Veteran of Many Hard-Fought Turf Battles Wins All the Way.

Dry Moon, Cydonia and Copper Demon Race Well and Successfully.

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 12.—The racing place at Empire City Tuesday afternoon was the modest Melrose Selling Stakes at a mile and a sixteenth and worth \$2,185 to the winner.

The opening foam purse for second class two-year-old fillies of the selling division at five-eighths brought out nine and the right one won.
