BELMONT PARK BEAUTIFUL

Work of Transformation Under Way and Progressing Rapidly. Will Be Unsurpassed in Picturesque Detail and Magnificence of Its Appointments.

NEW YORK, N. Y., December 11.—Work is progressing rapidly in the transformation of Belmont Park, and if the weather remains open until Christmas those who have been familiar with the greatest of all American racing plants since its inception in 1905 will find the physical changes decided upon by the management well under way. These are to cost \$600,000. When the gates are thrown open for the spring meeting of 1921 New York will have a race course second to none in the world in picturesque detail and in the magnificence of its appointments. It will be the last word in utility as well as charm. The entire scheme has been developed along lines which have brought out the natural beauties of the environment in a manner that will delight those who love the horse and want to see him in an attractive setting.

The Westchester Racing Association has had in contemplation for some time the improvement of its home. The changes are the result of much thought on the part of the directorate. They were not undertaken until viewed from every angle. In their adoption, as well as in their consideration, the dominant thought has been to give the patrons of the course the finest return possible for the money paid at the gate. The Westchester Racing Association has never been a commercial organization. Its members know that it will never yield more than an ordinary return on the investment. It is their contribution to racing, and the quality of their sportsmanship is revealed in the fact that an obligation of \$600,000 has been cheerfully assumed after a period of lean years. It means no dividends for the present.

The public will now share in all the natural gifts with which the place has been endowed. The magnificent gardens, rare shrubberies and sylvan retreats, which were formerly a part of the grounds of the Turf and Field Club, will now be a portion of the paddock. The track clubhouse will be fitted as a public restaurant, while the newly remodeled grandstand will contain many innovations for the comfort of the public, which will find in Belmont Park an institution unique in scope and character.

When the changes now under way were first discussed three plans were considered and the final choice called for a union of the existing stands through the medium of a fifty-foot bay. The field stand was to be razed and rebuilt at an angle with the grandstand. This gave a structure 950 feet in length, affording seating accommodations for 17,200 persons, taking the benches on the roof into consideration. Each seat commands a perfect view of the course.

It was determined to elevate the seats in the grandstand twelve feet and carry them out to a line with the front of the structure. This utilized a space of twenty-eight feet hitherto unused. There will be 140 boxes available in this area. Ramps sixteen feet wide at intervals of every 100 feet will lead to the mezzanine floor, upon which will be located a rest room, ladies' retiring room, emergency hospital and booths for the sale of candy, chocolate, coffee, lunches and other refreshments.

On the ground floor the steps formerly leading to the lawn from beneath the grandstand have been eliminated. This is now a graduated walk of cement. There will be luncheon counters, a service office, telegraph and telephone booths and a men's toilet in this area. The approach to the stand will be through the medium of a double stairway every 100 feet. The aisles leading to the seats will be wide enough to guarantee against congestion. The top corridor will afford a promenade, giving an extensive view of the splendid paddock and the course proper. From it access will be had to the press box and the band stand. The former will be opposite the finish and the latter in the middle of the stand.

TURF AND FIELD CLUB QUARTERS.

The Turf and Field Club members will occupy the easterly 150 feet of the rebuilt field stand. In this section there will be thirty-nine boxes, as well as a club buffet, restroom, ladies' retiring room, cloak room and a private room for the stewards. There will be an ornamental fence five feet high between the club and public sections. A gate will be placed on the mezzanine floor through which club members may reach the main stand. The stairways at the rear of the stands will afford an easy means of reaching the paddock, which will be the most beautiful in the country and will compare favorably with anything abroad. Every variety of rare tree and shrub is to be found in this retreat, a conspicuous feature of which is a fountain lined with weeping beeches whose foliage touches the fringe of the pool. This section of the ground, as well as the former paddock, has been improved by the removal of a number of unsightly stumps. This brings into great prominence the fine box trees, rhododendrons and other ornamental trees and flowering shrubs, while in the background is the historic old Manice homestead, now occupied by the Turf and Field Club. The former paddock will be utilized as a parking space.

The improvements to the course proper are now well under way. The decision to race from right to left necessitated the placing of the new finishing line at a point about thirty feet below the former furlong post. This will afford a straight run in of 1,180 feet—about the same as at Saratoga. Superintendent Pelz has been at work for some time altering the grade on the turn as established by C. W. Leavitt and resoling the surface with loam full of humus, a deposit of which was located on the course. It is entirely free from grit and gravel, and more than three-quarters of a mile has already been finished. All the sand and devitalized soil had been removed before the work was begun. The grade on the turn, which will now come in for general use, was originally two feet from rail to

LEONARDO II. AND HIS MATES

UNWIELDY BAND OF TWO-YEAR-OLDS WHICH RACED IN THE COLORS OF J. W. McCLELLAND, WITH THE HOPEFUL STAKES WINNER AS THEIR LEADER AND UNDEFEATED STAR

Thirty-three horses raced in the name of J. W. McClelland this year, of which twenty-five were two-year-olds. None of the older horses was of much account in racing. But Leonardo II. was one of the two-year-olds. This son of Sweep and Ethel Pace was one of the stars of his age and, in that he also won all of his races, has a claim to dispute the two-year-old championship with Tryster. He started in four races and won them all. His first race was in a purse for maidens at Empire City July 14, in which he ran five-eighths in 1:00 and won by eight lengths. At Saratoga August 6 he won another purse at the same distance in 58% and finished five lengths in front of Hildur. August 20 he defeated Nutkins, Polly Ann and eight more at five and a half furlongs in 1:05%, also a purse race. All of these races were a part of his preparation for the rich Hopeful Stakes. This he won and ran its three-quarters over a slow track in 1:12%, but with Prudery giving him twelve pounds, besides her sex allowance, had his work cut out to win from her by a head. Leonardo II. will race in the name of the Xalapa Farm Stable next year and, if all goes well with him, will probably clash with Tryster in the Kentucky Derby. When so many horses are in one stable it is almost inevitable that some of them are neglected and thereby prevented from revealing their real gifts until some happy accident intervenes. The McClelland two-year-olds were bought regardless of price as yearlings and some now undistinguished may prove excellent three-year-olds. Bon Homme showed himself to be a good colt after leaving the stable and others may do likewise next year. The record of the stable was:

J. W. Healy recently secured the jumpers Soumanga and John Douglas from George Brooke III, the Pennsylvania turfman, and is wintering these along with a dozen belonging to John Lumsden, the Canadian owner, at Benning.

rail. This was reduced from two to three inches commencing at a point about forty feet from the inner rail. At the end of the turn, and the beginning of the homestretch, the course was remodeled, resoled and regraded, making it safe for the largest fields. The changes demonstrated that Belmont Park has a splendid bottom, and the rebuilt surface should be lightning fast and a factor in the establishment of new records.

The turn will be seventy feet wide and the track will gradually be increased to 110 feet at the old finish. It is proposed to bring in the outer fence at the end of the turn fifteen feet. From this point it will run to nothing at the old finish. The inner fence will also be moved from the junction of the straightaway and the circular course, making the run in much narrower for all events over this ground. It is expected that this will prevent horses from running out at this point.

It was found necessary to remodel the steeplechase course also, and at a special meeting of the stewards of the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association, held on Thursday of last week, the plans for the change drawn by Mr. Leavitt were accepted. Superintendent Pelz, who was present, was instructed to make the course over in conformity with the balance of the plan, and the timber-toppers will race to the left the same as the flat horses. This will necessitate the shifting of several of the obstacles, but they will be completed in ample time for the spring campaign.

It was feared at one time that the work would not be entirely completed by spring, but the splendid weather and the fact that the contractors, Terry & Tench, have employed a large force, is a guarantee that all will be in readiness for the opening of the season of 1921.

President August Belmont, J. E. Widener, Thomas J. Regan and others interested in the welfare of the Westchester Racing Association are regularly in touch with conditions, and are delighted with the manner in which the work is being prosecuted.

GREATEST WEEKDAY CROWD

All Previous Records at Havana Broken—Racing Close and Full of Thrills.

HAVANA, Cuba, December 11.—The attendance at Oriental Park this afternoon assumed holiday proportions. The crowd was the largest that ever turned out on a weekday since racing was inaugurated in Cuba. The track was much improved today and should be fast for Sunday's racing.

Close and hard-fought finishes again marked the sport, which was enthusiastically enjoyed by the immense crowd. No sooner had the spectators recovered their poise after one thrilling race than they were on their feet wildly cheering the winner of the next. This was true in all but the second, where the Armonia stable's Slippery Silver led all the way by a wide margin.

A neck finish between Cabin Creek and Willow Tree began the afternoon sport, then came another thriller in the third when Langhorne beat Avion by a similar margin. Marion Hollins had even a smaller margin to show for her victory over War Loan in the fourth, while Hocmir and Dolph got the decision in the last stride in the fifth and sixth races respectively.

George P. Sherman, the Baltimore druggist, is represented at the local track this season by a fairly useful stable, comprising Mayer House, Pokey B., Jack Dawson, Ben Butler, Charlotte Smith and Katy Kay. The stable commands the services of I. Fletcher, the jockey, and in addition to the horses named above are Marjorie Mignon and George C. Jr., which have been racing under his colors.

Louis Brown is handling the four-year-old Jill for Dr. G. C. Mizell, a Havana dentist.

P. A. Bolin arrived from Maryland with Sangallo, a seven-year-old horse by Solitaire II.—Lilly Golding.

Jockey Barnes, who was prevented from riding Friday through illness, returned to the saddle this afternoon and had the mount on Scintillate in the first race.

Jockey F. Wilson also resumed riding after an absence of one day.

Jockey C. H. Miller, who rode for A. J. Goldsborough on New York tracks this year, arrived this morning and will accept mounts during the remainder of the meeting.

The first race Sunday will be called at 2:15. This also will be the starting time for all Sundays and holidays.

L. G. Jennings, a well-known racing enthusiast from Cincinnati, accompanied by his bride, arrived today to enjoy a couple of weeks of racing.

TIPPITY WITCHET BEATEN

But Only After a Gallant Race Under High Weight.

Rain Spoils the Going Again and Leads to Wholesale Scratching from Races.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 11.—A heavy storm which developed before race time converted the track into bad condition and was responsible for wholesale withdrawals from the different dashes, leaving small fields to contest. As a result of the unpropitious weather condition a slump came in attendance, but at that a surprisingly large crowd viewed the sport. The rain continued throughout the afternoon and occasioned discomfort to the spectators on their way home.

Form was all awry as a result of the changed track and backers of favorites had a rough afternoon, the downfall of several of the pronounced choices being particularly costly. From a spectacular point the sport was on a par with the best here this meeting. Several of the finishes, after sensational stretch duels, bordering on the thrilling variety and the winners in several instances being in doubt until the judges had rendered their decision.

The \$1,500 handicap for all ages at one mile was the outstanding race and was contested by a quartet of useful racers, including Tippity Witchet. The latter had as a running mate Biff Bang to assist him in his task and the pair ruled overwhelming favorites, with Johnny Dundee's War Mask also coming in for considerable attention and Sea Sinner, the other starter, by no means was neglected. The latter, favored by his light impost, took a good lead at once, with War Mask his closest pursuer and Tippity Witchet, under his heavy impost following and seemingly in difficulties before reaching the half mile ground. There was no material change in the running order until coming into the stretch, where War Mask began gaining on the leader. Seventy yards from the finish Sea Sinner continued to appear the winner, but he gave way unexpectedly in the last few strides and it enabled War Mask to head him. Tippity Witchet also made a last desperate attempt and finished on the heels of the two leaders.

General, a veteran in these parts, made his local appearance for the first time, an auspicious one by landing the opener from Lonely and Poutney. Miss Kruter was the favored one, but any chance she might have had was reduced by the inefficient work of her rider.

George J. Long's Doric furnished the upset in the second race when she outstayed Silence to win by a head, with the favorite, Rolo, following. The latter showed the most speed for a half mile and dropped back.

A. L. Kirby's Talisman, under good guidance by King, had no difficulty in leading her opponents. Lancelot, running in the colors of his new owners, Snyder & Holmes, landed in second place, with Ablaze, the favored one, third. After the finish Talisman was claimed by Snyder & Holmes at a cost of \$2,000.

The defeat of The Swimmer in the fourth race was one of the pronounced upsets of the afternoon. Only four started in the race, with The Swimmer regarded as almost a certainty, but he ran disappointingly and landed third, Cock o' the Roost and Grayson staging a spirited stretch duel, with King's superior ride being responsible for Cock o' the Roost's victory.

George Duncan contributed to the thrills of the afternoon by a sensational victory in the sixth race after having been practically left at the post. Paul Connelly, the favorite, landed in second place, with Corson just heading Rapid Stride for the shorter portion of the purse.

S. A. Clifton is continuing the weeding out process in his extensive establishment here and this morning sold privately to Nugent Brothers of St. Louis Bullet Proof and Nominee. They were turned over to A. Thomas to train.

Lady Mountjoy in the last race broke down after going a quarter, while contending with War Club for the lead. The latter won with ridiculous ease. The stewards sustained the protest against the claim of Talisman on the ground of irregularity. Snyder and Holmes having neglected to register Lancelot as their property. The stewards also disqualified Lancelot from obtaining second money as a result of his owner's negligence in making the registration. Ablaze got second money by the disqualification, and Jack Scot third money. The disqualification, however, did not affect the betting, wagers being paid according to the original placing.

BUY TWELVE J. K. L. ROSS MARES

LEXINGTON, Ky., December 11.—John A. Payne and R. H. West, Jr., of Cincinnati, have purchased twelve thoroughbred mares, and leased the stallions Hill Hampton, by William Rufus—Estate, and Damosch, by Rock Sand—Dissembler, from J. K. L. Ross and they are to come to Kentucky from Maryland. The mares were all mated with Marathon last spring, and are to be mated with Hill Hampton next spring. There are four weanlings by Hill Hampton among the Ross youngsters in Maryland, and they are said to be splendid individuals. Damosch is to run out there for a couple of months and then go into training.

THE PORTER'S DAM DEAD IN KENTUCKY
