BULLET PROOF ONCE MORE

Wins at Three-Quarters in Fast Time Without Trouble.

PRINCE OF WALES' JUMPER

Kinlark Good Australian Gelding and Gift Horse May Go in Grand National.

The English newsmen are making quite a fuss over the Australian gift horse to the Prince of Wales, Kinlark, which landed from the Thermistocles at Plymouth, November 16, sound and well.

But Kinlark is no slouch. J. N. Niall, a Sydney, N. S. W., man, has owned him for several years and the horse has run in good company and performed well always.

At Flemington, Melbourne, April 24, Kinlark won the Neerum Chase, two and three-eighths miles and eighty yards, under 164 pounds in 4:49 1/4.

At any rate if Kinlark trains well and is entered in the Prince will have a respectable representative in the field for the Grand National Steeplechase of 1921.

MARYLAND BREEDING PLANS

Racing Commission Favors Establishment of State Bureau.

BALTIMORE, Md., December 2.—The project of establishing a state breeding bureau, with the one mile race tracks as the center, was discussed at a meeting held at the office of the State Racing Commission.

The meeting heard a preliminary report submitted by a committee composed of Thomas Clyde, Commissioner E. Clay Timanus, Carlos De Garmendia and George Brown, Jr.

After a discussion of the project the chairman of the commission, Stuart Olivier, appointed a committee to look into the matter further and report at a meeting to be called at some date not yet selected.
