Horses and Horsemen Leave Churchill Downs for Havana.

Many Prominent Stables Repre sented-Record . Entries for Stakes Closed Nov. 15.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., November 15.—One of the biggest shipments of race horses recorded in this country in recent years left this city Sunday over the Louisville and Nashville, Havana bound. The horses are intended for the seventh annual meeting at Oriental Park, Havana's beautiful track. The special comprised seventeen horse cars, two Pullmans and a day coach for the accommodation of trainers and attendants. By the middle of the week the thoroughbreds will have exchanged the mists and chill of Churchill Downs for the sunny, smiling climate of the Pearl of the Antilles. After their arrival there will be a week of rest and preparation before the curtain rises for the Havana meeting, which will extend one hundred days or more, in which time there will be ample opportunity for the thoroughbreds to garner some of the prizes offered.

The shipment from here Sunday represented only the horses in training which have finished out the fall season at the local track, large individual consignments having already left from eastern points as well as from Kentucky. The aggregation of horses congregated at Havana represents a good class of theroughbreds and in many instances will cause the colors of owners who are making their debut a oriental Park. Among the stables that preceded the special from Kentucky are those of Mose Goldblatt, who, in addition to his own, will handle a number of young horses for Harry Payne Whitney; W. H. Hall, O. L. Foster, J. Hurt, J. Burks, A. L. Taylor, A. D. Worley, H. E. Davis and P. J. Montour, All of these stables have reached their destination in good condition.

Among the stables that left last Friday was that of John Lowe, with twenty head, including the fast High Clould and American Ace. The consignment also embraces a number of highly prized yearlings, bred and owned by Edward Cebrian.

The colors of George M. Hendric, the Canadian owner, will be seen at Havana, that owner having commissioned trainer John Walters to take five of the stable's horses to Cuba. Claymore and Estero were among those that Mr. Walters shipped on the special. The stable of Williams Bros., which has raced most successfully at Havana in the past three years, was also sent on the special in charge of P. J. Williams, who is arranging to take an even dozen horses.

The stable of W. F. Knebelkamp, the Louisville baseball magnate, in charge of W. B. Finnegan, was also aboard the special. The consignment comprises ten horses, including the two-year-old colt Bruce Dudley, which will be the stable's candidate in the rich Cuban Derby.

LOUISVILLE RACERS TO CUBA MACOMBER STUD FOR SALE CARE OF SIRES IS IMPORTANT

Three Stallions and Forty-one Brood Mares in California to Be Disposed Of.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., November 15.—With the coming here for a short stay of A. K. Macomber it became known that the well-known breeder plans a "clean-up" of all his thoroughbred stock in California with the exception of eighteen yearlings in training at San Jose. Three stallions and fortyone brood mares are to be sold. At least one of the stallions, the Sunstar horse Hand Grenade, is likely to bring quite a substantial sum, as he was a good performer on the race course and is bred along lines that promise well for the stud. Hand Grenade was the major stallion in the breeding last spring at Elmwood Stock Farm, where he has been quartered since being retired from the turf. Some of the mares to be sold are in foal to him.

Hand Grenade, Liberty Loan and War Fame are the remaining members of a band of young stallions Mr. Macomber seat to Elmwood about two years ago. The Sunstar horse Palcines was sold to Frank J. Kelley of Chicago; the Sunstar horses Eliminator and War Cry were disposed of to Californians, and Hesperus, also a son of Sunstar, died last year. Eliminator is a brother to the Kentucky Oaks winner Sunbonnet, and recently changed hands in New York. War Cry was raced toward the end of the present year over New York tracks.

Hand Grenade is a beautifully formed brown, five years old, from the Greenlawn mare All Green, When trained by Walter Jennings, Hand Grenade "trimmed" good ones on the Metropolitan courses. Liberty Loan, a brown six-year-old, by Dick Finnell—Martha Palmer, by Sempronius, is well remembered by eastern racegoers, War Fame, the third stallion to be put on the market, is a four-year-old, by Prince Palatine, the stallion recently brought to the United States by E. F. Simms. War Fame is one of the tallest thoroughbreds ever seen hereabouts, standing about seventeen hands. He is a son of the Bill of Portland mare Verne.

Thirty of the mares up for sale were purchased from tharles T. Boots. Some of the mattens are daughters of Borgia and other sons of the celebrated Macgre

SANFORD'S ENGLISH PRIZES SIX IN 1921 EPSOM DERBY

Two Beautifully Bred Yearlings on the Transport Manhattan.

LONDON, England, November 3.—The Atiantic Transport steamer Manhattan, leaving London for New York today, carries two highly-bred yearlings which have been bought in England by Mr. John Sanford. Indeed, these are the only animals on the steamer. A New York huntsman has purchased some hunthers, but there was not sufficient time before the sailing date to obtain the papers. These animals will go over later.

One of Mr. Sanford's yearlings is a chestnut filly by Sunder—Snow Marten, for which he paid \$20,000. Snow Marten won the Oaks at Newmarket in the war time. She is, on the dam's side, related to Spion Kop, Orpheus and Comrade. all first-class horses in 1920, She was by Martagon—Siberia, a winner of \$48,400, by St. Simon from Sirenia, 'winner of the Jubilee Stakes and sister to Hammerkop, dam of Spion Kop.

There is another daughter of Snow Marten in Kentucky. She is Mr. Arthur Hancock's mare Betty Snow, which was sired by Sir Martin. When Snow Marten was in training she was bred to Sir Martin and with Mary Snow unborn she ran second to Son-in-Law in a field of thirty-one for the 1915 Cesarewitch at two and a quarter miles.

The other youngster is a bay colt by the extremely successful sire Charles O'Malley—Captive Princess, which was about the best of her year in Ireland, where she won the Irish Oaks and St. Leger. She is by Captivation, by Cyllene—Princess Eager, by Eager.

These two yearlings lack nothing on the score of individual excellence and their blood lines are of the highest class. They will go to Mr. Sanford's farm at Amsterdam, N. Y., to await with the other youngsters recently shipped the return of Hollie Hughes, who will winter Mr. Sanford's animals in Tennessee.

Mr. Sanford has been spending a lot of time in the Newmarket district, for his son is an undergraduate at Cambridge, where it is quite likely he will become master of the famous Cambridge University Drag Hunt. Mr. Sanford himself went to the docks to see these animals safely shipped on the Menhattan.

Quite a mild sensation in English racing circles is the announcement that Mr. Watkin Williams will sell by auction at the Newmarket December sales the whole of his horses in training as well as his mares and foals.

It was only last year that Mr. Watkin Williams, who is associated with Cardiff shipping circles, came into the bloodstock market when in July he gave \$17,500 for the Chester Cup winner Tom Pepper, who unfortunately died ten weeks later, before he carried his new owner's colors.

At the Doncaster sales Mr. Williams bought two yearlings from Sir Join Robinson's stud. They were successive lots and cost \$65,500. They were Syrian Prince, by The Tetrach—Lisma, by Persimon, the dam of Omar Khayyam, and Nymphida, by The Tetrach—Oenone, by St. Serf, the dam of African Star.

I am convinced that horses prefer being housed in wooden rather than in stone or brick stables, be privileged to see at will others of their kind, have all the freedom possible and live as far removed from the breeding shed as convenient.

My observation is that horses prefer wooden to brick or stone stables because they do better therein, and in this I am borne out by the observations of others who have or have had stallions in their charge

MONARCH'S GREAT QUALITY PECULIAR

Tracery's Good Son and His Convincing Victory in the Middle Park Plate.

LONDON, England. October 26.—The Middle Park Plate was really the most interesting race of the Cesarewitch week. We had to guess which was the best of the two-year-olds. Still we are not now thoroughly clear because Alan Breck did not run, and Leighton, which is unbeaten, was not nominated. Pharmacie was also absent. I understand that the owner of Monarch is willing to match his colt against the filly at weight-for-sex for \$25,000—distance were 144 entries for the Middle Park Plate, which closed in November last year. In the future it is to be a stake with an added value of \$5,000. The \$25 entry is to be abolished. This year that source contributed over \$3,500 toward the \$5,000 given to the race. This year the owner of Monarch received \$18,125.

The eight runners for the race intuded the remainder of the two-year-olds of high class and brilliance. Lemonora started favorite owing to his defeat of Humorist and Alan Breck at Doncaster when the last named was a shadow of himself. Indeed, that race may have done him infinite harm. Second favorite was Thunderer, which finished in front of Monarch at Ascot. The son of Tracery was then unlucky, as he stumbled. In September at Newbury, Thunderer won a valuable Foal Stakes, in which he was called upon to give so much weight that his chance seemed hopeless. Humorist won the Clearwell Stakes three days prior to the Middle Park Plate. Before that race Mr. Joel was asked the definite question as to which he regarded as his best colt. He readily replied: "At home Humorist is best, but after Thunderer's performance at Newbury I have my doubts." The betting showed the public took that view, for Thunderer was 9 to 4 and Humorist 10 to 1.

Monarch was a popular tip. He was confidently expected to win by all who knew most about him. Yet the public, as there was no mystery, would not have him. One might have asked the question, Why should not Monarch win? He had run six times. He would win him of the man and the second of the public

Tetrarch.

Teofani is by Black Duck, an obscure son of Galopin—Cigarette, a mare by Marco, which Mr. Sievier bought as a yearling and raced unsuccessfully for two seasons. Teofani was her first foal. Teofani was a sister to Heronry, a speedy two-year-old winner of four races. They were from Dame Heron, by Lowland Chief—Rent Day, which bred some unimportant winners. She was by Touchet—Lady Day, a winner of six races. This is not distinguished lineage, so the source of Monarch's merit is fairly clear. Here is his five-line pedigree:

"Parson" Parkes, the English Clergyman-Trainer, and His Life's Work.

The English trainer, A. W. ("Parson") Parkes, who recently died in England, was for several years an Episcopal clergyman and always a peculiar character. He was wiser about horses than souls and resigned to train the horses of Mr. Bleackley and was successful.

Commenting on the "Parson's" death, the Special Commissioner of the London Sportsman wrote as follows: "After Mr. Bleackley's death he trained intermittently at Epson, Shrewton and elsewhere for various owners, but on the outbreak of the war he gave up racing and set himself energetically to war work. He had managed to secure a particularly good machine for making horseshoes, and he obtained from Lord Kitchener a contract to supply as many shoes as he could as long as the war lasted. He soon had about 300 men working in day and night shifts, and turned out millions of shoes. He had never really lost the parson's instincts, and he neither attended a race meeting nor made a single bet until the war ended. Then, having done his patriotic work, he went back to his first love, and having met Mr. Dickson, who has important interests in the steel trade, he set about training for that gentleman, and was almost immediately successful with such winners as Piracus and Orange William. He was educated at Dublin and Durham Universities and graduated with first-class honors. I can well imagine that as a preacher he would be second to none, for he was an extraordinarily ready and eloquent speaker. No one whom I ever heard surpassed him, especially on election platforms, for which he was always in great request. Nor did I ever meet a man who was better or more amusing company."
