DELAY ACTION ON ENSOR

Jockey Club Stewards Table His Application Until July Meeting—Details of Business.

NEW YORK, N. Y., May 2.—L. Ensor's last opportunity to secure a jockey license before the opening of the metropolitan season at Jamaica was removed last week when the stewards of the Jockey Club, meeting in the new offices at 66 West Fortieth street, voted to lay his application on the table until the July meeting.

Ensor's sensational riding and his successive falls from grace have been a subject of discussion in turf circles for many months. When in form the rider is generally recognized as qualified to rank with the best of the jockey brigade, but his periodic flashes of fine horsemanship have invariably been followed in the past by behavior which has brought upon him the sharp displeasure of racing officials.

Ensor lost his license for the last time to date when he reported to the scales at Saratoga last August "in an unfit condition to ride." Since that time there have been repeated reports that he was to be restored to good standing. He has been exercising the R. T. Wilson horses daily and keeping himself in good condition.

On the opening day at Havre de Grace Ensor's name was posted on the jockey board as one of the riders in the first race, but the Maryland Racing Commission denied him permission to ride. They had received no notice that he had been reinstated by the Jockey Club.

The action of the stewards Wednesday indicates that Ensor is to be placed on probation, and may be granted a license in July if he continues to tread the straight and narrow path.

In accordance with the recommendations of the license committee the stewards denied the applications of jockeys A. Collins, G. Yeargin and Charles R. Peak for restoration to good standing. Peak has not been in good standing for several years. Collins lost his license following investigation of his ride on Saddle Ring at Saratoga last August. Yeargin was barred following an unsatisfactory ride on Leatherface at the Spa.

The applications of Daniel Ahern, Paul Headley and Lester Loughlin for restoration to good standing were laid on the table. A number of trainers' and jockeys' licenses were granted on recommendation of the license committee.

The stewards present at the meeting were: August Belmont, F. K. Sturgis, H. K. Knapp, Joseph E. Davis, William Woodward, John E. Cowdin and Joseph E. Widener.

The officials for the United Hunts Racing Association were appointed. A. H. Morris was named as deputy steward to represent F. R. Hitchcock during the latter's absence abroad.

Assistant secretary Algernon Daingerfield was instructed to notify all members of the Jockey Club that arrangements have been completed between the Kentucky Jockey Club and the racing associations under the jurisdiction of the Jockey Club for the mutual recognition of their respective buttons and insignia.

Von Stade at the meeting of the United Hunts Racing Association. W. S. Vosburgh at the meeting of the Metropolitan Jockey Club. J. E. Widener at the meeting of the Westchester Racing Association. J. E. Davis at the meeting of the Queens County Jockey Club. A. H. Morris at the meeting of the Empire City Racing Association. J. E. Widener at the meeting of the Saratoga Association.

TREDENNIS FOUND HIMSELF

The most striking modern instance of horse study and intelligent handling of an individual is the Irish sire Tredennis, which, when racing, could not run fast enough to keep himself warm. Albert Lowry bought him eventually for \$500 and got the money back a thousand times over. He relied simply on the horse's breeding and gave him a chance. It was a case of sheer speculation. Mr. Lowry, or any other breeder, might make a hundred similar experiments and meet with failure every time.

That Boniface is in grand form was proven in the Philadelphia, when he conquered the mighty Exterminator. The result of that victory and another success gave the Ross star the honor of heading the list of money-winning horses, of which the following won \$500 or more each:

HAVRE DE GRACE'S GREAT MEETING

SPRING RACING AT HARFORD COUNTY TRACK IMMENSELY SUCCESSFUL---J. K. L. ROSS LEADS THE WINNING OWNERS, BONIFACE THE HORSES AND C. LANG THE JOCKEYS

The spring meeting at the picturesque Havre de Grace course from April 15 to April 29 was immensely successful both from a racing and a financial standpoint. The Harford Agricultural and Breeders' Association distributed \$142,428 in stakes and purses during the thirteen days of racing, during which time ninety-one races were run and the daily average distribution amounted to \$10,956. Large fields were the general rule and the class of the horses was above the ordinary. The Philadelphia Handicap furnished the outstanding racing thrill of the meeting when the two veteran gladiators, the gallant Exterminator and the courageous Boniface, staged a spectacular duel, the last-named emerging triumphant after a brilliant contest.

Keen was the rivalry between the J. K. L. Ross stable and that of H. P. Whitney for the leading honors of the meeting. Both won the same number of races, finished second the same number of times, but the Ross horses secured third money five times to one for H. P. Whitney. This gave the Ross stable the leadership in money won with \$13,595 to its credit to \$12,499 for H. P. Whitney. The owners who won \$500 or more each:

Old Harry Page and His Veteran Racer Gold Plate Win Feature of One Day's Sport.

NEW YORK, N. Y., May 2.—Old Harry Page and his ancient hunter Gold Plate took the spotlight right away from what was meant for a feature down at the Terminal course today.

It was the curtain raiser for the big season that is to begin at Jamaica tomorrow and one of the most delightful days of sport ever conducted by the association.

Some of the fields were pruned down materially by the blue pencil and in one, a steeplechase, in which professional riders took part, only one horse finished, but with this exception the contests were truly first class.

Mr. Page and Gold Plate performed in the Baltimore Country Club Plate and the only starters against him were Mrs. A. F. Depeyster's Sweet Kiss, ridden by Al Davis, and W. C. Langley's Mar Tom, with J. Bosley in the saddle.

Gold Plate has always been much at home over the Terminal course and the old fellow looked exceedingly fit in the parade to the post.

Sweet Kiss was first to show the way, but she soon gave way to Mar Tom, while Mr. Page had his old chestnut gelding under restraint.

Mr. Page permitted Mar Tom to go right along, but before he had completed the first turn of the course he came down.

With this one out of the way Mr. Page eased his hold sufficiently on Gold Plate to let him go to the front and when he saved a dozen lengths on the turn he was soon romping along with a safe lead.

As Mr. Page and Gold Plate appeared on the track for the parade the band struck up "Auld Lang Syne" and both horse and rider were given a rousing welcome.

The horse and rider came out of the race in good condition and never in his long and honorable career on the turf had Harry Page been given more riotous applause.

And the feature race was all that it was meant to be. It was the Masters of Fox Hounds Association Plate over about three and a half miles of a post and rail course.

In this there were seven starters over the trying course and the only one that did not finish was Al Davis' Texas Star, with his own rider in the saddle.

There was something of a professional atmosphere about the opening three-quarter mile dash when Fairbrother landed vague, from the Huntingdon Valley Farms, winner from Lyke, on the Greentree Stable's Irish Sea, while Boxwood, also from the Greentree Stable, was third.

It was rather a bad day for the Greentree Stable, for Irish Sea stumbled badly when making his bid through the final sixteenth and then in the steeplechase, that also engaged the professional riders, Mohican, from the same stable, unseated J. Rowan.

At the end of the program the three-quarters mile for gentleman riders saw Narosla, well ridden by Penn Smith, winner in a drive from Piraeus, ridden by his owner, J. G. Leiper, Jr. In this contest Mr. Leiper delayed his challenge too long and failed to get up, though his mount was undoubtedly best.

Upon receipt of the official rules from the Tijuana Jockey Club, which included the revocation of jockey H. Saladin's license, the license granted him in Kentucky was withdrawn by the stewards.

Jockey J. Owens, who had the mount on May Bodine in the first race, was suspended for the remainder of the meeting by the stewards for rough riding.
