RAIN A SARATOGA VISITOR

Resultant Track Change Brings
About Much Scratching.

Restraint Wins the Consolation
Stakes with Ease—Pen Rose
Leads All the Way.

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 8.—A typical off-day card was further marred by a heavy storm which ranged in this section during the night, converting the track into an ellipse of mud, which was directly responsible for the many withdrawals from the different dashes. The attendance, however, did not show any trace of decrease; on the contrary, there was present a better weekday assemblage than was expected. Considering track conditions and the limited number of starters, capital racing was on tap, featured by the success of most of the favorites.

The Consolation Stakes, of \$3,750 guaranteed value, for two-year-olds found wanting in speed sufficient to compete successfully in the United States Hotel, Grand Union Hotel, Spinnaway or Hopeful Stakes, was the headline in a monetary way, but the three starters—Restraint, Cape Pillar and Swift Grass—did not promise particularly as offering much in the way of a rattling good contest. Restraint, Ranococas-owned, was held to be far superior to her opponents, and was awarded considerable betting attention. Wisdom was justified here, for it was only a canter for the filly to lead her opponents home, Cape Pillar landing in second place. Trainer Hildreth was notified of \$1,000 of the \$2,130 that went to the winner. She was in for \$1,400 and B. A. Lane bid her up to \$2,400 before desisting. She was retained with an advance of \$5.

The third race, a mile dash exclusively for mares three years old and over, originally had a field of ten entered and promised well as a contest, but when withdrawals were all in only Pen Rose, Chateau Thierry and Cimarron were left to strive for the purse. Pen Rose was the pronounced choice here, and she never gave her supporters any serious concern, for Fator took her into a good lead at once and she was never fully extended, winning as the rider plied from Chateau Thierry, Cimarron giving the latter some stubborn contention for second place.

KUMMER'S BLUNDER DEFEATS TEN-LEC.

Jockey E. Kummer's blunder in the fourth race in guiding Ten-Lec into the deepest going upset plans of the Foreign Stable to land the victory. The filly had the purse at her mercy when rounding into the stretch, but for some reason Kummer elected to take her to the inner rail where the going was holding. Parader, which had been her closest follower in the earlier running, gained steadily as a result of having the better footing through the last eighth and succeeded in getting up in the last few strides to overhaul the exhausted Ten-Lec. The Foreign Stable's connections thought highly of their representative and supported her with rare confidence. It was stupid work on the part of Kummer that brought about her failure.

Musty, owned by J. S. Cosden, had the call in the initial dash, a maiden race at three-quarters, bringing to the barrier thirteen non-winners. The doubt whether Musty would get off in a forward flight on account of his bad past manners was responsible for the liberal market about him and the support for Lampus and Sagacity. Musty gave his supporters but little concern as to the result when he left the barrier in advance and increased his lead with every stride to ultimately win as his rider pleased, Lucky Find landing in second place and Briganna finishing third. Lampus and Sagacity were prominent in the first half.

BEST CONTEST OF AFTERNOON.

The best contest of the afternoon came when least expected in the fifth race, which had maiden jockeys astride the mounts. There were six starters and they came to the finish strong out across the track in almost evenly aligned, Pickwick, on the extreme outside where the footing was most solid, getting up after making a tardy beginning to beat Mavehona, with Scotch Verdict in third place. The winner was guided by F. Reilly. Turnabout was the favored one in the race, but Pickwick and Mavehona were by no means neglected.

Eleven two-year-olds concluded the afternoon's proceedings and they furnished an exciting struggle, with the victory ultimately going to W. P. Thompson's Nedna, on which Fator rode a wide course to secure the better footing. The staunchly supported Roulette, in J. S. Cosden's colors, finished second, only slightly in back of the winner, and Caretaker disposed of the others for third place.

Jockey Fator was much in the limelight during the afternoon and rode three of his mounts to victory, inaugurating his success with Pen Rose and following in succession with Restraint and Nedna.

William Ryan, prominent on all American tracks, was a visitor and contemplates an indefinite stay. Mavehona was claimed out of the fifth race by F. J. Kelley at a cost of \$3,220.

Frank J. Bruen, general manager of the Havana track, arrived today for a consultation with Thomas Monahan, who recently purchased the Cuban plant. Plans for next winter's race meeting will be unfolded to the horsemen within the next few days.

G. W. Ferman, whose horses are in Canada, arrived today for a brief visit.

Incheape and Purchase, the two Ranococas Stable cracks, are again in active training, having recovered from their recent mishaps. Incheape was intended to make his racing debut this afternoon in the Ranococas colors, but the change in track conditions caused trainer Hildreth to withdraw him.

Max Hirsch will make an effort to land some of the rich long-distance stakes in Kentucky next fall with Devastation, which he has entered extensively.

Easily Wins Windsor Handicap at Delorimier Park—Three Horses Fall During Race.

MONTREAL, Que., August 8.—Leading practically throughout, Cacambo scored an easy victory from Sentimental and Rameau in the Windsor Handicap, which featured the card at Delorimier Park this afternoon. The race was marred by a mishap, three of the horses falling. Oaklawn Belle, with Dunkinson up, was a keen contender when she fell at the second turn. George C. Jr., with Jacobs up, fell over the former, but both riders escaped with a slight shaking up.

Aunt Deda beat the favorite Lura in the opener and old J. D. Sugg scampered away with the second, leading home Jill and Velle, the favorite, Sand River II., finishing unplaced.

Mack Garner was a huge disappointment in the third race, following home Lady Ione, Walter Mack and Robert L. Owen.

Jockey Jackson, who received a bad fall while working British Isles here Thursday evening, was able to leave the hospital today.

For alleged practices detrimental to the best interests of racing Joseph Cardini, alias Cuban Harry, was taken into custody here this afternoon by detective G. Seward. He will appear before immigration authorities tomorrow and it is possible that he may be deported. According to detective Seward, Cardini is wanted by the police in New York. His arrest here followed an investigation which has been in progress for two weeks in connection with alleged tampering with jockeys riding at local tracks.

P. J. Miles was an arrival today with his stable at Blue Bonnets. He came from Hamilton.

Jockey J. Dawson has left here to ride at the fairs throughout the state of Maryland.

E. E. Major will ship his stable of nine head to Erie, Pa., at the close of this meeting on Thursday. Jockey D. Prible will accompany the stable.

General manager Frank Sullivan of the Quebec Hunt Club was a visitor here this morning attempting to induce horsemen to ship to the Quebec meeting next week. Edward Tribe has been engaged to do the starting there.

The three-year-old Joe Tag broke down in his race here on Saturday.

The two-year-old Captain Greet wrenched an ankle and was lame today.

In place of opening on Friday as per schedule the second meeting at King Edward Park will commence on Saturday.

L. T. Whitehill will send his string to Dorval Park at the close of this meeting.

S. C. Nuckolls, Jr., one of the Kentucky stewards, was an arrival from Devonshire, where he served in the stand last week. He plans an indefinite stay.

J. O. Keene of the Kentucky State Racing Commission, who has had a trio of two-year-olds here for some time, came in today.

Stewart Hunter, secretary to Senator Johnson N. Camden, joined the Kentucky delegation this afternoon.

Walter O. Parmer came from Windsor and will remain until the last of the week, when he returns there for the next meeting.

Jockey Lawrence Lyke, who spent Saturday in a hospital as the result of an injured eye, was unable to be at the track today.

Clarence Buxton came in with the good apprentice jockey A. Gantner from Canada. Buxton was not long in making his presence felt, as he bid Musty, winner of the first race, up from \$1,000 to \$2,005, at which figure trainer Garth retained him.

The two-year-old Ultimo in the C. A. Stoneham stable has been unsexed.

The stake blanks for the Empire City autumn meeting were received here today and will be looked after by V. B. Schaumburg.

Joseph P. Kennedy, former member of the Maryland Racing Commission, was among today's visitors.

Trainer W. A. Perkins, who has thirty-two horses at present in Windsor, was an arrival. He stated that his charges would be shipped to Latonia on August 29 and that they would be raced at the Windsor tracks until then.

C. T. Worthington came over from Fort Erie to attend the yearling sales.

The Zeus-Yuletide filly which sold for \$1,100 on the opening night was resold Friday night and W. J. Egan became her owner.

The yearlings bought for T. J. Pendergast's account will be broken and developed by L. Cahn, who will ship them with his other horses to Latonia before the opening there.

Nalapa Farm horses in training will be sold by Fasig-Tipton Co. on Monday night, August 15. The list includes: Alexander Hamilton, John Paul Jones, Caligula, Edgar Allan Poe, Mulciber, Despair, Scarpis, Denier Son, Sweep, The Trout, Ballot Mark, Good Time, Chatterton, Baracuda, Honorably Lighter, Quaker and Herslog, with probably several others.

YEARLING PRICES DROPPING

Results of Second Newmarket July Sales Show Reduction in Average Value.

LONDON, July 23.—It is only during the past two or three years that the second July Sales at Newmarket have become of importance. Prior to the war there were always two sale rings at Doncaster. This was a great inconvenience for many reasons. Since 1919 Messrs. Tattersall have rigorously cut down the Doncaster catalogue and sold in one ring only at the Yorkshire town. The result has been that breeders who cannot sell at Doncaster have all to send their yearlings to Newmarket, either in July or October, and the consequence is that the second July Sales have assumed much greater importance.

At the second July meeting this year one hundred animals were sold; they realized a total of \$188,300, which gives an average of \$1,883. At the corresponding sale last year the average for 107 yearlings was \$1,990. Last week fifty-three colts averaged \$2,000 and forty-seven fillies averaged \$1,790. The combined results of the yearlings sold at the first and second July meetings at Newmarket show that two hundred and fifty-six yearlings were disposed of for an aggregate of \$642,925; the average therefore was \$2,512.

Curiously, in 1920 an exactly similar number of yearlings were sold at auction, but the average was then \$2,900. The reduced figures were not unexpected; indeed it was generally anticipated that prices would be on a much lower level than in the previous year, due, of course, to the coal trouble and the severe depression in business circles. The actual results therefore came as an agreeable surprise, although a number of vendors were disappointed, as the results in places were "patchy." Some good youngsters went below their value while others sold well.

The feature of the second July Sales was seven yearlings from the famous Sledmere Stud. As a rule all their stock is offered at Doncaster, but there were so many yearlings this season that it was considered advisable to sell some of them in July at Newmarket. It may be taken for granted that the best have been reserved for Doncaster. The seven sold last week made an average of \$3,620, an amount well below their standard; but not anticipated by the Sledmere Stud manager. Last year at Doncaster the Sledmere average was \$21,020.

Lady James Douglas, the owner of Gainsborough, also sold all her yearlings at the second July Sales.

Last year the combined figures were: 136 colts averaged \$2,933 and 115 fillies averaged \$2,580; practically \$3,255 all round. The figures this year represent a drop of about 25 per cent in values. This was reflected in the market, for numerous yearlings were purchased for Italy, Spain, Australia and elsewhere.

AMERICAN JOCKEYS ARE IN THE LEAD

PARIS, France, Aug. 8.—American riders are displaying superior jockeyship both in England and France. In the monthly returns just issued by the Societe d'Encouragement showing results up to August 1, jockeys Frank O'Neill and Matt McGee are tied for leadership with fifty-two winning mounts each. A. K. Macomber has first call on O'Neill, Steve Donohue and Frank Bullock are also tied for winning mounts on the English turf.

FORT ERIE'S FINE INAUGURAL

Boniface First in Dominion Handicap by a Narrow Margin.

Ross Star Hard Pressed by My Dear—Thrilling Finishes Feature the Racing.

FORT ERIE, Ont., August 8.—The Dominion Handicap, which was offered as the feature attraction for the opening day's racing at Fort Erie this afternoon, was won by J. K. L. Ross' iron horse Boniface after a hard and grueling stretch drive with My Dear. Brilliant Jester being third. The race was a dash of a mile and a quarter, to which \$7,500 had been added, and called for horses three-year-olds and over. A field of five faced the starter, there being three withdrawals.

The start was a good one and Brilliant Jester, from the Seagram Stable, was the one to cut out the pace, while Boniface and My Dear were each lying within close striking distance. That alignment was maintained until well toward the turn-out of the stretch, when Claver sent Boniface after the leaders, McTaggart also calling on My Dear. When well straightened out in the stretch run Boniface stood a hard drive and just managed to hold a small advantage over the courageous little daughter of King James and win by a head. Brilliant Jester was a good third, while Sir Grafton brought up the rear, never having been a contending factor.

Threatening weather prevailed for the opening day and the severe storms of Saturday and Sunday left telling marks on the going, which was slow and holding and deep down on the inner rail. The card which was offered served to bring together well balanced fields, and the majority of the winners scored only after hard drives and close finishes.

Secondary to the feature event was the Buffalo Express Handicap, a dash of five and a half furlongs. This race brought together a small but well matched band of sprinters. The winner turned up in A. L. Kirby's Talisman, which managed to outstay the fast closing Eulah F. to win by a short margin. The latter had a shorter margin over Last One, while the favorite, Hildur, was fourth.

WINNER FOR TRAINER SCHELKE.

Fred Schelke, former trainer of Commander Ross' Canadian stable, had the distinction of sending the first winner of the meeting to the post in the Thornecliffe Stable's Push Pin, which beat the favorite, Lady Heart, in the opening dash. The race was for Canadian-bred two-year-olds at five-eighths of a mile. After a brief display of early speed Humorist gave way to Push Pin, and the daughter of First Sight—Sky Rocket showed the way thereafter. However, it was no clinch for the Thornecliffe standard bearer, as Lady Heart was right at her heels all the way. J. McTaggart's vigorous finish on the winner really decided the race. It was a close thing at the end, the first three horses being less than a half length apart.

Again in the second race the spectators were thrilled by a nose and head finish between the first three horses, the result of which was in doubt until the officials announced the placing. Seven platers, of more or less fondness for heavy going, faced the starter in this contest, with preference shown for Lady Luxury. The pace was fast for the track, Polar Cub setting a merry pace, with Lady Luxury closest in attendance. When the stretch was reached the pacemaker retired and Lady Luxury appeared all over the winner. Her backers were already hailing her as the victress, when they were given the shock of their lives, Libertybelle coming on the outside in the last eighth and earning the decision in the last stride. The early pace told on the favorite at the end and she tired when the winner made his belated but successful challenge. Marie Maxim was third, right at the leaders' flanks, after a good race.

Still another battle royal was provided in the closing dash of the afternoon, Eucrinette, Darnay and Woodthrush crossing the winning line in the order named with only the judges able to separate them. It was a fine finish and Claver showed to advantage.

LARGE CROWD IN ATTENDANCE.

The crowd, which was of large proportions despite the weather, was well rewarded for their journey across the river, betting was fairly brisk, although many of the winners paid large dividends for the usual investment.

General James W. Wadsworth, Sr., of the New York State Racing Commission, was a visitor this afternoon and viewed the races from the stewards' stand.

Jockey A. Claver arrived from Saratoga this morning to ride Boniface in the stake event. He returns to Saratoga tonight, while the horses will remain here until the conclusion of the meeting.

R. A. Eddy, general manager of the Business Men's Racing Association at New Orleans, was an arrival this morning. Mr. Eddy has glowing prospects for the forthcoming winter season at New Orleans.

At private sale L. A. Seregni sold to L. A. McDermid the plater Citizen, which will be shipped to Vancouver for racing at that point.

Word was received from Windsor that the condition of jockey E. Taylor is improving rapidly and that he would be discharged sooner than was expected. After a complete examination it was found that no bones had been broken.

R. A. Smith and L. Morris were exonerated in the federal court this morning. A stable boy named Norris was held by the authorities for having two half pints of liquor in his possession. The moving pictures that were found in the car were views of the Frontier Handicap of a year ago that was won by Slippery Elm. The horses at present at Saratoga were ordered released.

One of the outstanding improvements at the plant is a new paddock that at present removes all danger to the patrons from an excitable horse. A high wire fence separates the stalls from the ring and a large runway proceeds to the walking ring.
