



FANTOCHE A VICTOR AGAIN

Easily Defeats the Odds-On Favorite White Star.

Jockey Lyke Displays Some Excellent Horsemanship—Jefferson Track Still Heavy.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 20.—The \$1,000 mile purse which featured the card this afternoon was contested by some highly regarded two-year-olds, with C. W. Clark's White Star an overwhelming favorite, but he proved a sad disappointment, primarily due to the faulty riding he received from S. Wida. The finish found him in third place, with Fantoche the victor and Bunga Buck in second place. Fantoche's success was in a full measure due to Lyke's superb horsemanship, for he kept the colt in the best going and bided his time despite the long lead that King took with Bunga Buck in the first half mile. The rushing tactics of King caused Bunga Buck to tire when reaching the stretch and he proved a ready victim to Fantoche when Lyke began an earnest drive on him. Wida seems to have lost form completely and had White Star all over the track, being at a loss where to guide his mount and ultimately finding the worst places. He moved up well just before reaching the stretch, but finally tired badly.

Jockey Lyke also figured in the victory of Vice-Chairman, winner of the fourth race. The Bud Fisher representative was an overwhelming favorite and he gave his backers but little concern, for Lyke got him away well and, taking a good lead in the early running, led the others throughout to win easily up. Hadrian outstayed Sagamore for second place.

Steady rains since Saturday put the course in muddy condition again and the threatening weather served to cause a decrease in the expected attendance. The betting, however, was heavy and activity was the rule in the "exchange." During the afternoon small fields comprised the starters in the different dashes, with most of the finishes fairly close, some of the winners being driven to the limit to reach the goal in advance.

Favorites were in luck and began auspiciously when Toss J. succeeded in overthrowing Secretary in the initial dash to win by a nose.

McTaggart's superior ride accounted for Lonely's victory over Lancelot, ridden by Jarvis.

Harvey Smarr was much the best in the third race, for he had to overcome many obstacles he encountered soon after the start, but closed an immense gap in the last quarter and won from Old McKenna, with Galway in third place.

Cheer Leader and Gain de Cause, equal favorites, staged a rattling duel in the sixth race, with Cheer Leader, by virtue of having the best going and saving considerable ground on the turn, winning. Gain de Cause was far in advance of Young Adam, which finished before Romeo.

H. C. Busch, under a good ride by the diminutive Jarvis, showed the most speed for the entire way in the seventh race, Capital City landing in second place, with Paddy Dear third. Dababiah II was given considerable attention in the race, but she retired after going a mile, and Jack Reeves, after being far back, closed a big gap and might have been a dangerous contender had he found an opening next to the inner rail in the last quarter.

Lancelot was claimed for \$1,000 by W. Birnie, who was represented in the race by Pueblo.

G. Oddo, A. Svenke and O. Wendel had claims in for Dababiah II, and Oddo secured her in the draw at a cost of \$1,000.

PROSPERITY IN MARYLAND RACING

STATE, AS A FIELD OF RACING, MORE PRODUCTIVE OF MONEY FOR OWNERS THAN KENTUCKY, AND ONLY EXCEEDED IN THAT FEATURE BY THE CANADIAN AND NEW YORK FIELDS

It will probably surprise a good many people to learn that, as a field of racing, Maryland excelled Kentucky in money distributed among winning owners this year. Yet such is the fact. It is also a fact that of the four great racing fields of North America—Canada, New York, Maryland and Kentucky—last place in that respect falls to Kentucky. Decidedly, this is not as it should be. Of the four fields Canada leads with \$1,869,285; New York is second with \$1,598,405; Maryland third with \$1,374,099 and Kentucky last with \$1,364,959, the total for the four being the enormous sum of \$6,146,748. However, Maryland had more racing days than Kentucky, an item in favor of the latter state.

The Maryland Jockey Club led the Maryland racing organizations in both total and daily average distribution and is now one of the most liberal and progressive jockey clubs of the United States. It has done great things for racing in recent years and promises still greater for the near-by future. The two meetings of the Harford Agricultural and Breeders' Association at Havre de Grace gave it precedence over Laurel in total amount produced for owners, but the daily distribution at Laurel excelled that of Havre de Grace. The people running the Bowie track gave less than the controllers of the other three and probably made as much money as any of them. The new Maryland State Racing Commission should see to it that Bowie gives good stake races and otherwise elevates its racing in the future. There is no reasonable excuse for the cheap plan of racing there. With the same number of racing days, Havre de Grace yielded over \$3,000 per day more than Bowie and is less favorably located. Following is an interesting and comprehensive presentation of the statistics of Maryland racing in the good year 1920:

In a fashion the Maryland tracks were home ground for the stable of J. K. L. Ross, Ed. Parr and Edward B. McLean, wherefore it is in no wise surprising to find those owners thriving exceedingly in the Maryland campaign. Commander Ross did best of all in stable winnings with the big total of \$89,936. Then followed R. Parr with \$63,949, H. Clark, Mrs. F. A. with \$59,543 and E. B. McLean with \$43,483. Four more owners won less than these big leaders but more than \$20,000, they being W. J. Salmon with \$39,345, Glen Riddle Farm \$29,800, Sunnyland Stable 22,505 and Samuel Ross \$21,635. We are used to greatly advanced racing values in these days, yet it is worth recalling that it is only a few years back when smaller totals than were credited to the three leaders in Maryland alone this year sufficed to make Sam C. Hildreth the leading winning owner of 1911, John W. Schorr of 1912 and Harry Payne Whitney of 1913. Besides the leading winners named nineteen other owners won less than \$20,000 and more than \$10,000 in Maryland racing this year. These fortunate ones being J. R. Skinker, Gwyn R. Tompkins, L. Waterbury, J. E. Widener, R. T. Wilson, J. W. McClelland, F. Musante, Sam Louis, J. Lumsden, G. Peterson, J. W. Bean, Mrs. F. A. Clark, S. A. Clopton, J. B. Dunn, G. W. Forman, R. Goodloe, J. E. Griffin and S. C. Hildreth. It is no cause for wonder that so many owners regard Maryland racing with favorable eyes. The list of owners who won \$1,000 or more is as follows:

PETER PAN'S TURF CAREER

Sire of Tryster and Prudery a Remarkable Racer.

Won \$116,450 in Two Years' Racing—Best Three-Year-Old of 1907.

The marked success of Tryster and Prudery in the racing of 1920 brings their daddy, Peter Pan, into greater prominence as a sire than ever before. True, Peter Pan has sired other excellent race horses, such as the Futurity winner Pennant, Castleton, a stake winner and one of the fastest sprinters in England, Panopoly, Out the Way, Fibbertyghbet, Peter Piper, Vexations, Exodus and others. However, in Tryster and Prudery good judges believe Peter Pan has sent to the races two horses that will make the son of Commando as famous in the stud as he was on the race course.

Peter Pan was the product of the late James K. Keene's famous Castleton Stud and brought the largest price of any Keene horse at the dispersal sale of that noted turfman's racing and breeding establishment. Peter Pan was a remarkable race horse and unquestionably the best three-year-old of 1907. This is saying a great deal for a colt of the year in which such other grand young racers of that age as Ballot, Salvidore, Frank Gill, Electioneer, Montgomery, Dinna Ken and McCarter formed a collection probably unequalled in any other year. Peter Pan was a superb colt of great speed, a stayer and a weight-carrier of high class.

As a two-year-old Peter Pan was in the first flight and winner of the Surf Stakes at Sheepshead Bay, Fish Stakes and Hopeful Stakes at Saratoga and a purse. In the Hopeful Stakes he carried 139 pounds and ran three-quarters in 1:12½, a great performance. He was second to Water Pearl in the Double Event and third to Salvidore and McCarter in the Saratoga Special. He ran fifth in the Futurity with 127 pounds up when not at his best. He went into winter quarters with the reputation of being a good colt, but not the equal of Salvidore or Electioneer.

Peter Pan's first start as a three-year-old was for the Withers Stakes. To the surprise of all concerned Frank Gill beat him out by a neck in 1:40. All carried 126 pounds and Saracenesca was third. His next start was for the Carlton Stakes at Gravesend. He was beaten again. This time his conqueror was Dinna Ken, but he had to run the mile in 1:38½, to do it, breaking the track record. He carried 111 pounds to Peter Pan's 122 and won by half a length. Charles Edward was third. Then Peter Pan won the rich Belmont Stakes from his stablemate, Superman. Frank Gill was third. It was 126 pounds for all, with no time taken. The timer started his watch at the wrong place. Next he took the Standard Stakes from Electioneer and Flip Flap easily, one and one-quarter miles, in 2:05½, and won the Brooklyn Derby over a heavy track in 2:41 from Panmonok, Yankee Girl, Frank Gill and Oran. In the Tidal Stakes it was easy for him to defeat Hickory and Panmonok in 2:07½ for the mile and a quarter, but in the first running of the Coney Island Jockey Club Stakes, at a mile and a half, he ran unplaced to Frank Gill, Montgomery and Salvidore. He had up 129 pounds and led for a mile and a quarter, but severe racing with Salvidore told and he unexpectedly tired. Then he redeemed himself in the Advance Stakes by running away from Salvidore, Flip Flap, Montgomery, Running Water and two more, one and three-eighths miles, in 2:20.

Peter Pan's last and greatest race was for the \$25,000 Brighton Handicap, in which carrying 115 pounds and giving weight to everything in the race, he ran a mile and a quarter in 2:05½, and won from a crack band of the best handicap horses in this country, McCarter, 101, being second and Montgomery, 109, third. The story of this race is worth repeating. Peter Pan was a hot favorite. The rank and file of the racegoers had sublime faith in the great three-year-old and swamped the ring with their wagers. Peter Pan was ridden by Joe Notter, who at the time was a diminutive lightweight knocking at the door of fame.

The issue after the first half mile was strictly confined to the three horses placed at the end. McCarter, with Miller up, as was to be expected, beat the others away and made the running. For the first mile Miller kept looking back at the others. He did this so often and his horse seemed to be running so powerfully under him that ultimate victory for McCarter was freely predicted even before half the going had been negotiated. Montgomery, in the meantime, was always in near and close pursuit, but Miller apparently was not exercised over the horse's close proximity, but was looking for some one more formidable. This was Peter Pan, of course, which, during the early running, was so far back that he was invisible to the leader.

The favorite got away slowly, hemmed in on both sides and did
