ORDINARY DAY AT HAMILTON

Runquoï Proves the Victor in the Main Race in Fast Time.

James A. Sheridan Takes Steeplechase for Maiden Jumpers—Leaving for Fort Erie.

HAMILTON, Ont., August 4.—Another featureless card marked the fifth day's racing at Hamilton this afternoon, the program being framed to bring together the poorer grade of horses.

The time for the race, 1:44 1/2, established a new track record, clipping two-fifths of a second from the old mark held by Sailing B.

Conditions were all that could be desired this afternoon and resulted in another large crowd journeying to the course.

Wrath outfooted a band of cheap ones in the opening dash and set the talent off to a bad start when she led Winchester and Gurgling Water home.

The usual daily steeplechase was down for decision and produced a spirited contest, in which James A. Sheridan graduated from the maiden ranks when he beat Lieutenant Seas, with Flying Frog third.

Arrangements have been completed between the Seagram Stable and jockey Butwell, who is at present at Windsor, to come here to ride one of the Seagram starters in the Hamilton Cup, which is to be run on Saturday.

Trainer Joseph Tevis reported this morning that Dellahm would not be a starter until late at Fort Erie, Dellahm has been sulking of late in his work.

Harry Giddings reported this morning that he had made arrangements to ship to the farm at Oakville the two platers Heath Bell and Oakling. The former will be freshened up for fall racing, while Oakling has developed soreness.

W. P. Frazer of the Canadian Racing Associations arrived from Toronto this morning and stated that he knew nothing beyond what he had heard in reference to the change in dates for the second meeting at Keilworth.

Stake blanks for the fall meeting at Woodbine Park arrived today and were distributed by Joseph McLennan. The entries to the stakes close August 18. The Toronto Autumn Cup and the Ontario Jockey Club Cup, each of \$7,500 added, head the imposing list of stake races.

The exodus to Fort Erie will begin on Saturday, when the first shipment leaves. The Kenton Stable, G. B. Foreman, J. K. L. Ross, H. Giddings and numerous others have completed arrangements to ship.

DUETTISTE IS IN ENGLAND

Mr. Widener's Jumping Champion to Be Pointed for 1922 Grand National.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., August 4.—Having been barred for all times from starting in France because of a technicality arising from the old French "blue laws" of turfdom, Duettiste, Mr. J. E. Widener's high-class steeplechaser, is destined for a campaign in England, according to his owner, who returned last week from a trip abroad.

The horse was recently shipped to Great Britain and will be trained by Escott, one of the foremost horsemen of that country and who has saddled two Grand National winners.

It was with the intention of seeing Duettiste race in the Grand Hurdle Race at Auteuil, that Mr. Widener, who is serving as a steward at the local meeting, made his French journey. To his surprise he found that the horse was under the ban due to the fact that he had shipped him out of that country during the wartime period without complying with all of the formalities required in such cases.

When Duettiste left France with three of his stablemates, racing was practically suspended, and he procured the necessary papers from the minister of agriculture to conform with the legal regulations.

The law in question, however, requires that the departure of a horse which has never started in that country must be advertised three days in advance of its leaving, and of this rule he was ignorant.

Somebody invoked the rule on him when the horse was returned there, and upon discovering that it still was valid, he immediately sent his good jumper to England.

Duettiste is now in Escott's Stable at Lewes, England, and will probably be entered and start in some races under National rules this late autumn and winter. Duettiste will be a real American candidate in the Grand National and is just the horse to win that race, being of the right age and capacity, skillful at the fences, and fast on the flat.

QUITE QUEEN OF THE TRACK

MISS JOY RUNS AWAY FROM THE OTHER CRACK FILLIES OF THE YEAR IN WINNING THE SCHUYLerville STAKES AT SARATOGA, THE FREQUENT CANADIAN VICTRESS, SECOND THOUGHTS, FINISHING SECOND, WHILE MY REVERIE RUNS UNPLACED

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 4.—Montfort Jones' peerless Miss Joy, whose racing this year should not have been dimmed with defeat, proved conclusively in the Schuylerville running her right to the crown as queen of two-year-old fillies, for she won in a manner befitting royalty and was never fully extended in the five and a half furlongs that enabled her to land the \$3,175 net that fell to the victress.

Following her came Second Thoughts, representative of the best that Canada could muster, and Nancy Shanks, representing Maryland-Virginia, followed, with My Reverie, proclaimed as the best miss in the East, following.

As a contest it was devoid of spectacular features. It was more in the hare and hound order, the Kentucky filly enacting the role of hare and right merrily did she lead her opponents, and that, too, at a heart-breaking pace as attested by her first quarter after traversing a sixteenth to find her full stride in 27 1/2.

The three-eighths found her stride undiminished, for she covered the distance in 33 1/2, the half mile in 46 and the last five-eighths in 58 1/2.

The expected strong opposition to come from My Reverie did not materialize, though the heretofore unbeaten filly was not lacking in speed. The best she could do was stay about two lengths off from Miss Joy for the first quarter, but when Garner released Miss Joy from restraint she bounded away with wonderful ease and left My Reverie floundering. Her leg weariness became manifest when she started serving out. Second Thoughts, as a result, was forced to come wide, for she was on the outside of My Reverie.

Finding his competitors thoroughly spent an eighth from the finish, Garner began easing Miss Joy up, and her last sixteenth was covered under restraint.

It required strong riding to bring Second Thoughts into second place, for Nancy Shanks, benefitting by My Reverie and Second Thoughts coming wide, closed a good bit of ground by virtue of staying close to the inner rail, and made a threatening rush near the end for second place honors.

She failed to overhaul Second Thoughts, but My Reverie fell an easy victim to her rush.

As predicted on the occasion of her debut here, Miss Joy raced this afternoon in better fashion than she did in her initial eastern effort, and gave a fairly accurate line on her capability. It was pronounced good enough to give her a chance to beat the best in this section, and a meeting between Miss Joy and the much-heralded Morvich is now of keen interest. Their meeting will be delayed until the Saratoga Special, in which both carry equal weights.

Small fields again contested the different purses. In some of the dashes there was a smattering of good class horses, and where the better grade started developed interesting sport. The attendance showed a slight increase, the clubhouse contingent being more numerous than on former occasions at this meeting. The lawn activity was on a par with the former days here, with the price quaters having the better of the tilts at the conclusion of the afternoon.

FATOR TRIUMPHS OVER SANDE

Jockey Fator turned the tables on his roommate Sande, and incidentally beat his contract employer out of a purse when he landed Lunetta victress over Valor. Sande had sent Valor into a good lead soon after the start and, after disposing of Love Top, appeared a certain winner, but Valor's underpinning would not stand the strain in the last sixteenth, and he fell a ready victim to the rush of Lunetta.

Maidens started in the steeplechase over the about two miles course and it was fairly spectacular as a contest. Because of Peccant, Ben Hampson and Overmatch being trained by M. Smart, the trio were grouped. This entry furnished the winner and the runner up in Peccant and Overmatch. The latter might have been more dangerous but for a displacement of his saddle during the running, which retarded his stride and prevented his rider's best horsemanship.

Subahdar was given the call, but it was sadly misplaced, as he never figured seriously in the running. Umar, which was coupled with Plumcot, serving as the pacemaker for the first round, but it was on sufferance, as Peccant took the lead when Brooks called on him and he was under restraint. Umar did last long enough to take third place.

On the strength of her good Empire City showing when she became entangled in the barrier and finished in second place to Wellfinder, Joan Marie was given preference in the fifth race over Pickwick and The Lamb, but, judging by her poor showing, she needed a barrier to trail in her wake to steady her in running. Expectations of the wise set was not only astray as to Joan Marie, but Pickwick also disappointed. The winner turned up in Anniversary, which E. Haynes brought up with a rush in the last sixteenth to snatch the purse from The Lamb, Veteran following the pair.

Walter M. Jeffords' Reprisal, which had a previous victory to his credit at this meeting as a result of winning the inaugural dash, again made good by a high display of speed that kept him in front of the others for the entire way in the closing race and won easily from Messines and Step Lightly. The West fancied Brunswick here, but that faint-hearted racer, after finding himself unequal to head his field in the first quarter of the race, gave way completely in the stretch.

Maiden riders on ordinary two-year-olds did not prove an alluring combination, resulting in the opener being somewhat devoid of interest. Eight made the contest here, over the five and a half furlongs route, the winner turning up in R. T. Wilson's Duaceap, ridden by H. Walters, Bantry Pass, on which T. Finn had the mount, finished in second place, with Sailing Along third. The latter, carry-

ing H. P. Whitney's silks, came in for the most consideration, with Bantry Pass a supposed good thing, judging by the confident support for her. She might have won but for being guided wide, enabling the busy Walters to slip the winner through next to the inner rail in the last eighth of the stretch rush.

W. Shaw, who was a jockey of prominence on American tracks not so long ago and whose more recent riding activities have been confined to tracks abroad, is on a visit here and contemplates a return to the saddle, but his riding will be done in Europe.

T. J. Healey, acting for R. T. Wilson, Jr., has sold privately five highly valued yearlings, sired by Olambala and Campfire, to Charles A. Stoneham. The consideration is said to have been a big sum.

John E. Madden has sold to S. C. Hildreth for the Ranocous Stable's account, the promising broodmare Star Gift colt and a colt sired by Ozden.

The chestnut filly by Uncle—Plantness, brought here in the H. P. Headley consignment, died last night of pneumonia.

Writing from Baltimore to Sam Louis W. A. Burtschell stated that he was progressing finely but would not attempt to do any work until in the fall, when he will resume training a string of horses.

Jack McCormack, who has charge of the P. A. Clark horses, is pointing Plambette and Nancy Lee with a view to starting them in the Latonia Championship Stakes, to be run in September at the Latonia track.

Sam Louis acquired Bodanzky privately yesterday from W. J. Salmon. Jockey W. Kelsay has severed connections with the Oak Ridge Stable and has contracted to ride for Willis Sharpe Kilmer.

R. A. Smith arrived this morning from Windsor in advance of his horses, which were delayed and are expected to reach the Saratoga track tomorrow. Ed W. Simms was an arrival today from Texas and will be here during the remainder of the meeting.

Frank J. Bruen, general manager of the Havana track, is an expected arrival tomorrow. Jockey L. Morris, under contract to R. A. Smith, will arrive tomorrow from Canada to ride the horses of his contract employer.

George Carroll has engaged second call to E. R. Bradley during the meeting here. "Bud" Fisher holds the contract on the rider's service. Jockey Frank Keogh was forced to suspend riding on account of being afflicted with boils.

John E. Madden today sold Collinga, a two-year-old chestnut daughter of Light Brigade—Hindoo Rose, to Commander J. K. L. Ross for a reported price of \$17,500. The filly worked five-eighths of a mile in 1:00 1/2, this morning and the Canadian sportsman took her over following this trial. She was a double winner at the recent Empire City meeting; also won a race for maiden jockeys at Aqueduct, in which she was disqualified.

CURRENT NOTES OF THE TURF

One of the best of the second-class handicap horses in Belgian racing is named Boni Mich, after Chicago's celebrated lake front thoroughfare.

The post time in race 59068, run at Hamilton Monday, should read "Went to post at 4:40. At post 5 minutes," instead of 3:40, as published. The error occurred in telegraphic transmission.

J. Booth, the Queensland, Australia, trainer, whose horses won five races at Brisbane, among them the Brisbane Cup with Impeyan and handicap with Syconelle, had a double bet on the pair of \$15,000 to \$105.

Racehorse training in the streets is occasionally something of a nuisance in Kensington, and last week two offenders were fined \$1 each and \$1.75 costs, in default three days' imprisonment.—Sydney, N. S. W., Referee.

The early French three-year-old champion Ksar, by Bruleur—Kizil Kougan, is not to race again until autumn. He was the high-priced yearling of 1918—\$30,200. French turfmen still marvel at Ksar's bad race in the Grand Prix.

Steve Donoghue, England's crack jockey, was once asked the weight of a horse. "Bless me," he said, "now you have got me. I can tell you the weight of every jockey breathing—but of a horse, no. Why, I've never been asked the question before, strange as it may seem."

Milton Henry is again riding well at the French courses. July 14 at St. Cloud he surprised by landing the Spanish Marquis de Martorel's Nonvel An, a long-priced horse, winner of the \$15,000 Prix des Marechaux from Verdier (Bellhouse) and Viburnum (MacGee). Three short heads separated the horses.

FINANCIERS AT SARATOGA

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., August 4.—Harry P. Sinclair, of oil and Ranocous fame, has leased the palatial Edward E. Ashton home on Broadway for the racing season, and plans to spend the entire period here. His establishment, which has been sweeping everything before it on the New York tracks to date this spring and summer, received a double setback in the first stakes in which it was represented here when Kai-Sang was beaten in the Flash by Miss Joy, and Mad Hatter succumbed to Yellow Hand in the Saratoga Handicap.

Barney Baruch, noted financier, is another who has taken an elaborate home here for the month of August. Mr. Baruch is a regular at Saratoga every summer.

MARTHA FALLON A FAST ONE

Takes the Border Cities Handicap in Runaway Fashion.

Kentucky Owners Dominate Day at Devonshire, Owner Worthington Scoring a Double.

WINDSOR, Ont., August 4.—C. W. Moore's McGee filly Martha Fallon scored her third straight victory in Canada when she beat a band of speedy two-year-olds in the \$5,000 Border Cities Handicap at Devonshire Park this afternoon. She was ridden by Pool, made all the pace and won by a length and a half from Devonite. The stable connections were quite confident and scratched John Finn, Martha Fallon never left the result in doubt after covering the first eighth. She held command throughout and at the end was under slight restraint. The winner's portion of the money was \$4,000.

It was a great day for the Kentuckians. C. T. Worthington scored a double when he won the first two races with Icon and Evelyn White. The former was ridden by Dishmon, and it was his first winning mount since his accident at this track last summer.

The going dried out as the afternoon progressed, but heavy clouds hung over the course which threatened at any minute to unload a deluge.

B. B. Rice has decided to rest his horses at Devonshire until the return of racing at Windsor. At the conclusion of the next meeting here he will ship his stable to Havre de Grace. Rice contemplates adding several more horses to his stable before shipping to Cuba. He will also make an effort to secure the promising apprentice Penman to ride for him this winter.

William Dondas arrived this morning from Parkersburg, W. Va., where he went to inspect that racing plant. Dondas pronounced the track at Parkersburg the best half-mile track in the country. It is eighty feet wide, with the turns well thrown up. The stables are of the finest. The Parkersburg dates are from September 23 to 27. There will be twenty-five running races and the smallest purse will be \$300.

The further entry of the horse Gold Galore has been ordered refused by the stewards. The horse was fractious in the paddock yesterday and just as he reached the track he lunged several times and unseating his rider, Mangum, kicked the latter on the head. He was withdrawn from that race and money wagered on him refunded.

TROUBLE WITH UNCLE SAM

R. A. Smith's Good Horses Seized Because of Liquor Stored in Their Car.

BUFFALO, N. Y., August 4.—Nine race horses, including Slippery Elm, winner of the Civic Holiday Handicap at Devonshire Park Monday, are being detained at the Green street yards of the American Railway Express Company and will probably be seized by United States customs officials. Customs inspectors on duty at the yards last night said that they found a case of French wine, eight quarts of whiskey and sixteen pints of the same liquid, besides two bundles of cloth and two motion picture films, stored in the car with the horses. The horses were en route to Saratoga from Windsor.

The horses that may pass into the possession of Uncle Sam before the day is out are: Wilfex, Tom Cassidy, Mark West, Pony Bill, Irish Kiss, John Morrell, Slippery Elm, Ultra Gold and Benevolent.

Deputy collector Smith said this morning that if the horses are officially seized they will ask the permission of Judge Hazel to sell them at public auction at once, on the grounds that they are perishable merchandise.

While the inspectors are investigating the circumstances surrounding the presence of the liquor and merchandise in a car, a local expert broker is locating the owner of the horses to notify him of their detention.

"We have been keeping close watch of these race horse shipments," said Deputy Smith this morning. "This is the third time that our men have taken liquor from cars containing race horses. Once during the last Fort Erie meeting at another time we found liquor in the cars with horses."

GOOD SEND-OFF AT DELORIMIER PARK

MONTREAL, Que., August 4.—J. M. Cooper provided the winner of the Sherbrooke purse, the feature of the opening day's racing at Delorimier Park this afternoon, in Sheba. She led throughout, withstood a challenge from George W., and drew away in the stretch. Fireworth ran a dull race, and Chefa had no opposition for third place.

Little Less easily took the measure of some speedy two-year-olds in the second race. Guardsman caused somewhat of a sensation in winning the initial race at odds of almost 40 to 1, the season's record locally.

Walter Mack and Truant both won with speed to spare. Petrograd broke down badly during the running of the fifth race.

Mrs. A. Miller claimed Frivolous for \$900 after his last victory at Kempton Park.

Starter Elmer Wilson is able to be about again after his recent illness. He is rapidly regaining his strength.

Judge F. W. Gerhardt will leave here at the close of the King Edward Park meeting for Erie, Pa., where he will serve as judge and racing secretary during the racing at the Erie County fall fair, from August 22 to 28.

Joseph T. Walker, United States secret service officer, has returned to New York, having recovered and taken with him the plates from which the bogus twenty-dollar notes were made that were put into circulation at the recent Maisonneuve Park meeting.

VALIDITY OF RACING CHARTERS TESTED The Western Racing Association, operating the Devonshire race course, faced three gambling charges in the Windsor police court today, the result of a prosecution started by William Greer, provincial police inspector, acting presumably under instructions from Attorney General Raney, who, it is intimated, has ordered the legality of racing association charters tested. Similar charges were preferred against the Windsor Jockey Club three weeks ago, but these cases have not yet been disposed of. It was stated today on good authority that the charges against the racing associations here are purely to test the validity of the charter under which the associations operate, with a view to making a test case affecting all other race courses in the province. Magistrate Gundy today laid the charges over for eight days, when it is expected that the prosecutors will be ready to proceed with their case.

ENGLISH JUDICIAL SENSE A London magistrate, recognizing that the destruction of betting slips by the police caused loss and inconvenience to customers of bookmakers arrested for street betting, recently expressed his willingness to allow the latter the option of paying an extra fine and having their slips returned. He was generally commended for taking such a commonsense view of the position.
