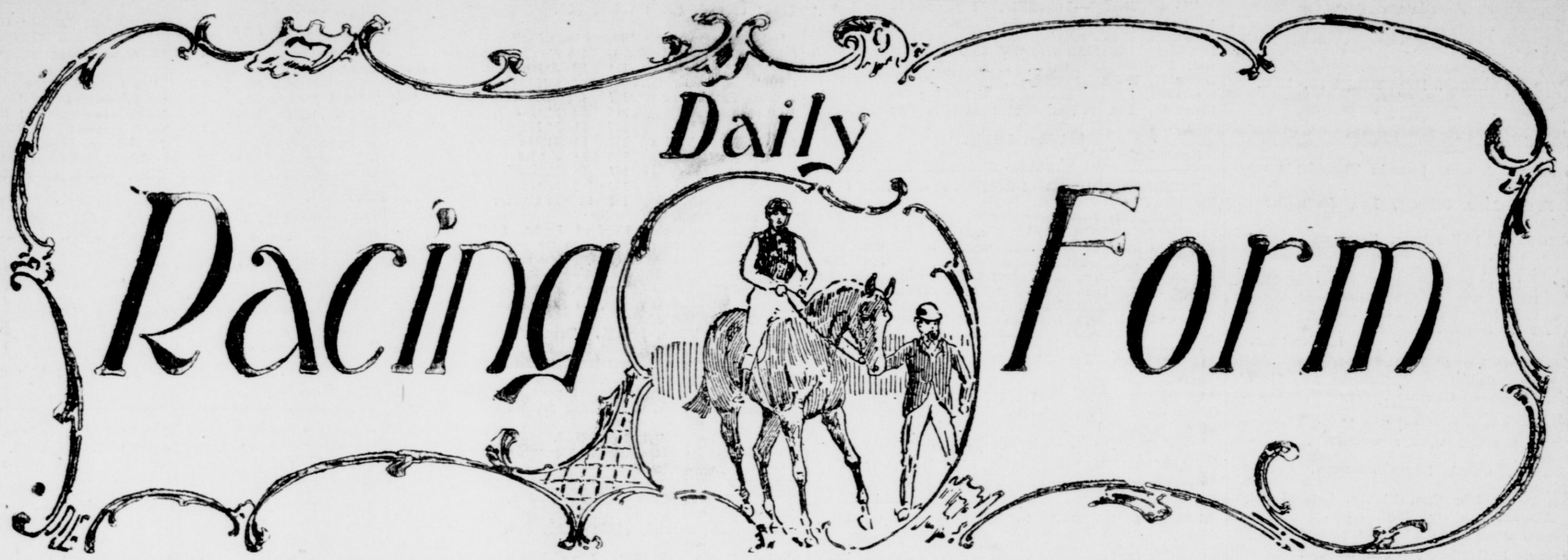

BRUCE LOWE NO. 9 FAMILY

Maid of Masham Branch One of the Best of Groups.

Much of Its Quality in America—How Its Excellence Was Gathered and Held.

(BY EXILE.)

The Maid of Masham branch of the No. 9 family is now recognized as being, on all counts, one of the best all round of the Bruce Lowe families. This is the result, as I see it, of the introduction of the Matchem strain, through Young Melbourne and his sons Rapid Rhine and Brother to Stafford. Theoretically, it is facts and facts, and it was not until the daughters, and other female descendants of Maid of Masham, were bred to Melbourne sires that this branch of the No. 9 family sprang into prominence. Since this was done, however, the success, both as sires and as race horses, of members of this family has been nothing short of amazing.

Until the days of Cylene, with one exception, no strong male line to either Herod, Matchem or Eclipse was brought forward by a No. 9 horse. The one exception is Bramble, sire of the Maria West horse Ben Brush, and it is on account of these two that the Don John line to Eclipse still carries on. Ben Brush, as you know, is the only non-figure sire to head the American winning stallion list and Bramble the only No. 9 sire transmitted, prior to 1895, to bring forward a strong sire line from either of the three fountain heads. Moreover, so far as I am aware, the Don John-Bonnie Scotland line to Eclipse lives and flourishes only in the United States. The success of Bonnie Scotland line horses as sires is proverbial. It is remarkable, therefore, that one of these transmitters of sire excellence should be a No. 9 horse and the other a member of the non-figure family of Maria West. This, I take it, is further proof that outcrossing is the life and soul of horse breeding. In this connection permit me to point out that with due care in the selection of desirable mates the line of Bonnie Scotland may be so built up and strengthened that the bloodstock breeders of the world in time will find it incumbent upon them to seek out-cross sires in this country to help out their own already overworked lines of Eclipse.

Since Bramble's day the No. 9 sire Cylene has appeared on the scene and at the present the Bend Or line best carried on by Cylene's son, Polymelus is another impressive No. 9 newcomer, though he is not a member of the Maid of Masham branch of the family. So is Dark Ronald, the successful sire of the One Thousand Guineas winner Vancluse, son in law, Magpie, Ambassador and the newcomer Brown Prince.

HEROD; MATCHEM; ECLIPSE BLEND.

Maid of Masham, a chestnut daughter of Don John—what a really influential sire he was!—was foaled in 1845 and became the dam of five good producing daughters and no prominent sires. The best of these were Gilbert's dam, by Topophilite; Lady Masham, by Brother to Stafford, an unnamed daughter of Young Melbourne; Faraway, by Young Melbourne, and Outfits' dam, by Toddington; Gilbert's dam bred Stella and Lady Paramount, by the Matchem sire Brother to Stafford and Black Star by the Eclipse horse Fore-runner. Here, indeed, is a good object lesson concerning the good results which come from a blending of the strains of Herod, Matchem and Eclipse—in other words, outcrossing. Those of you who have made an intelligent study of bloodstock breeding do not need to be told by which mare the Maid of Masham family is best carried on. There is no room for argument here and I for one am convinced that the Matchem blood of Brother to Stafford is in great measure responsible for the success of the Stella branch of the family, for to Stella trace the four times leading sire of the United States, Star Shoot, Sidus and St. Celestra, Ecton, St. Astra and Diavolezza in France, as against the rather indifferent success, both as a race horse and sire, of Hessian.

The Lady Masham, also by Brother to Stafford, branch of the family is responsible for the production of some real horses in Peter, Timothy, Friar Rock and Fair Play. To the unnamed daughter of Young Melbourne trace Sir Martin and Sir Barton, and Faraway, by Young Melbourne, is ancestress of the Derby sire Cylene, the Cesarewitch winner Yentol, Whittier and all the many good winning descendants of Distant Shore. A word here as to nomenclature: Faraway, Distant Shore, Landsend, Arcadia. Can you beat it? I fancy not.

PROFITS OF OVER \$2,000,000

Earned by Tracks in Ontario—Windsor Ranks First with \$630,000.

TORONTO, Ont., December 29.—The aggregate profits made by the racing associations in Ontario during 1920, according to figures submitted to the provincial treasurer's department, work out at about \$2,275,000. A credit balance was the outcome of every meeting, with the exception of the second of the Ontario Jockey Club, which showed a slight deficit, but the spring meeting netted a gain of \$215,752. In the matter of profits the Windsor Jockey Club ranks first with \$630,000, Kenilworth following with \$406,000 and the Niagara Racing Association third with \$382,000. The Western Racing Association came out on the right side by \$265,000, the Ontario Jockey Club by \$211,000, Hamilton Jockey Club by \$159,000, Thorncliffe Park, \$123,000; Metropolitan Racing Association, \$57,000, and the Toronto Driving Club, \$43,076.

An analysis of the returns made to the provincial treasurer by the racing clubs of Ontario for the year shows that a total amount of over \$42,000,000 was wagered at the various meetings. The figures submitted by the Windsor Jockey Club heads the list with \$7,819,377. Kenilworth comes next with \$6,902,317. The Ontario Jockey Club is third with \$6,727,372. Returns regarding the meetings at Dufferin Park, Toronto, were available today, these showing that at the meeting under the auspices of the Metropolitan Racing Association the amount wagered was \$1,185,102, and at the Toronto Driving Club \$1,029,420.

In the case of the Metropolitan Racing Association the net gain is given as \$57,283, the receipts including \$118,510 from the mutuels, being \$147,790 and the disbursements \$90,446. At the Toronto Driving Club's meeting a net gain of \$43,076 is recorded. The receipts total \$133,207, of which \$102,926 was from mutuels. The disbursements figured \$90,131.

HEAVY TRACK AT HAVANA

Blazeaway First in Principal Race of Day—Good Sport Despite Difficult Going.

HAVANA, Cuba, December 29.—Racing at Oriental Park today was over a heavy track. There was no outstanding feature, the fourth race being the main offering of the program. A good band of sprinters with a partiality for a soft track made up the field with favorites divided between Blazeaway and Discussion. They finished first and third as named with Osgood between them. The latter is a superior mud runner and set a fast pace for the going, showing the way from the start, but was no match for Blazeaway when the final test came, although he was in close quarters at the end. Discussion ran well and forwardly throughout, but tired in the final strides.

Despite cloudy skies a large crowd turned out this afternoon. It was one of the biggest midweek attendances this season. Well balanced fields went to the post and interesting contests were in order.

After many unsuccessful attempts, the Havana filly Ravanna finally managed to graduate from the maiden ranks when she won the first race today. In doing so she upset a well-planned coup with Kenmore, which was backed down from 15 to 6 to 1. The latter set the pace to the last eighth, where Ravanna took command to win by a safe margin.

No liberties were taken with Floor in the second race, and the Loydecker color bearer led all the way, gamely and successfully resisting the menacing closing challenge of the much-raced Timothy J. Hogan, which has only been once outside of the money in his last nine starts, without, however, a winning bracket to his credit. At the eighth post it appeared as if Timothy J. Hogan would win, but just as he got on even terms with the leader he tired and lost a close decision.

Lucie May scored a lucky victory in the third race. After leading by a wide margin to the last eighth, she tired suddenly and, in a twinkling, a ten-length lead dwindled into a neck-and-neck finish. Miss Wright just failing to overtake her as the winning line was crossed. Le Balafre, the favorite, was close by, finishing fastest of all after beginning slowly.

After being outrun in the early part of the fifth race Bill Hunley came from the rear with a fine display of speed and, overtaking the leader in the stretch, fought it out gamely in the last eighth to win drawing clear. But for excessive use in racing Ed Garrison and Senator James into defeat in the first half, Scarpia II. would probably have won. However, his early efforts told when hard pressed by the ultimate winner.

Jockey F. Hunt made it a double when he brought home Lariat an easy winner in the final race of the afternoon. Hunt had previously ridden Blazeaway to victory in the fourth race. He had no trouble scoring with Lariat, as the latter held his opponents safe throughout.

Mose Goldblatt's imported three-year-old colt Atta Boy II., regarded as one of the best horses in the handicap division at Oriental Park, is one of the horses Senor E. Alvarez is contemplating buying from Mr. Goldblatt. However, the horse sustained injuries this afternoon that may cause his temporary retirement from racing. While being worked between the first and second races the horse collided with another near the three-quarters post and, after unseating the rider, galloped around the track to the paddock gate, where he jumped over the iron gate and sustained a slight cut on the knee and stifle, injuries which caused the blood to flow freely. The exercise boy escaped with minor hurts.

Milredo was claimed out of the sixth race by Mariano Stable for \$1,100.

Thomas Monahan, owner of the stable being trained by T. H. McAvoy, arrived Tuesday from New York on an extended visit.

Jockey Atkinson was forced to cancel his engagements to ride O'Malley and Sir Edgar owing to illness. Jockey B. Kennedy, who has been on the ailing list for several days, is rapidly improving.

CENTIMETER FOR KENTUCKY DERBY

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 29.—G. L. Blackford, well-known Texas breeder, plans to nominate Centimeter, his good two-year-old, to the Kentucky Derby and many other stakes in the Blue Grass state next year, and he, as well as trainer R. N. (Dick) Vestal, is confident that he will be even better as a three-year-old than he was this year.

Muskallonge is easily the best two-year-old shown here to date this season and he is improving all the time. His races in Kentucky were of the highest order even though he won no stakes there, as he always raced with stake winners and his performances were highly creditable.

Centimeter won the Idle Hour Stakes at Lexington and the Harold Stakes at Latonia, but after the latter victory something went wrong with him and he had to be let up on. He is training soundly again and will soon be sent to the post. Both of these Blackford-bred colts were sired by Meelick.

FAST TRACK RACING AGAIN

Jefferson Park at Its Best, with a Big Crowd Present.

Eddie Rickenbacher Wins Again—Polythia Beaten by Parader—Lieutenant Perkins First.

NEW ORLEANS, La., December 29.—Eddie Rickenbacher had full opportunity to give a display of his best speed in the five-eighths purse, in which he met some of the speediest sprinters in these parts, and acquitted himself in gallant fashion by winning in decisive style from Martin May and Apple Jack II., after having been forced to overcome a serious loss of ground as the result of Rising Rock, in an effort to bolt, forcing him wide. He succeeded in getting clear of Rising Rock in the last eighth and drew away to win under restraint. Rising Rock, in the early running, had shown a fine line of speed in setting a fast pace and led Eddie Rickenbacher, and had he refrained from his attempt to bolt, the pair would have furnished a spectacular struggle, but Rising Rock's running out and forcing Eddie Rickenbacher wide enabled the others to save much ground on the stretch turn and finish close up to Eddie Rickenbacher.

About the biggest attendance of the present meeting was on hand to view today's racing, which was held under pleasant conditions, weather and track being superb and a contributing element to the good sport of the day.

As a secondary feature, a handicap for two-year-olds held much interest and it brought about the downfall of Polythia, which was asked to carry 122 pounds. She was unequal to the task of conceding sixteen pounds to Parader and the Clifton colt beat her home after a hard drive. Polythia's undoing was assisted by the pace that Madeline Lillian forced in the early racing.

The colors of Farnum & Fizer scored their initial victory of the meeting when Dark Hill led for the entire way in the sixth race and won easily from Honolulu Boy, with Baladin in third place. The latter would have given the winner a stout argument had he had the benefit of a good ride, the diminutive Jarvis being unable to make him extend himself.

One of the closest finishes of the present meeting came with the running of the third race when Lieutenant Perkins beat Hidden Jewel. The latter finished in the middle of the track and Lieutenant Perkins on the extreme inside and the deceptive angle brought about a demonstration of no small proportion, the objectors to the judges' decision holding that Hidden Jewel had got up in time to win.

Royden began auspiciously for the backers of favorites by winning the opener with ease from Hopover, with Pansy Blossom in third place.

Ina Kay, the favorite in the second race, was beaten decisively by Rainbow Girl. Ina Kay had to be forced out to her utmost to retain second place from the fast coming Vansylvia.

The Clifton stable made it a double for the afternoon when Sandy Mac overhauled Bengali in the last sixteenth after Bengali had taken a lead of ten lengths in the first half mile. Mab landed in third place.

District Attorney Buchler this morning filed his bill of particulars in connection with the T. E. McBride betting case and the trial was set for January 5.

Former Mayor Martin Behrman, who played a prominent part in the restoration of racing in and adjacent to New Orleans, was among today's visitors and took a keen interest in the racing.

General manager Matt J. Winn of the Kentucky Jockey Club sent horsemen here a reminder this morning that payments are due before January 1 to the Lexington Breeders' Futurity and the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes. Failure to declare automatically makes the entry ineligible.

CUBAN MEETING WONDERFUL

So Says Mose Goldblatt on His Return to Cincinnati for the Holidays.

CINCINNATI, O., December 29.—Mose Goldblatt, who has a big stable racing in Cuba, is here for the holidays. He is enthusiastic over racing conditions at Havana and says they are having a wonderful meeting over there.

"Oriental Park has been improved wonderfully since I was there five years ago," said Mr. Goldblatt, "and Frank J. Bruen is just about the most capable and popular race track manager on the continent. John Hachmeister seems to have fitted in well as a racing steward. Hachmeister, of course, knows racing as well as any man on the track and he assumed and took hold of the presiding stewardship just as efficiently as he would run the business end of the sport. Jim Milton is starting better than I have ever seen him do before."

"The play in the mutual machines is 50 per cent greater than last year and the crowds have been larger despite a 50 per cent increase in the price of admission. They are having a wonderful meeting, although but comparatively few American tourists had arrived up to the time I left there."

Goldblatt was immensely pleased with the victory of his colt Billy Barton in the Cuban Championship Stakes last Sunday. He has refused an offer of \$25,000 for the colt and says, barring accidents, he is a certain winner of the \$15,000 Cuban Derby.
