



POSSIBLE TROUBLE AHEAD

Attempt to Reinstate Shilling Fraught with Danger.

Maryland Action Not in Accord with Universally Respected Turf Procedure.

NEW YORK, N. Y., November 11.—The Maryland State Racing Commission met yesterday at Baltimore and reinstated Carroll Shilling, the jockey who has, for eight years, been refused relief by the Jockey Club.

Upon the surface it looks like a serious difference between the Maryland commission and the Jockey Club. There have been indications of such a conflict for some time.

The conflict is not likely to be beneficial to the American turf. Should the Jockey Club retaliate, one of its first probable acts would be to close all official records, such as registration, to those out of joint with its authority.

Shilling was suspended at Havre de Grace September 25, 1912, for grasping the bridle of Jacqueline in a race.

LEXINGTON, Ky., November 11.—It develops that an unsuccessful effort was made in September to have the Kentucky State Racing Commission grant Carroll Shilling a license to ride regardless of the New York Jockey Club's denial of that privilege.

A member of the state racing commission, which at the time was not in session, informed the lawyer that Shilling had been repeatedly denied a license by the Jockey Club to ride, but that that body had granted him a license to train.

ROMANCE OF CESAREWITCH

How Cleopatra's Sale Caused Bracket to Go to Mrs. Robinson—Immense Betting.

LONDON, England, October 20.—The Cesarewitch is the most popular handicap of the English racing season. It is run over two and one-quarter miles with only one turn, the last mile and a quarter being quite straight.

The weights were published six weeks before the decision of the race. Before the weights appeared the three-year-old filly Bracket was favorite and all these weeks she was prominent in the wagering.

ARMISTICE DAY OBSERVED

Veterans Made Free Guests at Churchill Downs Yesterday.

Coyne Repeats His Recent Good Race—Blushing Beauty and Brotherly Love Winners.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., November 11.—One of the biggest crowds that has witnessed the racing here this season was on hand at Churchill Downs this afternoon. Included in the large throng were numerous officers and service men now stationed at Camp Knox and hosts of civilians, formerly in the branches of the United States army and navy, active during the World War.

For the occasion a splendid racing offering had been provided, with a handicap for two-year-olds, over the three-quarters mile route, serving as the feature. It furnished a splendid test for the youngsters that tried conclusions, with the winner turning up in Coyne, which also in a previous race had triumphed over some good ones.

The three-quarters dash preceding the feature also brought out some fast sprinters and in this By Golly, a recent acquisition to the Milo Shields establishment, won with the utmost ease after having led the entire way, Claude Brown being closest to him at the finish, with Mellora in third place.

Frank F. made a runaway of the third race and won easily up to a canter, with Keep in second place, being aided in this by the immense amount of ground she saved on the last turn.

E. R. Bradley's Blushing Beauty opened proceedings auspiciously for backers of the favorites when she won the opening dash from Harry B., with the poorly-ridden Dodge in third place.

Corilla outstayed the thirteen other maidens that started in the second race, but had to be ridden to her utmost to do so, Eleanor S. landing in second place and Cut Up third.

RUNAWAY VICTORY FOR FRANK F.

Frank F. made a runaway of the third race and won easily up to a canter, with Keep in second place, being aided in this by the immense amount of ground she saved on the last turn.

E. R. Bradley's colors were also successful in the final race when his Brotherly Love won from Accelerate and Lothair. Lucky B. was an outstanding favorite here and came in for confident support, but he quit badly as a result of the fast pace that Brotherly Love forced him to set.

DECISIVE A BIG SURPRISE

His Victory in Monkton Steeplechase Entirely Unexpected—Results of Graded Handicaps.

PIMLICO, Md., November 11.—Howard W. Maxwell's five-year-old gelding Decisive upset all the calculations in the running of the Monkton three-mile steeplechase handicap, which featured the program of the Maryland Jockey Club this afternoon.

In compliance with a request of Wm. F. Broening, Mayor of Baltimore, in connection with the declaration of a holiday in observance of the Armistice anniversary, racing activities stopped for one minute this afternoon, beginning at four o'clock.

The Pimlico graded handicap in three sections served as the secondary feature of the day's racing. Each contest was at a mile. The first fell to Morton L. Schwartz's Audacious with Sonnings Park in second place and Leochares third.

J. B. Campbell, who will serve as secretary at the Jefferson Park meeting, leaves for New Orleans tomorrow night.

C. K. Moore returned to New York today after spending a day watching them run at the hilltop course. His horses have been shipped to Havana.

NECESSITY OF WEIGHT-FOR-AGE RACES

LEXINGTON, Ky., November 11.—The indeterminate character of American racing, what with the all too early retirement of Man o' War and the victory of the eight-year-old Pif Jr., carrying the trifling impost of 106 pounds, of the Latonia Cup Handicap, was never more apparent than at the present and the necessity of well-endowed weight-for-age cup races, absolute, if the thoroughbred horse, as bred in this country, is to take corresponding rank with those bred elsewhere.

Man o' War would next year, if kept in training, be absolutely in the hands of the handicapper. As matters stand there are now practically no cup races in which the horse can take his part, meeting his fellows under weight-for-age conditions.

Handicaps are but man's opinion of the ability of horses over a given distance to handle weight, and this is forcibly brought home by the victory of the leniently treated Pif Jr. in the Latonia Cup Handicap of last Saturday.

Racing I have always understood to be carried on as a healthful, invigorating amusement for the public and as an effort to determine the relative racing merits of the participants, and this the manner of the development of the thoroughbred horse. Handicap victories determine nothing.

Bachelor's Double is fourteen years old, a chestnut, by Tredennis—Lady Bawn (a twin), by Le Noir—Milady, by Kisher. He was bred and raced by J. Lowry always in Ireland until the end of 1909.

ANGON'S INCONSISTENCY INVESTIGATED

LOUISVILLE, Ky., November 11.—The stewards had a further talk with jockey Murray concerning Angon's two recent races. Immediately after his dismounting in the first one on Saturday he was questioned regarding his ride, he having been in several pockets and, in the opinion of the stewards, having ridden a badly judged race.

He explained that he had made every possible effort to win. Angon's improved showing yesterday, both in the matter of riding and of speed, caused the stewards to again question Murray. He again maintained that he made equally as great an effort in the losing race as he did in the winning one; that he did not bet on either race, nor did anyone else bet for him.

CUBAN STAKES CLOSE NEXT MONDAY

INTEREST IN HORSE SHOW

Class of Thoroughbreds to Be Striking Feature—Breeding of Mile. Denise.

(BY C. J. FITZ GERALD.)

NEW YORK, N. Y., November 11.—The National Horse Show Association, whose annual exhibition has for many decades been a feature of social and economic life in the East, will be held as usual in Madison Square Garden, November 15 to 20, and judging from the numbers and quality of the entries and the interest which is being taken in the event, it will be as successful as any of its predecessors.

Hunter and saddle classes have for many years been the chief features of the exhibition, but this year there will be a remarkable display of military horses, there being no less than sixteen classes for animals of this description.

Most of those who are behind this Remount movement saw active service abroad and have an intimate knowledge of what was accomplished by thoroughbreds, and the grades of that remarkable family on the battle front—not only by the horses from the United States, but those of France and England as well.

The Remount Service favors the thoroughbred as a top-cross in securing this type. The display of stallions of that breed, as well as the clean-breds, half and three-quarter-breds among the trooper mounts, and in the hunter and saddle classes, will as a result have a greater attraction for the public than ever before.

Under the circumstances the class for thoroughbred stallions will be a striking feature of the show this year. The federal government will be represented by three of its best horses from the station at Front Royal, Va. These will be the eleven-year-old Ganadore, by The Commoner—Mountain Mist, by Magnetizer; the five-year-old Zenith, by Ogden—Zahra, by Mazagan; and the six-year-old horse Greek Legend, by Polymelus—Evidance, by Sidus.

Opposed to them will be Chief Lally, a five-year-old horse from The Jockey Club's Breeding Bureau, located at the White Plains station of the New York State Constabulary, and three other well-bred stallions. Chief Lally is a grand young horse by King James—Rossaire, by Sempronius, and whose third dam Roseville was the dam of Ben Brush.

LESSON OF TEST RACE.

The outcome of the recent 300-mile endurance race over the county roads of Vermont, New Hampshire and Massachusetts, from Fort Ethan Allen to Camp Devens, which was won by the grade thoroughbred mare Mile. Denise, with another grade

thoroughbred, Bunkie, in third place, both of which were trained and ridden by officers of the Remount Service, is considered a vindication of this method of breeding to obtain cavalry horses.

Something of the breeding of Mile. Denise will be interesting. She was born in Texas, and was sired by Arch Oldham, a son of Gallantry, by Galopin, dam Pearl Barnes, by Barnes, a son of Billet. Her dam was a mare that was known to be nearly thoroughbred.

No claim of breeding is made for Bunkie on the dam's side. His sire, Bowling Brook, a son of the horse King Galop, by Galopin, was once owned by G. W. Poole and raced throughout the West and South with considerable success.

EASY FOR SOUND THOROUGHbred.

In commenting on the performance of the winner, which went through the test with only a loss of twenty-five pounds in weight, August Belmont, the chairman of The Jockey Club, who has been most generous in his donations of thoroughbred stallions to the federal government, said: "The promoters of the test are entitled to the greatest credit, as they have shown the value of blood. If a grade thoroughbred can win such events, how much easier it would be for a good, sound thoroughbred properly trained to succeed."

John E. Madden, who had two trotters engaged, one of which was disabled by a kick, also regards the result of the endurance race as a victory for the thoroughbred. "All the blood in our horses that is not thoroughbred is scrub," was his comment after the race. "That applies to every family of horses bred anywhere."

Pierre Lorillard, Jr., one of the American officers serving abroad who were active in the formation of the remount service, and who is a director of the National Horse Show Association, said in the same connection a few days ago: "The outcome of that race shows that we are right in our horse breeding experiments. I would like to see some obstacles in the course of another year, particularly ditches, as there are always plenty of those to cross in any campaign. The proper type of mount ought to be able to take a man anywhere."

Mile. Denise will be seen at the Garden with Major Stanley Koch, who rode her in the endurance race, in the saddle. Major Koch shares in the honor of the great little mare's achievement, as he gave her splendid care at the close of each day's sixty-mile period and during this race he and Lieutenant McCreery, who rode Bunkie, adhered strictly to a formulated schedule which conserved the powers of their mounts in a manner that excited the admiration of those who followed the movements of the contestants throughout the test.

OFFICIAL ENGLISH HANDICAP

Leighton and Monarch Stamped as the Best Two-Year-Olds of 1920.

LONDON, England, October 22.—The weights for the Free Handicap for two-year-olds are out. The compilation is of great interest as being the official view of the merits of the year's juveniles. The Jockey Club handicapper has taken a margin of 35 pounds to bring the 112 youngsters together.

Leighton, which is unbeaten, and Monarch hold the place of honor, each with 126 pounds, and then follow Humerist and Pharmacie with 123 pounds, and Lemonora and Thunderer, 121 pounds; Milesius, Polemarch and Alan Breck next at 119 pounds.

Polly Flinders, which came from the Clarendon Stable with such a big reputation, is set to carry 108 pounds. Corporal and Plum, which have played such a dramatic part in selling races, are assessed at 101 pounds and 100 pounds, respectively, while Napoleon, which has failed to sustain his Brockley Stakes reputation, figures at 99 pounds. Torment, the property of His Majesty, which beat a huge band in a Nursery Plate at Newmarket recently, is low down in the scale at 93 pounds.
