DAY OF LATONIA CUP DECISION

ANOTHER FOR UNCLE SAM

Kentucky Derby Winner Shows Return of Early Spring Form.

SIX WELL-MATCHED CAMPAIGNERS NAMED TO CONTEST FOR THE \$7,500 ADDED LONG DISTANCE STAKE FEATURE

Latonia's Military Handicap Gives Sand Bed to the Government.

Butwell's Superior Riding Helps Charlie Summy Defeat Flibbertygibbet in Close Finish.

Miss Muffins Wins in Her Style of Last Spring—High Cloud No Longer a Maiden.

LAUREL, Md., October 29.—Ral Parr's Paul Jones, under an excellent ride by jockey Kummer, showed a return to his Kentucky Derby form this afternoon, scoring an impressive victory in a mile and a quarter race under allowance conditions, which featured today's racing at Laurel. J. S. Tyree's Dr. Joe finished second and Tantalus was third.

LATONIA, Ky., October 29.—General manager Winn and resident manager Harry F. Breivogel have perfected elaborate preparations to take care of the immense throng expected to witness the decision of the \$7,500 added Latonia Cup at two miles and a quarter, the outstanding feature of the closing day program at Latonia. While disappointment was expressed over the absence of the great Exterminator from the cup race, the field named, although small in numbers, is comprised of tried and true campaigners, well matched and right on edge for a grueling contest. Of the six carded to go Minto II. and Donnacona are the overnight favorites, with Sway also highly regarded. The best riding talent available here has been secured to pilot the starters. Wilson's injury will cause a change in the rider or Minto II. and trainer Spence is undecided whom he will employ, but it will probably be T. Murray. LATONIA, Ky., October 29.—The United States Remount Association this afternoon secured another suitable stallion for cavalry breeding through the medium of the military handicaps instituted at this track with a view of aiding the United States government in its quest for thoroughbreds necessary to secure the proper type of army remounts. The winner on this occasion was Sand Bed, a three-year-old chestnut son of Ogden—Sandpocket, carrying the silks of Roscoe Goose. He proved best of the six others starting and took the \$2,200 net that served as the winner's portion of the \$2,500 purse. The United States government also pays Goose \$750 when the horse is taken over.

The Sea King colt made all the pace and won by a length and a half under a mild drive. The Kentucky Derby winner was the only successful favorite on the flat racing card. Cold winds swept the course this afternoon and kept down the attendance somewhat. Explosive, running in the colors of F. A. Swenke with Wessler in the saddle, opened the day's proceedings by getting down in front of Chow by a head. Salesman was a poor third. Two claims were entered for Chow, which was the property of Mrs. R. I. Miller. N. S. Vall's bid of \$2,315 won out over G. W. J. Bissell's offer of \$2,305.

ENGLISH HORSES SHELVED WINTRY BLASTS AT EMPIRE

Cold Weather Keeps Attendance Down—Recourt Victorious in Eclipse Handicap.

M. Colford's Bob Redfield, with R. Gilbert up, accounted for the steeplechase after a hard drive with Smithfield. Ormead was third. Fair Mac, the only other starter, was crowded into one of the standards outlying the course as the field swung toward the stretch, and W. Gentry, his rider, was unseated. Gentry's claim of foul was not allowed.

Arion, The Vizier and Stefan the Great Follow Buchan into Retirement.

NEW YORK, N. Y., October 29.—Cold, wintry blasts, blowing through the grandstand and paddock, gave notice to racers today that the season was near the end, tomorrow marking the close of the Metropolitan racing for the year. Today's card was brightened by one race, the Eclipse Handicap, while the others brought out horses of no more than mediocre caliber. In the feature race, Recourt, stanchly backed, showed a superior mud-running effort and defeated a band of high-class racers when he took into camp War Mask, Sweep Clean, Tom McTaggart, War Note and others in easy fashion.

St. Michael, from the stable of G. A. Cochran, displayed a return to his best form to win the third race from Dr. Charles Wells and Night Rader. Kelsay made all the pace with the winner. Another favorite went wrong in the fifth. E. B. McLean's good sprinter Charlie Summy made all the pace and secured a nose decision over Flibbertygibbet, while Young Adam, public choice, finished third. It was Butwell's riding that kept the Asagual gelding in front. Flibbertygibbet closed with more reserve strength, but Butwell outrode Harbourne on the lightly weighted challenger.

LONDON, England, October 29.—After Buchan won the Doncaster Cup it was intended to retire him to the stud. This decision was revised and it was decided to let him run in the \$25,000 Jockey Club Stakes. He was all right when he left for Newmarket, but like so many of his stable companions he developed a cough and was withdrawn the morning of the race. Buchan goes to the stud forthwith at a fee of \$2,000. Within forty-eight hours his list for 1921 was filled and within a week an announcement was made that the son of Sunstar is also booked full for 1922 and 1923. Buchan was a most unlucky race horse, but for indifferent jockeyship he would have won several more important races.

War Note, for which there was considerable backing, essayed to make the pace. The Spanish Prince colt opened up a lead of three lengths in the first half and appeared to be going easily. Rounding the turn out of the straightaway, Recourt and War Mask both moved up quickly and soon War Note was in third place. When the field entered the stretch Recourt went into the lead and increased it to the finish, winning by four lengths. War Note ran in the colors of C. K. Moore in the race, he having been purchased by Mr. Moore from John E. Madden, acting for Montfort Jones, before the race.

Pickle Fancy led an immense band in the sixth and beat the favorite, Paul Connelly, a length. Pretty Baby was third. A special will leave Sunday for Havana. It will be made up of two cars from here and five coming through from New York. In the consignment leaving here will be the strings of A. H. Diaz, W. L. Oliver, J. J. McCafferty, F. Ginty, G. Foley, M. Siefert, F. Delbarrio and R. D. Carter.

Another young horse to retire is Stefan the Great, by The Tetrarch—Perfect Peach, by Persimmon. He won the Middle Park Plate, but damaged his hock when running in the Two Thousand Guineas in 1919. His fee has been fixed at \$470 and nearly all available subscriptions for 1921 have been taken. Stefan is brother to Sarchedon, a particularly good looking colt, whose chief characteristic is speed. An Irish syndicate, of which Lady Greenall is a member, has been for some time most anxious the horse should stand for service in Ireland. I believe a price option in a lease was the difficulty, but this has been overcome. I know a New Zealand offer of \$75,000 was refused some months ago, so assume the price of Sarchedon is in the neighborhood of \$100,000—perhaps more.

Jackey "Buddle" Ensor came back from Baltimore, where he went to greet his little daughter, and rode Lady Stella to victory in the opening dash. Havana, the closing favorite, was second, seven lengths in advance of Gwendola. The latter was the medium of concerted backing from a certain coterie.

Without reference to her race of yesterday, which was run under changed track conditions, the stewards have decided to refuse the entry of H. Hay's Napoli for inconsistency.

Arion, a big, good looking son of Valens, which last season won the Jubilee Stakes, Newbury Summer Cup and the Liverpool Cup, proved difficult to train in 1920. He is advertised for stud service in 1921 at the moderate fee of \$95. The Vizier, another good looking colt by Valens and exceptionally well bred on the dam's side, has also gone to the stud. He ran third to Pomern in the Two Thousand Guineas, and won some good races. His winnings amount to \$17,425. He comes of the same family as Phalaris, Laveno, Eager and other high-class winners and sires. His fee will be \$95.

Ragazza, a filly which had shown on Thursday her fondness for the soft going when she beat a band of fair platers, repeated that performance in the third race, defeating the heavily backed favorite Sammy Kelly by two lengths. Ragazza's success brought a battle among the halter men for her. She finally went to Hart Dernham for \$1,720. Sammy Kelly also found a new home, going to T. J. Carroll for \$1,326. Old Prince of Como, another starter in this race, will hereafter munch his oats in Cuba during the winter months. He was claimed by T. J. Hodge for \$1,810.

George Miller distributed the first issue of the Bowle condition books among the horsemen today. J. G. Bussey, acting for E. Graham, bought the two-year-old Seraphine from G. A. Cochran. Seraphine is a big, good-looking filly by His Majesty Pleione, by Sain, that raced well in Kentucky last spring. Mr. Bussey will winter the filly. J. Butwell has contracted to ride for Senor E. Alvarez at Havana during the winter.

Rich Gift, by Saxham (by Desmond)—Berne, by Buckingham (Galopin), from the dam of Farman, won numerous races and has been thought good enough to be given a chance at the stud. His fee is fixed at \$490. Galluper Light rapped himself last week and has probably run his last race. Nothing definite has been announced as to his retirement to Mr. A. de Rothschild's stud farm at Leighton Buzzard. Cinnu, which won the One Thousand Guineas and ran second in the Oaks, has hurt her hocks and been taken from training, as has Keysoe, the St. Leger winner of 1919.

Sam C. Hildreth confirmed today his intention of sending Grey Lag to Louisville, to start in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes, worth approximately \$25,000 net to the winner. Jockey Wilson was badly shaken up and bruised as a result of colliding with an automobile while riding a motor cycle. At first it was thought his leg was broken, but examination at the hospital, where he is now confined, showed no bones broken. He will ride again during the Louisville meeting.

"SNAPPER" GARRISON RETIRES; MONTFORT JONES' NEW TRAINER

Sweep Clean, the three-year-old colt by Sweep-Tenawa, by Tenny, which won for Mr. Montfort Jones at Empire City Tuesday so impressively, is said to be held in high store by Mr. Jones and William Shields, who saddled the colt and prepared him for his best effort. It was the first win for the Sweep colt as a three-year-old, he having started but once before this year, when he finished third and finished only three-quarters of a length behind Gentle W. and Round Robin.

L'ENJOLEUR FINALLY WINS. L'Enjoleur scored a hollow victory in the fifth race, the Spearmin gelding winning his first brackets by seven or more lengths from an ordinary band. He was an equal favorite with Chimera for the race, the latter finishing second. Florasin, the one about which there was something stirring in the earlier operations, was ordered withdrawn by the stewards on account of lameness just before the bugle called the horses to the post. As there is no recognition of betting by the stewards the old custom of twenty minutes for new books was not allowed.

The stable of Mr. Montfort Jones has been divided, part of the horses being sent to Kentucky in charge of Frank Gallor and those remaining in the East are being looked after by William Shields, Edward ("Snapper") Garrison is the contract trainer for the stable, but the veteran jockey has been incapacitated by illness since last summer, from giving his attention to the Jones horses, and has virtually retired as their trainer.

The first special train destined for Havana will leave New York next Sunday. It will have five cars with seventy-five thoroughbreds aboard. The following stables will be included in the shipment: C. K. Moore, Ed Springer, F. Kerns, T. M. Monahan, A. Tempest, E. A. Burke, F. McGovern, J. Mulreanan, J. W. Pangle and C. H. Davis. R. S. Eddy general manager of the Fair Grounds track, New Orleans, was a visitor at Empire City today. He was merely doing missionary work for the Crescent City course. Mr. Eddy says that the short meeting of only thirty-three days at the Fair Grounds track next winter had caused many horsemen who had formerly raced there, to divert their stables to other tracks. "We are going to have plenty of horses, however, and those of the better class," said Mr. Eddy.

MAN O' WAR is the great American race horse.

He has done wonderful things and has gone for good from racing. His deeds on the race courses of this country will long be remembered. The record of Man o' War's racing feats deserve preservation. It is likely to be many years before such a great equine figure again appears in America. ARGENTINE SIRE GOING TO ENGLAND

Senor Unzué, the Argentine breeder, is sending his good grey horse Grey Fox to England at the end of this year, and he will therefore be available for next season. Grey Fox is a great, good-looking, big-bodied, grey horse by Le Samartain (sire of Roi Herode)—Dancing Fox, by Flying Fox, her dam Gavotte, by Saxifrage. This is a good branch of No. 5 family. Grey Fox is the only horse who ever beat the \$200,000 Botafogo. He ran in twenty-five races, winning fourteen and never unplaced. His total winnings were \$104,450. There is no doubt about his being a fine stayer.
