SMALL FIELDS AT BELMONT

Milkmaid Forced to Make a Track Record to Win.

Yung Ching Defeats the Speedy La Rablee and Hoodwink—Ticacey Takes a Race.

NEW YORK, N. Y., September 3.—Delightful racing weather brought out a good crowd at Belmont Park this afternoon to see a mediocre program of races decided. The fields were small and had little in the way of good class horses contesting, barring the feature of the day, the Great Neck Handicap, in which four good racers faced the barrier, with J. K. L. Ross' Milkmaid rulling the favorite around 6 to 5 and less. Milkmaid won in a driving finish with Fair Gain and set a new mark for one mile and a sixteenth, 1:43 3/4, at Belmont Park.

In the running Debadou, which was the medium of quite a plunge, set a sizzling pace and held to his task until far in the stretch, where Milkmaid, on the outside, Fair Gain and Donnacona all passed him. The three fought it out through the last fifty yards, Milkmaid getting up in the last strides to beat Fair Gain by a head, with Donnacona only a half length back and Debadou close up.

For the third time the public choice finished second when Liola defeated Tan II., favorite, in a driving finish in the third race. Lottery, which had raced last most of the way, showed a good performance in finishing third. Liola was in front all the way. Tan II. was hard ridden all through the stretch, but could never get up. Sea Queen showed a dash of early speed, but quit badly. The old mare Favour, which had quite a following, showed little speed and finished last.

A promising maiden lost its allowance when J. E. Widener's English-bred Yung Ching took the measure of the hot favorite, La Rablee, and the speedy Hoodwink in the second race. He had shown speed in his single race at Saratoga and in a gamely contested finish had the best of La Rablee by a half length, with Hoodwink a close-up third. George D. Widener's Royal Duck, which finished fourth, ran well enough to suggest an early win.

The fifth race was invested with a tinge of interest from the fact that it was won by a horse bred by the former Missouri breeder Barney Schreiber. The starters were about as bad as bad race horses can be, but somebody knew Ticacey was best and he went to the post an odds-on favorite and, to show no mistake was made, won by seven lengths from Alors.

Eight carloads of horses arrived at Belmont Park yesterday from Saratoga. It is expected that the fields will be larger for the remainder of the meeting.

The stables of S. Louis and M. J. Murphy were sent direct from Saratoga to Havre de Grace. Ed Trotter, trainer for the Florissant Stable, has changed his mind about retiring his horses in the East and has shipped his stable from Saratoga back to Kentucky for the fall campaign.

EXTERMINATOR TO BE BUSY

W. S. Kilmer's Plans for His McGee Gelding to First Race at Havre de Grace.

Willis Sharpe Kilmer is authority for the statement that his great McGee gelding Exterminator, which, after winning two big stakes at Windsor—the Windsor Jockey Club Handicap and the Hendrie Memorial Cup—traveled to Saratoga and won for the second year in succession the famous Saratoga Cup, would be immediately shipped to Havre de Grace to be prepared for engagements in the \$5,000 Harford County Handicap and the \$10,000 Havre de Grace Handicap, races of one mile and a sixteenth and one mile and an eighth that will be features of the September meeting of the Harford Agricultural and Breeders' Association. Exterminator was on the market for some time and Mr. Kilmer turned down offers of \$40,000 and \$45,000 for him in spite of the fact that he is a gelding. But the Binghamton sportsman has decided now that Exterminator shall not be sold. He will race at Havre de Grace, Laurel Park and Pimlico, also fill several engagements on the New York and Kentucky tracks before going into winter quarters at Remlik Hall farm in Middlesex County, Virginia. Next year, while Mr. Kilmer is touring the world on his private yacht, Exterminator will be racing over the Maryland, Kentucky, New York and Canadian circuits.

Exterminator is no stranger to patrons of Havre de Grace racing. He was at the Harford County track last year and he and Cudgel had a battle royal in the Havre de Grace Handicap. He won the Pimlico Autumn Handicap of 1918, which was the year of his Kentucky Derby victory. It is possible that Exterminator may go up from Havre de Grace to Belmont Park on September 15, to start in the \$5,000 Autumn Gold Cup, a handicap at two miles for horses three years old and over.

NEWCOMER TO TURF BUYS YEARLINGS

LEXINGTON, Ky., September 3.—For a local man who is a newcomer to the turf and who does not want his name mentioned at present, Robert C. Frakes bought of Messrs. Carr & Platt the yearling bay colt by Light Brigade or Peter Quince—Bunchy, and the yearling chestnut filly, by Ballot—Stareddia, by Star Shoot. They will be broken here after the fall meeting.

SPRING MEETING FOR SHREVEPORT

The contemplated race meeting in connection with the state fair, to be held at Shreveport, La., has been abandoned and arrangements are under way for a fifteen-day spring meeting next year, to follow the racing at New Orleans.

FEATURE RACE TO YORKIST

W. Russell's Recently Acquired Plater Takes Canadian Handicap—Looking Up and Gloria France in Close Contest.

WINDSOR, Ont., September 3.—The Canadian Handicap for three-year-olds and over foaled in Canada, a purse of \$3,000, served as the feature of the third day's racing at Devonshire Park this afternoon. Although a field of only six faced the starter the race was productive of a keen struggle to the final eighth when W. Russell's Yorkist drew away to win easing up. Bugle March was as easily second, with the early pacemaker Sturdee third two lengths away.

That Russell secured a bargain when he claimed Yorkist for \$1,700 at Fort Erie there is no doubt. He was away none too well today and, despite being carried extremely wide when entering the stretch, he came on to win as his rider pleased.

Nine fast sprinters met in the fifth race, the secondary feature, but the contest developed into a two-horse affair between Looking Up and Gloria France. This pair raced as a team for most of the way and the former proved the gamer when the real struggle came. Incidentally the Ogden Stable filly equaled the track record of 1:11 1/2, established by Eddie Rickenbacher yesterday.

Alvin T. Hart took the measure of some good two-year-olds in the third race. Previous to the running of this race W. C. Went claimed the favorite, Mary Reigel, for \$2,600 from W. F. Knebelkamp.

Closing with a rush in the stretch run Acclaim annexed the opening dash, which was for maiden two-year-olds.

F. Richards, general manager of the Dorval Jockey Club, and Raymond Beaudry, treasurer of the same association, are arrivals in the interest of the meeting to open at the Montreal course two weeks hence.

Oaklawn Belle was not permitted to start here yesterday for the reason that her owners were unable to give a satisfactory account of her racing during the past five years. She won a maiden race at the recent Mount Royal meeting and there is considerable doubt as to whether or not she was eligible to such a race.

Tomorrow and Monday the racing here will commence at two o'clock.

QUEBEC HANDICAP TO SEDAN

Reverses Decision Gained by The Boy in Their Last Meeting—Lady in Black a Big Surpriser.

OTTAWA, Ontario, September 3.—Mrs. L. Brown's six-year-old Jim Gaffney—Kitty Belle Brooks gelding Sedan, favored by a big change in the weights from his last meeting with The Boy, reversed the decision over the F. A. Goss color bearer in the Quebec Handicap, at three-quarters of a mile, the feature of the Connaught Park card this afternoon, and equaled the track record of 1:13 3/4, held by Top 'o' Morning. The Boy finished second, well beaten, and Vive McGee, after racing in third position from start to finish, won the small portion of the purse. Jockey H. Myers rode the winner, his second of the day. He also won on Mouette in the opening race, for Canadian-bred maidens.

Lady in Black upset calculations in winning the Rideau Purse, at a mile. It was the first time the daughter of Boots and Saddle—Yankee Tree had gone more than three-quarters, and the presence in the race of such proved stayers as Royal Jester and War Club caused the J. A. Parsons color bearer to be overlooked in the betting, with the result that she paid \$46.90 on a \$2 ticket. Jockey Harbour rode the winner. War Club and Royal Jester finished second and third respectively.

Steeplechase riders Haynes and Howard have reported to Jim Donahue at Blue Bonnets to prepare the Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark jumpers for the coming meeting.

Some of Ral Parr's timbertoppers will be shipped to Montreal for the Blue Bonnets meeting. P. Hinchey's Sand River II. is reported ill with a fever. H. Tullett's Humma spread a hoof in the race of yesterday.

Jockey Butwell leaves for Havre de Grace at the conclusion of the present meeting. E. B. McLean has first call on his services for the Havre meeting. E. F. Whitney will have second call. Butwell rode successfully for the latter horseman while he was on the Canadian circuit earlier in the summer.

Jack Mount pulled up slightly lame after his race yesterday. Belle Roberts, also from the Pelican stable, is temporarily on the shelf.

BE FRANK IN FINE FETTLE

Has Been Shipped to Havre de Grace to Be Prepared for Fall Campaign in Maryland and Kentucky.

The horses of William Jennings and G. E. Hall have been shipped from Saratoga to Havre de Grace. Included in the shipment was the good horse Be Frank, which will be prepared at the Maryland track for his engagements in the \$10,000 Havre de Grace Handicap.

Be Frank is practically one of Maryland's own. The property of Cornelius M. Garrison, a broker of New York City, this big, powerful-striding gelding by Sir John Johnson—Frankness, spends his winters at the Jennings farm, which is in Baltimore County. He does his spring training at Pimlico and Havre de Grace. Unlike Exterminator, which seems to be good at all seasons of the year, but like most other geldings, Be Frank races best in the late summer and fall. His effort against Exterminator in the Latonia Autumn Cup was a sample of his best racing. Be Frank was not of much account in Kentucky last June and July, but he had plenty of rest at Saratoga and is galloping famously. That Be Frank will give a creditable account of himself in the Havre de Grace Handicap, no matter what horses start, Jennings is confident.

After the running of the Havre de Grace Handicap Be Frank will train for the long-distance races to be decided in the course of the Laurel fall meeting. He may go west for another Latonia Autumn Cup, or he may remain in Maryland and train for the Bowie Cup, which will be renewed at Pimlico.
