# DUI Facts

Each year in this nation, approximately 17,000 people are killed as a result of drunk driving. That is one person every 30 minutes.

## PENALTIES

The penalties for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) of alcohol and/or drugs have increased during the last decade. The penalties described in this brochure affect all drivers whose blood alcohol, or BAC, tests results show .08 percent or more. Drivers under 21 may be subject to zero tolerance and graduated driver licensing laws, as well as more severe penalties for DUI.

### First DUI Conviction

- Class A Misdemeanor
- Minimum of one year loss of full driving privileges.
- Possible imprisonment for up to one year.
- Maximum fine of \$2,500.

### Second DUI Conviction

- Class A Misdemeanor
- Minimum five-year loss of full driving privileges for a second conviction within 20 years.
- Possible imprisonment for up to one year.
- Mandatory 5 days in jail or 30 days community service for 2nd conviction in 5 years.
- Maximum fine of \$2,500.

### Third DUI Conviction

- Class 4 Felony
- Minimum 10-year loss of full driving privileges.
- Possible imprisonment of one to three years.
- Maximum fine of \$ 25,000.

## **Aggravated DUI**

- Aggravated DUI is defined as: a third or subsequent DUI violation; driving under the influence while operating a school bus carrying children; a DUI resulting in great bodily harm, permanent disability or disfigurement to another person; or a second DUI after a prior conviction for reckless homicide; or a DUI conviction committed in a school speed zone and bodily harm resulted

## **Class 4 Felony - Aggravated DUI Penalties**

- Loss of full driving privileges for a minimum of one year.
- Possible imprisonment for one to three years; one to 12 years if DUI is based on great bodily harm, or permanent disability, or disfigurement to another.
- Maximum fine of \$25,000.

## **Reckless Homicide (DUI)**

- A DUI resulting in the loss of life
- Class 2 Felony with possible imprisonment of three-14 years and fines up to \$25,000.
- Possible imprisonment for six-28 years for multiple fatalities.
- Two-year minimum revocation of driving privileges.

## **OTHER ALCOHOL OFFENSES**

### **Providing Alcohol to a Person Under 21**

- Possible imprisonment for up to one year.
- Minimum fine of \$500 and Maximum fine of \$2,500.
- Class 4 felony if death occurs; possible imprisonment for 1 to 3 years; maximum \$25,000 fine.

## **Illegal Transportation of an Alcoholic Beverage**

- Maximum fine of \$1,000.
- Point-assigned violation will be entered on driver's record.
- Driver's license suspension for a second conviction in a 12-month period.
- Driver's license suspension for a first conviction if the driver is less than 21 years of age.

## **Knowingly Permitting a Driver Under the Influence to Operate a Vehicle**

- Possible imprisonment for up to one year.
- Maximum fine of \$2,500.

## **Statutory Summary Suspension:**

- An administrative procedure providing for the automatic driver's license suspension of a driver arrested for DUI who fails chemical testing or refuses to submit to, or fails to, complete testing.

## **Penalty for failing chemical testing:**

- first offense - mandatory three-month driver's license suspension
- second offense - mandatory 12-month suspension



## Penalty for refusing to submit to chemical testing:

- first offense - mandatory six-month driver's license suspension
- second offense - mandatory 36-month suspension

## How To Report A Drunk Driver

You can report a suspected drunk driver to your nearest Illinois State Police Headquarters by providing the following information:

- The location you are calling from.
- Time, location, direction of travel, and description of the suspected drunk driver.
- The make, color, and license number (if known) of the car.

The Illinois State Police can also be contacted by telephone or citizens band radio.

### Blood Alcohol Content

One drink equals:

- 1 oz. 86 proof liquor, or
- 3 oz. wine, or
- 12 oz. beer

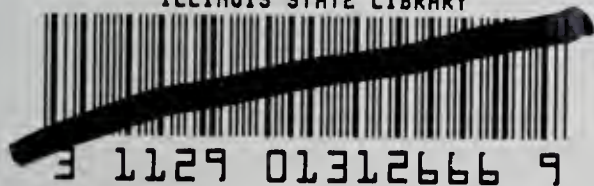
Levels of Intoxication:

- BAC less than .05% - Caution
- BAC .05 to .079% - Driving Impaired
- BAC .08% & up - **Presumed Under the Influence**
