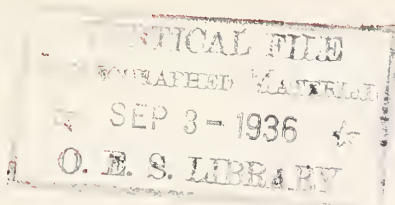

DRIVEWAYS

The problem of how to build a good private driveway has confronted many home owners. Many would like to improve existing drives themselves or build new ones in better location, doing part or all of the work without hiring labor.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has prepared some information, which the owner can use as a guide in constructing a private driveway. Illustrations and cross-section drawings accompany the description of a number of different types of driveway, such as stone, gravel, cinder, slag, bituminous material, concrete, and brick. The best dimensions for ordinary family use are suggested in each case. The information can be obtained by writing to the Bureau of Public Roads, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.
