FINALE AT BLUE BONNETS

Spectacular and Thrilling Finish in Steeplechase Feature.

Eight Ross Horses in One Race, but Leased to Club Members—Ajom the Winner.

MONTREAL, Quebec, September 16.—A spectacular and thrilling finish resulted from the running of the Bartlett McLennan Steeplechase under handicap conditions for four-year-olds and over at two and a half miles.

A heavy downpour of rain, which set in early this morning, changed the track conditions, but had little effect on the withdrawals.

The third race was framed under conditions which provided that the horses running in the race be either owned or leased by a member of the Montreal Jockey Club.

Word was received here that Frank J. Bruen, general manager of the Cuba American Jockey and Auto Club, would be in Baltimore some time in October to consult with horsemen who intend shipping to Cuba.

MAN O' WAR ON TO HAVRE

Champion Three-Year-Old Faces Hardest Task of His Career in Potomac Handicap, to Be Run Saturday.

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., September 16.—Samuel D. Riddle of Philadelphia wired from New York this afternoon that his unbeaten three-year-old Man o' War will leave Belmont Park this evening for Havre de Grace to start Saturday in the \$10,000 Potomac Handicap.

Wildair, which came down yesterday, worked a mile and an eighth in 1:53 after the third race here this afternoon.

If no rain falls tomorrow the going will be as fast as it ever is, and it is a certainty that with Man o' War in the Potomac, the Harford Agricultural and Breeders' Association will be called on to entertain the greatest crowd that ever assembled at the Havre de Grace course.
