FAVORITES PROVE FICKLE

Unexpected Winners Crop Up in Jefferson Park Racing.

Owner Kirby Wins Two Races and a Second Place—Judge Price First at Long Odds.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 3.—A. L. Kirby's colors were in the limelight at Jefferson Park this afternoon, were carried to victory on two occasions and barely missed making it a triple.

Close racing was the order despite the featureless card and ordinary starters. Backers of favorites experienced a rough time for most of the first choices were beaten in steady fashion.

Charles A. Byrne was considered to have the second race at his mercy, particularly as Lyke had the mount on him, but Winchester never left the result in doubt, winning commandingly from the start, with Charles A. Byrne in second place.

A pronounced upset came with the running of the sixth race, for which H. C. Basch was backed to the exclusion of all the others. The subsequent victory of Judge Price at fancy odds was a hard jolt for his backers.

Another odds-on favorite to go down to defeat was Murphy. He showed the way until reaching the stretch where he was passed in turn by Bengali and Normandie, the former winning easily.

Blue Jeans proved much the best of those which met in the fourth race for she began poorly and had to come around all the others but won easily from Lover's Lane.

Jockey Gregory was the first to come under the starter's displeasure and was suspended for three days for disobedience at the post.

Many additional arrivals got in this morning, the newcomers including G. R. Bryson, who brought his horses from Bowie.

S. A. Clopton, acting for H. P. Whitney, sold Amaze to F. Letteller at private terms. He also sold the chestnut yearling colt by Star Shoot—Any Time to J. S. Randolph. Clopton has fifty horses here and he is making strong effort to dispose of most of them.

H. D. Bauer, who is accumulating an extensive racing string, which now includes Tippetty Witchet and Table D'Honneur, was an arrival from Bowie yesterday.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

William Woodard is making preparations to ship a carload of horses belonging to himself and others from Kentucky to New Orleans.

Fourteen additional nominations to the Belmont stakes of 1923 have been received from Hal Price Headley, of Belmont Stud of Kentucky, who is in Paris. The entries came from France.

J. T. Combs of Louisville, a veteran trainer of horses, died at New Orleans Tuesday of injuries sustained from an epileptic fit fall. His remains were sent to Louisville for burial.

Kay Spence is not going to Cuba this winter. He was quite a factor there in the past. He will stick to his Louisville home and care for the Thraves and his own horses at Douglas Park during the cold months.

Golden Broom was one of the sharp disappointments of 1920. He won but \$250. Against his cost of \$15,000 as a yearling at Saratoga in 1918 goes \$10,050, \$8,800 of which was won by the handsome Sweeper—Zuna colt as a two-year-old in 1919.

There is under consideration by the Maryland Jockey Club the matter of starting and finishing all Pimlico mile races at the sixteenth post, so as to give starters a longer run to the first turn. No decision has been reached, but there are excellent reasons for the change.

RANGOON FOR 1921 KENTUCKY DERBY

LEXINGTON, Ky., December 3.—Rangoon, Darjeeling, Bettina and Dark Ben, bred and owned by Senator Johnson N. Camden, and trained quite successfully by J. C. Milam, this, their first year on the turf, have been sent over to Hartland Stud to run out until about January 15, when they will come back to the Kentucky Jockey Club track to get their preparation for three-year-old racing.

Rangoon possibly will be Senator Camden's reliance for the next Kentucky Derby, though it is his intention to name three geldings for that event and put Bettina in the Kentucky Oaks. Lorraine, Hellum and Peco have been retired. Lorraine is to be mated with Light Brigade and the other two with Peter Quince.

BIG TOTAL WON FOR COMMANDER J. K. L. ROSS BY BONIFACE, SIR BARTON, STAR VOTER, BILLY KELLY, LION D'OR, BABY GRAND, MILKMAID AND OTHER STARS OF RACING

This year the J. K. L. Ross stable was a powerful racing combination and won more money than in any previous year in its history, but the Whitney stable won more, so it was not given to Commander Ross to figure as the leading American owner for the third year in succession. At the outset of the racing year almost anyone of experience in racing matters would have picked Sir Barton as the probable best money winner of the stable, but this noted horse failed signally in that respect and Boniface turned out to be its chief money gatherer.

SARATOGA STAKES' ENTRIES

Big Increase in Nominations Received for Stellar Events of 1921.

A total of 1,208 nominations were received for the Saratoga stakes of 1921, which closed for entries on November 27. This is an increase of 176 over the figures of 1920. The Hopeful Stakes, the richest of two-year-old races, closed with 238 nominations as compared with 225 of last year, fourteen of these entries coming from France for the account of H. P. Headley of the Beaumont Stud of Lexington, Ky.

LATE KENTUCKY TURF GOSSIP

Kay Spence Buys Sister to Viva America—More Horses Shipped South.

LEXINGTON, Ky., December 3.—Kay Spence, acting for Colonel W. E. Applegate and himself, today purchased from Charles W. Moore the yearling sister to Viva America by McGee—Pink Rose, and she was shipped this afternoon to Louisville along with three other yearlings. She was broken by C. W. Worthington at the Kentucky Jockey Club track here and is regarded as one of the best of her sex and age.

Carr and Piatt have sold the bay filly yearling by Delhi—Tres Joli to Robert Frakes. Will Woodard will leave for New Orleans tomorrow morning. He shipped from here yesterday three horses of his own, four for J. O. Keene, two for J. C. Milam and one for W. H. Fizer. Woodard's bay filly by Beach Comber—Degenerate, Pagan Pan is among those sent by Keene. Milam's two are coming two-year-olds, the bay filly by the Finn—Rabbit and the chestnut filly by Golden Maxim—Our Blonde to be handled by Will Perkins, who left here this morning for New Orleans.

Phil T. Chinn and Mrs. Chinn have arrived in Lexington to spend the winter. A. J. Joyner is spending today at A. B. Hancock's Claiborne Stud in Bourbon County. W. W. Darden and W. L. Threlkeld were visitors there this morning and the latter booked his English mare Pleasant Fuss to Omar Khayyam. Frederick Johnson of New York is the guest of Hal Price Headley at Beaumont Farm, where he has an interest in the stallion Brown Prince.

BETTING AT NEW ORLEANS

Expressions From a Number of Recently Elected Officials.

Much Pother About a Matter Supposed to Have Been Settled by Supreme Court of Louisiana.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 3.—The Business Men's Association will open racing January 1 and will operate within the provisions of all laws, according to Walter Gleason, attorney for the association. Beyond this statement Mr. Gleason will make no further comment on the charge made by District Attorney-elect Marr that the Locke law is being violated at the Jefferson Park track, and that, if the same system is used at the Fair Grounds, he will prosecute as the district attorney of the Parish of Orleans.

When asked if he believed the system used at the Fair Grounds during the meeting of 1920, the same system now used at the Jefferson Park track was a violation of the Locke law, Mr. Gleason replied that he did not care to enter into any premature discussion of the law or betting system. "I have only this statement to make," said Mr. Gleason. "I do not know what system of betting prevails on the Jefferson Parish Fair race track, as I have not been there during this meeting. I can only say that the Business Men's Racing Association will operate and keep within the provisions of all laws on the statute books. Beyond this I can say nothing."

Mayor-elect Andrew J. McShane favors horse racing as long as the people want it—if it is conducted legally. This was his attitude as expressed when interviewed in reference to the statement by Judge Robert H. Marr that the system of betting at the Jefferson Park track was, in his opinion, a violation of the law.

"I would not care to announce my opinion, because of two things," replied Mr. McShane. "The first is that I have not read Judge Marr's comment and second is that I will have to know the actual conditions first."

"When we take into consideration the large attendance at horse races, it is evident that the people want sport. I am for what the people want, whether it happens to agree with my own opinion or not. You may say for me that I am for horse racing as long as the people want it, if it is conducted legally."

"You also can say that I am absolutely against hand-books, banked gambling games and lotteries. Betting at race tracks must be conducted legally. As to whether betting as conducted at the Jefferson Park and the Fair Grounds tracks is legal, I am not prepared to say because I am not a lawyer."

The Mayor-elect was asked his opinion about issuing a permit for the conducting of the meeting at the Fair Grounds track.

"I do not know anything about the issuance of such a permit," He replied. "The commission council is composed of five members and I am only one member. I do not know whether the Business Men's Racing Association will have to be issued a permit or not. These are matters which will have to be taken up after the new commission council goes into office. As for the issuance of a permit for racing I would treat that just like the issuance of any other permits that have been issued by the City. I suppose the best way to find out how many permits are out, is to call them all in then look over the applicant and see if he is fit to receive a permit."

The attitude of the city commissioners-elect on racing in New Orleans is generally favorable, only one, Wilbert Black, opposes.

Conrad A. Buchler, who succeeds Mr. Rivararde as District Attorney of the parishes of Jefferson, St. Charles and St. John, declared on Thursday that he expects to take office Monday.

"I propose to do my full duty," said Mr. Buchler. "and I will enforce the law without fear or favor. I have been to the Jefferson race track once this meeting, but I did not bet nor did I pay any particular attention to the system of betting."

"As District Attorney I will not be in a position to be a detective, but if the Sheriff of Jefferson Parish makes any arrest for violation of the Locke law I will prosecute. If any private citizen furnishes me with evidence that the law is being violated at the Jefferson track I will file information against and prosecute the guilty persons. I will give the Locke law and the Supreme Court's decision in the Austin case my full attention at once and make a close study of them."

Sheriff J. B. Dauenhauser on Thursday declared that he will take no action against the officials of the Jefferson Park track until he confers with Mr. Buchler.

ANCIENT HISTORY OF CHESTER CUP

In 1816 Gen. Grosvenor gave a cup valued at \$100 and joined Sir T. G. Egerton in another worth \$300. The city contributed, too, and to give more extension still to that policy a stake was devised in 1824 to stand in the name of the tradesmen of Chester, who contributed \$500. There were, later on, proposals to add some cheese to the bounty, and if good traders of Chester had had their way the winner of the cup might have carried off a ton of that delicious commodity.

FORT ERIE MEETINGS' BIG RETURNS

TORONTO, Ontario, December 3.—The amount wagered at the two meetings of the Niagara Racing Association, Fort Erie, was \$5,515,547, the first totaling \$2,323,917, and the second \$3,191,630. The balance of the association's receipts over disbursements aggregated over \$380,000. At the autumn meeting the revenue was \$441,247, including commissions from pari-mutuels of \$319,000 and gate receipts of \$83,949. This worked out at \$260,882 over the disbursements.
