MORE MONEY FOR MONTFORT

Pegasus Helps Him Out in Taking Grab Bag Handicap.

Tryster Pleases by His Appearance and Easy Victory—Sande Three Times Winner.

SARATOGA, N. Y., August 17.—Montfort Jones added another stake victory to his credit here when Pegasus, ably ridden by Keogh, accounted for the Grab Bag Handicap, contested by an even dozen of the higher class two-year-olds.

The opening race was vested with additional interest in the presence of Harry Payne Whitney's Tryster among the carded starters. It was the first racing he had done since his start in the Preakness.

PIRATE MCGEE WINS AND CHANGES OWNERS.

The fifth race, in which a poor hand started, resulted in a victory for Pirate McGee, on which Pennan had the mount. Sagacity finished second and Episode just succeeded in finishing third.

John E. Madden's Deadlock, an overwhelming favorite, accounted for the final dash with Frank Furst in second place and Chesterbrook third.

The victory of Pegasus this afternoon marked the fourth two-year-old stake winner that trainer J. C. Milham has saddled during this meeting.

LEXINGTON, Ky., Aug. 17.—Ultimus is dead. The celebrated thoroughbred stallion, son of Commando and Running Stream, by Domino, property of Hal Price Headley and William B. Miller, expired at Beaumont Farm this morning.

Ultimus, an "inbred Domino," was fifteen years old and was valued at \$75,000. He was insured for \$25,000. Ultimus was the sire of Luke McKee, Last Coin, Bonnie Mary, Harry Kelly, High Cloud, Last Straw, Grasp, Kens, Intrigue, Meliora, May Queen, Step Lightly, Filigree, Second Thoughts, Ultima Thule, My Revere and other good horses.

HEAVY TRACK AT WINDSOR

Opening Day Card Is Marred by Numerous Withdrawals.

Feature Race to Bygone Days—Overlooked Minute Man Defeats Bullet Proof.

WINDSOR, Ont., August 17.—What gave promise of being an exceptionally good opening day card was ruined by numerous withdrawals due to the changed track conditions caused by the heavy rains of the early morning.

The fifth race at one mile served as the feature attraction, and C. J. Brockmiller's Bygone Days was returned winner of it. Only four of the overnight acceptances answered the call—Eddie Kickbasher, Bullion and Mint Cat declining.

In the second race at one mile for Canadian-bred horses, three-year-olds and over, Yorkist was the pronounced choice after June Fly stayed away.

Minute Man was entered in the fourth race and was on the eligible list, but was omitted by an oversight when the entries were published.

The third race fell to Some Baby, the Wilson three-year-old rewarding the confidence of his many admirers by racing home a length and a half in front of Tharon, which just headed Tubby A. for second place.

Following the running of the Canadian-bred race, P. G. Christopher deposited a claim in the box. The claim was filed four minutes after the allotted time. The envelope was returned unopened.

Arrangements have been completed between Walter House and jockey J. Butwell whereby the latter will proceed to Saratoga to ride Sweep By in the Liverpool.

Entries for the fall stakes to be run at Toronto, which close tomorrow, have been subscribed to in a liberal manner, according to Joseph McLennan.

Trainer A. L. Austin reported this morning that Vic Munoz had been unsexed and would be on the shelf for some time.

T. E. Crist arrived from Saratoga, accompanied by jockey R. Holloway. Crist brought along his sensational mare Inezog, with which he won a fortune, also the horses Despair and Whalebone, which he purchased at Saratoga.

Jockeys S. Sneiderman and W. Obert came on from the east and jockey J. McGattart returned from his home in Montreal.

The outlook for the coming meeting at Dorval was never more promising. All of the prominent stables that have raced over the Canadian circuit have secured stable accommodations.

level. Left Fielder made a bad landing and turned a somersault. Hunt on Woodruff could not guide his mount out of the way of the prostrate horse and was unseated. None of the riders was injured by his fall.

Ed W. Simms' stable, following the disposal of many of its horses in training Monday night, now consists of fourteen head. Nine are under the direct care of trainer Kim Patterson; two—Vista and Last Rose—are in charge of Will Wallace, and three two-year-olds are in Charles Hughes' care. It is probable that the entire band will be welded into one establishment before long.

Jockey J. Mooney was among the arrivals this morning, but will not resume riding for a week, at least. He was injured at Empire on Pansy, but is rounding steadily back into good condition.

F. Wilson, who was suspended for ten days by the stewards for rough riding, resumed the saddle this afternoon.

G. W. Forman claimed Gipsy Lad from the fifth race yesterday at a cost of \$3,200.

The big band of high priced yearlings bought by H. C. Fisher during the recent sales here will be shipped to Louisville next Monday and given their early racing lessons at Douglas Park, where they also will be wintered.

Fred Tarral's yearling purchases for the Riviera Stable's account will be shipped Sunday to Gravesend, where they will be broken and given their preliminary. There are ten colts and fillies in the consignment.

W. P. Fraser, secretary of the Canadian Racing Association and the Ontario Jockey Club, was among the visitors for an indefinite stay.

Louis Feustel, after saddling Oceania in the Grab Bag Handicap, left for Belmont Park, where he will arrange for the reception of the Nursery Stud youngsters, owned by Maj. August Belmont, and which he will train next year. Feustel will return here to look after the H. D. Riddle horses after he finishes arrangements for the care of the Belmont youngsters.

Kirk Parrington, owner of the Florissant Stable, has bought the contract on Jockey B. Kennedy, held by Gifford A. Cochran. Insubordination resulted in the rider's suspension by his contract employer. Kennedy will go with the Florissant Stable to Kentucky, where Kennedy first came into prominence as a rider.

Paul Weidel, which broke down at Latonia, will be retired to the stud. Mose Lowenstein today leased him for his first season to Baylor Pickman, and he will stand next year at the latter's farm, just outside of Louisville, Ky.

FRENCH SUCCESSES FOR MACOMBER

DEAUVILLE, France, Aug. 17.—The meeting on Saturday, August 13, at the beautiful little city of Bernay in the Department of the Eure, built on the Charleonne River, was a most successful one for A. K. Macomber and his American jockey, Frank O'Neill, who rode the winners.

Both of the two-year-old races of the meeting were won by fillies bred by the late W. K. Vanderbilt, and trained by W. Murphy, at La Morlaize; one by Moonbeam, a chestnut filly by Sweeper—Con Etiole II., by Flying Fox, and the other by Morisande, a brown filly by Rabelais—Affiche, by Sans Souci II.

At Deauville, Sunday, August 14, Macomber's three-year-old Phasia, by Maintenon—Pope Joan, by Disguise, won the fashionable Prix Merettes, beating Capt. Jefferson D. Cohn's Glorious, ridden by Steve Donaghue, by a short head. Frank O'Neill rode the winner.

Other results at Deauville, Sunday, were: The Marquis de Martorell's Cesarewitch candidate Navel An, by Jacoba—Niell, ridden by Milton Henry, beat Baron E. de Rothschild's Vesperation, b. c. by Sans Souci II.—Wetaria, ridden by F. O'Neill, also a Cesarewitch entry, by a head.

The Prix Roches Noire was won by Baron E. de Rothschild's Viburnum, a four-year-old son of Bay Chery—Viridiflora, by Sans Souci II., ridden by the American jockey Matt McGee. Among those which ran were N. E. Ambatielos' Fisticuff, by Irish Lad, ridden by M. Garner and A. K. Macomber's Pantagruel, a two-year-old bay colt by Rabelais—Cagotte, by Champignon, trained by W. Duke, and Baron E. de Rothschild's Zanpanie, piloted by Matt McGee.

MONTREAL, Que., August 17.—Taking the lead after completing half the journey R. V. Haymaker's Laura scored a decisive victory over Musito and Oaklawn Belle in the La Salle Handicap, which featured the racing at King Edward Park today.

Jockey W. Hinphy's riding was again a feature. He piloted Laura four winners today, bringing his total up to thirteen during four days of this meeting.

Entries close today for eight valuable stake races to be run at Woodbine Park during the Ontario Jockey Club's autumn meeting, from September 24 to October 1. They include the Toronto Autumn and Ontario Jockey Club Cups, each of \$7,500 added; the Durham and Seagram Cups, King George Stakes, Lansdowne's Nursery Handicap, Grey Stakes and Hendrie Steeplechase, each with \$5,000 added.

The reason why Lord Derby owns so few, if any, wayward runners is probably due to the fact that he will not have his animals punished with the whip. The late Lord Falmouth, by the way, would not allow his horses to be touched by whip or spur, and Lord Derby shares the same view, viz., that more races are lost than won by the fall.—Sporting Life.

SPORTING HORSE OF THE WORLD The thoroughbred horse is the sporting horse of the world. The breed was established for racing and has been maintained for that purpose in England and other countries since the days of Charles II., who was restored to the throne in 1660. Certain strains have at times thrown out "sports" that have shown other qualities, which were intensified and established by clever breeders, who established saddlers, hunters, coaches and the trotter, Messenger being the foundation stone in the inheritance of the last-named. These "sports" came from the thoroughbred family before the breed was thoroughly established and carried with them the characteristics of an ancestor whose form or way of going came to the surface after a lapse of years. The day, however, has gone by when a cross of thoroughbred blood can improve any of these families unless it is buried by top crosses of the breed with which it is blended.
