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Preface

The ARF Drug Education Resources Directory, has been developed to familiarize educators with a variety of print and audio-visual materials that may be used for teaching children and adolescents about drugs (including alcohol and tobacco) and lifestyle choices. The materials listed are intended for school use; however, many are also appropriate to other educational settings or the home environment.

The Directory is organized into six modules: *Primary Resources* (for Kindergarten to Grade 3); *Junior Resources* (for Grades 4-6); *Intermediate Resources* (for Grades 7-10); *Senior Resources* (for Grades 11 to the end of secondary school); *Répertoire des ressources éducatives sur les drogues* (French resources for Kindergarten to the end of secondary school); and *Recommended Films and Videotapes* (for Kindergarten to the end of secondary school). The modules stand on their own; however, the films and videotapes module may be used as a companion to each of the primary resources, junior resources, intermediate resources, and senior resources modules.

The French-language resources module has its own listing of French films and videotapes. In addition, throughout the English-language modules, materials are especially noted if they are also available in French.

Each module, except Recommended Films and Videotapes, includes a very brief selection of key reference materials for educators. Most are books; however, it should be noted that no other books for teacher use have been identified since the number of possible inclusions is very extensive and beyond the scope of the Directory.

Films and videotapes listed in the Directory have been reviewed and recommended for purchase by the ARF Audio/Visual Assessment Committee (publisher of Projections). Each film has been evaluated and assigned a rating on a six-point scale based on scientific accuracy, emotional and visual impact, usefulness to the target audience, and effectiveness in assisting people with alcohol and other drug-related decisions. The pamphlets, curricula, teaching kits, and other classroom resources have generally not been evaluated. (Exceptions have been noted in the text.) Also, users should be aware that there may be charges for the items listed.

Our intention has been to create an inventory of resources for classroom use that are current and readily accessible and have a Canadian focus. Some non-Canadian materials that are widely used and known to be relevant and easily accessible have also been included. Therefore, the Directory presents the range of materials currently available rather than a vetted selection.

Although materials were rigorously solicited, no directory of resources could be complete for long in a field where new products are constantly being developed. We apologize for any errors or omissions and would welcome suggestions for additions to the collection.
