JUST DAVID BY NOSE

Beats Pegasus in Exciting Finish in Latonia's Main Race.

Queen Charming Again Triumphs—Seclusion, Speckled Beauty and Parader Disappoint.

LATONIA, Ky., Oct. 16.—Latonia's racing offer for Thursday was decidedly below standard and it brought to the post in the different races some of the more humbler ones to strive for the rich purses. The sport did not suffer to any appreciable extent, for the even caliber of the contestants brought about hard fought contests with close finishes. Favorites were not particularly successful, most of them going down to defeat.

The principal race was the Stationers' Claiming Mile Handicap, in which five of the high grade platers met and it furnished an exciting duel between Just David and Pegasus, the former winning by a nose. Mergler rode him exceptionally well and he also saved much ground for the entire way. Pegasus looked like the winner an eighth out, where he had attained a slight lead, but in the final drive he tired slightly and Just David managed to again regain the lead he had relinquished to Pegasus in the stretch. King Gorin II. finished in third place after a hard race. Quince Garden was expected to cut a prominent figure in the result, but he was done after going three-quarters.

Queen Charming, which has been racing consistently, was victress of the fourth race, in which she met some ordinary ones that included New Gold and Elusive. New Gold finished in second place, showing superiority over the others. Elusive kept Queen Charming close company for the first half mile, but when Martin began using his whip the filly swerved all over the track and tired perceptibly in the last eighth. Queen Charming was the first successful favorite of the afternoon.

O'DONNELL AT FAULT.

Jockey S. O'Donnell, who came here heralded as a crack rider, suffered considerable in reputation, when, through his blunders, Seclusion, an outstanding favorite, went down to defeat by a narrow margin, the inexperienced Hoagland beating him home with the outsider, Phil McCann. Seclusion was pounds the best, but O'Donnell took her far out of contention in the first three-eighths and only began to move up just before reaching the stretch. The filly found a clear course next the inner rail which saved her considerable ground and she responded in game style, but missed the victory by a head. After the finish M. Shapoff claimed her at a cost of \$2,500.

P. T. Chinn's Speckled Beauty was supported to the exclusion of the others in the second race, comprising a dozen maiden youngsters, but after flattering in the lead until reaching the stretch, she began fading fast and Dr. Tanner, hard ridden and holding on well, won by a small margin from Rocky with Bad Luck pressing the pair closely and just in advance of Backbiter. The finish here was spectacular. The leaders all driving hard changed leadership during the last sixteenth and it required the last stride to determine the winner.

GRIFFIN RIDES WELL.

Parader was the third successive favorite to go down to defeat. He was beaten home by Elias O., on which the diminutive Griffin rode especially well and succeeded in overcoming considerable interference at the first turn. He kept him in close proximity to the leaders thereafter and came away in the stretch to win with much in reserve. Parader attained the lead at one stage and looked to be the winner at that time, but he tired steadily when urged hard. Tender Seth, showing the most speed for three quarters, retired thereafter, but was good enough to land in third place.

Riviera, which in a preceding start won handily, came right back with a good performance to beat some fast youngsters in the sixth race. Bridesmaid was close on her heels with the favorite, Kitty Pat, following. Riviera displayed a high order of speed from the start and she was given a hustling ride by Heupel. Bridesmaid and Kitty Pat were both laggards in the early stages, but they moved up determinedly and finished going faster than the winner. The trainer of the latter tried to have the filly excused from starting but as he gave no justifiable excuse for wanting to withdraw her after the usual scratch time, the stewards declined to grant his request.

The concluding race, in which some ordinary ones met, produced a spirited finish after Miss Mazie, Yorick and Kindred had fought a hard duel from the start. Miss Mazie showed improvement in her running from a preceding start and she got up to win in the last stride, Yorick beating home Kindred also by the narrow margin.

EPINARD REACHES LAUREL

Arrives at Maryland Track After Safe Journey From Latonia.

Will be Certain Starter in Laurel Stakes to be Run Saturday—His Probable Opponents.

LAUREL, Md., Oct. 16.—Epinard arrived at Laurel this morning without mishap on his trip from Latonia, scene of the third and last of his contract engagements in the United States. He was accompanied by his stablemates Satin Slippers and Idle Girl. In the other end of the three-door car came Ladkin, Blind Play and Diagram, three thoroughbreds belonging to August Belmont. Frank Leigh, assistant trainer of Epinar and Dick Williams, groom of the French champion, rode with him from Kentucky. They left Latonia about noon Wednesday and were switched into the Laurel Park unloading chute at 9:50 this morning.

Eugene Leigh and Louis Feustel, trainers of Epinar and Ladkin, arrived later in the morning. Epinar and Ladkin are scheduled to clash Saturday in the \$10,000 Laurel stakes. The race is at a mile, the distance over which Ladkin defeated Epinar narrowly in the second of the International specials, which brought the French horse to this country. The Laurel is a condition race. Epinar receives eleven pounds the best of the weights with regard to Ladkin as compared with the imposts in their first meeting.

EPINARD'S ADVANTAGE.

Then the French horse carried scale of 126 and Ladkin, being a year younger, 119. Saturday Epinar is in with 116 and Ladkin must carry 120. Had Epinar won any of the three international specials, the conditions would have required him to carry 126 pounds. Had he won two of them his impost for Saturday would have been 130.

Because of the weights Epinar will be favorite in the Laurel, despite the fact that it is a real array of horses that is likely to oppose him. The probable field was increased this morning by the arrival of My Play, brother to Man o' War, which runs in the silks of the Lexington Stable. Roy Walden shipped the son of Fair Play from New York to Pimlico and sent him by van from the Baltimore course to Laurel with three stablemates. Andy Shuttling accompanied the outfit to ride My Play Saturday. Following are the most likely opponents of Epinar: Ladkin, My Play, Wise Counsellor, Sun Flag, Single Foot and Whetstone. Other prospects, those less likely starters, are Donaghee, Big Blaze, Initiate and Arcady.

NO POMP OR CEREMONY.

Epinar's entry into Laurel was attended by no pomp or ceremony. When his car was spotted a few paddock loungers welcomed him. As the car came to a stop, Frank Leigh stepped to the platform and helped a bystander place a plank to the exit of the car. After traps had been unloaded from one side of the car, Ladkin, Blind Play and Diagram, in the order named, paraded from their end of the car, and to the barn occupied by Commander J. K. L. Ross, where half a dozen stalls had been set aside for the new arrivals. Epinar was the first of the foreigners to unload. He was playful, but not fractious, as Dick Williams led him from the car.

A light blanket obscured his barrel but watchers were impressed by the sleekness of his coat where the sunshine struck and reflected from its chestnut smoothness. Next in the procession came Frank Leigh with Satin Slippers and Pete, the stable's Aire-dale. Idle Girl brought up the rear. All of the horses were quartered quickly and it was announced later that Epinar would be paraded publicly following the fifth race.

HONOR TO E. R. BRADLEY

Master of Idle Hour Farm Secures Crack Colt From Rancocas Stable, Paying \$10,000.

LATONIA, Ky., Oct. 16.—The biggest turf transaction of the present Latonia meeting was consummated Thursday morning when S. C. Hildreth, acting for the Rancocas stable, sold the three-year-old Honor to E. R. Bradley for the sum of \$10,000. Horsemen are of the opinion that the master of Idle Hour Farm secured a bargain. Honor is a bay colt by Fair Play—Crystal Maid and has started twice here. In his first start, last Saturday, he was beaten by a half length by Dare Say. Wednesday the colt, making his second start, won by ten lengths, running the mile in 1:36. It was this good race that impelled Mr. Bradley to add the colt to his stable. Honor is eligible to the Latonia Championship Stakes and may start in the Bradley colors in that stake. Bob Tail—the Bradley main dependence for the Latonia Championship Stakes—went wrong some time ago and will not start.

BARBARY BUSH VICTORIOUS

Beats Orpheus in Principal Contest at Laurel Park.

Ten Minutes Accounts for Quantic Handicap, After Which Epinar Is Paraded Before the Crowd.

LAUREL, Md., Oct. 16.—Barbary Bush beat Orpheus by a length in the Gunpowder purse, an all-aged race that came fourth on the program. It was at a mile. Harlan finished third. Parke saved ground all the way with the Greentree stable gelding and rode him out by hand to maintain this lead through the stretch. Harlan was away fastest of all, but Barbary Bush, taking the inside position, saved ground and was showing the way around the first turn. Harlan attending him closely with Orpheus outside of them both and all three of them racing almost in perfect alignment. Nearing the stretch Barbary Bush drew out slightly, but Orpheus came on him again and stood a drive gamely. Harlan saved ground, but was beaten five lengths by the second horse. Three others competed but failed to bother the leaders.

Immediately after Ten Minutes won the feature the Quantic Handicap for the Glen Riddle farm at Laurel this afternoon. Epinar, the French champion, was paraded for the inspection of a large crowd. Accompanied by a stable pony and mounted by an exercise boy, the famous son of Badajoz galloped up in front of the stewards' stand to the strains of the Marseillaise. Eugene Leigh and Frank Leigh were in the group that surrounded the French horse as a battery of photographers did their work.

The race in which Ten Minutes triumphed was a fitting introduction to the French champion, which has run three great races in this country. The Hourless colt began slowly and was last of the field for half of the mile and a sixteenth course, came around and won going away. Dr. O'Mara, the pace-maker, held on for second money a length in front of Golden Sphere. J. Parke had the mount on Ten Minutes, his second winner in two consecutive races.

A good band of two-year-olds staged a thriller in the third race with Contract finishing in front with Saratoga Maje second and Courageous third. Saratoga Maje made the pace almost to the finish, but gave way by a head to Contract, which came on the outside. Kennedy rode the vic-

CLAIM OPTION EXERCISED

Judge Murphy and Associates Assert That First Payment on Jefferson Park Deal Made.

With rival interests claiming control of the Jefferson Park track at New Orleans, a court fight to determine the legal ownership now appears probable. In fact, according to Charles Essig, associated with Joseph A. Murphy, Attorney Albert Sabath left Wednesday evening for New Orleans to seek a court injunction restraining the New Orleans faction, comprising Messrs. R. S. Eddy, Jr., James Lemarie, R. Maestri and R. A. Leigh from taking control of the Jefferson Park track.

According to Judge Murphy's representatives here James F. O'Hara and Gad D. Bryan, Jr., original builders of the track, had granted an option for the controlling interest to Joseph A. Murphy, trustee of the National Racing Association, composed of Chicago and New Orleans business men. Reports from New Orleans last week stated that this option had been exercised. This was confirmed yesterday by Charles T. Essig, Chicago representative of Murphy's organization, who stated that the deal had been closed by payment of \$30,000 to O'Hara & Bryan in Baltimore on October 10.

Later reports from New Orleans were to the effect that the Murphy option, expiring October 10, had been allowed to lapse, an that four New Orleans citizens, headed by R. S. Eddy, Jr., had purchased the track upon an option held by G. R. Bryson.

It was said here yesterday that the Murphy option was exercised on the specified date, since depositions have been made by the Greenbaum Sons Bank & Trust Company and by the Postal Telegraph Company that \$30,000 was delivered to the O'Hara & Bryan representatives through the Western National Bank of Baltimore before the option expired.

Mr. Essig stated last night that a further payment of \$50,000 would be made October 20 and the balance November 20, thus completing the contract as provided in the Murphy option.

It was further stated that Judge Murphy had wired from Dallas, Texas, his resignation as presiding steward at Bowie track in Maryland, as well as all the other tracks controlled by O'Hara & Bryan interests.

EMPIRE CITY OPENING

Great Sport Marks Inaugural Day Racing at Yonkers Course.

Scarsdale Handicap to Lucky Play—Stimulus Proves Best in the Juvenile Feature.

YONKERS, N. Y., Oct. 16.—It was a great day of racing that marked the opening of the Empire City Racing Association meeting at the Yonkers track Thursday, and with bright, warm weather an immense throng was in attendance. August Belmont's Lucky Play, under an excellent ride by Clarence Kummer, was the bright and particular star, when he was winner of the mile of the Scarsdale Handicap and in a companion feature, the Killarney Purse for two-year-olds, Marshall Field's Stimulus again proved his worth when he took the measure of W. R. Coe's Zuker. Both of the features brought about stirring finishes.

With a short delay at the post the start for the Scarsdale was a good one, but there came a bit of bumping on the first turn in which Rialto was knocked back badly. Lucky Play had the inside position at the post and Kummer rushed him along to escape the threatened crowding, coming clear before the turn was reached. Laurano was outrunning the others and he was well lapped on the Belmont three-year-old and racing under slight restraint. Kummer was content to hold Laurano, and when the Metropolitan winner made the pace a bit hot after passing the half mile ground, he eased Lucky Play slightly for a few paces. It was Rinkey that was racing in third place, but she was four lengths back of the first two and showing the way to James Butler's Sleepy Head, one that was racing along the inner rail strongly and the two-year-old Tick Tock followed him closely with Rialto last.

BREATHING SPELL HELPS.

After his breathing spell Kummer permitted Lucky Play to run along again after rounding out of the back stretch, and he quickly passed Laurano to go into the command. Laurano was all through from his early effort and swinging into the stretch Lucky Play was clear of his company. He had made a good turn for home and Kummer was master of the situation.

The Killarney Purse over, the short three-quarters distance brought about a good contest when Marshall Field's Stimulus, the top weight, led home W. R. Coe's Zuker, with James Butler's Pique beating H. P. Whitney's Noah for third.

From a good start it was Pique that went out in the lead, but Stimulus was right after him and Noah was a strong-going third. Zuker was a bit slow to find his racing legs and Callahan was permitting him to settle into his stride, with the result that he was badly outrun. Pique held to his lead through the backstretch and cut out a fast pace, but Stimulus, racing along inside of him, was going well, with plenty in reserve, and it was evident that he could go into command at the first asking. Noah was also racing well back of the pair of them, but Zuker had dropped back until he was a full five lengths further away and the others followed along back of him with little chance to be any closer.

Before the stretch was reached Stimulus had shaken off Pique and swinging for home he was a length to the good, while Noah was tiring and unable to improve his position. Stimulus seemed to have the race put away when suddenly Zuker loomed up on the outside. He had closed a big gap and was charging along on the outside at a terrific pace. Thurber sensed the danger and drove Stimulus, and none too soon for the son of Ultimus was doing his best at the end to beat the grandson of Ultimus by a neck. The running suggested that Callahan had waited too long with Zuker and that an earlier move would have seen the Coe colt winner. But it must be remembered that while he was avoiding the early pace Stimulus, under the top weight, was forcing that same pace to put away Pique and Noah.

OPENER TO BLUE HILL.

Jack Richardson's Blue Hill was winner of the opening race of the day and meeting. This was a mile race for cheap platers and at the end he was showing the way to W. Kearns' Bear Grass, while J. O. Burtschell's Wrackhorn saved third from Honfleur. Bear Grass was the one to cut out the running and Honfleur chased along after him and in close attendance, while Delysia also raced forwardly through the early stages. Then, leaving the backstretch, Blue Hill moved up on the outside until at the head of the stretch he was almost on even terms with Bear Grass and Honfleur. Bear Grass saved ground on the stretch turn, while Blue Hill was forced to go wide, but the latter was good enough to put the Kearns' plater away readily in the last eighth. Wrackhorn finished resolutely to take third place from the tiring Honfleur. The race run by Blue Hill was a decided improvement over his last

Here and There on the Turf

Master Charlie's Class.
Will Race in Kentucky.
Epinard and Kummer at Laurel.
Chevy Chase is Promising.

When William Daniels' Master Charlie ran such an impressive race to win the Remsen Handicap at Jamaica Wednesday, he took front rank among the candidates for the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes, to be decided at Churchill Downs during the meeting which is to open October 23.

It is not often that a colt that is a winner in March is capable of going on and winning the \$50,000 Hopeful at Saratoga, but that is what the son of Lord Archer and Bachelor's Choice accomplished before his fine performance in the Remsen Handicap.

When it is taken into consideration that from time to time Andy Blakely has had to nurse the good colt along he is entitled to great credit for the present condition of his charge, though, of course, he has had something to work on worth while.

Master Charlie made his first appearance in a race at Tijuana on March 9, which meant that he had been in training for a considerable time before that date. Beaten in his first start he followed it with three victories, two at Tijuana and one at Jamaica. The notable victory at the Mexican course was in the Tijuana Futurity, and it was his victory there that compelled him to take up a severe penalty in his New York engagements.

He took the Colorado Stakes at Jamaica on May 10 and after one more start at the course of the Metropolitan Jockey Club he was not seen again until the August racing at Saratoga.

Beaten in both the Grab Bag and the Adirondack Handicaps, Master Charlie gave a full realization of his racing ability when he shouldered 130 pounds and won the Hopeful Stakes, adding just \$48,700 to his winnings. There were twenty-five of the best that could be mustered in the field for the Hopeful, and those that finished behind Mr. Daniel's English colt were Pas Seul, Kentucky Cardinal, Single Foot, Blue Ridge, Sunny Man, Swope, American Flag, Sun Hator, By Himself, Forward Pass, Backbone, Supremus, Hamadan, Crumple, Stirrup Cup, Laplander, Dangerous, Clouland, Brown Sugar, Stimulus, Joe Marone III, The Bat, Trip Lightly and Almadel.

The Remsen Handicap was the next start for Master Charlie. He was not an eligible to the Futurity at Belmont Park, won by Mother Goose, but in the Hopeful Stakes he had easily beaten Stimulus, the colt that was pressing Mr. Whitney's filly closely at the finish. And he had beaten Stimulus with fifteen more pounds in the saddle than was carried by Mr. Fields' good colt.

The Remsen Handicap saw him again carrying 130 pounds, and he conclusively verified the Hopeful Stakes running when he ran the three-quarters around the Jamaica turns in 1:11 1/2, the fastest time that has been hung up by a two-year-old in the East this year. What made the performance doubly impressive is the fact that Master Charlie ran out on both of the turns, losing a deal of ground. This made it impossible for Babin to send him along at his best speed, for he was too busily engaged in his endeavor to keep the colt straight.

This running out on the turns is a bad habit and it may cost Master Charlie some races, but he is a colt of high speed, and his Jamaica race showed that even running out he was able to finish out the three-quarters in impressive fashion.

Since early in the year, when Blakely was convinced that Master Charlie is a high-class colt, he has had the Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes, at a mile, in view, and the Remsen Handicap was a part of the colt's preparation for the engagement at Churchill Downs. Master Charlie has been taking long gallops as a part of his preparation and he has convinced his trainer that he is fit and ready to race over the mile route.

He has already shown that he is a rare weight carrier and a colt of great speed, so that if he also proves a stayer, as is promised, he will finish his racing this year with about as much right to the two-year-old championship as any two-year-old that has been shown.

Racing in New York has entered on its last lap. With the sport that comes at the Yonkers course of the Empire City Racing Association the turf season closes October 30, except for two days that the United Hunts will entertain at Belmont Park.

This last meeting promises to furnish excellent racing and, while some of the best horses have been sent to Maryland or Kentucky to fill stake engagements, there are still plenty of them at hand to keep the New Yorkers well entertained.

And it has been a truly remarkable racing season. The coming of Epinarid to this coun-

try will always make 1924 stand out in American turf history and his two races in New York cannot fail to work great good for the future of racing.

While on the subject of the coming over of Epinarid, it is impossible to forget the important part played by M. J. Winn in the coming of the French champion. Mr. Winn, on behalf of the Kentucky Jockey Club, offered the richest added money that was hung up when \$50,000 was the prize as against the \$25,000 that was offered at both Belmont Park and Aqueduct. It was natural that the Kentucky race should be the crowning achievement of the three races that have been run.

Few men have done as much for racing in this country as M. J. Winn and no one man is entitled to more credit for the tremendous prosperity that has come to Kentucky racing and the Kentucky Jockey Club.

With the assurance that Epinarid will be raced in the Laurel Handicap Saturday and that he will be ridden by Clarence Kummer, these is new interest in that mile stake race. Under conditions of this stake Epinarid is in exceedingly well when only required to take up 116 pounds and it ought to afford him a new chance to show his worth.

Marylanders should see the son of Badajoz and Epine Blanche at his best and Maryland

is entitled to an exhibition of the distinguished visitor. It is a state that has been doing big things for the turf of the country and no section has more ardent devotees to the sport than are found in Maryland.

While the Laurel Handicap will be the big attraction on Saturday there will also be great interest in the running of the Chevy Chase Steeplechase Handicap over the two miles and a half course. This is a race to which \$5,000 is added, while the Laurel Handicap has \$10,000 added.

The cross-country fixture has attracted the best steeplechasers in the country and it is assured that the field will be a representative one. Not Much and Dan IV., both imported jumpers, head the list, with 165 and 162 respectively, and then comes another importation in The Red Knight under 156 pounds.

J. E. Widener's Duettiste, the old horse with which it was hoped an American victory in the Liverpool Grand National would be scored, is just a pound under the named imported horses, but, as a matter of fact, Duettiste is imported himself, having been bred in France by August Belmont. But Duettiste will always be looked upon as an American product.

On through the list, many a good one is found among the lighter weights, and, altogether, the Chevy Chase holds out great promise.
