MORE MUDDY TRACK RACING

Continued Rain Does Away With the Proposed Special Race.

Zev Takes the Albany Handicap Like a High-Class Colt—Bradley Colt Disqualified.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., August 28.—The Rancocas Stable took another of the Saratoga stakes this afternoon, when Zev the fast son of The Finn and Miss Kearney, was winner of the Albany Handicap, at three-quarters. The race was worth \$3,925 to the winner and it marked the fifth straight victory for the colt. He was greatly favored by the heavy track, but it was a high-class performance, when he took up 125 pounds, and giving away great lumps of weight, won easily.

Another rain that fell last night made the track heavy again and there seems no possible chance now for the running of the three-year-old special race, that had been promised for tomorrow.

With some rain this forenoon and lowering clouds all day, there was a falling off in the attendance, while the track condition brought so many scratches that the card was fairly riddled by the blue pencil before post time, although the overnight list was heavy one that gave promise of plenty of contention.

It was natural that Zev should be looked upon as well-nigh a sure winner of the Albany Handicap, for he had proved himself a rarely good colt in soft going. It was a track condition that induced the scratching of Gifford A. Cochran's recent purchase, Goshawk, one that had been required to give Zev two pounds by Mr. Vosburgh. The others to be declared were Blossom Time, Purity and Crochet.

Little time was lost at the post and Sande lost less time in going into the lead with Zev. Once out there he always held the race perfectly safe and at the end was two and a half lengths to the good and racing easily. Morton L. Schwartz' Pennon, a son of Pennant, that has shown a fine turn of speed in some races, was first to chase after Zev, but Boys Believe Me, from the Idle Hour Stock Farm, was right with him. Lyke was successful in having the Greentree Stable's Cherry Pie away better than has been his fortune in most races, and he was right up in the bunch. Walter J. Salmon's Vigil was not far away.

HANDICAPPED BY GOING.

Lyke was forced to take to the outside with Cherry Pie to find racing room, but the colt could not keep step with the early pacemaker and ran as if handicapped by the soft footing. He soon dropped back while Vigil raced up and into second place.

Sande saved on the stretch turn, while McAtee went out slightly with Vigil, but this had no bearing in the result, for Zev was racing so well that the result was never in doubt. Vigil was just as much better than the others at the weights and was five lengths before Boys Believe Me at the end. Cherry Pie had come wide on the stretch turn and Lyke rode him hard all through the stretch, but he was four lengths back of Mr. Bradley's colt.

The race serves to demonstrate that Cherry Pie is anything but a mud runner, while it verified the mud running form of the winner and tended to show that Vigil is also at home in such going.

The opening race was a three-quarters dash for maidens and it resulted in a good finish when Thomas Monahan's Notime came through next to the rail in the stretch to beat Wild Heather home in a drive. Six lengths farther back Jocose had no trouble about beating Adelia S., the only other starter. Jocose cut out the running, but he was never able to draw away from Wild Heather and then at the head of the stretch the Jeffords colt drew alongside, making his challenge on the outside of the leader. Jocose went out slightly and then it was that Merimee made his winning rush with Notime. Through the last eighth it was a pretty fight. Notime and Wild Heather easily drew away from Jocose. Wild Heather seemed best, but he tired slightly and right at the finish Notime nosed him out.

FOUR OUT OF EIGHTEEN GO.

Frederick Johnson's Certain found the going much in his favor in the five and a half furlongs dash for selling plater two-year-olds that was the second race and at the end had Lady Myra well beaten. Although there were eighteen names sent out in the overnight list the field was reduced to four starters by reason of the heavy going. Prince Regent caused some delay at the barrier by his lunging and at the start, while it was a good one, he did not leave on the same stride with the others. The other three dashed away on the same stride and for an eighth raced closely lapped, with Lady

BEGIN WORK AT HAWTHORNE

Preparations for Revival of Chicago Racing on September 30 Now Under Way.

WINDSOR, Ont., August 28.—Joseph A. Murphy today received a wire from Chicago that an agreement had been reached with the United States government in respect to the buildings on the Hawthorne track at Chicago and big forces of men were put to work today getting the track in condition for the meeting opening September 30. Thirty men have been put on the stables. All of the scaffolds on the grandstand have been finished ready for the carpenters. The work on the track proper will be started tomorrow and by the end of the week a force of sixty men will be at work.

Judge Murphy announced today that he had practically completed his officials. He will serve as presiding steward, in addition to giving personal supervision to all departments. Fred W. Gerhardt will act as racing secretary. He is at work on the book, which will be in the hands of the printer by the end of the week. Charles T. Essig will serve as associate steward. George T. Miller will do the starting and John Carey act as paddock judge.

A delegation of prominent horsemen closely affiliated with the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association spent two hours in conference with Judge Murphy Sunday. They heartily approved of the plan to operate as a club this year. They realized that better control of the crowd can be had, a cleaner proposition in every way presented, and when the bill which is being drawn for the legislature January 1 is presented it will have behind it an organization of the best people in the West.

The club dues will be \$50, which will admit members and ladies to all privileges during the coming meeting. None but club members will be admitted to the grounds, except the usual privileges which will be extended to horsemen. It is planned to organize the club on democratic lines, only decent citizenship being required for membership. The drive for members will be started this week with Mr. Essig, an expert on these things, in charge. Special offices will be opened for the drive.

DOUBLE FOR J. R. SKINKER

Fusee and Duke John Carry His Colors to Victory at Connaught Park.

OTTAWA, Ont., August 28.—The J. R. Skinker colors were much in the limelight at Connaught Park this afternoon. W. A. Burtshell saddled both of the Skinker winners when he sent Fusee to the post in the fourth race and Duke John in the fifth.

Fusee came from behind in his race and in a stretch drive outgamed the favorite, Quannah, to beat the latter by half a length. P. Walls had the mount on Fusee.

Duke John's victory came with the running of the President's Handicap, a dash of one mile, to which \$1,000 was added. Eddie Barnes had the mount on Duke John and when the barrier was sprung he was away in front and hugged the inside rail all the way. Duke John was under slight restraint the entire race and at no stage of the journey did the result appear in doubt. Martin A. Noonan was second and the Ross representative, Messines, third.

The first race fell to Lancelot, which made all the pace and in a driving finish beat Al Pierce by a length and a half. The winner opened up a long lead in the early stages, but tired badly in the stretch run.

Seth's Lemon beat Ethel Clayton by a head in the second race and his victory was due to Buxton outriding Gregory when it came to the finish.

The Canadian-bred Doc Gaiety, backed for a good thing, proved an easy winner in the third race. He made all the pace and withstood determined opposition from Maypole at the eighth post and at the end won going away by three lengths.

Seth's Lemon was claimed by A. V. Thomas from E. E. Major for \$1,550.

Arthur Brent will ship his horses from Montreal to Maryland. He announced that his clever little rider, Huntamer, would be in condition to ride at the Laurel meeting. Huntamer has been resting up all summer, recovering from his accident at Tijuana last winter, and is apparently in good form again.

IRISH MEETINGS CANCELED

LONDON, England, August 28.—The Ennis meeting, arranged to be held on September 8, has been canceled, as have those for Miltown Malby for August 25 and September 7.

PHOTOPLAY'S BY A HEAD

Defeats Carmandale in Thrilling Finish in Devonshire Park's Main Attraction.

WINDSOR, Ont., August 28.—W. C. Weant's Photoplay, a daughter of Atheling II.—Envy, was the winner of the Bell Telephone Handicap, the feature of this afternoon's card at Devonshire Park. She won in a thrilling finish with A. Alexandra's Carmandale, while third place fell to J. B. Dunn's Madeline Lillian.

The main attraction was a dash of three-quarters mile, for three-year-olds and over, and brought together a field of seven. There was a slight delay at the barrier, but the field left in good alignment. Carmandale began slower than usual, but soon settled into his stride and went to the front with a rush. Photoplay was the one to race in closest pursuit, while the remainder were closely bunched. Carmandale held a safe lead entering the stretch, but Photoplay was closing gamely under punishment and favored by the light weight wore down the tiring pace maker and got up in the final strides. The time for the race was 1:12, the fastest displayed at the meeting. Photoplay was accorded considerable support in the wagering, although Carmandale was the pronounced choice.

Weather conditions which prevailed this afternoon were all that could be desired and a large crowd turned out for a Monday.

An allowance race, at a mile, for three-year-olds, furnished an upset for the talent, when the warmly supported Fannie Bean failed her backers and finished third to Phucky and Moss Fox II. The winner followed the early pace cut out by Moss Fox II. and at the end was drawing clear. Wilson, who rode Fannie Bean, used poor judgment, to say the least, particularly when making his move in taking an outside position rounding the turn.

Right On Time accounted for the opening dash of the day in an easy manner from Dr. McArthur, while Erlanger was third. The winner was outrun in the early stages, but closed with a rush and after racing Dr. McArthur into defeat drew clear decisively at the finish.

Ring was installed the choice in the second race, but failed, finishing second to Ablaze. The latter dominated the running from the start.

Another long priced winner accounted for the sixth race, which was at three-quarters, when Shoot Away wore down Harp of the North and won drawing away. Bobby Allen was up in the final stride to take second place from the tiring Harp of the North.

A notice was posted in the secretary's office this morning as follows: "Unless riders are reported at 9 a. m. the day of the race owners may be fined and horses may be scratched."

The stewards ordered Bugle March withdrawn pending word of his reinstatement by the Canadian Racing Associations.

MESSANGER IN RETIREMENT

Owing to a Slight Injury Probably Will Not Start in the Hopeful or Futurity.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., August 28.—For a day or two there has been a rumor that the great colt Messenger had bowed a tendon and that it was because of this mishap that he was not a starter in the Grand Union Hotel Stakes and would be an absentee from the Hopeful, Futurity and the other big races of the autumn. August Belmont, the owner and breeder of Messenger, when asked about it said:

"Messenger has not bowed a tendon, but he did grab himself and is now under treatment. Dr. McCully thinks he could fill his engagements, but I am not going to take any chances. You can say that he will not be seen in either the Hopeful or the Futurity. If the colt had really been tightly wound up my course might have been different, but he was only coming to the top of his preparation. Will he start in anything this fall? That will depend entirely on how he comes along."

This is bad news for the racing public, but it would have been worse if the regal chestnut had gone wrong. The bruise he sustained will yield to treatment. Time plays as important a part as medicine in such cases. It is a coincidence that Man o' War grabbed himself in the race with Sir Barton at Windsor and was lame the morning after that contest. Messenger may be ready for a late engagement at Jamaica or Aqueduct. If he doesn't start until next year the public will have him as a topic of discussion during the winter. The impression now prevailing is that he is a very great colt. His looks and work as well as his last public appearance all strengthen the belief that he will take his place among the best.

KENTUCKY AUTUMN RACING

Prospects Excellent for High-Class Sport at the Downs.

Crack Field for Falls City Handicap, Opening Day Attraction—Many Arrivals.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., August 28.—Churchill Downs is wearing its finest autumn garb in preparation for the opening of the Kentucky fall racing season at the local course Wednesday afternoon. A number of improvements have been made since the close of the spring meeting and when Colonel Matt J. Winn, vice-president and general manager of the Kentucky Jockey Club, arrived Saturday from his home in Covington, he found everything in readiness for the bugle.

A great term of racing is Colonel Winn's prediction. He has spent much of the summer in the East and has the promise of most of the big eastern stables that they will send star racers to Kentucky for the rich stakes to be decided on the Blue Grass circuit. "From the standpoint of high-class sport I look for the coming season to be second to none in the history of Kentucky racing," said Colonel Winn. "Our stakes have all filled well, and, what is more, the stars of the country entered will be here to face the barrier. The Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes, at one mile, for two-year-olds, unquestionably will be the best two-year-old race in Kentucky this year. Our own star youngsters will go to the post and they will be met by the best the East has produced. The winner of this race well might be considered the winter favorite for next year's Kentucky Derby."

A high-class field will face the barrier in the Falls City Handicap, which will feature the opening day. Firebrand, Lady Madcap, Dr. Clark, United Verde, Thibodaux, Rockminister, Minto II. and other cracks are among the candidates. This race is at one mile and an eighth.

PLENTY OF RACING MATERIAL.

The Golden Rod Handicap, for two-year-olds, also will be decided. It will serve as a fine preliminary for the Jockey Club Stakes. The daily programs will bring together leading performers in overnight purses and handicaps. More than 500 horses are now quartered here and several hundred more will be added by late arrivals from Saratoga and Canada.

A number of the eligibles for the Falls City Handicap were given their final trials this morning, but the most impressive by far was that of Lady Madcap. She covered the mile and an eighth in 1:54 in good style and ran the final eighth in 13%. The Desha Breckinridge mare was under restraint the first part of the gallop. She ran the first quarter in 25%, half in 50% and three-quarters in 1:15%, then she began to increase her speed and ended up the mile in 1:40%.

Neddum, Jake Greenberg's hope in the Falls City, ran the same distance in 1:56%, the first mile in 1:42%. He was never extended.

Parader, from the T. J. Pendergast stable, galloped a mile in 1:45% in preparation for this stake this morning.

TRACK AT ITS BEST.

The Downs course was at its best today and many fast moves were noted. Braedalbane worked three-quarters of a mile in 1:14 and he was eased up in the last eighth. He covered the first five-eighths in 1:00%.

Racing secretary William H. Shelley opened his office at the Downs today. Judge J. S. Wallace and Julius Reeder reported for duty this morning and spent the day registering horses that will participate in the coming meeting.

Trainer Kay Spence of the Montfort Jones establishment arrived last night from Saratoga. He stopped off at his employer's Audley Farm, Berryville, Va., for a day en route.

Danny Moriarty was an arrival from his home in Hot Springs, Ark., where he spent the summer.

Track superintendent Tom Young received a request from E. R. Bradley for twenty stalls from Saratoga. Part of the Bradley string will go to Belmont Park from the Spa. The stables of John M. Goode, C. T. Worthington and Robert C. Frakes came in from Lexington at noon today.

Trainer R. N. Vestal brought only five horses down from Latonia for the Churchill Downs meeting. They are Centimeter, Maximac, Kinsman, Chief Curry and Tex. All belong to G. L. Blackford. The remainder will be ready for the Latonia meeting.

R. T. Watts brought jockey Johnny Owens down from Canada.

Here and There on the Turf

Messenger's Misfortune. Edict's Spinaway Victory. Whitney's Hopeful Stakes Eligibles.

It is little short of a calamity that August Belmont's two-year-old Messenger has been thrown out of training. The son of Fair Play and Mission has attracted more attention than any of the two-year-olds of the year, and in his short racing career was already hailed as the colt best qualified to finish the racing season at the top of the heap.

Apart from his sturdy blood lines no colt more looked the part than Messenege. A colt of great size and substance he is built along racing lines and is exquisitely balanced, with long well-placed muscles, which only suggest the power and speed that is his by a careful inspection.

When Mr. Belmont announced that Messenege would be reserved for the Futurity and not be started in the Hopeful, the announcement was as music to the ears of some of those who had eligibles to the closing stake race of the Saratoga meeting.

The success of Edict in the Spinaway Stakes, after she had raced earlier among the selling platers, was a development. It might be said on behalf of Edict that Hildreth himself was in a measure fooled by the filly, and he considered her just a high-class selling plater in the early meeting.

J. C. Milam was one who felt that he had the stake money in his pocket with his good filly Anna M. Humphrey. Unfortunately, both she and his Flash Stakes winner, Dust Flower, went wrong, as did Messenege, and they were not even able to keep their engagements in the Spinaway won by Edict Saturday.

It may be that the heavy condition of the track Saturday played an important part in the decision of the Spinaway Stakes, but Edict, no matter what the track condition, was graduated with flying colors from the ranks of the selling platers.

Harry Payne Whitney, with Flagstaff, Rialto, Picketer, Chickvale, Enchantment, Twaddle, Panache and Quarrel, has Hopeful Stakes eligibles enough, and it would not be at all surprising if Enchantment is the only starter of the band in the big race.

SMITH YEARLINGS SELL WELL

Star of the Sale a Superman Colt Bought by Admiral Grayson—Thirty-Five Sold.

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N. Y., August 28.—Rear Admiral Cary T. Grayson carried a yearling bay colt by Superman—Princess Ormonde to \$7,000, the top figure of the James B. Smith sale, held in the Fasig-Tipton mart Friday night. He met with plenty of competition before he finally obtained the youngster, as Montfort Jones, Fred Good and Max Hirsch also bid on him, but they fell out one after another after passing the \$5,000 mark.

While the attendance at last night's sale was up to the standard of previous nights, quite a few of the most liberal buyers, among them Samuel C. Hildreth and J. C. Milam, were absent. The bidding lagged except in spots, but, as a rule, the horses were sold for what was considered fair sums. One of the purchasers last night was Samuel H. Harris, theatrical magnate, who acquired three yearlings at a cost of \$8,300.

J. C. MILAM'S BIG STRING OF YEARLINGS

LEXINGTON, Ky., August 28.—J. C. Milam has sixty-eight yearlings in training at the Kentucky Association track here and that is probably more by several than any other man in America has under his direction. Forty-five and one-half of these youngsters are Milam's property and the other twenty-two and one-half are owned by J. N. Camden, master of Hartland Stud, who was at the course Saturday morning to see them.

Milam shipped from here tonight for Louisville the three-year-old Merle and the two-year-olds Big Bertha, Estrella and Duley, the property of Senator Camden, to join Chalmette, also owned by Senator Camden; Lady Madcap and Braedabane, property of Desha Breckinridge; Child's Play, which Milam leased from Phil T. Chinn last spring, and Watheful Waiting, Muriel Von Der and Whiteleather, which he leased a few days ago from John E. Madden for the Kentucky season.

LATEST GOSSIP FROM SARATOGA

Fred Rehberger, secretary of the Queens County Jockey Club, has received the books for the meeting at Aqueduct from September 18 to September 30. For the opening day there is a surplus of \$430.31 to be added to the overnight purses. While the steeplechasing did not amount to much during the Saratoga meeting, there will be an effort to awaken interest at Aqueduct. There are eight cross-country races carded for the twelve days of racing. These include the Bushwick Handicap, with \$3,000 added, and the Queensboro, another handicap to which \$3,500 is added. The overnight races are of \$1,000 and \$1,200 value.

This coming fall there will be run for the first time a new three-year-old handicap of a mile and a sixteenth, known as the New Rochelle. This has attracted all of the top-notch three-year-olds and Mr. Schaumburg has suggested that its running might lead to a real test for the best eastern three-year-olds being added to the attractions later in the meeting.

S. C. Hildreth tonight shipped most of the horses of the Ranocas Stable back to Belmont Park, keeping Zev, Coeur de Lion, Bud Lerner and his star three-year-old, Kai-Sang,

here. The two-year-olds are engaged for the remaining days of the meeting and Kai-Sang will be on hand in the hope that there may be employment for him before the end of the meeting.

A cheering sign in the entries that have been received for the stakes to be run at Empire City is that the races for the older divisions have filled better than they did last year. This would indicate that there will be no trouble about filling entertaining programs without depending on the two-year-olds.

State Senator John J. Dunnigan of the Bronx and Lieutenant Thomas McManus are late arrivals from New York. Senator Dunnigan is accompanied by his family and will remain for the month of September in their Union avenue cottage.

The Gifford A. Cochran horses will be shipped to Belmont Park Wednesday night and the present plan is to leave the recent purchase, Goshawk, behind to fill his engagement in the Hopeful Stakes, should the track be fast.

D. R. McDaniel will ship his horses to Aqueduct Wednesday and promised to take a lively part in the fall racing about New York.
