CAPTAIN MAC FIRST HOME

Defeats Sterling by Inches in a Nobly Contested Race.

Favorites Again Find Rough Treatment—Blushing Beauty and Lucky B. Winners.

LATONIA, Ky., October 5.—C. W. Clark's Captain Mac and C. C. Van Meter's Sterling staged a spectacular duel in the sixth race at a mile and an eighth for a purse of \$2,300, featuring today's card. Captain Mac triumphed, but only by the slightest of margin, and that only in the last stride. Sterling disputing every inch of ground with him through the last quarter, and only succumbed right at the end. Sterling, in the earlier running, was the leader and had made a fast pace, but Captain Mac gradually gained on him and just before rounding into the stretch it appeared as if he would come away to an easy victory, but Sterling was not to be disposed of without a struggle and the many backers of Captain Mac became anxious when the Clark representative failed to shake him off. Both jockeys were striving to their utmost and the finish found the horses so close together that no one could pronounce the result until the official placing was displayed. Travesty had little difficulty in outstaying Grand Slam, the only other starter, for third place.

Today's attendance was again up to the average, but the difficult card caused a slight slump in the speculation. Captain Mac was the only pronounced choice to win.

E. R. Bradley's successes continue and his Blushing Beauty was one to contribute a purse to his score when she finished in advance of the other good fillies and mares starting at three-quarters. She won easily enough, after giving her supporters some concern by her bad post behavior, but the start found her off well and, following the early pacemaker closely, ultimately drew out in the last sixteenth to win easily from Blue Paradise, with Furbelow in third place. The latter, however, was disqualified for having swerved sharply near the end and impeded Looking Up and others. Marjorie Hynes was the one best supported in the race, but Garner gave her a misjudged ride and took her back in the early running. When he did rouse himself in the stretch he found himself badly pocketed, with the result that Marjorie Hynes did not have much opportunity to extend herself.

The backers of favorites again encountered many obstacles and the defeat of the first five choices left them disconsolate and with well depleted purses. They began by installing Rifle favorite in the opener, but he finished among the also rans, Port Light winning here with consummate ease from Missed the Time. Linden was installed the choice in the second, but he was taken into camp by Lucky B., which beat him by a scant head in a spirited drive. Cigale was backed to the exclusion of the others in the third race, but Saharazade just lasted long enough to get home in advance of her.

Marjorie Hynes was the next favorite beaten, and Tawasian contributed to the general down-fall when she failed to overcome the interference she suffered from in the early running to get up in time to head Machiavelli.

J. McPherson, represented in the second race by Alabama, claimed Linden for \$3,500.

Milo Shield's Bradley's Choice made it a double for that owner during the afternoon, incidentally making it the second favorite to succeed during the day.

J. T. Strite claimed Bourbon Green for \$2,100 from the last race.

KENILWORTH OPENS TODAY

WINDSOR, Ont., October 5.—The final meeting of the year in Canada will be inaugurated at Kenilworth Park tomorrow. The Woodstock Handicap, with a small but well-matched field named to contest it, will be the main attraction of opening day. The track is at its best, and as there is plenty of good racing material here the sport should be well up to the standard of the previous meetings. The climax of the greatest season of racing ever held in the Dominion will come with the running of the special race between Man o' War and Sir Barton on Tuesday, October 12, for the greatest turf prizes ever offered anywhere, \$75,000 and a \$5,000 gold cup. Elaborate preparations have been under way ever since the big race was certain to be run here, with the result that only the finishing touches remain to be completed so that Kenilworth will be in thorough readiness to entertain the largest crowd that ever witnessed a race in Canada.

MAN O' WAR IN FAST WORK-OUTS

NEW YORK, N. Y., October 5.—Man o' War was given his final work-out at Belmont Park this morning before being shipped to Keenilworth Park. He was sent a mile and a quarter the right way of the track and gave a startling display of speed, working the mile and a quarter in 2:02% miles. The fractional time of the trial was quarter in 23, half in 47, five-eighths in 59%, three-quarters in 1:12, mile in 1:36%, mile and an eighth in 1:50 and mile and a quarter in 2:02%. He came out of his work fresh as a daisy.

Trainer Feustel will load the champion on an express car tomorrow morning and start for Kenilworth. In addition to the trainer, two rubbers and a pony will accompany Man o' War.

EASY RACE TO JOHN P. GRIER

Routledge, His Only Opponent, No Match for Whitney Crack—Calvert Killed by Fall.

LAUREL, Md., October 5.—An exceptionally large midweek crowd gathered at the Maryland Fair course this afternoon, attracted there presumably because of the scheduled appearance of H. P. Whitney's John P. Grier in a purse race at a mile. Routledge, flying the colors of Mrs. W. M. Jeffords, was the only one to face the Whitney crack. They carried the same weight, 115 pounds, but this did not help Routledge, the Whitney colt winning as his rider pleased, although his margin of victory was but a length. Routledge outbroke the Whisk Broom II. colt from an inside position and raced in front for a quarter of a mile. Straightened into the backstretch, Ambrose called on John P. Grier. Readily he opened up a lead and easily maintained it to the end.

The Glenburie, a three-quarter-mile handicap for three-year-olds and over, carded as the secondary attraction, provided a much more interesting race. The winner turned up in Knot, from the stable of Samuel Ross. Knot triumphed by a neck over the Greenrette stable Peter Piper after a hard drive. War Marvel, representing S. Louis, finished third. Keogh rode the winner.

J. Heupel was shaken up in a fall from Calvert in the sixth race and sustained a broken collar bone. The horse was killed in the fall.

Sir William Johnson bolted through the fence on the way to the post in the last race and threw jockey Jarvis and ran away to his barn. He was brought back and jockey Bryson substituted.

W. B. Marshall's Seaboard was gelded this morning. This is one of the string which Walter Hart campaigned in Canada for George Wingfield during the summer and with his speed should be a useful plater when cured of his meanness.

J. W. Healy arrived from Canada today. The Lumsden jumpers in his charge were unloaded at the course this morning.

Sleepechase rider A. Stretch, who did the riding for Healy at the last Blue Bonnets and Woodbine meetings, also is an arrival.

The car from Canada carried the good jumper Hearts of Oak, which was campaigned through the field there by W. Wilson.

The L. J. Donahue jumpers also arrived from Canada.

Allan Bulcroft is another arrival. His son George, the apprentice rider, accompanied him. Bulcroft reports that the promising timber topper Jim Thorpe was taken sick at Toronto and left there.

T. Havreson has been stricken here with an attack of ptomaine poisoning.

Fred Burlew, trainer of the J. H. Rossetter horses, has received word that the good mare Passing Showers is in foal to Friar Rock, sire of Incapable and other highly prized juveniles.

Jimmy Butwell has contracted to ride next season for E. B. McLean. He has been doing well in Maryland in the colors of the Washington sportsman.

Oriole, the \$20,000 purchase of J. K. L. Ross from the Livingston disposal sale, arrived from New York this morning.

Paddy Dear and Regreso, the pair claimed in New York a few days ago by S. Polk and T. S. Vail, respectively, also arrived.

Ed Cole is leaving tonight for Windsor to serve as judge at the Kenilworth meeting.

Stewart Polk has received word from California that the race track interests there are highly elated over the reservation of stalls at Tijuana by Sam Hildreth and that the mentors of the sport in lower California look for other prominent owners to ship there to contest for the \$20,000 Cofroth Handicap, the two \$10,000 events and the four \$5,000 stakes and others to be decided there next winter.

Sam Louis claimed Sugarmint from E. B. McLean yesterday for \$2,054 and the latter took Rollingick from J. H. Rossetter for \$2,000.

Fernwood has been added to the schooling list.

G. D. Bryan has directed racing secretary J. B. Campbell to arrange a \$2,500 stake as the feature of the opening of Jefferson Park on Thanksgiving day. It is probable that the event will call for three-year-olds and over to a mile and a sixteen at handicap weights.

ORDINARY SPORT AT JAMAICA

Thunderstorm Takes the Gowanus Selling Stakes and is Heavily Bid Up Afterward.

JAMAICA, N. Y., October 5.—R. T. Wilson's Thunderstorm won the Gowanus Selling Stakes, the feature of the day's program at Jamaica, but his victory cost his owner dearly, as the colt was won for \$8,500, \$3,500 over his entered price, by L. T. Bauer, a western turfman, but was retained by his owner for the usual \$5 advance. Thunderstorm, Pickwick and Major Parke were all about equal choices and in the running Pickwick was the leader to the stretch. At the stretch bend Thunderstorm, so Turner claimed, cut across in front of Pickwick and impeded the latter.

The Lafayette purse brought only three to the post. War Bond was being scratched. On account of strong backing for Sweet Music, Fair Gain receded in the quotations until he was equal choice with Sweet Music at the close of operations. In the running Fair Gain followed Sweet Music until an eighth out, when he challenged and finally won a driving finish by three parts of a length. On High finished fifteen lengths back.

The talent met a signal reverse in the second race when R. T. Wilson's Sunny Days, with jockey Ensor aboard, could finish no better than third. Sunny Days showed scant speed until near the finish.

George Boeve was the first to show, but Clare Frances soon outfooted him and retained her lead to the finish. Although she only beat Machine Gunner, by a nose at the end, Kummer, on Clare Frances, clearly outrode Davies on Machine Gunner.

Orcus, with a small following, won the opening dash for maiden two-year-olds. Orcus began quickly and showed the most speed for the entire race, winning in a canter by four lengths. Jamaica Belle was the closest contender until the last fifty yards, when she tired and Thornhedge, which came from far back, got up in a belated rush to take second place. Jamaica Belle was an easy third. Lady Stella, the post favorite, tired in the stretch and finished fourth. Johnny O'Connell showed a flash of early speed.
