AN OUTSIDER'S FUTURITY

Rich Race Unexpectedly Falls to the Filly Step Lightly.

Prudery Unplaced and Badly Beaten—Man o' War Makes New Record at Mile and a Half.

NEW YORK, N. Y., September 11.—Futurity day brought 25,000 racing enthusiasts to Belmont Park this afternoon to see the thirty-first running of the richest two-year-old fixture in America, which this year was worth \$35,870 to the winner, \$4,500 to second and \$2,250 to the third.

Man o' War had one horse to beat, Damask, in the Jockey Club Stakes at one mile and a half. He beat Damask away off and easily hung up a new American record for the distance, 2:28 3/4.

Three started in the Corinthian Steeplechase Handicap, with Square Dealer ruling favorite at odds-on. The winner turned up in Wisest Fool, which led throughout.

VICTORY FOR MRS. F. A. CLARK

Blighty II. Triumphantly Carries Her Colors Home First in Hendrie Memorial Steeplechase at Blue Bonnets.

MONTREAL, Que., September 11.—The Hendrie Memorial Steeplechase over a distance of two miles and a half, which was offered as today's feature of an exceptionally good card, resulted in a splendid victory for Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark when Blighty II. led the way home in front of his stable companion Minata, with the locally-owned Jim Thorpe third.

Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark was called to the stewards' stand and Sir Montague Allen made the presentation speech and presented the handsome cup that is awarded the victor amidst rounds of applause from the members on the lawn and in the stands.

The Earl Grey Handicap, for three-year-olds and over at a mile and a quarter, resulted in an easy victory for J. MacMann's three-year-old son of Uncle Continental when King's Champion, racing the final eighth of the distance, ran away from his opponents.

Eugene Levering, Jr., owner of the Glen Ivor Stable of steeplechasers, will arrive here on Monday. He will remain for the remainder of the Blue Bonnets meeting, at the conclusion of which he will leave for Toronto.

DRASTIC ACTION AGAINST G. PHILLIPS.

The stewards of the Montreal Jockey Club have issued a ruling refusing the entries of George Phillips and denying him the privileges of the grounds of the Montreal Jockey Club, for practices said to be detrimental to the best interests of racing.

Jockey T. Nolan, the premier rider of the J. K. L. Ross stable, left last night for Havre de Grace to ride Boniface in his stake engagement there. He will return to Canada on Monday.

George Hay, who is here in the interests of the Ontario Jockey Club, looking after the shipment of horses to Toronto, has arranged to send all of the steeplechase horses racing at Blue Bonnets direct to Woodbine. Mr. Hay announced that no cars will be available for the shipment of flat horses to Toronto until the conclusion of the Dorval meeting and that the Ontario Jockey Club would much rather that owners of the flat racers remain in Montreal until after the Dorval meeting is concluded.

Mortimer Mahoney, who will look after the management of the mutual department at Dorval, will spend tomorrow at that course looking after the details necessary to the opening of that meeting.

Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark was an arrival in Montreal this morning. She is here as the guest of Mrs. J. K. L. Ross, who gave a luncheon at the clubhouse at Blue Bonnets today in her honor.

THE PORTER'S GRAND RACE

E. B. McLean's Brilliant Campaigner Wins Harford County Handicap Before Immense Crowd at Havre de Grace.

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., September 11.—An immense gathering of racing devotees, including delegations from Philadelphia, Washington, Baltimore and surrounding cities, journeyed to the Harford County track today to welcome the return of the thoroughbred to Maryland.

Edward B. McLean of Washington furnished the winner of the Harford County Handicap, the feature of the opening day program, in his grand little horse The Porter. Withdrawals reduced the field to four starters.

The defeat of Lien d'Or, the overwhelming favorite in the third race, was the biggest disappointment of the afternoon. The Ross colt set a fast pace to the last eighth, where his heavy impost told and when St. Quentin drew up on even terms he tired and gave away in the last few strides.

Muttikins, the filly purchased by Commander Ross from J. E. Madden at Saratoga, scored an easy success in the opener, displaying brilliant speed considering the going.

Allvan was most favored in the second race, but found racing in the heavy going next to the inside rail too much for him, Short Change and Pocatello leading him home.
