RAIN PAYS ANOTHER VISIT

Jefferson Park Drenched, but Good Racing Is Not Prevented.

Angon Defeats Rapid Day Narrowly in a Long Drive Through the Stretch—Track Gossip.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 27.—Lloyd Gentry's Angon, shouldering 138 pounds, again figured in a winning performance when he accounted for the five and a half furlongs handicap which featured today's program, but his success was only accomplished after one of his hardest efforts, for Rapid Day gave him a stubborn battle all through the stretch and with a better beginning might have reversed the decision, for only a slight head separated the pair at the finish. Angon essayed keeping close to Cock o' the Roost during the early running and, succeeding, had little difficulty in taking the lead on the stretch turn and at this point appeared as if he would win in easy style, but Rapid Day came along with a terrific rush, forcing Murray on Angon to go to the whip and the last eighth found the pair driving to the limit, with Angon just managing to retain a head advantage to the end. Angon was an overwhelming favorite and his victory was popular.

A twenty-four-hour respite is seemingly all the Jefferson Park track can obtain from the weather man, for a heavy rain storm again visited the course during the afternoon and caused bad conditions. Considering the adverse weather a surprisingly large attendance, almost causing congestion, was present. Scratches, as a result of the changed track, were numerous, but it improved the sport. Several of the finishes being hard fought from barrier to the finish.

Backers of favorites began badly when the first four choices went down into defeat. They inaugurated their failures with Secretary, which was beaten a short distance by Tony Sutton, which led for the entire race.

Sentimental was backed to the exclusion of the other starters in the second race, but the best she could do was to land in third place. Mooney's weak riding being partially to blame. The purse in this race fell to Ivanmist, which beat Madras Gingham hand by a nose.

Harry Burgoyne was the next surprise, his victory coming unexpectedly after Valerie West had appeared a certain winner, but she quit right at the end, enabling Harry Burgoyne to get up in the last strides. Poultry, a reeding favorite, landed third.

Tan Son was the victor in the fourth race and his margin was only a nose better than Petrarch, with Undine, a supposed "good thing," a nose back of the pair and the same margin before Mary Head.

Medusa was favorite in the sixth race and was the easiest winner of the afternoon, leading from the start and winning as her rider pleased, with Betsy in second place and Kirstie's Cub just outstaying Walter Turnbow.

Jockey Thurber was taken sick after riding Cock o' the Roost and was displaced on Highland Lad by Murray.

David Gideon was among the newcomers from New York and will remain for the rest of the racing season.

The stewards found extenuating circumstances for Layke's unfitness to ride Saturday which brought about his suspension in the fact that he had reduced eleven pounds. The suspension was removed and he will resume riding tomorrow.

Acting for Bud Fisher, the noted cartoonist, E. R. Bradley has bought on private terms the colt Muskallone from G. L. Blackford. The purchase price is said to have been \$10,000. He will be trained by B. C. Benbury.

E. C. Smith, Malcolm Macfarlan and Allen Mehle, who will act as stewards during the coming Fair Grounds meeting, will meet next Thursday to go over the applications for trainer and jockey licenses.

Secretary McLeeman of the Fair Grounds announced that entries during the coming Fair Grounds racing will close daily at 10:30 a. m. instead of 11:00 o'clock, as in former meetings.

Dr. L. N. Holmes, veterinarian, has been added to the roster of the Fair Grounds officials, according to an announcement made by general manager Robert S. Eddy, Jr., this morning. Dr. Holmes will serve as one of the stewards and his activities will be from the ground, surveying racing matters in general from various stations.

INTERESTING VISITOR AT TIJUANA

SAN DIEGO, Cal., December 27.—A recent visitor at the Tijuana track was George Lane, owner of the famous Bar U ranch in Alberta, Can. Mr. Lane is one of the great ranchers of the Northwest, farming 10,000 acres of wheat land and grazing vast numbers of horses and cattle on his ranges. He is the largest breeder of Percherons in America and his trade goes both east and west. He sends horses to England that win in the principal show rings and has exported a big consignment of Canadian-breds to Japan. Mr. Lane's interest in horses is not confined to the big ones, as he is president of the Thoroughbred Horse Society of Alberta and of the Chinook Jockey Club of Calgary. He is a neighbor and partner of the Prince of Wales, for whom he last year selected 4,000 acres of land adjoining the Bar U and in concert with whom he has imported a number of thoroughbred mares and young stock, to soon be joined by a stallion selected from the king's stud, and whose progeny will, as soon as they are ready for racing, be seen in action on Canadian and American courses.

WEDDING CAKE TO RACE NO MORE

NEW YORK, N. Y., December 27.—J. H. Rosseter's good filly Wedding Cake, 3, by Rock View-Latona, by Sain, will race no more. Trainer Burlew will ship her from the Belmont Park stable to Kentucky within a few days. She is to go into the stud as a matron. It is not known with whom Wedding Cake will be mated.

DISPUTE OVER MARYLAND TAX

Track Managements Differ with Racing Commission as to Methods of Computation.

BALTIMORE, Md., December 27.—Thursday, January 30 is the date for the hearing at which appears may be made from the Maryland Racing Commission's computation of the 15 per cent of the net earnings of the four one-mile tracks due the state.

While only one of the racing associations has requested a hearing, the other three tracks are not allowing their interests to drag and they will have their representatives, in the event that they, too, may decide to make an appeal in the same matter.

The one which has asked for the hearing is the Maryland State Fair, which conducts the racing at the Laurel track. J. E. Hayward, secretary to the racing commission, today advised Janney, Stuart & Ober as counsel for the Maryland State Fair of the granting of the request and of the date set for the hearing.

C. L. Strauss, counsel for the Maryland Jockey Club, operating Pimlico, called at the offices of the racing commission a day or so ago and requested the privilege of conferring with the board, either directly or through Attorney General Armstrong, with reference to the board's computation of earnings in so far as the Pimlico track is concerned.

Shirley Carter, counsel for the Southern Maryland Agricultural Association, which controls Bowie, also paid the commission a call and secured some data relative to the apportionment of the 15 per cent tax. Judging from the action of the legal representatives of the Pimlico and Bowie tracks, it is probable that they will take advantage of the opportunity to join in the appeal with the Laurel track interests.

The racing commission has not yet asked the attorney general for a formal ruling as to its powers under the law in determining the proportion of expense for new construction, etc., that can be legally charged against the tracks for the year, or rather against that portion of the year during which the tracks have been under the jurisdiction of the commission.

Whether payment to the state treasurer of receipts from the track shall be made in a lump sum after the question of the 15 per cent tax has been decided had not been ruled upon this morning by the commission.

The state has due from the commission \$6,000 for each of the sixty-nine racing days of the fall season, this amount totaling \$414,000. The commission has the money in hand and can transmit it, less expenses and a working balance, by the first of the year. Such deductions would amount to approximately \$30,000, so that the state would receive from the \$6,000 per diem fee about \$384,000.

The commission has already fixed the total of 15 per cent tax due from the tracks at \$132,000. The tracks estimate the amount of tax due at between \$92,000 and \$93,000. The amount that will ultimately be paid by the tracks will, therefore, not be in excess of \$132,000, and if the commission consents to a revision on downward, it will be less than that amount.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., December 27.—Well-sounding names have been selected by Adolph B. Spreckels for his fifteen coming two-year-olds in training at Pleasanton. All of the youngsters were bred and raised at the owner's famous Napa Stock Farm and were shipped to Pleasanton to be prepared for racing over the New York tracks next spring. Mr. Spreckels has bred some high-class horses in years gone by and it appears that his reputation will be more than sustained by the latest band to be put into training.

The "pick of the basket" of the babies is undoubtedly a finely-formed chestnut, given the name of Runstar, by the Votter stallion Runnymede, dam the Salvation mare Salvatrix, a good producer. Trainer C. W. ("Bill") Carroll believes he has another Dr. Leggo in this colt.

FIELD DAY FOR F. WILSON

Rides Four Winners at Havana—Right Angle Defeats Out the Way.

HAVANA, Cuba, December 27.—The unreliable sprinter Right Angle scored his first victory under the colors of the Armonia Stable this afternoon when he got up in the final stride and beat the fast horse Out the Way in the \$1,000 handicap, run as the third race. Out the Way set a terrific pace, leading with a good margin until well inside the last eighth, where he tired badly and just failed to last long enough. The finish was close and required the official placing to decide the winner.

The attendance today was quite flattering considering that it was Monday and immediately following two holidays. Speculation was keen and the public gave the books an awful drubbing.

The outstanding feature of this afternoon's sport was the riding of jockey F. Wilson, who rode four winners, three in a row.

Hunter Platt, under Barwell's powerful finish, took the initial dash, defeating Driffield by a head. Lithford led all the way in the second, but was doing his best at the end to hold Gold Stone safe.

Penelope set the pace throughout in the fourth race and was never in danger. Wilson had the mount on Penelope and followed this success by bringing Guaranteed and Clip home victorious in the final two races.

Jockey Kennedy canceled his engagements on account of illness.

The mare Little Panchiti, which was due to foal in February, slipped the colt in foal by J. J. Murdock last night. Little Panchiti was purchased a few days ago by J. E. Wallace.

Brigida was kicked while at the post in the last race and will be on the shelf for a couple of weeks.

Jockey Fletcher was suspended for five days by the starter for disobedience at the post in the first race.

Bill Hunley was claimed by T. Doyle for \$1,100.

STEPHEN DONOGHUE'S MANY WINNERS

In seven racing seasons, 1914-1920, the leading jockey of Great Britain, Stephen Donoghue, has ridden 612 winners. His best years were 1914 and 1919, 129 winners each, and this, during which he scored 143 wins. Donoghue has been on three Epsom Derby winners, two of the Two Thousand Guineas, one of the Oaks, one of the St. Leger, but has never ridden a filly to win the One Thousand Guineas.

GRAND NATIONAL VALUE RAISED

It is announced that the 1921 Grand National Steeplechase will be of \$25,000 added. The starting fee will be \$250, entrance \$50, acceptance of weight \$100. Last year's added money was \$17,500 and the race was worth \$21,875. Next April's race will be worth about \$32,000.

BRUCE LOWE NO. 7 FAMILY

Not a Group from Which Regularly Influential Horses Come.

Responsible for Our Great Levity Family and Many Matrons of Excellence.

(BY ENLIE.)

The D'Arcy's black-legged Royal mare, or Bruce Lowe No. 7 family, is occasionally responsible for the production of a race horse or sire of unusual excellence. For all this, though, it is not a family from which really influential horses with any regularity do come.

The No. 7 horse Trustee, in this country, is the sire of that famous stud matron Levity. Otherwise no No. 7 horse has, so far as I am aware, made any great reputation for himself as a sire here, and even Trustee left no son behind strong enough to carry on his line.

The Matchem line lives best because of the No. 7 sire West Australian. Matchem's ancestor in the direct male line is the No. 7 horse Walton, but it looks as though the end were in sight for the Wild Dayrell line, and the Eclipse line of the No. 7 horse Henningbrough has also ceased to be. All of this is the cause of much speculation as to what fate holds in store for the male line of St. Simon, as brought forward by the No. 7 horses Persimmon and his brother Florizel and Diamond Jubilee. Persimmon's No. 7 son, however, Comedy King, is making a go of it down in Australia and I cannot think that the case of sire perpetuation for No. 7 horses quite so forlorn as it is for members of family No. 5.

Many and good are the winners and sires of race horses, which trace to the foundation mare, Myrrha, dam of Malecoln, by Malek. Myrrha bred three good producing daughters, Queen of the May, by Serl Hercules; Messalina, by Bay Middleton, and her sister, Ellen Middleton. Ellen Middleton was best, for not only did she breed the Derby winner Wild Dayrell, but to her trace this year's winner of the St. Leger, Calgula, Pictor, Hector, Jaeger, Lanus and that great trinity, Persimmon, Florizel II, and Diamond Jubilee. Messalina is ancestress of Remorse, and, in France, of Saxifrage and Salsador, and to Queen of the May trace Hacklet and all the descendants of Cleeley Hacklet.

The Gilsbie Fairy by the Hermes branch of the No. 7 family is largest. Gilsbie Fairy, to the several matings of Whisker, bred four good daughters in Maria, Emma, Caroline and Maid of Lune. The best of these were Maria and Emma.

Maria herself foaled Enclid, Extempore and Equation, all by Emilius and Extempore, ancestress of Comedy King, Fieldfowler, Wisdom, Mordant, Dean Swift and Flying Fox. The Maid of Lune and Caroline branches are nothing like so fertile of winners, but the Emma branch is good, indeed. To Emma trace Donovan, Raeburn, Semolina, Caterer, King Monmouth and Parmesan. There is something rather uncanny about these non-sire lines, for from these families so many times come sires which are not capable of transmitting their own sire excellence to their sons and grandsons. If this is not so, what, then, the cause of the passing of Parmesan in the male line, or the non-success, as a sire of sires, of that truly good race horse Donovan.

But what all of you wish, I know, are winners and mares which will breed them. None of you can go wrong in buying either yearlings or brood mares which trace in the female line to Maria's granddaughter, Jen d'Esprit, by Flatcatcher, to Go-ahead, granddaughter of Emma, and members of either the Messalina or Ellen Middleton branches of the Myrrha by Malek division of the No. 7 family.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

W. R. Coe has three yearlings in Cuba, two by Harmonicon and one by Hell's Bells.

Recent claims at Tijuana included: Kentucky Boy, owned by R. H. Good, was claimed by C. Vail for \$900 and Happy Valley, owned by A. Lund, went to L. T. Whitehill for \$1,200.

Elias O. Anita Springer, Betsy's Pet and Hyeree are the names of the yearlings that will carry the colors of E. D. Springer in the juvenile races to be run at Havana after January 1.

In the outside stables at Belmont Park are four horses owned by Otto Rasch, three by T. O. Moore and one yearling belonging to T. J. Healey. They have stalls in the menaced stables and are there for the winter.

Thomas Monahan has three promising yearlings at Oriental Park in Speed, a chestnut colt by Frizzle—Elizabeth Peyton; Baby Boy, a bay son of Abumim—Magic Shot, and Ann M., a brown daughter of Light Brigade—Ringosa.

The Orby—Message filly Head Note, for which Lord Wilton paid \$30,000 as a yearling, was sold to J. H. Pearl at the Newmarket December sales for \$12,500 for use as a brood mare. She was useless in racing.

F. Ambrose Clark will make his return to steeplechasing in 1921 with four green four-year-olds. In the past Mr. Clark cut quite a figure in the ranks of the timbercoppers. He will ship all four to Aiken, S. C., to winter and have them conditioned for next season.

The entries of Phedden and Walter Mack were ordered refused by the stewards at Tijuana pending an investigation of their ownership. These horses have been running in the name of H. E. Crist, but it is reported that they are really owned by a man ruled off the turf.

During 1920, though Italy is supposed to be in a bad financial way, \$640,547 was given in stakes and purses for flat racing and \$78,596 for steeplechasing and hurdle racing. The Besnater Stud with \$96,295, Signor de Tesio with \$67,870 and Signor G. de Montel with \$55,950 were the leading winner owners.
