



EXTERMINATOR THE WINNER

W. S. Kilmer's Star Campaigner First in Windsor's Feature.

Sir Barton's Withdrawal Robs Race of Much Interest—B. Kennedy in the Limelight.

WINDSOR, Ontario, August 21.—W. S. Kilmer furnished the winner of the Windsor Jockey Club Handicap, the \$10,000 opening day feature of the second meeting, in his sterling campaigner Exterminator. The race was robbed of some of its interest by the absence of Sir Barton, trainer H. G. Bedwell withdrawing the Ross star after the track became slippery. Showers fell during the afternoon, but did not affect the track much, Exterminator equaling the track record for a mile and an eighth in winning the big race.

A distinctive feature of the inaugural day's sport was the brilliant horsemanship displayed by jockey B. Kennedy, who rode three of the afternoon's winners. He brought home Maurice H. in the lead of a big band of two-year-olds in the opening dash, followed that success with a well-earned victory with Flame in the race for Canadian-bred horses, and then landed Cheer Leader a winner in the sixth after a hard fought struggle, with the result in doubt until the last few strides.

W. P. Fraser, who is one of the associate stewards here, has arranged to leave for Saratoga next week in the interest of the fall meeting at Woodbine. The Ontario Jockey Club has offered a flattering list of fixtures for its seven days' meeting. The program book shows \$112,000 in added money with fourth money to every race run during the meeting. \$17,500 will be distributed on the opening day and \$23,500 on the closing day, the smallest purse being \$1,500. The Canadian-bred horses have been given consideration by the club and long distance races will be featured, while \$16,500 will be added to the steeplechase races.

Arrangements have been made for a special horse train to leave here next Saturday night for Ottawa. The horses will be loaded at the Windsor course and unloaded at the gates of the Connaught Park Jockey Club. The shipment will go through on express schedule.

Starter Milton today received a wire from Frank J. Bruen, general manager of Oriental Park, announcing his intended arrival here Monday from Saratoga, presumably for the purpose of doing missionary work for the coming winter meeting at Havana.

J. B. Campbell is distributing stable application blanks and stake blanks for the Pimlico, Laurel and Empire City meetings. Empire City stakes close Monday, and those at Laurel will be closed next Thursday. Entries for the Pimlico fixtures will be accepted up to the end of next month.

J. D. Richardson of the J. D. Richardson Co., custom house brokers, will be at the paddock daily to arrange with horsemen for the transfer of their horses across the border at the conclusion of racing in Windsor. The Kentucky contingent will leave Canada at the end of the Devonshire meeting.

REDUCTIONS IN TIME RECORDS

HOW SPEED MARKS IN AMERICAN RACING HAVE FALLEN SINCE 1880---MAN O' WAR THE ONLY HORSE TO HOLD THREE AT ONE TIME

S. D. Riddle's incomparable three-year-old Man o' War is the holder of three American and one probable world's record. This distinction has never come to any other American thoroughbred. The nearest approach to it is Iron Mask, which holds two records, both made over the fast Juarez, Mexico, course. They, too, are at short distances, one being 1:03 2-5 for five and a half furlongs, and the other 1:09 3-5 for three-quarters of a mile. Another remarkable feature in connection with Man o' War's performances is that he broke the records at distances of one mile or over, this year. The first one came in the Withers Stakes at Belmont Park, when he established a new record of 1:35 4-5 for one mile. Sun Briar held the previous record, 2:36 1-5, made during the running of a race. Roamer holds the mile record of 1:34 4-5 against time, which he made at Saratoga on August 21, 1918, shattering the long-standing mark of Salvator. The next mark to be set by Man o' War was in the Dwyer Stakes, one mile and an eighth, 1:49 1-5, at Aqueduct. In this race the son of Fair Play not only broke the American record for the distance, held jointly by Borrow and Boots, 1:49 2-5, both made in 1917 at Aqueduct, but set a possible world's mark for the distance. In the Belmont Stakes, at Belmont Park, one mile and three-eighths, Man o' War smashed the American record for the distance into smithereens, running the distance in 2:14 1-5, the previous mark, 2:17 2-5, being held by Sir Barton.

The table here presented shows the American time records from three-eighths of a mile to four miles as they stood in 1880, 1890, 1900, 1910 and as they are today, forming an interesting exhibit of the gradual cutting down of records as the art of track-making became better understood. Students of speed figures will find food for reflection in the following tabulation:

AMERICAN VICTORIES IN FRANCE

At Deauville, on August 4, J. Rutgers Le Roy, in whose name the horses of the late W. K. Vanderbilt are now running, won the Prix de Honneur, \$1,600, with Earline, ch. f. 2, by Sea Sick—Early and Ofsen, and the Prix de Villers, \$1,600, with Patsik, 2 by Sea Sick—Petulance. Both horses were bred by Mr. Vanderbilt. The horses of Mr. A. K. Macomber, Miss Glatigne and Pommeret, were placed fifth in both races. Mr. Vanderbilt also bred the winner of the Prix de Meautry (run the same day), Glorious, by Maintenance—Gloria II., now owned by Capt. J. D. Coha.

MAN O' WAR IS INVINCIBLE

Takes the Travers Stakes and Leads All the Way Easily.

Prudery Victress in the Grand Union Hotel Stakes—Record Crowd Views the Races.

(BY J. L. DEMPSEY.) SARATOGA, N. Y., August 21.—Man o' War added additional glory to his already full measure by taking the Travers Stakes in his customary easy style and, equaling the track record of 2:01 1/2, incidentally disposing of his most formidable rivals in the three-year-old division and setting at rest any doubts that might have existed as to whether John P. Grier or Upset might have a chance to finish in front of him. Never had a pair of three-year-olds been more painstakingly prepared for a combat than John P. Grier and Upset had been for this special occasion. Trainer Rowe had expended all his skill for the emergency. He was determined, if possible to bring about the downfall of the great Man o' War by one of his charges, and the pair of colts were as fits as human agency could make them. They both showed their top form, but their best was not good enough to even make the great Riddle owned colt extend himself, for he won with the most consummate ease. Schuttlinger virtually beginning to ease him up in the last sixteenth. Had Man o' War been permitted to continue at full stride through the stretch, there is every reason for belief that he would have reduced the running time by a second. Considerable anxiety was manifested by the Man o' War admirers before the race as to the tactics that would be employed by the Whitney pair in the running. The skeptics believed that in the event John P. Grier forced the pace Man o' War would be weakened to an extent that would enable Upset to pick him up in the stretch. Trainer Fenstel was the least perturbed before the race and when Schuttlinger was about to mount him Fenstel remarked to the jockey: "Use your own judgment and be guided by the running. You are on a good horse, and I have no fears for the result." Schuttlinger's judgment was to take Man o' War to the front immediately after the start, John P. Grier following, with Upset restrained a half dozen lengths behind. John P. Grier made a hard effort to keep up with Man o' War, but the first half mile, which was covered in 46 1/2, found him a full length back, with Upset still a half dozen lengths in the rear. From the half mile ground Man o' War was master of the situation, for he moved away at his rider's will and his margin of command was regulated by Schuttlinger. Finding John P. Grier done for after going three-quarters, Schuttlinger took a restraining hold on Man o' War and about this time Upset began moving up. Just before rounding into the stretch Rodriguez tried to bring Upset through next to the inner rail, but although finding John P. Grier tiring badly, Ambrose would not permit the stable mate to save ground and forced Upset to come around. It mattered little if Upset could have gained any advantage by coming through next to the rail, for there was no chance of heading the leader. The race had a net value to the winner of \$9,275.

TO STUDY TURF CONDITIONS

Maryland State Racing Commission to Visit Kentucky and New York with That End in View.

BALTIMORE, Md., August 21.—The Maryland Racing Commission will go to Kentucky and New York to study racing problems as they are handled in those states. The members of that newly appointed commission are anxious to get a comprehensive and first hand outline of the system by which racing is handled elsewhere, particularly in Kentucky, where it is said to be most practical and up to date. The commission will go to Lexington first, where the Blue Grass State Commission makes its headquarters. There they will make a study of the system employed to keep the commission in touch with the various race tracks.
