EXCELSIOR NOMINATIONS

Jamaica Stake Attracts Fifty Horses of Handicap Division.

Three-Year-Olds of Quality Included Among Those Named for Event—Race Dates Back to the 1903 Season.

NEW YORK, N. Y., April 25.—It was in the spring of 1903 that the Metropolitan Jockey Club gave its first meeting at Jamaica, the mile course that is within a short distance of the old Long Island town of the same name.

There has been considerable expansion of Jamaica in the twenty years that have intervened and it is a much more bustling and important center than it was at that time, but it appears that the track itself is as far away from becoming a residence section as it was in April of 1903.

The Metropolitan Jockey Club and Jamaica form a truly important link in the New York racing circuit and though it came through lean years, along with the other racing organizations of the state, it has prospered until it would be ill indeed if it was crowded out by expanding Jamaica proper.

The year that Jamaica was admitted to the New York turf racing began at Aqueduct on April 15 and Jamaica had second place on the date schedule, conducting its meeting from April 27 for ten days, when the move was made to old Morris Park, which has since been crowded out by the growth of New York into Westchester.

It was that growth that made necessary the move of the Westchester Racing Association to Belmont Park, so that we have a Westchester association miles from its old home from which it took its name.

EXCELSIOR OPENING FEATURE.

On that opening day at Jamaica, back in 1903, the Excelsior Handicap also came into being and an idea of the instant success of the infant jockey club is had from the fact that when the race was won by the late Col. William C. Whitney's Blackstock, other owners who had representatives in the big field that raced were W. L. Fanshawe, J. Hackett, F. J. Lantry, Foxhall P. Keene, Newton Bennington, Walter C. Rollins, Henry J. Morris, W. C. De B. Lopez, Alex Shields, P. H. McCarren, William L. Oliver, W. C. Daly and Michael F. Dwyer.

THE PREVIOUS WINNERS.

Those that have taken the race besides its initial winner, Blackstock, have been: Rostrand, Santa Catalina, Merry Lark, Dr. Gardner, McCarter, Guy Fisher, Meridian, Addie M., Sand Marsh, Roamer, George Smith, Naturalist, Boniface, Blazes and Senings Park.

This is a list that will compare favorably with the winners of any race of like age and the Excelsior Handicap from its beginning, has been a race that has brought together horses of real excellence.

This year the Excelsior Handicap nominations assure that it will be fully up to its best traditions and in the fifty that are named are found the names of the best handicap horses of last year, as well as the most promising three-year-olds of the year, with few exceptions.

The race this year will be run Saturday, May 12, the same date on which the Preakness Stakes is decided at Pimlico. This fact had its effect on the three-year-old entries, but there are many in the list that will not make Pimlico, but will try for the Excelsior Handicap.

ENGLAND'S NEW STALLIONS

Many Sires of Promise Sending Their First Crop of Juveniles to the Spring Races.

(SPECIAL CORRESPONDENCE.)

LONDON, April 10.—Grand Parade is the first of the young stallions whose two-year-olds make their appearance in 1923 to be credited with a winner. Two days later Hainault followed. Irish Elegance has had one or two unsuccessful runners.

Grand Lassie, by Grand Parade—Estrella, a good Spearmint mare with indifferent hocks, won the Sutton Plate at Birmingham on April 3. She beat sixteen others, including Saucy Girl filly and Cookie's Brother, both winners. Lord Glanely, who owns and bred Grand Lassie, bought her dam for \$4,350. The Birmingham winner was not the first runner by Grand Parade. He got Grand Excel unplaced in the Brocklesby. Grand Parade sired twenty foals from twenty-one mares in 1923, so he can have numerous runners this year.

Willis Sharpe Kilmer has a good Grand Parade yearling from Mentha, a daughter of Spearmint, which was bought for him at Newmarket sales in 1921. Oshkosh, a brown filly by Hainault—Lady Georgette, by By George, won a race at Croxton Park April 6. She is a first foal and the first runner by Hainault, a good-looking half-brother by Swynford, to Phalaris. He was more or less a cripple when in training, owing to a knee accident as a yearling. He won six fair class races and carried top weight in the Cambridgeshire. He hobbled to the post, looking as though he would fall. All the same, he finished fifth in a field of twenty-two. Later on Lord Dunraven bought him as a stallion for \$40,000. He is with Lomand, at Adare, probably the most beautiful village in Ireland. Hainault can have seventeen runners in 1923.

Other young sires to have their first offspring racing this season are By Jingo, by Aquascutum, which was mated with one mare in 1920; Irish Elegance, by Sir Archibald; and Gainsborough, by Bayardo, the best colt of his year. The last named can have fourteen runners, including Jura, a half-sister to Craig, an Ernan.

He, a handsome and good-staying son of Santoi, has eleven youngsters to run for him. My Ronald has the same number. He was a most moderate race horse, sired by Dark Ronald. Prince Philip, in Ireland, had a good chance and there are fourteen two-year-olds by the son of Roi Herode and Santee by Santoi. Radiant, brother to Sunstar, returned from India late in 1920. He had a short season, so there are only six representatives.

St. Tudwal, by St. Frusquin, a good-looking horse which made his reputation over hurdles, has the same number. Skyrocket, by Sunstar, from the dam of Craig an Ernan, has eleven two-year-olds to run for him. His first produce were unlucky, as seven other foals died before they were one year old. Syndrian, son of Sunder, can have thirteen runners. He is not quite sound in his wind, which prevented his sale as a stallion just before he finished racing. S. B. Joel, therefore, gave him an opportunity at the stud. Nearly all the youngsters by Syndrian are from Mr. Joel's mares.

BUSTER KEATON TO JAMAICA

Buster Keaton, the fast two-year-old belonging to J. C. McKay and J. W. Schenk, is on his way to Jamaica from California in charge of trainer George Miller. The star juvenile is included in a carload of thoroughbreds which also includes the horses of J. M. Crane in charge of C. Kirschbaum.

TURNER GOING TO FRANCE

Nash Turner, trainer and former jockey, will return to France shortly. Trainer Turner received his credentials from the Jockey Club Monday and made it known that he had completed arrangements to resume the training of thoroughbreds in France.

Trainer Andrew Blakely and jockey J. Merimee arrived at Jamaica Monday from Tijuana. Blakely campaigned the William Daniel horses at Tijuana during the winter.

TIJUANA RACING STATISTICS

Total of \$698,290 Distributed in Stakes and Purses at Meeting.

One Thousand and One Races Run—C. B. Irwin Makes Remarkable Record—Abadane Hero of Horses.

The Tijuana meeting of 1922-1923 extended over a period of 125 racing days, from Thanksgiving Day, November 30, 1922, to Sunday, April 22, 1923. A total of 1,001 races were run and \$698,290, a daily average of \$5,586, was distributed in stakes and purses.

The outstanding incident in connection with the long meeting was the remarkable success achieved by the stable of C. B. Irwin, the Wyoming horseman. Altogether his horses won 111 races, finished second in 74, was third 66 times and accounted for \$73,310.

Commander J. K. L. Ross has no reason to regret sending a division of his stable to race at Tijuana, as they well repaid the expense of shipping them West by winning a total of \$40,920.

By virtue of capturing the rich Coffroth Handicap Rebuke was the largest money-winning horse of the meeting. The real hero was Abadane, with twelve victories to his credit. He carried heavy imposts, conceded much weight to his opponents and won at all distances. Harry D. was another that raced in brilliant fashion, accounting for fifteen races.

The riding honors belong to F. Stevens, who rode 71 winners. C. Ralls was second with 62, while W. Pool and E. Petzoldt tied for third place with 50 each.
