FAVORITES' DAY AT LATONIA

Jorice Outpaces Clintonville in the Afternoon's Feature.

Bettina Stays a Mile in Good Style—Beaming Beauty Wins for Owner Bradley.

LATONIA, Ky., October 13.—Sprinters were given opportunity to perform in the feature race, the \$2,000 handicap at three-quarters, the chief monetary offering on today's card. Five fleet ones went to the post, but Jorice easily proved her superiority and won in easy style from Clintonville, with George Starr just beating Ocean Sweep for third place. The non-staying Out the Way again displayed a great turn of speed, but after leading for a half mile he retired to ultimately land as whizzer-in.

The entirely pleasant racing conditions that have prevailed here for some time continue and the great mass of racing devotees in these parts are taking advantage and continue flocking to the course in great numbers. Today's racing offering was somewhat above the ordinary midweek card, and it was productive of some excellent racing, featured by several close finishes. Form was well conserved, for most of the winners came out of the ranks of favorites.

The mile dash, contested by a dozen two-year-olds for a purse of \$2,000, brought with its running a bad jam on the first turn and it caused Napoo, ridden by Mangan, to go down in a heap. Luckily no others in the race went down and it terminated in nothing more serious than a bad shaking up for the rider and no injury to the horse. This race, as well as the three-quarters dash for two-year-olds, was accounted for by representative from J. N. Camden's stable. His Bettina landed the mile dash and Dark Ben, a son of the famous Ben Brush, showed himself to be far above the ordinary to land the shorter race, considering his slow beginning and his exhaustive effort to work his way through the compact field. On the stretch turn his chances seemed none too rosy, but he responded gamely to Lyke's persistent urging and managed to get up in the last few strides to overhaul All Right Sir.

Furbelow, which in a former race figured in a disqualification because of her interference to others right at the end, again proved a torment to her backers in the opening dash, in which she was favorite. Her refusal to join with the others at the start and her subsequent unwillingness to extend herself fully, despite the persuasions of her rider, caused her to be hopelessly out of any chance after the first eighth and it was useless to continue, so her rider eased her up. E. R. Bradley's Beaming Beauty, which has been racing well here, landed the purse from Gipsy Queen and Lady Luxury.

Mazola, which should have been victress in a previous race, but succumbed as a result of poor riding, was given a good ride and had no difficulty in winning this afternoon from Sam's Boy and Missed the Time.

Thomas McDowell, member of the Kentucky State Racing Commission, and who is racing several horses here, was an arrival today from Lexington. It was his first visit to the track since the opening.

Most of the big delegation that went to Kenilworth Park to witness the Sir Barton-Man o' War race returned this morning.

Madge F., in the final race, entered for \$1,400, was claimed by H. Fields at a cost of \$2,600. Buladin, also in the same race, was claimed by Snyder & Holmes for \$1,900.

MAN O' WAR—EXTERMINATOR

Manager Matt Winn Makes Offer of \$50,000 for Special Race to Be Run in Kentucky.

LATONIA, Ky., October 13.—J. O. Keene, who was among the visitors at Kenilworth Park yesterday and witnessed the Sir Barton-Man o' War race, returned this morning. He informed manager Matt J. Winn that he thought Samuel D. Riddle would be in a receptive mood to entertain a proposition that would bring Man o' War here to engage in some special race. This view is taken on the supposition that Mr. Riddle would likely desire to make Man o' War the greatest money-winning horse in the world before his retirement to the stud. At present he is nearly \$35,000 off from Isinglass' turf earnings.

Mr. Winn at once set about getting in touch with Mr. Riddle to place before him an offer of \$50,000 for a contest with Exterminator over the mile and a half distance, the race to be run either at Latonia or Louisville.

Man o' War is reported to have come out of his race with Sir Barton in excellent fettle, and it would require little or no effort to keep him in good trim for the mile and a half contest. At present Man o' War is also in closer proximity to these parts than he has ever been since he was transferred east from Kentucky, so this in a measure should overcome the shipping prejudice.

Mr. Winn is eagerly awaiting advices to his overtures, and the racing public in this section is also eager for a glimpse of the horse of the century.

CESAREWITCH WON BY WOMAN OWNER

LONDON, England, October 13.—The Cesarewitch Handicap of two miles and a quarter was run at Newmarket today, with thirty-two horses starting, and was won by Mrs. G. Robinson's three-year-old bay filly Bracket, by Cantilever—Simonath, at 8 to 1 and carrying 101 pounds, by Fugleman—Hackline, 100 to 9, carrying 98 pounds, was second, and W. T. De Pledge's seven-year-old gelding Greek Scholar, by Collar—Amphinome, 25 to 1 and carrying 100 pounds, was third.

END OF CANADIAN SEASON

Large Attendance Sees Final Day's Sport at Kenilworth—Closing Feature to Hindoostan.

WINDSOR, Ontario, October 13.—With the running of today's program at Kenilworth Park the curtain on racing in Canada for the season of 1920 was rung down. The Kenilworth club has had a most successful meeting, many people having been attracted here from all parts of the country to attend the special race between Man o' War and Sir Barton. Like yesterday, this afternoon was a perfect one for outdoor sports and a large crowd was in attendance. The feature race, a \$2,000 handicap, at one mile and a sixteenth, fell to Hindoostan, which made most of the pace and beat Kuklux by a length.

Jockeys Grune and Harbourne having ridden fifteen each were forced to cancel their mounts this afternoon where the five-pound apprentice allowance was claimed. The Canadian rules stipulate that after a boy rides fifteen winners their contract employer only is entitled to the five pounds allowance.

Commander J. K. L. Ross added another young rider to his stable when he purchased the contract on Harbourne, which was held by J. McIlmurray. The latter also disposed of the plater Biddledee to R. H. Goode.

W. C. Weant claimed the plater Ten Can yesterday for \$3,500.

Toombeola came out of his race the other day a lame horse and will be on the shelf for some time. Pierrot also pulled up sore after his race.

George Walker will ship the Brookdale Stable horses to Barrie, Ont., tomorrow, where they will go into winter quarters.

Jack Atkin wired starter Harry Morrissey that he would be in New York October 20.

Joseph McLennan leaves for his home in Chicago for a short visit before resuming his duties at Bowie, Md.

Man o' War threw one of his hind shoes at the seven-eighths post in his race yesterday and finished the race with only three plates. Man o' War was shipped to his owner's farm near Philadelphia on 5 o'clock this afternoon. Sir Barton leaves with the remainder of the Ross horses for Laurel tomorrow.

There was a rumor that jockey Sande severed his connections with the J. K. L. Ross stable after Keogh was substituted on Sir Barton in the Gold Cup race yesterday and that Commander Ross, good sportsman that he is, on hearing that the lad was dissatisfied, presented him with his contract. It is said that Sande may ride for the Harry Payne Whitney stable next year.

John Oliver Keene, Kay Spence, W. V. Thraves and the remainder of the big delegation that came from Kentucky to witness the big race departed last night.

Frank J. Bruen, manager at Oriental Park, left for Kentucky tonight to arrange some of the details for the shipment of the stables to Cuba.

DAY OF MISHAPS AT JAMAICA

Jockeys Weiner and Sneiderman Injured, the Later Seriously—Gueland Disqualified.

NEW YORK, N. Y., October 13.—Racing at Jamaica today was marred by a series of accidents. In the opening dash jockey S. Sneiderman, who had the mount on St. Donard, the favorite, fell with his mount at the sixteenth post after St. Donard had jumped on the heels of the horse in front of him. When St. Donard went down, Strabout, ridden by F. Weiner, fell over him and the horse was so badly injured he had to be destroyed. Weiner escaped with a bad shaking up, but Sneiderman suffered a fractured skull. Both boys were taken to a hospital at Jamaica. Sneiderman was brought to the jockey quarters in an unconscious state, bleeding profusely with a contusion of the scalp. During the morning Sneiderman was employed by a motion picture concern to pose in jockey costume and the remark was made while the pictures were being taken that it was an unlucky day, being the "thirteenth."

In the second race Gueland, the winner, was disqualified and the race given to Mose. This came about through the boldness of jockey Hopkins, who deliberately hit Mose across the head during the stretch run. Mose was fast gaining on Gueland and when he received the blow it retarded the horse, in the opinion of the stewards, and caused him to lose the race. Hopkins, in addition to losing the race on Gueland, was suspended for the remainder of the meeting. Mose was claimed after the race by George Peterson for \$2,010.

Jockey Fairbrother returned from Laurel yesterday after riding Senor A. H. Diaz' General J. M. Gomez to victory Tuesday at the Maryland course. It is said the veteran jockey has signed to ride for the Cuban sportsman at Havana during the coming winter.

W. H. Karrick will leave for Latonia next week with the good three-year-old filly Cleopatra, where she will start in the Latonia Championship race, to be decided October 23.

Starter Cassidy, who was missing from his post Monday and Tuesday on account of illness and his place filled by his assistant, Roy Dickinson, was back today attending to his duties as usual.

J. W. SCHORR TO RETIRE FROM RACING

John W. Schorr contemplates retiring from the turf for at least a period of one year and devote his time to a business enterprise, associated with two of his sons, in Memphis, Tenn. At present Mr. Schorr has only three horses, consisting of Luke Dillon, Joe Mancini and Frank Moody. These, with a miscellaneous assortment of stable paraphernalia, will be sold privately before the conclusion of Kentucky fall racing.

REMOUNT OFFICE AT LATONIA TRACK

Mr. James Moore, representing the United States Remount Association, has installed an office at the Latonia track with a view to securing suitable stations for the government Breeding Bureau and also to enroll members in the Remount Association. A drive for membership at the Latonia track has been set for October 23. Colonel Scott, Colonel Koch and Colonel Whitehead will come for the occasion.

Marrero went to the front with Ben Hampson and, rating him well, won by two lengths. Tarascon and Le Dinosaur were closest to Ben Hampson at the finish. The Skinker color-bearer paid \$56.30 for \$2.

Another winner at lucrative odds was Link Boy, which ran in the colors of T. Taylor. Jockey Yeargin piloted the colt over the mile course, leading practically all the way and won easily from American Eagle and Railbird.

Son and Daughter of Orby First and Third in Big English Race.

LONDON, England, October 13.—At the Newmarket Second October meeting yesterday the Champion Stakes was the feature. It was run on hard ground. Two children of Richard Croker's Anglo-American Epsom Derby winner of 1907—Orby and Diadem—were first and third in the race in Orpheus and Diadem.
