QUEEN CITY HANDICAP DAY

Behave Yourself Runs a Grand Race Before a Great Crowd.

McGoodwin Proves a Good Colt in Finishing Second; Brother Batch Third.

LATONIA, Ky., October 16.—E. R. Bradley's Behave Yourself, a son of Marathon—Miss Ringlets, continued this afternoon the outstanding success scored by this stable during the present term of Kentucky autumn racing. Incidentally he made himself the leading money contributor to the establishment by adding the substantial sum of \$15,275, the net amount that fell to the winner of the Queen City Handicap, which he won easily from McGoodwin and Brother Batch in the splendid time of 1:38.4, the fastest that ever a two-year-old has recorded over the course.

Behave Yourself was clearly entitled to the honors he scored, for he proved himself a capital racer and performed in a fashion that must make him a to-be-reckoned-with factor next year as a three-year-old. Lyke rode him in confident fashion and did not become anxious when Bangoon cut out a fast pace and had a clear lead. The Bradley colt was under restraint, but followed Bangoon steadily and, when the latter displayed symptoms of tiring, Behave Yourself passed him and, once in the lead, the race was practically over so far as first money was concerned, for the last sixteenth found Lyke having Behave Yourself under restraint and viewing over his shoulders the desperate effort of McGoodwin to overhail him. Bangoon, after his fine display for seven-eighths, began tiring badly under his heavy impost and it enabled Brother Batch to beat him for third place. Bangoon had Bettina to assist in landing the race, but she was eliminated early, as the result of interference she suffered from on the first turn, and Blowing Bubbles, which was coupled with Behave Yourself, fared just as badly as Bettina when Bangoon bumped him on the first turn.

The Bradley pair were outstanding favorites, with the Camden twain also coming in for considerable support. There was also some sharp betting activity about McGoodwin and the Brother Batch connections also thought well enough of his chances to back him freely. Brother Batch might have been closer up at the finish but for the interference he met in the early running.

Pleasant weather was a contributing factor in bringing to the course the full quota of racing lovers in these parts and taxed the commodious track to its full capacity. The track was at its best and fast time was the rule in most of the dashes.

The three-quarters handicap, serving as one of the supplementary features, fell to Jack Hare Jr. in easy style, with Beaming Beauty in second place and Westwood third. With a better ride on Westwood he would have reversed the finish with Beaming Beauty.

The mile and a sixteenth handicap was another routing affair, with the winner here turning up in Woodtrap, which showed the way for the entire distance and beat Irwin and Under Fire.

TALISMAN A RANK FAILURE.

The inconsistently racing Talisman proved a rank failure in the initial dash, for which she was an outstanding favorite, Sam Reh winning here easily from Discussion, with Port Light in third place.

Trainer Max Hirsch, in charge of the G. W. Loft owned Tiptopy Witchet, Donnacona and On Watch, was an arrival today from New York, accompanied by jockey Pierce. On Watch is an intended starter in the Latonia Championship Stakes, to be decided next Saturday. The others will make the remainder of the Kentucky campaign and participate in the stakes to which they are eligible. Hirsch will at the close of Kentucky racing transfer them back to Belmont Park, where they will join the others of the Loft stable and go into winter retirement.

Lloyd Gentry bought Ginger on private terms this morning for a reported price in excess of \$10,000. He will be raced next winter with others that Gentry intends to take to New Orleans after the close of racing in Louisville.

The stewards have been investigating the ownership of the horses run in the name of R. L. Baker & Co. and of A. Baker, his brother. As a result thereof, A. Baker has, under rule 118, been fined \$100 for running Cockroach, trained by A. Baker, in the name of R. L. Baker & Co., the horse being the property of C. Alexander and registered as the property of A. Baker and C. Alexander. Had Cockroach won on Friday, the purse would have been forfeited. A. Baker pleaded that the entry of the horse in the name of R. L. Baker & Co. was an error and oversight. The stewards also notified the entry clerk not to accept any further entries from either of these stables unless the ownership was clearly defined and conformed to the recorded registration list.

There being some doubt as to the provisions of the verbal call given by John Paul on jockey Kennedy's services to R. L. Baker & Co., he was requested by the stewards to have it put in writing and filed with the secretary.

Messrs. J. N. Camden, T. C. McDowell and H. B. Pollard of the Kentucky State Racing Commission, held a meeting this afternoon and amended rule 254 to enable suspended riders to gallop horses during morning hours and have the privilege of staying at the track at nights. They will, however, be debarred from privileges of the grandstand, paddock and betting pavilion during racing hours.

LATONIA CHAMPIONSHIP FIELD

SIXTY-THREE PRESENT ELIGIBLES TO THE RICHEST FALL THREE-YEAR-OLD STAKES OF 1920 --- THE LIST OF THOSE STILL IN AND RACING --- FIGURES ABOUT THE MOST PROMISING TWENTY-SEVEN CANDIDATES

Many valuable and justly coveted races still impend in Kentucky and Maryland racing. Foremost of these is the Latonia Championship Stakes, which will have its second running at Latonia Saturday, October 23. This great race, in a way the American St. Leger, had its first running last year, when its gross value was a shade less than \$50,000, to be exact \$49,650, of which the winner, Mad Hatter, took \$44,090. Because of a detrimental change in the conditions of the race and a smaller entry list, its gross and net value will not be near as much this year. But it is still a worth-winning race, one of the richest of the United States for three-year-olds exclusively.

As is not infrequently the case in connection with stake races which close for entries long before their time for decision, various causes operated to make the field small numerically on the occasion of its first running, only eight going to the post. Similar influences this year seem destined to bring about a like result. But there is distinct promise of a more strenuously contested race than it was when Mad Hatter so easily triumphed over Sway.

For a time there was a feeling that H. P. Whitney held a mortgage on this year's race with his John P. Grier, Upset, Wildair and Damask. Of late it has become apparent that its foreclosure is to be formidably contested. Colin's best son, On Watch, has been giving such imposing displays of great speed under high weight as to cast serious doubt over the Whitney certainty. Undoubtedly he is a mailing-good colt in superb form and will have a confident following.

The Championship Stakes of 1919 had 471 entries. That of 1920 342. The changes in the conditions of the race referred to affects its value to such an extent that, with eight starters, the winner will take less than \$25,000, which compares poorly with Mad Hatter's big winning. Even so, it is the main prize of our fall campaign and well worth any man's winning. At present the probable starters seem John P. Grier, Upset, Wildair, On Watch, Cleopatra, Fair Gain, Best Pal and Sterling, with Westwood and Captain Aleock as possibilities.

The following are the conditions for the race:
Latonia Championship Stakes for 1920, \$15,000 added. By subscription of \$15.00 each (cash to accompany entry). For three-year-olds (foals of 1917); \$15,000 to be added by the Kentucky Jockey Club, Incorporated, of which \$3,000 to second horse, \$2,000 to third horse and \$1,000 to fourth horse. The original nominator of the winner to receive \$1,000, of the second horse \$500, of the third horse \$300 and of the fourth horse \$200. Colts and geldings to carry 122 pounds; fillies 119 pounds.

Acceptances through the entry box the day before the race at the usual time of closing. In addition to first money, the owner of the winning horse will be presented with a beautiful trophy valued at \$1,000.

ANOTHER PARR SURPRISE

His Colt Blazes Defeats John P. Grier in Maryland Handicap.

Failure of Whitney Entry Biggest Shock of Fall Season—Careful Again Victorious.

LAUREL, Md., Oct. 16.—Last spring Capt. Ral Parr furnished a big surprise when he won the Kentucky Derby with Paul Jones. Today the popular Virginia not only surprised but fairly astounded an immense Saturday gathering at the Maryland State Fair course when his Wrack colt Blazes triumphed over the crack Whitney pair, John P. Grier and Damask, in the \$10,000 added Maryland Handicap, one of the outstanding features of the fall meeting at Laurel.

The defeat of John P. Grier was the biggest shock of the fall season. On the strength of the brilliant performances of the son of Whisk Broom II.—Wonder and the recent good form of Damask the public poured its money in on the Whitney entry, with the result that the pair went to the post an overwhelming favorite, being quoted at 1 to 10. Five faced the starter and the Whitney backers felt no uneasiness when Butwell sent Blazes away in the lead. As they passed the judges' stand the first time Blazes was a length and a half in front of John P. Grier, with Herd Girl following closest. John P. Grier took the rail position from the Ross color-bearer, going to the first turn and closely pursued the pacemaker through the backstretch while the Wrack colt sped along under light restraint. Nearing the half-mile post John P. Grier began to weaken under his impost of 127 pounds and Damask, slipping through on the inside rail, took up the task after his stablemate had tired. Rounding into the stretch, Blazes had an advantage of a length and a half over Damask, a length of which he maintained to the end under the energetic and skillful riding of Butwell. Damask closed fast, but never seriously threatened the winner. The race was worth \$7,500 to the winner.

The Eutaw, a three-quarter mile claiming handicap, for three-year-olds and over, which served as one of the supplementary attractions, fell to Sam Louis' War Marvel, which packed top weight of 115 pounds and won by half a length from Sam Ross' Pride of India. Helen Atkin was a bang-up third.

Walter J. Salmon's popular filly Careful won the third race, for two-year-old fillies at three-quarters mile. The Wrack—Mindful filly hooked up today with E. F. Whitney's By Jimmy, which ran her to a head earlier in the meeting. Although the Jim Gaffney filly was the beneficiary in a six-pound switch in the weights over those which prevailed on the occasion of their other clash, today's race was no contest. Careful won easy by a length, with By Jimmy second and Muttikins, from the J. K. L. Ross stable, third. Careful carried 123 pounds and By Jimmy 107. Under a perfect ride by Frank Keogh, Careful showed versatility in making all the pace, whereas in her two succeeding starts she had come from behind to win.

Kirah, ridden by Jarvis, was an easy winner of a three-quarters-mile dash for platers, which opened the program. Lloyd George finished second, Ina Kay third.

STEEPLECHASER RUPICA DESTROYED.

R. H. Crawford again rode the winner of the steeplechase, piloting Ticket to victory over Martian and Westminster. Rupica, the only other starter, fell at the twelfth fence and was so badly injured that he was destroyed.

The suspension of jockey Haynes for five days has been extended for the remainder of the meeting in view of further evidence of the case.

Jockey Earl Sande announces that no overtures have been made by H. P. Whitney seeking to obtain his contract. Another report is in circulation now that Gehe Wayland has offered Sande \$12,000 and fees to ride for W. J. Salmon next year.

Flibbertygibbet, belonging to C. I. Wilson, got in from Canada this morning.

Wash Norvell arrived from Windsor today. He will spend the remainder of the meeting here and then go to Pindico, where he serves in an official capacity.

J. Grune, the apprentice picked up by J. K. L. Ross in Canada last summer, has joined the establishment here.

Jockeys H. Myers and W. Hinchy are the latest additions to the riding colony, both coming from Windsor.

J. McIlmurray, whose horses raced in Canada last summer, is an arrival.

Richard Scully shipped here from Hagerstown this morning.

J. E. Davis today shipped Sidera. Whalebone and two yearlings to Bening to be turned out. Sidera is broken down. Whalebone has been fired.

J. Kennedy sold the filly Pleasing Picture to Milton Cann for \$2,500. She is a three-year-old by Ildrim—Pictures, by Watercross, and will be used for breeding purposes.

Jockey Stearns stopped off at his home on the way here from Windsor.

SIRE SUPREMACY SETTLED

Man o' War, by his Kenilworth Cup victory of last Tuesday, has once and for all definitely settled the question of the 1920 sire supremacy. Seventeen of the progeny of his sire, Fair Play, have already this year won in first moneys along over \$225,000. Broomstick, the runner-up, has not as much as \$120,000 to his credit, therefore no matter the result of the Latonia Championship Stakes, the position of Fair Play as leading sire is unassailable. Rock Sand now leads Meddler for brood mare sire honors, his daughters having bred the winners of over \$220,000 as against the \$145,000 which the sons and daughters of Meddler mares have won. Just twenty of Rock Sand's daughters, out of a possible thirty-two, are this year productive of twenty-four winners of sixty-seven races worth the above amount.
