



EDDIE RICKENBACHER WINS

Stays a Mile in Game Style and Fast Time.

Close and Exciting Finishes Again the Order—Marmite Beats Jock Scot by a Nose.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 25.—The speedy Eddie Rickenbacher, regarded as a sprinter only, sprung a surprise in the Christmas Handicap for a purse of \$1,500, at a mile, when he galloped home by a comfortable margin in advance of Dancing Spray, with Master Bill heading the others in third place and Sterling, the favorite, among the unplaced ones.

More pleasant conditions than which governed this afternoon could not be desired and it resulted in record attendance being on hand to witness the most exciting sport that has been noted at the course.

The big crowd was speculatively inclined and kept the "exchange" in a ferment of activity. The layers, however, had by far the better of the speculative argument, for favorites were beaten steadily, several outsiders succeeding in giving the organizers a distinct advantage.

The thrillers began in the initial dash when Marmite just managed to last long enough to beat Jock Scot home by a nose, with Port Light the same distance back.

Sweet Liberty, the favorite in the race, showed the most speed until reaching the last eighth, where she collapsed suddenly and finished far back.

Archie Alexander, Bobby Allen and Title landed in that order at the finish of the second race heads apart after a sensational stretch struggle.

Waukeag, at long odds, just managed to have a nose the best of Golden Dawn at the end of the mile and a sixteenth race, with Nello Yorke a nose back of the pair.

Polythia made her debut in these parts and proved much the best of the highly regarded youngsters starting in the fifth race and led all the way to win easily from Bunga Buck and Madeline Lillian.

C. N. Freeman's colors were carried to victory in a double during the afternoon when War Club, an extreme outsider in the sixth race, duplicated Waukeag's winning race.

The finish in the sixth was also a close one, War Club just managing to outstay the favorite, Dark Hill, with Kimpalong pressing the pair hard.

Jockey Lyke will not be seen in the saddle during the remainder of the Jefferson Park meeting, as a result of reporting to the scales in an unfit condition to ride.

Dr. William Parker of Hot Springs, an ardent admirer of racing and brother of Governor Parker of Louisiana, was among today's visitors.

Starter A. B. Dade, who will do the starting at the Fair Grounds, was among today's visitors at Jefferson Park and witnessed the racing from the stewards' stand.

John W. Conditine and Phil Hyams were among today's New York arrivals.

Great interest is being taken in the trials of the yearlings at the Fair Grounds, which are to make their racing debut as two-year-olds after the first of the year.

EXPERT ON TIJUANA HORSES

George Berry's View of Animals Racing at Far Western Track.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., December 25.—An expert estimate of the capability of the horses at Tijuana is contained in a letter written by George W. Berry, who is training a string for two wealthy oil men at the Lower California track.

"Of the mature division," he writes, "I should say Be Frank is by far the best, with Thunderstorm, Peace Penant and Nopperhan next in order. Of the three-year-olds, on form, Divina seems the best, with Boomerville, I should judge, about next best.

"Of the selling platers I should judge Cover Up, a daughter of Disguise and Costume, and therefore an inbred Domino, to be the best. She is a beautiful individual and should race in better company. I should judge there are approximately fifty yearlings on hand. O. A. Bianchi has five or six, the progeny of Jim Gaffney; W. C. Weant has a half dozen, mostly by Boots and Saddle and Moss Fox; George Van Gordon, five; Van Dusen, seven; Ben Jones, eight; the progeny of Harrigan.

"A beautiful filly by Atheling, dam Leonia, by Woodsthorpe, is in the stable of E. A. Stokes, a capable and painstaking trainer.

"Our Disguise-Las Flores colt is far and away the best-looking yearling in training and has shown best in his work. The Honeywood-Decency colt is developing beautifully.

"All of these colts are being schooled regularly daily at the barrier.

"The feature of the meeting is the starting of Harry Morrissey, which is absolutely perfect. A man can send his horse to the post and rest assured he is going to have a square deal.

"Taking everything into consideration the meeting so far has been a big success. The fake reformers got a sad jolt when the anti-form chart law was snowed under by a vote of the people of San Diego. Looks like the worm was turning."

FAILURES AS PROGENITORS

Few Futurity Winners Have Achieved Success in the Stud.

NEW YORK, N. Y., December 25.—A review of the Futurity, the greatest racing feature for two-year-old thoroughbreds in this country, reveals the fact that few of those which have finished first in this stake have done much for posterity.

None of the colts which have achieved distinction through the race during the thirty-one years it has been held has sired a colt or filly eligible to start that was capable of annexing it.

Artful was the best filly of her day and William C. Whitney, her owner, was eager to match her against Sycoby at Brighton Beach in 1905 to run a mile and an eighth or a mile and a quarter for \$10,000 a side.

Artful was as good as made. Artful to date is a failure in the stud, though there are indications that she will yet make good through her daughter Paintbrush. Maskette was taken to France by Mr. Vanderbilt. She has achieved great distinction as a matron in that country and is one of the most highly prized of the many fine mares which passed to A. K. Macomber when he took over the stable of the late American sportsman.

Of the twenty-two colts Domino founded a family through his son Comodoro, and history will accord him a place of prominence.

Family through his son Comodoro, and history will accord him a place of prominence. Ogden sired a really good horse in The Finn, and Sweep, which has already sired some good horses, among them Eternal, begets so much speed that he must be considered a success.

BALLYHOO BEY A FAILURE.

Of the others Ballyhoo Bey was a failure and so was Savable, though neither had much chance to show their progeny. Ormondale sired Purchase and Ormesdale, a flashy but uncertain performer. Electioneer gave the turf a fair horse in Leo Ray, and then went to Canada where he was mated with nothing but cold-blooded dams.

This leaves Trojan, Dumboyne and Man of War for consideration. There is a lot of discussion as to whether the latter is a chance horse. The fact that his sire was a high-class horse and the sire of his dam was a winner of the Triple Crown, while he himself was a veritable Titan, favors the belief that he will sire a great horse.

The Futurity is the oldest of the breeding prizes of the American turf and with its traditions and values has done much for the thoroughbred. It carries a greater sentimental appeal than any other turf fixture, and the action of the Westchester management in adding \$10,000 to the stake will no doubt result in an increased entry for the race in 1923.

Racing secretary Earlocker of the Westchester Racing Association, who is now in Kentucky on a visit, reports the greatest degree of interest in the Futurity. Taking into consideration the fact that the other events to be decided at Belmont Park, which closed recently, had a flattering increase over previous years, it is believed that the Futurity for 1923 will break all records.

The additions which have been made for the accommodation of the public at Belmont Park will be none too large to take care of the crowd which will gather to see the Futurity of 1923 and those that come after.

CUBAN FEATURE TO HERRON

Derby Winner Defeats Atta Boy II. in Christmas Handicap.

Race Thriller from Start to Finish

—Four Straight Wins for

Vic Munoz.

HAVANA, Cuba, Dec. 25.—Senor E. L. Alvarez' good colt Herron turned the tables on Atta Boy II. in the running of the Christmas Handicap this afternoon when he came from behind in a spirited finish and won the race.

Mose Goldblatt's Furbelou accounted for the Santa Claus Handicap when he beat Assumption by a scant length. The winner was swerving all over the track in the stretch run and at the end sharply interfered with Assumption, which undoubtedly would have won with a clear way.

The crack Peter Pan colt Vic Munoz, carrying the silks of the Armonia stable, won his fourth straight victory when he was returned winner of the first race of the afternoon.

A show start ruined whatever chance old Hoicnr had of winning the second race, in which he was the favorite. He finished third, only beaten a nose for second place, while Polar Cub had no trouble annexing the purse, as Avion's fractious behavior at the post told on her at the end.

The veteran turfman T. Cheek scored another success here when his Peep of Day gelding Red led all the way in the third and under Butwell's energetic riding lasted long enough to secure a close decision over Huntress.

The McGee gelding View was best in the fourth race and ran accordingly, never being in danger of defeat at any part of the contest.

The Armonia stable furnished two winners in Vic Munoz and Riverside, the latter accounting for the seventh race.

The entry of the mare Jill has been refused until the owner and trainer come to some understanding regarding some settlement of the latter's claims.

W. F. Knebelkamp, owner of the Louisville baseball club, will arrive with Mrs. Knebelkamp next week on an extended visit. He has a stable of horses at the local track in charge of W. B. Fimegan.

The Cuba-American Jockey Club offered for the seven races today a total of \$7,600, which is a record here.

E. Brewster is rapidly disposing of the horses he brought to Cuba belonging to Jack Keene. He sold today Miss Dixie and Darley Belle to M. E. Thompson. Willow Tree is now the only horse left and when this one is disposed of he will leave for New Orleans to assume charge of the Keene horses racing in that city, which are in care of Liam Keene. The latter is going to Arizona for his health. Jockey McCoy will accompany Mr. Brewster to New Orleans.

Several hundred patrons enjoyed the Christmas dinner in the grandstand restaurant. The menu was varied and included many dishes appropriate for the holidays. Steward Fred Engle was in charge of the arrangements in preparation for the feast under the supervision of chef Monsieur Marius Matot.
