SARATOGA, N. Y., August 13.—Good looking youngsters, the progeny of popular and winning sires, including Sweep, Ballot, Star Shoot, Ben Brush, Brummel and His Majesty...

The star of the sale, in the matter of price, was The Sweep—Iridesence colt in the J. S. Barbee consignment.

The seven other youngsters in the Barbee lot brought his aggregate to \$17,150, an average of \$2,437.75 per head.

The five head offered by Stone & Rucker were disposed of for an aggregate of \$9,400, an average of \$1,880.

The eight head of the Runnymede offering yielded \$10,300, an average of \$1,287.22.

The bidding was uniform and on the whole it was the most satisfactory sale of the present season.

Maryland Track Will Distribute Between \$200,000 and \$250,000 to Horsemen at Fall Race Meeting.

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., August 13.—Between \$200,000 and \$250,000 will be distributed among horsemen at Havre de Grace in the course of the coming September race meeting...

For rough riding at Maisonneuve Tuesday, jockey E. Smith was suspended indefinitely, which caused him to change his plans in going to Hagerstown, Md.

An operation has been performed on the Canadian bred Sadducee by Dr. Fowler at Toronto. The horse was touched in the wind and is rapidly improving.

Commander J. K. L. Ross' good colt King Thrush is showing a return to the good form that he displayed in the early spring racing over the New York tracks.

SARATOGA'S ALL PURSE DAY

No Stake Races on the Card, but Attendance Is Good.

Dinna Care Easily Defeats Donnacona—Milkmaid in Good Form Again—Intrigante Falls.

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 13.—Threatening weather, culminating in a shower after the running of the fourth race, detracted somewhat from the racing this afternoon...

Uncertain track conditions contributed wholesale withdrawals—the feature race, a mile handicap, suffering particularly in this respect.

Another three-horse dash followed the feature, but in this Tenous Bon appeared to outclass his opponents, and he raced like it.

The sport began auspiciously for the backers when Milkmaid, carrying the J. K. L. Ross colors, scampered home with the initial dash at seven-eighths and won easily from Gloria France, with Red Red Rose in third place.

The concluding race brought about a fall in which jockey Sande and Intrigante, the favorite, figured, but luckily both escaped injury.

THE ALLY FAILS HIS BACKERS.

The Ally was backed extensively in the third race, but the finish found him in third place.

William P. Riggs, manager of the Laurel track, was an arrival here this afternoon and will remain for a week doing missionary work in the interest of the stakes to be run over the Laurel track.

W. T. Northey, secretary of the Blue Bonnets track in Montreal, was also a visitor to do missionary work among the horsemen in the interest of the stakes to be run at his track and which close Monday.

The yearlings bought by L. J. Carey were for the account of the Kilmare stable.

The colts bought by E. J. Trantor as agent were for the account of the Belair Stud.

J. C. Milam sold the Light Brigade—Sard colt and the Light Brigade—One Step filly to J. M. Danning, a New York broker.

Jockey M. O'Connor was suspended for the remainder of the meeting as a result of rough riding while astride James A. Sheridan in the steeplechase and jockey Hanna, on the winner, also suffered suspension.

At Goodwood on July 28 Major D. McCalmont's Tetratena, by The Tetrarch—Scotch Gift, won the King George Stakes, value \$5,000.

Messrs. Carr, Lyne, Platt and other prominent breeders, returned to their homes in Kentucky tonight. They were not overly enthused with the yearling market of this year.

It has been announced that General John J. Pershing will exhibit fifteen of his own horses at Marlboro next Tuesday, when the meeting at that place opens.

Due to his indifferent handling of Presumption in the second race at Maisonneuve Park Tuesday, jockey C. Thomas was suspended for the remainder of the meeting.

It is rumored in Canada that Frank McGinty will succeed James Milton as starter on the Canadian tracks after the latter leaves for Maryland to fill his engagement at Havre de Grace.

DEVONSHIRE TO GIVE OVER \$100,000

THREE STRAIGHT VICTORIES

Eddie Rickenbacher Continues His Winning Way at Fort Erie.

Runs Remarkably Fast Race to Account for the Buffalo Courier Handicap.

FORT ERIE, Ontario, August 13.—Commander J. K. L. Ross' big sprinter Lion d'Or went down to defeat at Fort Erie this afternoon when he was beaten by the three-year-olds Eddie Rickenbacher in the Buffalo Courier Handicap, a dash of three-quarters, which brought out the best band of sprinters that have gone to the post in Canada this summer.

Eddie Rickenbacher won in runaway fashion. He set a remarkable pace all the way and passed the winning mark a length and a half in front of Margerie Hynes. Lion d'Or was third, beaten four lengths for second place. Carmandale ran well to the turn out of the back stretch, where he tore for the outside fence and it took all that O'Brien could do to straighten him out. This put him out of the running. Today's victory is the third successive one that Eddie Rickenbacher has scored since passing into the hands of W. A. Burttischell, who is training him for J. R. Skinner, and in his present form he seems unbeatable by anything racing on this circuit at anything like equal weights.

The attendance keeps up in a remarkable manner and another large crowd turned out to witness the sport. The maiden jockey race was won by Sandy H., which beat Humma by a head in a driving finish. Both Aron and Remmert, who rode the first two horses, put up excellent rides for beginners. This was Remmert's first mount. The lad is under contract to J. B. Dunn, who picked him up at Aqueduct last spring. Roy Gordon has taken over jockey G. Walls' book and will make his engagements in the future. Harry Giddings' plater Wraite and jockey K. Parrington had a narrow escape from injury this morning. Wraite was being worked while the horses were on the track and Parrington was unable to keep him straight and he jumped inside the narrow and out of it and in some remarkable manner escaped injury.

The Hon. S. F. Tolmie, Minister of Agriculture, was a visitor at Fort Erie this afternoon. He made a thorough inspection of the plant, accompanied by Mr. S. Gilmartin, who is in charge of the animal department, and was well pleased with the manner in which that department was conducted. It is understood that the Hon. Tolmie will make a tour of inspection of every race course in Ontario and Quebec. Pat Knebelkamp, who is spending the month of August in Canada, contemplates adding a couple of useful horses to his string which will be shipped from Saratoga to Kentucky. He will choose horses that favor racing over a long distance of ground. C. R. Anderson's useful horse Stevenson pulled up lame in his race yesterday and will be on the shelf for a couple of weeks.

The sixth race on the original program for tomorrow was declared off and a race at one mile substituted. James T. Looney, accompanied by his son R. J. Looney, stopped off in Buffalo on their trip from Lexington to Saratoga and took in the races at Fort Erie this afternoon.

Jockey Richcreek suffered a smashed toe while Fletcher broke his collar bone as a result of the mixup at the finish in the second race yesterday when Musket and Polkey B. fell fifty yards from the finishing mark. Johnny Schorr left for Saratoga this morning with The Porter and The Baggage.

The condition book for the Ottawa meeting reached here this morning and were distributed among the horsemen by Joseph McLennan. The horses have been increased \$4,000 over those of the spring meeting. The club in conjunction with the Montreal Jockey Club and the Ontario Jockey Club, is making an extra effort to attract owners to ship their steeplechase horses to Ottawa and there will be a jumping race every day of the program. James Milton has received an offer for the brood mare Golden Ruby and will probably dispose of her. She has a filly foal at her side by Great Britain and was bred back to the son of The Commoner again last spring.
