DEVONSHIRE GOING BETTER

Good Weather Brings Improvement to Track and Racing.

Daydue Wins a Long Delayed Victory and Lothair Scores in Easy Style.

WINDSOR, Ont., August 5.—Harry Payne Whitney's colors were seen in front for the first time at the Devonshire track when his two-year-old filly Bewitch beat a band of maiden two-year-olds in the second race this afternoon.

There was a decided improvement in racing conditions, the weather being clear and cool, while the track was in decidedly better order than on the previous days of meeting.

Purses of \$2,000 were added to each of these races.

The sprint fell to Daydue, which was saddled by C. Buxton and ridden by his brother M. Buxton.

The claiming handicap was won by Lothair, which came from behind in the stretch and beat Old Chap into easy fashion.

The eastern-owned Lady Lillian, heavily backed by her people, beat a band of platers in the third, a claiming race at one mile.

A. Peletiere, the Crescent City horseman, has arranged to ship four of the six horses in his stable to the Jefferson Park course near New Orleans at the conclusion of the present meeting.

W. C. Weant has arranged to send his horse from here to Fort Erie.

NEARLY DONE AT HAMILTON

Next to the Last Day Devoted to Claiming Races.

Kuklux Victorious in the Feature Race of the Afternoon—Sea Tale's Steeplechase.

HAMILTON, Ont., August 5.—It was another ordinary card that was offered on the Hamilton Jockey Club course this afternoon.

The winner was ridden by Romanelli and his skill was mainly responsible for the gelding's victory.

J. W. Pangle graduated a maiden from the ranks this afternoon when he saddled Cubanita.

Word was received from Saratoga that Baby Grand and Boniface had been consigned to trainer Scofield at Fort Erie.

When Falsetto Came East from Kentucky and Vanquished the Mighty Spendthrift.

Since Saratoga holds the center of the racing stage through each month of August, with practically all the really good horses of the country in pleasing clash, it is but natural that interesting reminiscences having to do with memorable racing there in the past should crop up now and then.

To go back to 1879 is traveling quite a way, yet in that year a couple of races took place there which fairly convulsed the racing world.

Keene then possessed a magnificent three-year-old in Australian's chestnut son, Spendthrift.

Keene's opinion was solidly based on the conviction that he was in effect an invincible.

Following the running of the Withers Stakes, for this George Lorillard's fine Leamington colt Harold was a 2 to 5 favorite, and when he was left at the post wrath in abundance was engendered.

Then when near the finish jockey George Evans plainly caused up on Spendthrift, to let his stablemate Dan Sparling win, there was more fuel on the fire of trackside indignation, and a stormy scene followed that long was talked about.

There was no just basis for it, for it was Keene's privilege to win with either of his two starters.

In those days horses were not coupled in the betting as now, and it was alleged that the stable money was on Dan Sparling, at 5 to 1 and better, while Spendthrift was second choice in the betting at 3 to 1.

After that Spendthrift went on, and in succession won the Belmont Stakes at Jerome Park, Lorillard Stakes at the same track and the Jersey Derby at Monmouth Park, defeating such stars of the time as Harold, Monitor, Magnetism, Report and others with the ease of an all-conqueror.

He was indeed a delightful young horse. But there was a better one in the land, though not many knew it, or would have believed it, anyhow.

Spendthrift was taken to Saratoga, and there also J. W. Hunt Reynolds of Kentucky had taken his bay Enquirer colt Falsetto.

The record showed that this colt had won the Phoenix Hotel Stakes at the Lexington spring meeting, then ran second to Lord Murphy in the Kentucky Derby, and afterward won the Clark Stakes at two miles.

Neat record, but not gaudy, said such eastern opinion as was thought worth while to express.

Along with Falsetto Reynolds brought the inimitable Isaac Murphy to ride him.

When Travers Stakes day arrived Spendthrift was a topheavy favorite, selling in one auction pool for \$1,600 to \$500 for Falsetto, \$200 for Harold and \$65 for Jericho.

Wherefore there was waiting, even stupefaction, when Falsetto not only won by two lengths, but won in a fashion that showed he was beyond the shadow of a doubt the master of Spendthrift.

This he confirmed a few weeks later, over that same track in the Kenner Stakes at two miles, when he defeated Spendthrift as easily as before, along with Jericho, Monitor and Harold.

Pierre Lorillard gave Hunt Reynolds \$20,000 for Falsetto, a great price for those days, and took him over to England. He did not race there. In a great trial he gave Parole twenty pounds and a beating, right on the heels of the latter having raised Cain over there the year before.

But he fell so lame soon after the trial that the idea of racing him had to be abandoned, and he was brought back to become in time the sire of three Kentucky Derby winners, Spendthrift, too, became a great sire, and of more enduring influence than Falsetto.

Man of War being his great-grandson and a living testimonial to the present standing of his line, Spendthrift also went over to England on a racing venture that came to nothing.

TRAINER W. H. MANSUR'S DEATH

LONDON, England, July 22.—W. H. Mansur, the well known ex-trainer, died at Newmarket yesterday, aged 85.

Few turfmen had had a more varied experience. After an apprenticeship he went to Cairo to take charge of the breeding and racing studs of Ismail Pacha, and from there he migrated to Russia, where he trained for the imperial government.

In 1870 Mansur returned to England and started training at Newmarket. One year Mansur turned out 134 winners.

One of Mansur's sons, George, went to America with the Duke of Beaufort's Strathrose in 1894, for the World's Fair Derby, in which he ran last.

Young Mansur also trained The Panther, which ran so ingloriously in the Epsom Derby of 1919.

TRAINER KARRICK'S NEW HORSES

Although still suffering from neuritis to no small extent, trainer W. H. Karrick of the W. R. Coe stable is still able to attend to his duties with the assistance of his son, Kenneth.
