YELLOW HAND BY INCHES

Wins Empire City Handicap After Thrilling Duel with Audacious.

California-Bred and Unbeaten Colt Morvich Scores His Fifth Straight Win.

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 9.—The Empire City course at Yonkers isn't a fast one. It was built for trotters and has some queeresses of conformation as to turns and soil which makes sane and safe racing ground. While hard, Empire City's clayey soil is not as elastic as that of the Long Island courses, and when it is muddy Empire City is a slough of despond. It is at its best on these muggy days, and the harrows and recent humidity have given it a cushion that breaks the jar of busy horse speed. This was shown in Saturday afternoon's race for the \$7,000 Empire City Handicap at a mile and an eighth, for the race Charles A. Stoneham's Yellow Hand carried 115 pounds and beat a fine band in his winning race and ran the distance in 1:51. This equaled the Empire City track record of Roamer, 1:28, made in July, 1918, and that of Dalmatian, 1:18, of July, 1910. Yellow Hand ran a gallant race and beat a fine aggregation of horses. There were nine named to go. Grey Lag, Royce Rools, Thunderclap—he had gone before—and Donacoma were declared. That left this fast five, this way weighted:

All the horses were backed but Lanius. He is all right in all ways but his legs—quite necessary tools for such work. Of all the backing accorded Yellow Hand had more than his share. He was well bought when Jack Goldsborough paid the R. T. Wilson folks a good price for the English gelding last winter.

YELLOW HAND-AUDACIOUS DUEL.

The real race was only for Yellow Hand and Audacious. Once past the stand Audacious—weight and all, for he is a speed merchant and a front runner of high degree—was in the lead and in the lead he stayed, kept busy always to the five-eighths ground by Yellow Hand. The quarter was in 23½, fast, the half in 48½—the turn impedes a bit—the three-quarters in 1:12½, the third quarter in 23½—the rear stretch is straight and faster—and the mile in 1:38½—the mile Empire record is Boots' 1:38½—and the mile and an eighth in 1:51—the Empire record's equal. But this is true discussion, let's to the race. The pair were together well past the half-mile ground. There Miller made his move. It is usually safer in front when your vehicle is going well and you know he's game. Yellow Hand, on call, got to and past Audacious quickly. Kummer had hardly called on Audacious yet. But rounding for the straight run home he did call. It was too late then. Yellow Hand, outside all the way, raced home with bright courage and, though Kummer drove the big chestnut with all his power, and Audacious gained on Yellow Hand in the last seventy-five yards, Audacious could never get up and Yellow Hand won a resplendent race, worth going a long day's journey to see, by a good head. Mad Hatter never got into the battle. He was away slowly—he loves front racing—saved ground early at the rails, closed on the leaders a trifle in the fast backstretch quarter and was driven hard as long as a chance seemed possible and yet he could only finish in third place and beaten two go.

The fractional time of the three miles which now is the standard for the Empire City record may as well be printed for interesting comparison:

RIALTO EASY FOR THUNDERCLAP.

Of the eight entered in the Rialto Purse Rancocas met two, Thunderclap and Krewer. They outclassed the others and were odds-on choices. Despair had been kept away for other action and Rancocas and Veto were waiting for soft going. Mars Cassidy started the six left. L'Eclair and Hounyham—bane of writers—seemed rather bashful in such company as Hildreth's colts Dimmesdale and Thunderstorm. They didn't come because they chose and had a piece of healthy work anyway. The Rialto course was at one of Empire's favorite routes—a mile and seventy yards. It fits the conformation nicely. Thunderclap won with something to spare. He didn't seem to have his Long Island merriness of action with him, but off in front, he raced in front and won with authority in 1:45. There was no fast pace. Thunderclap leisurely made his own. Hildreth declared to win with him. Krewer was second all the way, but had rather a hard time of it to get home a mere head before Dimmesdale, at which Ensor was busy all the way. The humble ones in the contest were in the shabby rear.

The rather sly Xalapa Farm folks had one of its periodical "good things," which was in the Breewort Selling Handicap over the short three-quarters of a mile sprinting course. It is just 1,200 yards long, and seems to be a million to a tired horse. There were eleven horses entered. Hildreth jerked out his pair, Dominique and Lord Brighton—the Rancocas pencil is full of nowadays jokes which scare owners of slow horses. Alexander Hamilton and three others didn't show up. The Kentuckians gave Despair backing which his past and bad temper hardly warranted. Old Cum Sah was the mild public choice. Despair, under the lean and skillful Callahan, won fighting. They had to be a clever pair to turn the trick. Cum Sah, off in front, and the Xalapa colt were the only figures in the race. Cum Sah and Despair hooked up on the turn and Cum Sah held his own. But in the long stretch drive youth and handling told—for Callahan out-ride Fator at the finish—and wore Cum Sah down and Despair won by a half length. Both were out.

FORT ERIE'S LARGEST CROWD

King Thrush Wins Closing Day Feature in a Rousing Finish—Favorites Fail.

FORT ERIE, Ont., July 9.—J. K. L. Ross furnished the winner of the Statler Hotel Handicap, which was offered as the feature attraction of the closing program of the Niagara Racing Association, when King Thrush led home Mock Orange in a grueling finish, with Sandy Beal third. The winner was ridden by Claver and made all the pace and hung on with rare courage under the whip through the final quarter to gain the decision by the shortest of margins. It was a sparkling race and a wonderful finish. So pleased was trainer Henry McDaniel that he departed from his usual custom and complimented Claver for his vigorous finish. It was probably the best ride Claver has shown this year.

The going was fast for the opening dash and turned to a sticky and slow track when a sudden rainstorm visited the course and lasted during the running of the third race. The storm forced one of the largest crowds in the history of the club to hunt points of shelter for a few minutes. However, the sun again made its appearance, but the close, sweltering heat of early morning was dispelled.

The public was all at sea and the talent had a hard time landing winners. Long-poled horses were in the ascendancy right from the start, the opening dash being annexed by Moss Fox II. at \$82.25 for the usual \$2 investment. Marble, a first-time starter from the Ross stable, was second, with Dorothy Buckner third.

The Inferno Handicap, which was offered for three-year-olds and over, witnessed the first success at the meeting for M. Brenner when Royal Visitor accounted for the race, with Sir Clarence second and Yorkist third. The winner was another that was neglected by the players and paid a substantial dividend.

Truro, which was installed a favorite in the fourth race, was kicked while at the post and failed to gather any part of the purse. The winner turned up in James Arthur's Wessie B., with Chateaugay and Lottie Lorraine getting the minor portions.

H. G. Bedwell was among the arrivals here today from Baltimore.

Jockey R. Lancaster departed for New York last night to report to trainer J. Fitzsimmons.

Ray Bryson, acting for E. K. Bryson, at private terms this morning purchased from B. A. Coburn the two-year-old The Managress.

Trainer Henry McDaniel this morning dispatched the J. K. L. Ross stable to Windsor, leaving but the three starters here, which will be shipped on Monday. The five head that were left at Montreal following the meeting at that point were expected to arrive in Hamilton today, having been shipped earlier in the week.

Jockey J. McTaggart, following the last race today, departed for his home in Baltimore for a few days, reporting to the Thernellie stable at Windsor. The stable of G. W. Forman and J. J. Farrell will be shipped to Hamilton to await the resumption of racing there. Both Mr. Farrell and Mr. Forman depart for Baltimore tonight.

Ex-jockey Willie Morris has been engaged by the Kenton Stable on the recommendation of starter Morrissey to break the large band of yearlings at present quartered in Kentucky. Morris left New York yesterday for the western farm.

A. L. Kirby will ship his stable from here to Windsor to participate in the meetings at that point. John Marino will also proceed to Windsor.

W. C. Westmoreland traded the two-year-old Dare to S. A. Crompton for Pig Noise. The latter will join the shipment for New York today.

At private terms this morning Charles Koerner purchased from Clarence Buxton the plate Leading Star, which the latter secured but a few days ago from J. A. Coburn.

E. W. Moore departs for Windsor tonight. In addition to his own horses he takes Skeer Face, Cock of the Main and another for W. C. Weant.

C. B. Baker of Detroit this morning purchased from C. L. Whiting the two-year-old Rosa Atkin. Carey Winfrey has decided to ship from here to Windsor, and will leave here Sunday.

LORD GLANELY'S FILLY WESTERN HILL

LONDON, England, June 25.—Lord Glanely has a two-year-old filly of rare promise in Western Hill. On Derby day she won the Caterham Stakes by four lengths from a field of thirteen. She followed up this success three days later by taking the Redfern Plate at Kempton Park with odds of 6 to 4 laid on her. Clearly she is pretty smart. In her only other start she was fifth behind Aldergrove in the Spring Stakes at Newmarket. Western Hill was bred by her owner, and is by Quantock, now at the stud in Australia. Lord Glanely having sold him for \$2,000 in December, 1919. He was a speedy race horse, but became so incorrigible and dangerous at the gate that he was "warned off" by the Jockey Club. He has, however, sired some useful winners from few chances and it looks as though a mistake was made when he was sold.

Melton Fuse, the dam of Western Hill, is by Melton, from Shimose, whose granddam was Fuse. The latter bred Candlenas and St. Blaise. Shimose was by the parrot-mouthed Simontault, a large percentage of whose offspring inherited his defect.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

A surplus of \$10,757 claiming money during the last two days at Aqueduct will be added to the overnight races on the opening day of the fall meeting at Aqueduct.

W. Rosen, who fell with New Haven in the steeplechase at Aqueduct Friday, suffered a broken collarbone on the left side, and W. Green, who went down with Le Cyprin, was knocked unconscious for about half an hour.

The horses bought out of Thursday's Aqueduct auction sale by J. S. Garrett, will be shipped to Westchester, Pa., where their purchaser has a riding school. Those bought by L. C. Leith will be sent to Virginia, to be made into hunters.

Friday at Aqueduct, in addition to the sensational run-up of Sedgwick by S. C. Hildreth from \$5,000 to \$10,000, the Wilson Stable retaining the Olambala colt, J. J. Hertz, claimed anniversary for \$2,650 and R. T. McKeever took Maggie Murphy for \$2,020.

DELORIMIER MEETING ENDS

Assumption Takes Special Race—Old Pop Scores Third Straight Success.

MONTREAL, Que., July 9.—A much welcomed rain visited Delorimier Park at the conclusion of the racing yesterday and rendered the going heavy for today. As a result upsets came with the running of several of the races. There was no special feature down for decision, but despite this fact the half holiday crowd swelled the attendance to the largest of the meeting.

Assumption accounted for the second race, a special dash for Quebec-owned horses. He led throughout and won easily.

The Canadian-bred Old Pop scored his third victory at this meeting when he annexed the fourth race, in which he defeated some shifty sprinters. For practices detrimental to the best interests of racing the entries of the horses owned by W. B. Cross will be refused and he has been warned away from all tracks under the jurisdiction of the Quebec Breeders' and Racing Association.

The judges announced today that all horses pulling up lame or showing signs of soreness going to the post will be barred thereafter from starting on the tracks of the Quebec Breeders' Association until such time as they are pronounced sound by the club's veterinary, Dr. F. W. Ashe.

Two horses which started today and are affected by this ruling are Helen Major and George Bovee. E. P. Gorman, secretary of the Connaught Park Jockey Club, Ottawa, was a visitor here today. Word reached here that Charles Hall is en route here from Fort Erie to King Edward Park with Kuklux and Cormoran.

The horse Hay was scratched from the sixth race today for the reason that he was stolen out of his stable during last night. Owner McNulty reports that the horse was missed shortly after 4 o'clock this morning.

A carload of horses will leave here on Monday for the fair races at Ashlin, Ky. Included in the shipment will be Illinois Lad, Will Soon and J. Curly's string, which includes Madam Byn.

Examination disclosed the fact that Jockey C. Howard suffered a broken collar bone when his mount, Second Consul, fell during the running of the sixth race here yesterday.

Jockey F. Moore, who went down at the same time, suffered a scraped face, but resumed riding today.

TWENTY-SEVEN HORSES GO AT AUCTION

Twenty-seven horses were sold in the paddock at Aqueduct last Thursday. Considering the quality of those involved they brought good prices. Doughnut, for which N. L. Ryer paid \$1,800, brought the highest price of the horses offered. One of the interesting angles of the sale was the come down of Frog-town, which has been backsliding until he went under the hammer for \$125.

QUEER ITALIAN BETTING MONOPY

The first French bookmaker who started operating on the Italian turf had to share his profits with the race societies. The first 40,000 lire—about \$7,200—made went to them; he took the next 40,000 lire, and anything beyond was equally shared. Books were kept in duplicate, and were open to inspection by the officials. The first year the participants were \$21,230, and in 1900 he took over the local pari-mutuels as well, and obtained a monopoly of the betting.

MONTREAL, Que., July 9.—Jockey R. Buckles of St. Joseph, Mo., who was thrown from his mount at the Delorimier race track Thursday afternoon, died at a hospital here last night from a fracture of the skull. He was well known on the Canadian turf and also had appeared on American tracks.

LATONIA MEETING FINISHED

Fine Attendance Views the Decision of Good Races.

Best Pal a Victor in the Valuable Daniel Boone Handicap, with La Rablee Second.

LATONIA, Ky., July 9.—The Kentucky season, just terminated after sixty-one days, was not up to the financial success of last year. Country-wide depression made itself felt here and increased operating expenses, various taxes and increases in purses and stakes were contributing causes toward a decrease in profits compared with last year's earnings. General manager Winn was well satisfied, however, and voiced his gratification with results as a whole and will continue to plan for the fall on a pretentious scale.

The racing this year has been below the expected standard. Scarcity of good riders has been one of the drawbacks in this respect. The class of horses that has been in daily action has also been below the standard commensurate with the rich purse offerings in this section. The terrific heat that has prevailed for nearly the last two weeks of the Latonia meeting has caused a lapse of interest in the racing and the final days were draggy. The heated period was the severest in nearly fifty years.

Today's attendance was again large and numbered many from adjacent cities. Louisville was particularly well represented.

Early in the afternoon there was promise of relief from the intense heat, for rain began before post time and a strong breeze wafting across the course tempered the sultriness, but the sprinkle was of short duration.

The E. R. Bradley tide of success, which has been abundantly constant this year on Kentucky tracks, beginning at Lexington, continued to the last day here, when Best Pal, the half brother to Black Servant, accounted for the Daniel Boone Handicap, worth \$11,800 net to the winner, defeating some of the best that could be mustered in this section and covered the mile and three-sixteenths in the track record time of 1:56½, which is two-fifths of a second better than the former track mark held jointly by Milton B. Rancher, Drastic and Dr. Clark. La Rablee finished in second place, and Exterminator, top weight, and burdened with 135 pounds, following in advance of the compact band made up of Sands of Pleasure, Lady Madcap, Firebrand, The Porter and Woodtrap.

LYKE'S FAULTLESS RIDE.

Lyke rode Best Pal faultlessly and timed his final rush to almost the fraction that would insure his success. He was tiring in the last sixteenth and giving away steadily to the presidency of La Rablee, which had in the early racing been far back, but moved up in the last quarter in business-like style. Although running fastest at the end, she could not down the Bradley horse, and a scant length separated the pair at the finish. Exterminator was in his task in game style, was in the first flight from the start, encouraged his supporters to a high degree when he moved into the lead shortly after being straightened away for the stretch racing. But his weight began telling on him in the last eighth and the interference he suffered when Lyke came over to the inner rail with the winner also helped to lessen his chances.

The disappointment of the race was The Porter. This stalwart son of Sweep—Ballet Girl was considered the most formidable contender in the race, but he was always in the rear guard and just before reaching the stretch Garner resorted to the whip. It was of no avail, for he was thoroughly spent.

Spirited racing was the general rule in all the dashes, nearly all the winners being forced out of their utmost to get home in advance of their nearest followers.

Jockey Lyke carried off most of the honors, beginning with the initial race, when he piloted Freecutter, George J. Long's one time crack, to victory over Clintonville and with wins on Youneed and Best Pal. Garner also rode well, having the mounts on Pegasus and Sir Hugh respectively. Montfort Jones and J. N. Camden owned and both trained by J. C. Milam. Sir Hugh's escape from defeat was by the narrowest margin, Granite Ware barely failing in overtaking him right at the finish. On Pegasus Garner had comparatively easy sailing, for once in the lead, the colt only had to gallop along easily in the stretch and he was eased up to win by a half length from Hephaistos. Had Garner so elected Pegasus could have won by five lengths.

DADE'S ONLY REALLY POOR START.

A band of twelve of the poorest grade contested in the mile and a quarter dash and in it came the first really poor start that A. B. Dade has made at the meeting. His good starting has been one of the outstanding features. Whirling Dun was the victor in the mile and a quarter dash and he won easily. Wadsworth's Last, the favorite, having been left at the post.

Gipsy Queen, which has developed into a confirmed bad post actor, should have won the fourth race in easy style but for her bad post behavior, as she was away slowly and was only beaten by a neck after having closed an immense gap. At that Lyke's superior riding on Youneed was as much responsible for the victory as Gipsy Queen's tardy beginning.

The final race fell to Blanche Mac, a somewhat underrated player, judging by her race today, for she won from Brotherly Love and Paris Maid in fine style.

Col. Taylor, which finished third in the fourth race, was claimed by W. Rees for \$1,800. He is destined for half-mile Canadian racing, according to his new owner.

T. C. McDowell has revised his plans about going to Windsor and will send a contingent to Saratoga for the August meeting.

Best Pal will be a starter in the Frontier Handicap, to be run at Windsor the opening day. Jockey Lyke will have the mount. The Bradley horses, as

FRENCH RACING SCANDAL

Great To-Do Over the Error of Heros XII. at Auteuil.

Parfremont's Excuse for Mistake — Lawsuits, Disqualifications and Fines Follow.

PARIS, France, June 21.—The greatest fiasco ever associated with an important race in France utterly spoiled the Grand Steeplechase de Paris at Auteuil on Sunday when the enormous crowd witnessed the unusual spectacle of two outsiders, Roi Belge and Master Bob, although hopelessly beaten and practically felled off half a mile from the finish, taking first and second places. This was made possible by an incomprehensible mistake on the part of Parfremont, who was riding Heros XII., a hot favorite for the race. When four-fifths of the distance had been covered the three leading horses—Heros XII., Absidea and Rayon—took the wrong course, leaving the only other two horses which remained standing to gallop along to the winning post. The point at which the incident occurred was hidden from the view of the majority of spectators and there was general consternation when the two outsiders were seen to be finishing alone.

This extraordinary occurrence has created a great sensation in French racing circles. At the moment of the disaster Heros XII., on whose victory the public had gone solid, was slightly in front, going remarkably well, and victory seemed well within his grasp. Parfremont, who has won this important race several times, should know every inch of the course, and such an error on his part is positively bewildering to racegoers. The stewards subsequently suspended him from riding for the rest of the year, and Thibault, the jockey on Rayon, which also ran out, was fined \$100 for the mistake. Hardy, the rider of Absidea, which was in close attendance on Heros XII. at the fatal moment, said that he shouted to Parfremont that he was going the wrong way, but as the jockey on Heros XII. continued, Hardy thought, in view of Parfremont's great experience of the course, that, after all, he was right and a moment later all the leading horses were out of the race.

HEROS XII. IN PREVIOUS SCANDAL.

Heros XII. is the noted steeplechaser that was the subject of a recent scandal at Enghien, when, backed heavily by the public, he finished nowhere. The jockey, Thibault, was made the scapegoat by the owner, and an interesting sequel to the affair is that legal proceedings have been instituted by Thibault against the owner of Heros XII. for \$40,000 damages for alleged libel in a statement sent to the press by the owner of the horse. It is said that tremendous financial interests were at stake over Sunday's great race, for which Heros XII. had been backed for over \$200,000 by his owner. One well-known bookmaker (betting is allowed between owners). It is reported, stood to lose \$300,000 had Heros XII. won. With the air full of such rumors there is little wonder that the most amazing stories are in circulation.

It is stated that the owners of Heros XII. had put Parfremont, the jockey, on \$10,000 to nothing if he won. Parfremont's excuse is that the race always used to finish on the hurdle race course, and being occupied in watching Absidea he forgot the change that had been made.

On top of it all the owner of Absidea has challenged the owner of Heros XII., which came in third, to a race for a stake of \$100,000 on the same conditions as Sunday's big event. The owner of Heros XII. has declined to consider the offer until the horse has run in another race. There has been considerable irritation among the French public by reason of the indifferent showing of this famous jumper, which has necessitated special police precautions being taken several times at meetings at which he has run.

Aknusti was once in front, slipping through on the side rails on the upper turn, where he was improved a bit. Sande gave Aknusti good handling, however, and rode him a rousing finish. But the Californian had speed to spare and wore Aknusti down to draw more than clear in the closing strides. Cloughjordan had a clear path and was closing on Aknusti at the finish. Draft, the stout favorite, had more speed than endurance and ran wide. Sande claimed a foul by Metcalf on the stretch turn. It was not allowed. Runstar was reported by the work watchers as hardly ready. The report was true. His appearance bore it out. Runstar will run better next time. He was but mildly supported. Aknusti's market was a smart one. So was that over Ultimo, which got away poorly and had an easy race.

Elated by the victory of his former stablemate, Morvich, though he's a little jealous about the stories that Runstar can beat him doing anything, showed folks some more of his bright speed in the Spark Hill Purse, for two-year-olds, at five and a half furlongs. Thank goodness not out of a chute or other deceptive contraption that causes untrue racing. The New York public got to like the slippery footed Californian colt and backs him always. He was an odds-on favorite, defeating Sideral, Missionary and Nose Dive—five of the nine entered did not want his game—as if they were mere ponies of head lads and three lengths. Sideral was six as far before Missionary. This makes Fred Burley's Morvich's fifth race. He cost about \$4,000. It's the flesh and blood horse, not the one of prices, that's worth while.

Mr. Madden's new pupil is going well. His Devastation won again, the Seminole purse for adult selling platers at the mile and seventy yards distance falling to that creature in rather easy fashion. He wasn't favorite, either. Old Jack Scott was that mark for moderators to shoot at. Displacing Claguer early Jack Scott led jauntily well into the straight. There Kummer, who had saved ground with the rather reserved Devastation, brought him along and in the contention which ensued Jack stopped a bit as if short. Devastation came on to win more easily than he seemed to by a long length.

The Empire course drew a great Saturday crowd of 16,000 or 17,000 people. Racing didn't begin until 2:30, fifteen minutes later than the Long Island course schedule. The air was better. There was some little life in it.

The Yonkers going was fast enough for good horses to break into speed glows, as Yellow Hand did.

Only two favorites, Thunderclap and Morvich, behaved themselves.

Algernon Daingerfield took in the sport for the first time in about two weeks. He has been confined to his home by illness.

Starter Mars Cassidy resumed his duties, but not until after the first race. C. J. Fitz Gerald dispatched the field for the opening race. Mr. Cassidy reported that his wife, whose illness called him to Cincinnati earlier in the week, is still quite sick.

J. Carmody, whose riding was one of the features of the racing a year ago last winter at Havana, accepted his first mount of the year in the opening race.

BETTING CHECK LEGAL RULING

An important decision under the English gaming act was recently given in the Court of King's Bench of London, England, by Justice McCardie.

The action was that of Maskell vs. Hill, and it arose out of a dispute concerning betting transactions. The plaintiff, J. T. Maskell of Chudwell Heath, Essex, claimed against Joseph Hill of High Street, Stratford, to recover \$2,000, the amount of check paid by defendant as plaintiff's agent in respect of betting losses.

Justice McCardie held that the money was not recoverable, as the gaming act only applied to checks paid to a principal with whom a bet was made.
