RAIN A LATONIA VISITOR

Mars the Going, but Does Not Prevent Good Racing.

Claude Brown Defeats Minute Man in Stirring Finish—Kingfisher Takes the Long Race.

LATONIA, Ky., October 25.—After twenty-two days of consecutive fast track racing conditions changed this afternoon on account of a hard rain that visited these parts during the night, causing the track to become muddy and giving horses with a liking for the going their first chance of the meeting. Intermittent showers during the afternoon served as a drawback, but the attendance was again of generous numbers and seemed unmindful. The racing was spirited and several of the finishes were of the closest variety.

The three-quarters of a mile dash particularly resulted in a thrilling struggle, with Claude Brown and Minute Man the central figures and Claude Brown, the ultimate winner by a nose, Kinburn landing third not far distant from the pair. Claude Brown's victory was somewhat of a surprise, for the impression prevailed that he did not run well in the going.

Rifle, which had confident support, made good in the fifth race, a dash at a mile and a sixteenth, but his backers experienced a bad spell as a result of the horse's stubbornness at the barrier. When the start was effected it found him in front and he retained the lead for the entire way to win easily from Belgian Queen, with General Glenn in third place.

The mile and a half dash went to Kingfisher, a pronounced favorite, which led for the entire race, with Wadsworth's Last in closest pursuit and the pair landing a length apart at the finish.

North Shore, carrying the silks of Mrs. J. Phillips and grouped with others in the field, held on just long enough to outstay Ionia in the second race, a dash for maiden fillies. The opener fell to Jago, which showed all his old time form in the muddy going and won easily from Military Girl and Sweeping Glenn.

Gallagher Bros.' Pongee gave a sparkling exhibition in the sixth race, which she won from Julia N. and Dimples, with some other good ones in their wake. Pongee led all the way, closely attended by Julia N., but the latter swerved near the end and barely outstayed Dimples for second place.

Arthur B. Parker, brother of Governor John Parker of Louisiana and an ardent lover of racing, was among today's visitors.

R. C. Frakes will go to Lexington to break fifteen yearlings he has there. Mazola was turned over by him to D. Lahan and Rasola and Quick View were turned over to trainer R. P. Brooks. Clem Theisen, another member that Frakes had in charge has been turned out.

Paul Weidel has been turned out by Mose Lowenstein.

JOCKEY KENNEDY PUNISHED.

Jockey B. Kennedy, who previously had incurred a suspension for the remainder of the Latonia meeting, had a supplementary ruling imposed against him by the stewards, which makes him ineligible to ride for the remainder of the Kentucky racing season. The added punishment was a result of his assault on jockeys Wida and Buel, both of whom were said to have been battered up considerably by Kennedy outside of the race track.

Trainer James Rowe departed yesterday for New York after superintending the shipment of Damask and John P. Grier. He was not disappointed by the failure of the colts to land the Latonia Championship Stakes, John P. Grier having shown off form and soreness during the past week and Damask showing more or less the effects of his quartercrack.

Jockeys Coltilletti and Ambrose were also departing ones for the East.

Cleopatra was shipped by trainer Karrick to Belmont Park to rejoin other idle ones owned by W. R. Coe. The filly is done with racing and will be bred next spring.

Jockey Fairbrother went with Karrick to New York last night.

Arthur B. Hancock, according to the records here, was the nominator of Cleopatra in the Championship Stakes and Max Hirsch was the nominator of On Watch and will be credited respectively with the \$1,000 and \$500 that goes to the nominators.

Louise Wynne and Elizabeth A. were bought at private terms yesterday by H. Neusteter from J. Milam.

The first horses to be shipped from Latonia to Cuba will leave next Saturday and will include the stables of H. E. Davis, O. L. Foster and W. H. Hall.

General manager Frank J. Bruen is due to reach Latonia from Laurel next Friday.

Mose Goldblatt will race in Cuba the coming winter. His stable will be augmented by a number from the Harry Payne Whitney establishment.

Jockey Turner's shoulder injury is more grave than at first supposed and he will probably not ride again during the Kentucky season.

R. S. Eddy, general manager of the Fair Grounds track in New Orleans, departed yesterday for Maryland and New York in quest of horses to race at the Fair Grounds.

Jockey Heinisch signaled his return to the saddle after an illness of two weeks by riding North Shore to victory in the second race.

Jockey F. Wilson had to cancel his riding engagements after the second race on account of an injury to one of his hands.

The respective victories of Marjorie Hynes and Sterling Saturday caused them to be ineligible to the fourth race this afternoon.

MILITARY RACE AT LAUREL

Le Gardon Winner of Contest in Which Army Officers Are the Riders.

LAUREL, Md., October 25.—A military race added tone to an ordinary card at Laurel this afternoon and provided interesting sport. Six thoroughbreds, one the property of the United States government and the remainder owned by officers of the United States army, made up the field. All were ridden by army officers from Camp Meyer, Va. The winner turned up in Le Gardon, a six-year-old gelded son of Negofol—Goma, owned by Col. W. G. Gambrell and ridden by Major Chandler, the ranking officer of all the riders engaged. Chari Babe, owned and trained and also ridden by Lieut. Bardeen, finished second, and Yestersun, ridden by Lieut. Taylor, third. The race was at a mile and a sixteenth.

From a moving start Yestersun went to the front rounding the first turn. Chari Babe and Le Gardon moved into contention through the backstretch and Major Chandler took the lead when he brought the Negofol gelding through on the inside rail at the half-mile post. Yestersun followed in game pursuit of the winner, but went to the outside fence when turning for home and this cost the Peep o' Day gelding second place, for he came again and would have overtaken Chari Babe in a few more strides. Thomas Clyde presented the victorious rider with a piece of plate.

Step Lightly, starting for the first time since her victory in the Futurity, scored a hollow victory over a band of two-year-olds, going three-quarters in the most pretentious race on the day's card. Step Lightly made all the pace and won easily up, with S. A. Clopton's Twopair and General J. M. Gomez in second and third place, respectively.

F. Burlew, acting for J. H. Rosseter has sold the two-year-olds Thoughtless Beauty and Perplexity to S. A. Clopton.

Rollicking Ails, Good Hope and Farmingdale have been lost to the Rosseter Stable through claims and there are more in the barn which will be disposed of before going into winter quarters.

Jack Atkin and Gene Normie arrived from New York today in the interests of the meeting of the Tijuana Jockey Club, which is scheduled to open Thanksgiving Day.

Fred Shelke, who trained the Canadian division of the J. K. L. Ross stable this year, is an arrival from Montreal. He brought a band of mares from the Ross farm above Montreal to the one near here, where they will be bred. Mr. Shelke returns to Canada tomorrow with several yearlings.

J. Heupel, who was injured in a fall early at this meeting, will return to the saddle at Pimlico.

Mick Daly has suffered a relapse of the stomach trouble which confined him to his bed last week and has been taken to a Baltimore hospital.

Jockey C. Fairbrother leaves for Cuba at the conclusion of the Pimlico meeting to ride for Senator A. H. Diaz.

R. S. Eddy, general manager of the Fair Grounds track, also was among the day's arrivals.

James Rowe arrived at Pimlico this morning from Kentucky, bringing John P. Grier and Damask, H. P. Whitney's unsuccessful candidates in the Latonia Championship Stakes.

Senior Alvarez has obtained first call on the services of the apprentice G. Bulcroft for the coming meeting at Oriental Park. J. Butwell may do the heavyweight riding for this establishment.

David Gideon arrived today from New York.

Uncle Sam's flag flew atop the paddock today with the colors of other owners because of the inclusion in the day's program of the military race.

W. Weir will ship Filbertygibbet and the other horses in his charge to Fort Erie at the conclusion of the Bowie meeting.

ENSOR IN LIMELIGHT AGAIN

Returns to Empire City and Rides Four Winners and One Second Out of Five Mounts.

NEW YORK, N. Y., October 25.—Jockey Ensor returned to Empire City yesterday from Latonia, where he rode On Watch in the Latonia Championship Stakes and finished second to Cleopatra. That he made his presence felt, the orators will testify, as he won four out of five mounts and finished second on the fifth. Ensor's superior jockeyship was clearly defined in the Rose Tree Purse, when he won with Edwina, clearly outdistancing Mooney, who had the leg up on Sweet Music, the favorite. The finish was one of the most stirring ones of the meeting and it was only in the last few strides Ensor was able to lift his mount over the winning line.

Only three started in this race, with Sweet Music an odds-on favorite at the opening, but the pressure of the backing on Edwina and Lady Gertrude, the latter the medium of a heavy plunge, which sent the Coe filly up to even money at the close. Lady Gertrude could never get in hailing distance of the two.

S. C. Hildreth and his friends went to Krewer in the Hillside Handicap like it was all over. From an opening of 9 to 5, the colt was backed to a closing of 6 to 5, and while he was always in front he was pressed throughout by Elected II. It was only by the energetic ride given him by jockey Sande that he was able to shake off the Voter filly right at the finish.

Ensor had an easy time of it, putting R. T. Wilson's Dry Moon across in the Rainbow Selling Stakes, in which four started. Dry Moon was well backed and, taking the lead from the rise of the barrier, won all the way from Vibrate and Mavourneen.

The second race was easy for W. J. Spiers' War Note. Getting off in front, the Spanish Prince colt raced into a long lead, which he retained throughout. Phalaris, the favorite, finished absolutely last. Here is a peculiar gelding. It seems as if he can't get to the front; he sulks. War Note raced like a good colt, running the mile and seventy yards in 1:43 1/2, which is within three-fifths of a second of the track record. He looked so good to E. W. Smith that he ran him up to \$5,000 and bought the colt. War Note was entered to be sold for \$3,500.

In the opening dash the rejuvenated old plater Aurum returned to the races after a three weeks' rest and made good. Under a vigorous ride at the hands of Earl Sande the gelding raced Lovely and On High into defeat, taking the lead just before entering the stretch and lasted long enough to beat Mildred.
