, to be retired to the stud.

The string of M. Seifert, comprising eight head, and S. Polk, with seven head, have arrived at Mount Royal Park, Montreal, from Hamilton. Jockey E. Fator accompanied the Polk stable.

Bodenham, a now seven-year-old Irish gelding, by Zria—Pretensions, is one of the best hurdle racers in India, having won five races in succession, among which were the valuable Rudwan Cup and the Grand Annual Handicap. It was in the first named race that he beat among others Blackmaller, which later won the India Grand National.

Writing of small race horses, it may be mentioned that Little Wonder, which won the Derby, was only 14.3 when he carried off the "blue riband." There is a tradition in the old world Sussex village of Flindon that as a foal Little Wonder was brought up on milk in the kitchen of a laborer's cottage.—The Winning Post.
