



JOHN P. GRIER BY A HEAD

Defeats Cleopatra Narrowly in a Thrilling Finish.

Great Crowd Gathers at Aqueduct and Is Rewarded With Some Excellent Racing.

NEW YORK, N. Y., September 25.—With ideal Indian summer weather and a good program one of the largest crowds of the fall season of racing at Aqueduct was out today. Only two started in the Aqueduct Handicap, feature of the day's racing. The Hildreth pair, Cirrus and Mad Hatter, were withdrawn, leaving John P. Grier and Cleopatra as starters. John P. Grier was an overwhelming favorite. It was a close finish, with John P. Grier just lasting to win after leading all the way. Jockey McAtee, who rode Cleopatra, entered a complaint after the race that Ambrose had interfered with his mount when entering the backstretch by foul riding tactics. Cleopatra would have won in a few more strides, as the Whitney colt was all out at the finish. The time, 2:12, established a new track record.

Major Parke, heavily backed favorite, won the third race, a selling handicap at seven-eighths of a mile, after a hard drive in the stretch. The Livingston colt followed War Note to the stretch bend, where he raced into the lead. After a shaking up to withstand the challenge of Pickwick a sixteenth out, Major Parke came on to win by three-quarters of a length. Different Eyes showed early speed. Pickwick ran a good race, coming fast when straightened out in the stretch, but he was hardly good enough for the winner. Kashmir, which finished third, was a follower in the early racing and came from far back to take third place.

EXTERMINATOR A WINNER

Noted Gelding Scores Another Great Triumph in the Toronto Autumn Cup.

TORONTO, Ont., September 25.—The fall meeting of the Ontario Jockey Club at the picturesque Woodbine course was ushered in this afternoon with the running of a card that bristled with feature events. The Toronto Autumn Cup was awarded the place of honor and brought together a good field of long-distance performers. After the withdrawal of Boniface, W. S. Kilmer's famous Exterminator went to the post a topheavy favorite and the immense crowd was on its feet cheering wildly when that gallant turf hero was returned the winner. Exterminator shouldered the heavy impost of 132 pounds, giving weight to all his opponents, and in a terrific drive that lasted all through the stretch defeated the lightly weighted My Dear by a head after an exceptionally fast run race. Third money fell to Bondage.

Ideal racing conditions brought out a gathering that taxed the spacious accommodations of the stands and lawns. They were well rewarded, as the racing was of a spirited order and close finishes predominated.

The running of the Woodbine Autumn Steeplechase under handicap conditions was attended with direful results to the Glen Iver stable when the fencer Old Bill Bender suffered injuries which necessitated his destruction. Haynes on Elysian was badly shaken up when Elysian fell and was removed in an ambulance. Blighty II was returned the winner in a drive from Kingstown Pier and Bencher.

Mrs. F. Ambrose Clark, whose stable of steeplechasers are at Woodbine Park, was an arrival from New York. This is her first visit to Toronto and she was much taken with the beautiful course of the Ontario Jockey Club, which she pronounced one of the best and most picturesque she had ever visited.

Astraea came out of her race yesterday with a dislocated stifle. Little Maude was jumped on in her race and one of the small arteries in her hind leg severed. Little Nearer pulled up lame after the finish in his race.

Norman Macfarlan, who acted as one of the stewards at Dorval, left for Kentucky last night.

EASTERN SHORE TO CAREFUL

W. J. Salmon's Crack Filly Scores Impressive Victory and Handsomely Rewards Her Admirers.

HAVRE DE GRACE, Md., September 25.—W. J. Salmon's crack filly Careful, carrying top weight of 124 pounds under a masterful ride by Frankie Keogh, this afternoon won the Eastern Shore Handicap at three-quarters of a mile, worth \$7,000 to the winner. Hildur, running in the colors of J. K. L. Ross, with Rodriguez astride, was second and The Baggage, which Mrs. R. I. Miller took out of a claiming race a few days ago from E. B. McLean finished third. General J. M. Gomez, the A. H. Diaz representative, which was accorded favoritism, finished fourth. Step Lightly, the Futurity winner, was withdrawn by trainer Wayland and the W. J. Salmon colors were lightly regarded by the spectators. Careful paid \$12.50 in the \$2 mutuels.

The victory of the Wrack filly was in every way convincing. Keogh, after getting her away quickly, remained her in third place behind Hildur and The Baggage until well through the stretch. Seventy-five yards from the finish Keogh went to the whip and, Careful responding gamely, drew clear to win by a half length. Hildur also held on gamely under vigorous riding by Rodriguez, but tired at the end and could not successfully withstand Careful's challenge. The Baggage ran well under her light impost, General J. M. Gomez got started slowly and finished fast, but too late to overtake the leaders.

Ideal weather and the best card that has been offered at this meeting brought out a good sized holiday crowd to the course.

LEXINGTON MEETING IS OVER

Believe Idle Hour Defeats Star Voter in the Breeders' Futurity Stakes.

LEXINGTON, Ky., September 25.—In a terrific drive practically lasting for the entire length of the stretch, Believe Idle Hour triumphed over Star Voter in the running of the eleventh Breeders' Futurity, which this year had a net value of \$6,393 to the winner. Following the leaders, five lengths back, came Sir Thomas Kean, a slight margin in advance of Gangway. Second money was worth \$1,888, and \$944 and \$215 respectively went to Sir Thomas Kean and Gangway. E. R. Bradley's nominator and breeder of Believe Idle Hour received \$300 additional and John E. Madden, nominator of Star Voter, receives \$200. T. M. Murphy, nominator of Sir Thomas Kean, gets \$100.

The struggle was always between Believe Idle Hour and Star Voter. Both were away forwardly and for the first sixteenth raced on even terms, the Bradley filly under Pool's strong riding taking the lead there, but Sunde kept Star Voter in close proximity and on the stretch turn he began challenging in stubborn style. For awhile it appeared as if Star Voter would succeed in wearing Believe Idle Hour down, but Pool, alert and expecting Sunde's effort, began plying whip and heel at the same time that Sunde began his drive and Believe Idle Hour, holding gamely to her task, kept just enough in advance to cause Star Voter to become discouraged and he showed a tendency to swerve out slightly right at the end. The others in the wake of the leaders headed by Sir Thomas Kean were always far back and never menaced them. The time of the race, 1:09 1/2, equals the track record for the distance, held by Bradley's Choice. The victory of Believe Idle Hour was highly popular and the filly and her rider were greeted with prolonged applause on their return to the judges' stand.

Getaway day, coupled with the running of the Breeders' Futurity, was responsible for an immense attendance this afternoon. After the running of the fourth race a storm threatened, but the lightning flashes ceased just before the horses were called to the post in the feature. The racing was interesting and some of the finishes were close. Favorites succumbed in most of the dashes and their failure was costly to the majority of the big crowd.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

W. C. Kennedy has shipped Isabelle H. and Stir Up to Richmond. The veteran fencer Gold Bond, owned by Ernie Heider, has been destroyed. The death is announced after a long illness of M. Louis Pichon, for many years a prominent official of the Societe des Steeple Chases de France.
