JOIN THE LIFESAVING TEAM

We have an invisible team at work, right here at Walt Disney World. A team that insures a reserve supply of life giving blood is on hand should you need it 24 hours-a-day, day after day after day. And there is another team at work, one located some 20 miles from our Magic Kingdom, providing the expertise, equipment and storage facilities for that life giving blood.

Together they make up the **lifesaving team** here to protect you and your family in the event of an emergency.

Our Disney team is made up of many cast members who donate blood on a regular basis; people like **Jim Thompson** of our Print Shop who has donated over eight gallons of blood, like **Alice Hardee** of Central First Aid, who has donated almost five gallons of blood. Other members of this "invisible" team include **Phil Counts** of Security who has donated over six gallons of blood in his lifetime and **Bill Bayko** who has donated over 10 gallons!

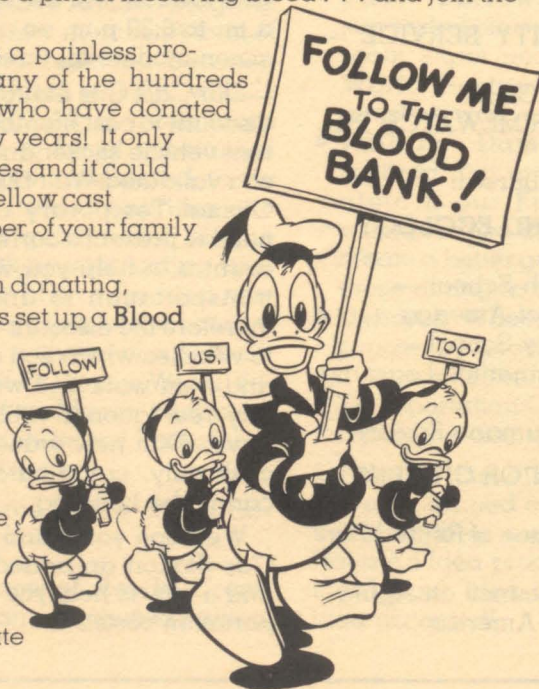
And back in Orlando at the Central Florida Blood Bank are dozens of nurses, technologists and laboratory assistants to keep the lifesaving team working.

Our Walt Disney World Blood Bank Drive begins next **Monday, April 30**, lasting through **Friday, May 11**. The mobile blood bank will be located throughout the Walt Disney World property to give every cast member the opportunity to donate a pint of lifesaving blood . . . and join the team!

Giving blood is a painless procedure; just ask any of the hundreds of cast members who have donated over the past few years! It only takes a few minutes and it could save the life of a fellow cast member, a member of your family or a friend!

To assist you in donating, Cast Activities has set up a **Blood Bank Hotline**. Here is the procedure you need to follow:

(1) First check with your supervisor to determine when it would be a good time for you to leave your shift to donate blood.



Last year hundreds of cast members rolled up their sleeves to donate blood to the Central Florida Blood Bank. Over 500 pints of blood were added to the Walt Disney World "bank" during our 1978 Blood Bank Drive.

(2) Then call the **Blood Bank Hotline** at extension 5757, or dial 824-5757 to schedule an appointment. By scheduling an appointment, you will reduce your wait time before donating blood.

(3) Then let your supervisor know when you are to donate blood and obtain a clearance to leave your shift. **Every cast member will be released from their shift to donate blood.**

(4) Arrive at the mobile blood bank unit as close to your appointment time as possible to assure you won't be delayed.

(5) After donating blood you will be given a receipt to take back to your supervisor when you return to work.

If you have not scheduled an appointment, but find that you have a few minutes before or after your shift, drop by the mobile blood bank unit. **You do not have to have an appointment**, although it is recommended so as to not inconvenience you in any way.

So take the time, roll up your sleeves, and join our lifesaving team!

Over 600 community leaders representing over 250 service organizations from Orange and Osceola counties attended the 1979 Community Service Awards luncheon last Tuesday in the Ballroom of the Americas at our Contemporary Resort Hotel.

Coordinated through our Public Relations Department, this annual awards ceremony honors service organizations for their outstanding contributions to our community. Six community leaders were selected to judge entrants on how well they utilized the funds and volunteers available to them. This year's judges included **Mrs. Thelma Dudley** of Valencia Community College; **Mrs. Carol Fenner**, on the Board of Directors of PESO, Orlando Opera Company, Florida Symphony Orchestra and the Junior League; **Lt. Casual Temporary cast members need to present a current ID. This discount is to help you with the cost of transportation to and from work, therefore the discount will apply only to vehicles which you use to travel to and from work and will not apply to any recreational vehicles you may have. Our new station will accept cash only, credit cards and checks cannot be honored.

EXPRESS BUS SERVICE OFF TO A GREAT START!

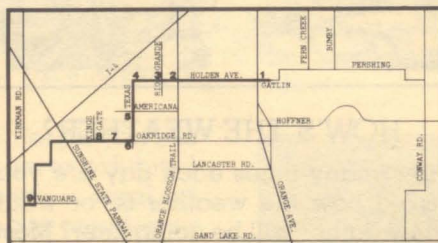
Our new **Express Bus Service** provided by Walt Disney World and the Orange, Seminole, Osceola Transportation Authority began service last week and is off to a great start!



This new bus service provides transportation to cast members living in the south/southwest Orlando area and to anyone driving by a bus stop along the route. The cost for this bus service is **90¢ one-way, \$1.80 round-trip**. If this first bus service is successful, additional routes will be added to serve cast members living in other areas.

Cast members who have tried our Express Bus Service have found it is an added convenience, giving them the opportunity to spend time reading the paper, writing letters, or just catching a few extra minutes of sleep instead of staring at the road all the way to work. One cast member was picked up on the corner of Texas and Oak Ridge and found himself at our Fantasyland tunnel entrance just 40 minutes later!

In addition, if April is the month you need to have your vehicle inspected at one of our Florida Vehicle Inspection Stations, then it's also the time to have your Walt Disney World vehicle sticker renewed.

And remember, you **must** have a validated Walt Disney World ID and a current vehicle sticker on your vehicle to receive your discount at our new Cast Gas Station, so hurry to our ID office, first floor of the Center and have your ID validated and your vehicle sticker renewed!

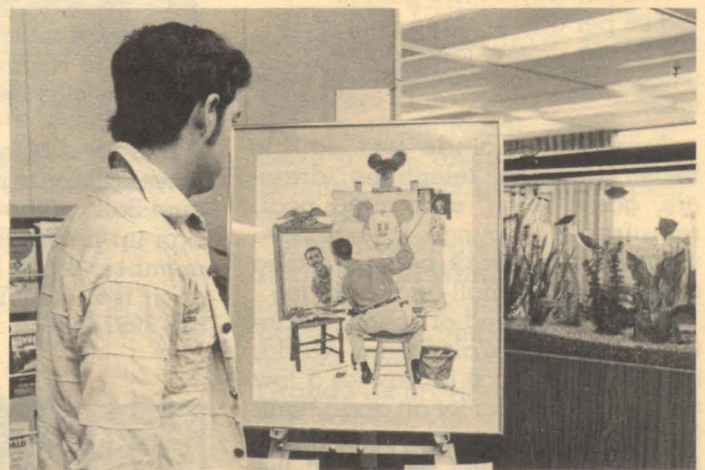

Just have them drop by **Cast Activities** (you cannot register at the hotel for this special rate) to take advantage of our special rate. Payment will be made through payroll deduction, on a daily or weekly rate. 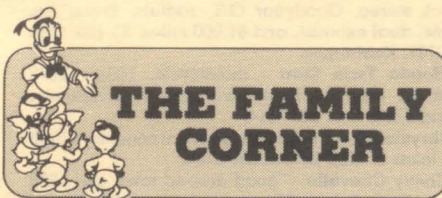
