ANGON THE PRIZE ACROBAT

Continues on His Erratic Way by Defeating Bullet Proof.

Cold Weather and Heavy Going Still Ruling at Jefferson Park, but the Racing Is Good.

(BY J. L. DEMPSEY.)

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 8.—Lloyd Gentry's Angon figured in a sparkling but acrobatic performance during the afternoon at Jefferson Park when he accounted for the all age handicap at three-quarters, triumphing easily over Bullet Proof and administering the first defeat sustained by the latter during the present racing here.

Form was well conserved and the racing was interesting, many of the finishes being hard fought, with small margins separating the winners and placed horses.

For the first time George J. Long's colors were carried to victory over this track when his Montillo won the opening dash by a short margin from Secretary, the favorite.

The one-time good colt Mormon made his debut in these parts an auspicious one and won in easy style in the second race from the outsider Saffron.

Back Bay, backed in confident style, accounted for the third race from Opportunity. Back Bay was much the best in the going, for he came from far back from a slow beginning.

Tugs furnished the surprise of the afternoon by beating Sasin home by a head, with H. C. Basch next in the third race. The latter was supported to the exclusion of the others in the race.

The colors of W. H. Rowe were carried to their first victory in the sixth race when Ballybell finished in advance of Bombast. Verity was a supposed good thing in this race, but ran a bad race.

There were many additions this afternoon to the visiting brigade and included "Cull" Holland, who at one time figured extensively on the turf, but is now in the brokerage business in New York.

Johnny Dundee was also among the newcomers from the East and will remain for the winter. Frank Farrow brought nine horses from Bowie.

Before leaving the Maryland course he shipped Polroma and May W. to Ben Jones' farm at Parnell, Missouri. Polroma is a son of Polymelus and is intended for stud service.

The horse sickness at the Fair Grounds is still rampant and many horses stabled there continue on the ailing list.

Jack Reeves and others owned by A. Swenke were among the horses to get in this afternoon from Bowie.

Jockey Walls displayed some of his old-time riding skill astride Ballybell and Nebraska, winners of the two concluding races.

"Bud" Fisher, noted cartoonist and owner of several good horses, which are now here, was an arrival and will remain several weeks.

BROOMSTICK SMALL AS A RACE HORSE

When H. P. Whitney's noted stallion Broomstick, leader of the American sires for three years in succession, and a wonderfully fast and stout-hearted race horse, was taking his early lessons in racing at the training quarters of his owner, Capt. S. S. Brown, down in Mobile during February, 1903, in charge of Peter Winumer, everybody who looked him over was impressed with his faultless conformation and exquisite finish, but most of them shook their heads and declared that he was a little beauty and might win some of the baby races at the winter tracks, but was too small to pick up scale weights and finish ahead of the big two-year-olds he would have to meet on the metropolitan circuit.

And yet Broomstick did win his first start on the metropolitan track, finishing in front in a good field in the Juvenile Stakes at Morris Park. His brilliant success on the turf later caused horsemen to wonder that such a small horse could do such things. But that he did is now turf history, and great as was his record on the race course it has been far surpassed by his wonderful success in the stud. After retiring to the easy life of the stud Broomstick grew to such length and substance that he is no longer regarded as a small thoroughbred.

TUBED HORSE WINS DERBY CUP

The Derby Cup, an important English autumn race at 1 3/4 miles and worth \$6,630, was run at Derby, November 20, and won by a tubed horse which had been a cripple all summer, and was only operated on in September for his throat affection.

Tubed horses often win sprint and middle distance races, but cup victories for "roarers" are novelties. The horse was Lord Penrhyn's Keranos, 3 years old, by Kennymove—Quick, which carried 114 pounds and beat a good field to win by two lengths.

MODEST STABLE OF W. M. JEFFORDS

NEW STABLE ESTABLISHED AT TIJUANA

SAN DIEGO, Cal., December 8.—Baron Long, managing director of the U. S. Grant Hotel of this city, and Carl Withington, capitalist, have bought from W. T. Anderson his entire stable of thoroughbreds quartered at the Tijuana track.

IMPORTANT POINT AN OWNER MISSED

DIFFERENT EYES THE WINNER

Easily Accounts for Principal Race at Oriental Park.

Close and Hard Fought Finishes Mark Yesterday's Racing—Antilles Stakes Sunday.

HAVANA, Cuba, December 8.—Outsiders had their innings at Oriental Park this afternoon and the majority of winners came from the most unexpected quarters.

The most pretentious field of the day met in the fifth race, a dash of five-eighths of a mile for an \$800 purse.

The inaugural dash was warmly contested every yard of the race. The General Roberts filly Two Eyes led all the way, but had no easy time of it, and after racing in to defeat, first Tosca, then Bertha Minix just lasted to outstay the fast closing Draftsman in a game finish.

There was another close finish in the second race, McLelland getting the decision over Timothy J. Hogan by a neck.

With one exception all the eight horses which F. A. Herold brought from Bowie are two-year-olds. Among the youngsters are some good performers that showed winning form at the Maryland tracks during the fall racing.

Carmody and Waterford proved the winning combination in the third race, while Blazeaway, from the Armonia Stable, had no trouble showing the way in the fourth.

The final dash of the afternoon fell to W. H. Hall's Dolph, which easily took the measure of Jellison after the latter had set the pace practically throughout.

T. A. McAvoy, trainer for Thomas Monahan, received word today that Mr. Monahan, accompanied by Col. M. J. Winn, general manager of the Kentucky Jockey Club, will arrive in Havana shortly after Christmas on an extended visit.

A field of ten starters is expected to contest the Antilles Handicap, at three-quarters mile, with an added value of \$2,000, which will be run next Sunday.

Catcher Hoefner of the Pittsburg National League baseball team, arrived this morning for an extended stay.

TIJUANA STAKES CLOSE SATURDAY

SAN DIEGO, Cal., December 8.—Eight Tijuana stakes close Saturday. They are the Coffey Handicap, \$20,000, two-year-olds and over, one mile and a quarter; U. S. Grant Hotel Handicap, \$10,000, two-year-olds and over, one mile and a furlong; Baja California Handicap, \$10,000, two-year-olds and over, one mile and a sixteenth; Tijuana Derby, \$5,000, three-year-olds of 1921, one mile and an eighth; San Diego Business Men's Handicap, \$5,000, two-year-olds and over, one mile and a sixteenth; Tijuana Cup, \$5,000, two-year-olds and over, two miles; Tijuana Futurity, \$5,000, foals of 1919, four and a half furlongs; Juvenile Stakes, \$2,500, foals of 1919, half a mile.

There are thirty-five brood mares and two stallions, Fair Play and Disguise, at J. H. Rosseter's Wikipup Ranch in California.

When the new dressing on the Tijuana track becomes firm and settled predictions are made that it will be much faster than it ever was.

The King James filly My Dear was a good and consistent winner for her owner, F. Musante, during the racing of 1920, her total for the year being \$15,160.

Tipitty Witchet is reported in splendid condition at the Fair Grounds track in New Orleans. It is not probable that he will race before the first of the year.

Jim Arthur has his old reliable Bondage to thank for the success achieved by his stable this year, that son of Ogden accounting for \$19,261 of the \$46,479 to Arthur's credit.

Frank Proctor, the well-known gentleman jockey, has purchased the four-year-old Jim Petrie, by Wire In—Cannie Maid, from Charles Crew and will make a jumper out of him.

EXILE'S PEDIGREE SCRUTINY

Consideration of No. 1 Family of the Bruce Lowe System.

Sunflower, Secret, Ellen Horne and Sister to Cobweb Branch Most Successful.

(BY EXILE.) To proceed with the special winner-producing branches of the different families. The No. 1 family, which winds up in Tregonwell's Natural Barb mare, has ever been most productive of winners of the best class and also of many influential sires.

One of the best branches of the No. 1 family, if not the best, is the Sunflower by Bay Middleton branch. Anything tracing to Sunflower is well worth while. To Sunflower trace the St. Leger winner Sunbeam, her daughter, that good brood mare Sunshine, by Thormanby, which is the dam of Napoli, dam of Laveno, Orvieto, Neapolis, one of the first sires to score a genuine Argentine success, and Ponza, dam of the Australian sire Positano, Crocus, half-sister by Thormanby to Sunbeam, broodmare, and is ancestress of the best horse in England in five years, Gay Crusader, and also Mayflower, sister to Crocus, which is ancestress of Votter and Celt.

The Problem branch of the No. 1 family, through Secret, is also exceptionally good, although not nearly so large a family as that of Sunbeam. Through Emilus, Problem bred Nameless, and Nameless, through Melbourne, foaled Secret, Secret, when mated with the Herod horse Macaroni, produced Lady Audley, dam of Pellegrino, and the One and Two Thousand Guineas winner Pilgrimage, which in turn bred Loved One (sire of Doris, dam of Sunstar and Princess Durrill), the Oaks winner Canterbury Pilgrim and the Derby winner Jeddah. Canterbury Pilgrim is, of course, the dam of that good little race horse and sire Chaucer and of the mighty Swynford.

Note, if you please, how frequently the names of the Herod sires Macaroni and Thormanby, and the Matchem sire Melbourne, appear as the foundation stones of a strong pedigree. The Ellen Horne branch of the No. 1 family is also extra good—first class in every respect. Ellen Horne's daughter Paradigm is the dam of the triple crown winner Lord Lyon (only partially successful as a sire), Achievement, Chevasance and Cognisance. To Paradigm trace Footlight, ancestress of Prince Palatine, Flair, Flotsam, etc., Illuminata, dam of Ladas and Chelandry, which bred Neil Gow, Traquair and Samphire, Wrack's dam. This also is the family of the Derby winner Cicero. To Ellen Horne also trace good old Bend Or and The Tetrarch's sire, Roi Herode.

DISTINGUISHED ANCESTRESS OF MEDDLER.

The Queen Bertha branch of the No. 1 family is exceptionally fine, especially for brood mares. Queen Bertha, winner of the Oaks herself, bred the Oaks winner Spinaway, whose daughter Busybody was also first home for the Oaks at Epsom, and is the dam of that really good brood mare sire the undefeated Meddler. To this family also belong the wonderful Wheel of Fortune, Amadis, etc. Queen Bertha traces back through Flax and Odessa to Sister to Cobweb and Cobweb, the dam of Bay Middleton, is also ancestress to the St. Leger winner of recent times, Black Jester, whose sire success is uncertain because of the fact that no great sire has come from this family since the days of Bay Middleton.

I see nothing to specially gloat over in the Wire by Waxy branch of this No. 1 family. The Prairie Bird, by Touchstone, has been unproductive of late. Jack Dav is probably best. In the days of Silvio and Bird of Freedom this was going strong as a running line. Members of this branch, however, have never attained too much distinction as sires.

What of the Trampoline branch? Trampoline, as you know, is the dam of Glencoe, and from this branch of the family come Hammurabi, Gallvan, the Oaks winner Cherrymoya, Louviers, etc., but it is nothing like so productive of good horses as are some of the other branches of the No. 1 family.

All of the above trace back to the Barb mare by way of Promise, by Snap. Promise had a half sister in Princess, by Herod, to which trace some notable horses. The most recent big gun is the Derby and Grand Prix winner Spearmin, now a successful sire. That fine stayer Santoi is also good. Dollar did much for the Flying Dutchman line in France, as did Mortemer for France and the United States, but the average class of members of the Princess family is not up to that of those which trace to Promise.

A rather occasional branch of the No. 1 family is that of Bonny Lass, many of whose descendants find a home here, Melbourne is the exception that goes to prove the rule. Without Melbourne the house of Matchem would have been swept aside. Robert the Devil is another distinguished racing member of the Bonny Lass family, but Robert, good race horse as he undoubtedly was, made rather a hash of it as a sire, and I am prone to regard the appearance of his name close up in a pedigree with suspicion.

To make a long story short, the best branches of the No. 1 family are the Sunflower by May Middleton, the Secret by Melbourne, the Ellen Horne by Redshank, and the Sister to Cobweb, though this latter's speciality is brood mares. No mistake can possibly be made in purchasing stallions, mares or yearlings which trace in the female line to either Sunflower, Secret or Ellen Horne.

HUNTING, FISHING AND SPORT.

From Ireland, birthplace of many notable British cross-country horses, a brilliant performer in All-ways appeared at Aintree, Liverpool course, November 10 in the Beecher Steeplechase of two and one-quarter miles. He is a brown gelding, five years old, by Ardoon-Lavono, and merely cantered to win under J. Anthony, the crack amateur. All-ways needs to be another Poethlyn is jumping finish. The English jumping sharps consider that All-ways is a certain future for Grand National Steeplechase honors and in a class with Poethlyn and Troystown.

California has 26,212 miles of fishing streams that contain sufficient water the year around to maintain fish life. Besides 1,200 miles of coast line they have 862,133 acres of fresh water lakes. Rainbow, steelhead, black spotted and mackinaw trout are native and, in addition to these species, the California fish and game commission has introduced into the waters of the state all the known species of trout of the eastern United States and foreign countries. Other desirable fresh water fish not native to California have also been stocked in the waters of that state. They boast the largest trout hatchery in the world.

LORD FALMOUTH AS BREEDER

Famous English Nobleman's Methods Were Straight and Simple.

One of the most successful breeders of thoroughbreds who ever lived, Lord Falmouth, conducted his breeding operations on only a small scale. Fifteen to twenty mares were all he considered necessary, yet the results attained approached almost the inconceivable. Just how the ill-advised and assuredly unsuccessful plan of having huge bands of mares originated I do not know, but I do know that those who have put this plan into practice have met with but ill success, and I also know that a small breeder victory tells the death knell of big broodmare bands which, in every way, is for the best interests of and for the better development of the thoroughbred horse, because the scattering of these mares to all sections of the country would mean the awakening of a more general interest in horse affairs the country over. Other countries have found small holdings are best and this is precisely what is about to take place here, and it is well that it is so, for by this means will a more general interest in the horse and his perfections be excited. That is, the people of the United States as a whole must be induced to take more than a cursory interest in the thoroughbred horse, and small broodmare holdings is the proper prescription. Racing and kindred interests can safely be left to take care of themselves, but horse breeding stands in need of all encouragement possible, hence the action of certain racing associations is worthy of every commendation in that they have set aside certain sums to be bestowed on the breeders of the winners of some of the more important races, which will of course give every breeder a personal interest in the result of a race, and this is of itself a big step toward interesting the general public in horse breeding affairs.

AMERICAN POLO PONIES SENT ABROAD

NEW YORK, N. Y., December 8.—J. P. Leher, who so efficiently handled the motor van service about the Metropolitan race tracks, yesterday transported forty-four polo ponies to the steamer which sailed for England. They came from Westbury, Long Island, and have been gathered by Mr. H. P. Whitney and his polo playing associates for the use of the players of the American team, which is to go to England next summer to regain the International Cup lost last year. The ponies are the pick of the United States and were gathered in all corners of the land, mostly, however, from California and Texas. Their selection took some four or six months and they are said by experts to be an agile and well-balanced lot. Many of them are fully trained.

It was quite an interesting shipment. The ponies were given special quarters on the ship and will be well cared for by a corps of well chosen attendants during the voyage and in their English quarters.
