STAKES TO BILLY BARTON

Scores Easy Victory in Cuba Two-Year-Old Mile Championship.

Bread Man Takes Secondary Feature—Dates for Remaining Stake Events.

HAVANA, Cuba, December 26.—Billy Barton, racing under the colors of Mose Goldblatt and making his first appearance at this meeting, accounted for the Cuba Two-Year-Old Mile Championship Stakes at Oriental Park this afternoon.

Bread Man showed another good performance today when he galloped home an easy winner in the "No Sallente" Handicap. This was a dash of one and one-sixteenth miles for a purse of \$1,200.

The dates for the running of the remaining stakes to be decided at Oriental Park have been announced as follows:

Director James at the odds-on of 12 to 1 furnished a big surprise by taking the second race. He was ridden by Bert Kennedy and under the latter's energetic handling led all the way, easily holding off Our Nephew, the nominated choice.

W. C. Westmoreland provided the winner of the opening dash in the Astronomer filly Gratian. She was kept close to the pacemaker Get 'Em until the last quarter, when she easily took command and had a length's advantage at the end.

FACTS ABOUT STALLION SEA HORSE II.

While as yet no horse above the ordinary has been sired by the Canadian National Bureau stallion Sea Horse II, since his arrival in Canada, breeders and horsemen of the Dominion are sanguine that some of his youngsters will develop into the class of thoroughbreds expected of the descendants of their internationally famous daddy.

Raced in New Zealand, Australia, England and the United States. Won at all distances from half a mile to two miles and a quarter on the flat, over hurdles and through the field.

Cost \$16,000 when nine years old and was insured for \$10,000 when brought to Canada. Won the New Zealand Cup of \$7,500, two miles; Auckland Handicap, Criterion Handicap, Short's Handicap, Hawkes Bay Guineas, Spring Handicap, Canterbury Derby, Canterbury Cup (two and one-quarter miles) and the Auckland Plate, besides many races through the field.

Worked a mile and one-quarter at Saratoga in 2:05 1/2 in preparation for a steeplechase. Sired by Nelson, winner of twenty-three races, mostly stakes, in thirty-eight starts and nineteen races at more than a mile and a half.

Nelson was out of My Idea, by Yattendon, which won the Sydney Cup in 1865 and sired Chester, winner of nineteen races out of forty-one starts, and Flaneur, unbeaten.

The dam of Sea Horse II, was Moonga, by Goldsborough, which defeated a field of eighteen in the Sydney Cup, running two miles on the turf in 3:32 1/2, with 129 pounds up. Goldsborough sired Melos, which defeated Carbine in the Champion Race Cup, and Arsenal, winner of the Melbourne Cup of 1886.

As a brood mare sire Goldsborough was the equal of Ratanap, Touchstone, Hermit, or even Stockwell. He got Cinchona, dam of Abercorn, winner of \$140,000 in four seasons; Frailty, dam of Trenton, Cuirassier and Niagara, the latter the only native sire to head the list for seven seasons.

Sea Horse II, has five crosses of Sir Hercules, the best son of Whalebone and the last of his get. But for Sir Hercules there would be no Faugh-a-Ballagh nor Birdcatcher and therefore no Stockwell, Ratanap nor Biscanony in England and no Learnington in the United States.

COMPLETE ENGLISH FIGURES

Sir R. Jardine, Cinna, Donoghue and Polymelus the Leading Winners.

LONDON, England, December 6.—The English flat racing season closed November 27 and only action will be under National Hunt or meetings outside the governance of the Jockey Club until March 14 next, when regular racing is resumed as usual, at Lincoln, with the Lincolnshire Handicap on its third day. This year regular racing began March 22. It was a peculiar season in many ways.

Sir R. W. B. Jardine led the owners who won over \$25,000 during the eight months. There were twenty-eight in the list, which follows:

BRUCE LOWE NO. 6 FAMILY

Diomed Early Member Gave America Lexington—French Success with Group Marked.

(BY EXILE.)

The first Derby ever run was won in 1780 by the No. 6 horse Diomed, which afterward, in his old age, was sent to this country, here to become the ancestor of Lexington. A brave start was this for family No. 6, and prior to Diomed's time, too, many famous race horses and sires swore allegiance to family No. 6, among them Gade, sire of Matchem, Bartlett's Childers, ancestor of Eclipse, his brother Flying Childers, Cygnet, King Fergus, male ancestor of Blacklock and Orville, Sorcerer, ancestor of Melbourne, Eleanor, this first filly winner of the Derby, and the Derby winner Phantom.

The French have, it would seem, done better with No. 6 horses than the English. The best of the No. 6 French horses I take to be Androcles, Gardefeu, Peuprepaire, Beaumont, Rayon d'Or's sire, Flageolet and Heaume.

In this country No. 6 horses such as Old Rosebud, Worth and Free Lance won. Sir Martin's sire Ogden is the sire of many another good winner, including Star Jasmine and The Firm. Basselaw struggled along but slowly. Escher did well as a sire. Down in South America Old Man, sire of the top-price Betafogo, is a No. 6 horse, but on account of the irregularity of their success in any line of endeavor members of the Old Bald Peg family have not much to recommend them.

PRODUCTIVE BRANCHES OF FAMILY.

No one particular branch of the No. 6 family is especially productive of winners. Flageolet, Ogden, Grey Leg, Erla Mor and Ferry trace to Constance by Gladiator, as also do those high-priced Lord Glanely's Blue Tit yearlings of this and last year.

The Protection by Defence branch of the No. 6 family is as good as any, for to Protection trace Cleopatra's sire Coreya, the stud failure Porfarius, Prior Lubin, The Rover, sire of St. Gatien, Mureoran and See Saw. Good though this may be, it is by no means great. To Worry by Welf, ancestress of Protection and also of Error, trace those two good French horses the ill-starred Holcauste and Gardelen. To Green Mantle, by Sultan, trace many good winners.

But no genuine success as a sire has come from this branch of the family. Young Giantess, daughter of the No. 6 Diomed, bred the Derby winner Eleanor, ancestress of Father Thames and Escher and her sister Priam's dam Cressida. To Young Giantess, via an unnamed daughter of Walton, also trace Basselaw and Veredeno, sire of Lassuk, dam of the Russian Derby winner Irish Lad.

A small though good branch of the No. 6 family was founded by Fair Charlotte, daughter of Cotton, and to her trace Musjid, the French sire Androcles, and the South American sire Old Man. Pleuprepaire, a good race horse though he was, failed to set up a house of his own and Pleuprepaire was a member of the Pipylina branch of the No. 6 family.

For some years success for them has, to say the least of it, been a bit sketchy and this may or may not be due to inbreeding in the early days of the history of the turf.

RUMORED RACING UPHEAVAL

New Orleans Fair Grounds May Have New Controllers.

Prospect the New Louisiana Jockey Club May Be Revived and Take Charge Soon.

(BY J. L. DEMPSEY.)

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 26.—Developments came thick and fast today in the racing situation concerning the Fair Grounds, where a thirty-three days meeting is to be inaugurated on next Saturday. Two of the local newspapers carried page stories to the effect that B. C. McClellan had tendered his resignation as president of the Business Men's Racing Association and one of them reports that Judge Joseph Murphy has been selected as presiding steward and manager of the racing department of this organization.

In regard to the betting system one paper states that Judge Murphy has devised a new plan, which was passed upon by the best lawyers in this section, and they have declared that it is within the provisions of the Locke law in every respect.

EDDY WILL NOT RESIGN.

It is said that president McClellan has confided to personal friends that he will step down and out. Reports of his forthcoming resignation have throughout been coupled with similar gossip regarding Robert S. Eddy, general manager of the Business Men's Racing Association, who has a contract with that organization that does not expire until May, 1921.

Seventeen choices were successful in forty-two races during the past week, which brings the total of winning favorites at the meeting up to eighty-four out of one hundred and eighty-nine races.

Odds-on choices were scarce in the past six days, only four going to the post, three of which won. Thus far twenty-two horses at less than even money have been returned winners at Jefferson Park, while fifteen met defeat.

In twenty-seven days the Jefferson Park track has distributed \$138,100 in purse money and one hundred and seventy owners have cut in on it. A Clifton's horses have earned more for him than any other stable, \$7,957.75. Others well up in the list of purse winning owners are: J. R. Skinker, \$4,515.56; C. N. Freeman, \$4,080.25; Snyder & Holmes, \$3,765.50; Lyod Gentry, \$3,555.75; Alex R. Gordon, \$3,145; Florissant Stable, \$3,060.50, and L. A. Broadus, \$2,926.

The contest for riding honors is more spirited than ever. Jockey J. J. Mooney is the leader, he having won eighteen races, but he is being hard pressed by C. Ponce, who has scored seventeen times, and H. King, who has piloted sixteen winners. J. Roberts and F. Coltrilli are next in order with fourteen and thirteen wins respectively. Seventy jockeys have accepted mounts at Jefferson Park and forty-seven have ridden one or more winners.

Many people viewed the workouts at the Fair Grounds this morning. This was the first Sunday morning this winter that a fast track was available there and the visitors were able to get a look at the coming two-year-olds at a time when they had a chance to show their best wares.

Both tracks here fairly swarmed with horses at exercise this morning.

ENTRIES TO NEW YEAR'S HANDICAP

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 26.—Thirty nominations were made to the \$3,000 added New Year's Handicap, to be run on next Saturday at the Fair Grounds. This race will be at one and one-sixteenth miles for three-year-olds and over. The entry fee was \$5 and it will cost \$15 additional to start. Weights to be announced by racing secretary J. McLennan on Wednesday.
