FAIR SPORT AT EMPIRE CITY

Edwina Runs Fine Race to Score Narrowly from Lady Emmeline.

Swift Grass and Mavourneen Finishes Worth Seeing—Weather Conditions Bad.

NEW YORK, N. Y., July 29.—This afternoon's races at Empire City were better than the average of this week's action at the course and were worth seeing.

Form wasn't at all out of joint for the class of horses performing. The public made three errors.

The weather conditions were bad. Rain fell during the afternoon and threatened all day.

A big field of fifteen two-year-olds non-winners of the meeting staggered through the Shamrock at five-eighths of a mile with Swift Grass and Fair Virginia mild choices.

Yonkers judgment gets thick under the weather conditions. Mavourneen should have been well considered for the Venus for a collection of seven mares over the short three-quarters course.

DARK HILL BEST AND WINS.

A murky lot of eight in-an-outers were in the mile and a quarter Oakfield, with The Lamb and Bantry most favored, and the best horse in the distance and weights, Dark Hill, as third choice.

The Soule mare, Edwina, just now at the top of her form, was the natural odds-on favorite for the Triumphant handicap at a mile and seventy yards and generously won it all the way.

Old Mose was a good horse in the Equality of one mile and seventy yards, which he won handsomely. It was the old fellow's first victory this year and he had to be far the best to score.

There was a fair field of seven in the five and a half furlong two-year-olds selling Cliff Purse—a typical field of fair ones of the kind.

William Garth has made arrangements to break his yearlings at Pinlico this year. He has been in the habit of starting his youngsters in training at Benning.

AMERICAN HORSE WINS AT ST. CLOUD

PARIS, France, July 29.—Marcel Boussac's Fitzger, by the American sire and dam, Fitz Herbert and Trigger, ridden by George Stern, won the Prix Magny, a race for two-year-olds, at Saint Cloud Tuesday. Fitzger was bred by Clarence Mackay.

THREE - YEAR - OLD HONORS

Latonia Championship Stakes May Decide Supremacy of the Year.

Kentucky again will be the final battle ground of aspirants for the three-year-old crown when the valuable Latonia Championship Stakes is run at the Milldale course next autumn.

Col. Matt J. Winn, vice president and general manager of the Kentucky Jockey Club, is spending much time in the East this summer recruiting star performers of that section for the rich array of stakes to be decided on the Kentucky circuit.

Among the leading contenders for the Latonia Championship next fall is Brother Batch, winner of the Latonia Derby, at one mile and a half.

Another Kentucky eligible that may cut some figure in the race is the stablemate of Black Servant, Behave Yourself, winner of the Kentucky Derby.

Senator Johnson N. Camden's Rangoon is another that is being primed for the big race. Rangoon possesses a high flight of speed, and, although his early races last spring were not impressive, he later came with a rush and must be accorded a chance in any kind of competition.

It is believed that Sam Hildreth will be represented by starters in the Championship. Along with Grey Lag he is expected to send Knobbie, which has forged to the front ranks this spring and summer.

Sporting Blood, which made an unsuccessful trip to Kentucky to run against Grey Lag, Tryster, Behave Yourself and others in the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes last fall, is another eastern candidate that is accorded attention.

FEATURELESS CARD AT KEMPTON PARK

MONTREAL, Que., July 29.—The card provided at Kempton Park today was devoid of any special features, but nevertheless was productive of interesting racing.

Vanslyvia and Mack Garner scored in their races only after hard driving finishes. Chantour came from behind the stretch to win the race for Canadian-bred horses.

Mrs. W. H. Denham, represented in the fifth race by No Trumps, claimed Mildred Euretta for \$950 from L. Omes. The mare has been sick since the spring meeting at Mount Royal and showed a dull performance today.

At a private sale W. B. Cross today disposed of his entire string, consisting of Lady Eileen, Vain Chick, Lean Wreck, Omato and Miss Hilarity, to C. H. Lamothe of Montreal, also the contract on jockey J. McBride. Lamothe has not yet engaged a trainer.

L. T. Whitehall has traded Hotfoot to W. E. Beechwood for the Canadian-bred Chandler.

J. G. Bussey returned this morning from Havre de Grace and shipped the horse Superior, which he deserted at Blue Bonnets, to Havre de Grace. The remainder of his horses, which were held up at the border, have consequently been released by the Canadian authorities.

The riding of jockey T. Matthews will be limited to only one horse, Assumption, here in future. The judges further ruled that only Matthews will be permitted to ride this horse following his unsatisfactory performance yesterday.

At the conclusion of this meeting T. C. Bevan will ship Orleans Girl and Winds of Chance to Hagerstown, Md.

W. Wolfe's Ruffra is destined for the same place. Several other stables have planned to leave here shortly for Erie, Pa., to take part in the racing at the Erie County Fair of six days, from August 22 to 27.

TINSPEAR'S FAST BRIGHTON RACE

The English Brighton track is excessively fast for sound horses. June 21 over it Tinspear, Major Weyland's bay horse, 6, by Spearmit—Tintara, won the Balesnabe Handicap. Under V. Smyth and with 123 pounds up he ran the mile and a quarter in 2:01 1/2. The English record is 2:04 1/2, made by an excessively fast horse, Stedfast, in 1911 at Newbury.

DEVONSHIRE INTERNATIONAL

Grey Lag and Black Servant to Meet in \$20,000 Opening Day Attraction.

WINDSOR, Ont., July 29.—Featured by the running of the Devonshire International, a dash of a mile and an eighth, for three-year-olds, to which \$20,000 is added, the first 1921 summer meeting under the auspices of the Western Racing Association will be opened tomorrow afternoon.

Apart from the star attraction the card which is offered is a good one and brings together a well-matched field of horses in each of the different races. The fourth race of the afternoon, at a mile and a sixteenth, brings together a small but good field, with Thunderclap, Grey Lag's traveling companion, picking up 120 pounds.

Turf followers and patrons in general will be surprised when they first see the reconstructed plant. Improvements that tend to add to the comfort of patrons have been completed on a lavish scale and this morning a small army of men was busily engaged in cleaning up the final traces and marks of the improvements.

Dave Leary, who has charge of the Ranococas starters, wired jockey Earl Sande to be here in the morning. Sande will have the leg up on both Ranococas starters.

Clarence Buxton announced today that he would leave for Saratoga at the Saturday afternoon with the yearling sales with an idea of picking up a few.

Star A. B. Dade has arrived from his home in Henderson, Ky., and will officiate at the barrier tomorrow.

HAMILTON'S SECOND MEETING

Brantford Selling Handicap Feature of Attractive Opening Day Program.

HAMILTON, Ont., July 29.—The second 1921 meeting under the auspices of the Hamilton Jockey Club will be ushered in the Saturday afternoon with a well-balanced card, featured by the running of the Brantford Selling Handicap at a distance of one mile and a sixteenth. This event will bring together a small but well-matched field and should be productive of a spirited contest.

Several new improvements of a minor nature have been completed that will add materially to the comfort of the patrons, chief of which are the installation of several new ticket booths.

That there will be no shortage of horses is plainly evident from the numerous arrivals. The invasion from Windsor was of a heavy order and brings together the best of the stables campaigning over the Canadian circuit.

The riding colony, while not as strong as the spring meeting, harbors some of the best boys on the circuit, which will be reinforced from time to time by the addition of others that are bound to come for the deciding of stakes and handicap races.

A. V. Thomas has resigned as trainer of the Nugent Bros.' stable.

Julius Reeder has succeeded W. H. Gerhardy in the official family.

SARATOGA RACING AT HAND

Rainfall Expected to Improve the Going by Monday.

Horses, Owners and Riders Arriving—Report Whitney Has Two Great Two-Year-Olds.

SARATOGA, N. Y., July 29.—Surprise was expressed by the advance guard in the habit of making a pilgrimage here annually that a lack of racing folks present is manifest, considering the near approach of the opening here.

The optimist fails to detect any signs that would indicate there would be any deviation from the former patronage and looks for the same brilliancy and gaiety at this meeting as that which has been a feature before.

Many explain the present absence of turf people to the fact that the racing at Empire City and Devonshire is keeping the horsemen at those places until Saturday, as the Sunday following will afford ample time for the intended comers here to be on hand in time for the opening of Monday.

There is expected quite a big delegation of west-coasters who are stopping off at Windsor to witness the decision of the Devonshire International \$20,000 race, which will have among its starters the crack three-year-olds Grey Lag and Black Servant.

Reservations on boats and trains for the next three days are unusually heavy, with an extra boat being forced into service to relieve the congestion, and a special train will also be pressed into action.

The hotel managements report hotel reservations are being booked steadily, but there is still considerable space to be had in the leading hostleries.

A heavy storm reached this section and rain continued unabated for hours. At one time the downfall was so copious as to be almost a deluge. The rain was badly needed and freshened the verdure instantly. The Oklahoma training track, as well as the main course, benefited vastly by the rain.

MISS JOY PRIDE OF THE WEST.

Westerners are confident that in Miss Joy they will have the means by which to achieve two-year-old supremacy, but a few usually well posted, while conceding Miss Joy to be a superior filly, hold out belief that she will be beaten and her conqueror will not necessarily have to be the unbeaten Mervich or the brilliant Runstar.

Former jockey W. Knapp, who was granted a trainer's license at the recent meeting of the Jockey Club, has taken over the horses that will race in the silks of W. S. Kilmer, succeeding William McDaniel, who resigned last Sunday.

Another addition to the riding colony was jockey C. Robinson, who came in from Empire City Saturday.

T. J. Pendergast of Kansas City, whose horses are here in charge of trainer J. C. Cahn, was another arrival.

The stables of C. A. Stonelam, W. H. Rowe, Fred Burlew and the first division of the Malapa Farm horses, in charge of James W. McClelland, came in from Empire City today.

Seven carloads of yearlings, the property of Kentucky breeders, arrived last night. Among them were seven youngsters consigned to Walter M. Jeffords, which will not be sold, two for George W. Loft and one for Tom Shaw.

The purses on the opening day of the local meeting include surplus bids of \$3,650, which the association received during the last two days of the meeting of 1920. This will give the three overnight races a value of \$2,216.67 each.

FRENCH RACING IS HEALTHY

English Obstacle Cracks Fail While Flat Ones All Succeed

Heros XII. Failure in Grand Hurdle—Lemonora's and Pomme de Terre's Victories.

PARIS, France, July 12.—The Grande Semaine got rather a black eye at its beginning. In the big steeplechase at Autenri there were ten starters and through falls and going the wrong course two finished. Heros XII, with George Parfremont up, was an overwhelming favorite. Three jumps from home the race had narrowed itself down to the favorite, the Italian mare Absidea and L'Yser. In some unaccountable manner Parfremont, who was leading, steered for the wrong jump, and Hardy on Absidea, Head on L'Yser, and Thibault on Rayon followed him; but Head saw his error and, in pulling around to get into the right course too suddenly, caused L'Yser to slip and fall on the flat. Owing to the drought the going was slippery. Roi Belge, lengths and lengths behind the others, went on and won, and Master Bob, also far behind, staggered home second. The stewards promptly suspended Parfremont for the balance of the year, fined Thibault five hundred francs and gave Hardy, on account of his lesser experience, a severe talking to. Parfremont tells me that he thinks the Italian mare would have won, L'Yser second, and he would have been third, as he was beaten when the mix-up took place.

TRESPASSER'S ABSURD PERFORMANCE.

Trespasser, the great English crack, made a laughable exhibition. He was pulled up and walked in. Jumping hurdles here and in England are two different games. Head on Forearm won a nice race and at the distance the best horse won. Souveins Toi went just 3,500 meters. It was a disappointed crowd which went down to defeat with him after nine straight wins. The Grand Prix closed the week. In terrible heat an enormous crowd sweltered and tired themselves out. It is ancient history now to read of the race, so we will merely say that Lemonora trailed next to last all the way until the field reached the little woods after coming down the hill. Here Childs moved him up and, coming around his horses on the outside, won going away from Flechois and Harporette, with Tacite a head off the latter. Joe Childs' supreme confidence was the most noticeable thing in the race. Three straight Grand Prix with Galloper Light, Comrade and Lemonora is a pretty severe object lesson and the English papers are asking what is wrong with the French thoroughbred? War rations, no racing, and the sending of untried fillies to the stud as brood mares during the hostilities is the answer, added to the exchange question which rendered the buying of good brood mares in England an impossibility, for the French.

FRENCH CROWDS AND SPECULATION.

Lord Zetland's Pomme de Terre came over and made a clean job of getting all the big stakes with his win in the Prix de President at St. Cloud. Figures do not lie, they tell us, so here go the official ones for a comparison with a big holiday race meeting in the States. Total receipts for Grand Prix day at Longchamps, 680,000 francs; pari-mutuel, 13,450,000 francs. The turnstiles for the paddock stand, the pavilion and the field showed that there were 105,839 people present when Lemonora won the fifty-fourth Grand Prix de Paris. Two-year-old racing began the last days of June. We have been having an unprecedented spell of dry weather. The gallops and the courses are like pavements. Trainers cannot work their horses, and we have seen no smasher out yet in the two-year-old division. Mr. Joseph Widener arrived for a short stay, and Jerry Welsh had a nice racing like filly by Negrofol—Rose Pompon, by Rock Sand, ready for a win. It was a small event of 10,000 francs at Le Tremblay. Rosarita, the Widener filly, broke slowly and ran rather greenly, but when MacGee got her settled down to racing she came on, and won rather handsily from Fortuna, one of the Macomber fleet, ridden by Frank O'Neill. The dull racing days are now on. Paris is thinning out, and everybody is waiting for Deauville. Mr. Replogle arrived last week and is starting for a trip into Central Europe. Mr. Widener is sailing home on the Paris July 16. O'Neill is heading the list of winning jockeys. MacGee, Bellhouse, Garner and Sharpe follow in this order.
