ART FESTIVA This WEEKEND IN VILLAGE

This weekend, from Friday through Sunday, Walt Disney World will be hosting our first "Art Festival at the Village" and you, your family and friends are invited to attend!

The festival began today with over 200 of the top artists and craftsmen in the country having been selected from over 700 applicants from across the U.S. and Canada to compete for 49 cash awards totaling over \$7,500 in nine categories.

The types of art and crafts which will be spotted throughout Lake Buena Vista's Village will include oil, acrylic and watercolor paints, graphics and drawings, photography and creative crafts. Many of the art works will be for sale as well as display, with prices touching in all ranges.

Selected to judge the Festival are three highly qualified

people in the field of art:

Lee M. Hoffman, from Mobile, Alabama, is a graduate of the University of Colorado with a degree in Art Education, a MFA degree in Painting from the University of Washington and graduate work in painting and sculpture. He is a founder and Chairman of the Art Departments at both Spring Hill College and University of Southern Alabama, as well as having judged many national and international art shows.

Ron Dembooky, from Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania, is a graduate of Philadelphia College of Art. He has exhibited in 13 states and won 70 awards in the past 10 years. His work has been published in many books and magazines, including NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC. He has also judged numerous art shows throughout the country.

Victor Rattner, from St. Simons Island, Georgia, is a graduate of the University of North Carolina. He has competed work in both writing and crafts and won awards in many shows, as well

as judging.

Mickey Mouse, acting as master of ceremonies, will present ribbons to all winning art entries tonight at 6 pm, beneath the Captain's Tower. And then at 6 pm on Sunday evening, the cash awards will be given under the Tower. Strolling throughout the Village all weekend will be various Disney bands and entertainment.


RARE FILM CELS IN GALLERY

Our own art gallery in the Village, Colonnade des Arts, will be holding its own festival of a sorts, when it presents rare original film cels used in some Disney animated classic motion pictures for sale. You can find cels from "Robin Hood", "Winnie the Pooh" and "Bedknobs & Broomsticks". In addition, rare

sets of animation cells . . . hand-inked from the original drawings and released in limited edition sets of 275 (from "Snow White", "Pinocchio", "Cinderella" and "Lady and the Tramp") will be sold in a collector's portfolio.

In addition, veteran Disney artist Bill Layne will be in Colonnade des Arts from 10 am til 1 pm and 2 pm to 5 pm all three days. Bill, who has painted backgrounds for such outstanding Disney animated classics as "Sleeping Beauty", "101 Dalmations", "Mary Poppins" and "The Jungle Book", will be there in person along with a special exhibit of original animation art from our Walt Disney Productions Archives.

Colonnade des Arts will be open daily from 10 am to 10 pm.

And an extra bonus is that the third or fourth person in the room pays only 50% of the minimum fare on either cruise.


