



FINAL KENTUCKY MEETING

Churchill Downs Fall Racing Begins Today with Splendid Card.

Track Given Special Treatment to Make It Faster Than Heretofore—Overflow of Horses.

(BY J. L. DEMPSEY.)

LOUISVILLE, Ky., November 1.—With Churchill Downs opening tomorrow Kentucky autumn racing enters its last stages and with the wind-up of the eleven days' meeting here comes a termination of the sport for this year in these parts.

At no former fall meeting has there been concentrated so many horses here and the total has created a shortage of stable space at both commodious Douglas Park and Churchill Downs.

The Churchill Downs management offers for its opening one of the best programs ever staged at any autumn meeting. The Falls City Handicap, with its \$5,000 added, has among its carded starters the topnotchers in these parts.

Churchill Downs has not been overlooked in the matter of improvements since the close of racing last spring. One of the many features has been to scrape the track, which will eliminate the cuppiness and make the oval more resilient.

EVERY STALL ON GROUNDS FILLED. The arrival of horses yesterday and this morning was continuous and darkness found every stall occupied.

The plant proper is in its usual excellent order and the vast patronage that will be on hand for the opening will find every comfort painstakingly anticipated and cared for.

The racing here will begin daily at 1:30 p. m. and obviate the possibility of racing in darkness.

P. Ferrell, manager of the E. Cebrian racing and breeding establishment and chief trainer, was an arrival from California.

Fifteen horses will be permitted to start in races at three-quarters, seven-eighths and one mile, while the limit will be twelve at all other distances.

Mose Goldblatt canceled his stall reservations for the Churchill Downs meeting and will ship direct from Latonia to Havana.

Trainer Cal Milan brought only three of the J. N. Camden horses here from Latonia, Rangoon, Darjeeling and Bettina.

Former jockey George Molesworth has taken over three of the George J. Long horses to train, Orlova, Cortez and Frank F.

The George M. Hendrie stable here in charge of trainer John Walters is the smallest in a long while, there being only seven horses in it.

Thomas C. McDowell's horses will be absentees, having been retired for the winter.

The E. R. Bradley horses will consist of seventeen. W. R. Hurley will have six of these under his supervision and the remainder will be looked after by Dick Thompson.

S. C. HILDRETH'S LUCK CHANGES AND HE LEADS THE MONEY-WINNING OWNERS OF MEETING --- JOCKEY ENSOR'S RIDING A DISTINCTIVE FEATURE

The final meeting of the year on the Metropolitan racing circuit was held at Empire City from October 16 to October 30, and during the thirteen days of racing \$118,791 was distributed in stakes and purses, the daily average distribution amounting to \$9,137.

A break in the ill-luck that has been pursuing the Hildreth stable this year came during the Empire meeting with the result that that capable turfman's name appears at the head of the money-winning owners, his horses having won seven races and \$16,109.

BALTIMORE, Md., November 1.—The Maryland Jockey Club celebrated its fiftieth anniversary today when the fall season of racing at Pimlico began.

The Pimlico Serial Weight-for-Age Race No. 1, which was offered as the main attraction, proved an easy victory for Billy Kelly, which beat his stablemate, Motor Cop, by a length.

Only five of the nine starters finished the course without a mishap in the steeplechase, which was over the two-mile course. The winner turned up in Martian, which beat the Greentree Stable entry, Mohican, a couple of lengths.

The attendance at Pimlico this afternoon was swelled by a big influx of visitors from New York. Among the arrivals were James Fitzsimmons, Thomas Healey, Frank Herold, J. J. McAuley, Mart Demarest, Thomas Hodge, F. Dahnken, Morton Schwartz, J. W. McClelland, Algernon Daingerfield and Doc Riddle.

W. Dugan is expected here in a few days to make final arrangements with several owners he contemplates racing some horses for in Cuba during the winter. He will take a number of the P. T. Chinn horses from Kentucky to Oriental Park.

Tom Hodge will race rather a pretentious string in Cuba.

B. B. Rice shipped Mumbo Jumbo and James over from Laurel. The remainder of his string were sent to Cuba. Rice has arranged with E. R. Bradley to take over jockey S. Boyle.

Crack Two-Year-Olds to Contend Next Saturday in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes.

When the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes for two-year-olds, at a mile, with \$10,000 added, had its first closing last year no announcement of the track over which it was to be run was made, but it was generally supposed it was another Latonia attraction. However, it was made known this year that it was assigned to Louisville.

H. P. Whitney's undefeated crack Tryster is one of the eligibles, as also are his Prudery, Broomspun, Princess Pandora, Dartmoor, Ararat and Exodus, but they are still in the East. Grey Lag is at Churchill Downs. Apparently the field will come from Brother Batch, Blowing Bubbles, Be-have Yourself, Brance Wheel, Colonel Baker, Rangoon, John S. Reardon, McGoodwin, Grey Lag, Bruce Dudley, Sir Lancelot, Hildur, Gold Digger, Uncle Velo, Gossip Avenue and Sporting Blood, without taking into account possibilities from the East, among which are the Whitney horses named, besides Smoke Screen, Brigadier General, Star Voter, Bon Homme, Serapis, Ten-Lec and others credited with good racing performances.
