



DULL DAY AT EMPIRE CITY

Purchase's Fine Race the Only Enlivening Feature.

Carries 140 Pounds to Fast and Easy Victory—Three Favorites Score.

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 25.—Empire City had a dull Monday afternoon's racing. Only the overnight Bronxville Handicap threw any light on its action.

New York loves Sam Hildreth's picture horse and cheered him going to the post, as he won, and after he came back to the scales, Purchase ran in bandages behind, as he had before, and won with plenty in reserve, and in the fast time made at the present Empire City meeting, 1:08 3/4, for the short three-quarters of a mile, which was the Bronxville's distance.

There wasn't much to the race except the massively fine way in which the great horse under great weight won it. War Note and Dry Moon were off in front. Purchase was a bit out of temper at the barrier. He, like other good fine race horses, is not intensely friendly with racing tools.

CALLAHAN'S RIDE HELPS BEVERLY BELLE.

Beverly Belle, of recent scandal and tricky dealing and a bit of class, won the opening race for the Park Hill, for two-year-olds, at five and a half furlongs, under selling conditions.

Moderate was the correct name for the purse offered for a dozen non-winners since May 1, at claiming price weights and the short three-quarters of a mile course.

The Ranococas colors were successful in the third race, without name, for two-year-old sellers at five and a half furlongs, when that rather nice Jack Atkin-Lotty Barr filly Restraint beat three others, among them the in-and-out Marsdale, which was a heavily backed favorite, as he should have been.

Diadi, hard at it for eight years, and thirteen other platers of low degree and all sorts of ages, met in the mile and a sixteenth Greenwich, the conditions of the barred racing quality. E. R. Bradley spent Sunday and today here looking over his horses, which are in charge of trainer William Hurley. He departed for Windsor tonight, where he will remain to witness the decision of the \$20,000 stake on Saturday next at Devonshire in which Black Servant will carry his colors.

MONTREAL, Que., July 25.—Taking the lead at the start, Assumption never left the result in doubt in the handicap which was the main contest of today's card at Maisonneuve Park.

The weather was again intensely hot, but a good crowd for a Monday witnessed the sport. Winds of Chance graduated from the maiden ranks when she got home ahead of some fair three-year-olds in the third race.

Lady Felix annexed the initial dash for Canadian-breds, this also marking her first success. Jockey C. White, after an absence of four years from the saddle, has been restored to good standing and had his first mount today.

Starter Elmer Wilson was taken ill today and Edward Tribe dispatched the fields in a satisfactory manner.

SIRE TEN POINT DIES FROM COLIC

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 25.—Word was received at the office of the Jockey Club of the death at Avon, N. Y., of the eleven-year-old sire Ten Point, by Jack Point—Gold Ten, by Goldcrest, which L. A. Aste of New York had loaned to the Breeding Bureau of the Jockey Club, and which had been sent to the Genesee Valley before the opening of the breeding season this year.

Ten Point was a fine specimen of the big, rugged type of the thoroughbred and he was a successful sire for his chances. Everything that has been trained, with the exception of a couple of two-year-olds, that owned him as a parent has been a winner.

SPEED OF VETERAN DODGE

Outpaces King Thrush in a Fast Kenilworth Race.

WINDSOR, Ont., July 25.—J. S. Ward's Dodge was the winner of the Woodstock Purse, which was offered as the feature attraction at Kenilworth this afternoon.

King Thrush was the one to take second money, and Besthoff was third. The winner was away forwardly and, under restraint, set a fast pace for his opponents to follow.

What might have been a serious accident was averted when jockey E. Donohue was thrown when Ten Can got caught in a jam while going to the first turn in the feature race. Donohue, unfortunately, could not get his feet clear from the stirrup irons, and hanging onto his mount by the neck, was carried in this manner for several yards.

Mr. R. E. Haynes, who has been purchasing horses in England for the last thirty years for the Seagram Stable, was a visitor here today. Mr. Haynes has received many congratulations over the result of his purchases in England last fall for the Seagram Stable of seven racers and two brood mares.

The former include Golden Sphere, Kentish Boy, Lady Meave, Brilliant Jester and others. Brilliant Jester is a brother to Black Ray, which was one of the four horses belonging to J. B. Joel that in one day won four stake races at the recent Liverpool meeting.

Jockey E. Pool was forced to cancel his engagements following the second race. He was hit over the eye by a flying clod which caused a swelling.

T. E. Crist has purchased on private terms from E. Loh the contract on the apprentice R. Holway. This had began his riding career at New Orleans last winter and showed promise.

The stewards on Saturday notified Jockey Dishmon to accept no more mounts until sufficient improvement has been shown in his general health. Dishmon is still at times bothered by the effects of the fall he sustained some time ago.

An X-ray examination of Jockey E. Taylor disclosed the fact that he had sustained a dislocated ankle. The injured member was encased in a plaster of paris cast and will keep him from the saddle for over a month.

The dates for the fall meeting at Dufferin Park, Toronto, have been announced as September 15 to 22, inclusive.

Trainer R. A. Smith of the Sunnyside Stable announced that he would ship from Devonshire Park to Saratoga to engage in racing at that point.

E. B. McLean's Saddle and Boots, which was taken down with fever in the paddock on Saturday, was in such a condition that it was deemed dangerous to transfer him back to the stable at Windsor.

The apprentice J. Rowan, who is under contract to E. F. Whitney, will accompany that owner to Saratoga.

NOTABLE FRENCH TURFMAN GONE

PARIS, France, July 5.—With the death of Count Henri Costa de Beauregard the French racing world has lost one of the last representatives of what it is accustomed to call the classic period of the turf.

The count was a member of the so-called racing "pleiade," which included such famous names of the French turf as Delamarre, Bertheux, Kergerlay and Schieckler. He was made a member of the committee of the Society for the Encouragement of Racing in 1881, and for years occupied a redoubtable position on the French turf.

But Count Henri Costa was more interested in the success of his colors, white and cerise, than in anything else. He held an important position in the imperial hunting entourage of Napoleon III. He was one of the best shots in France and for years while he served on the racing committee his opinions on all questions that came up were well regarded by the other members.
