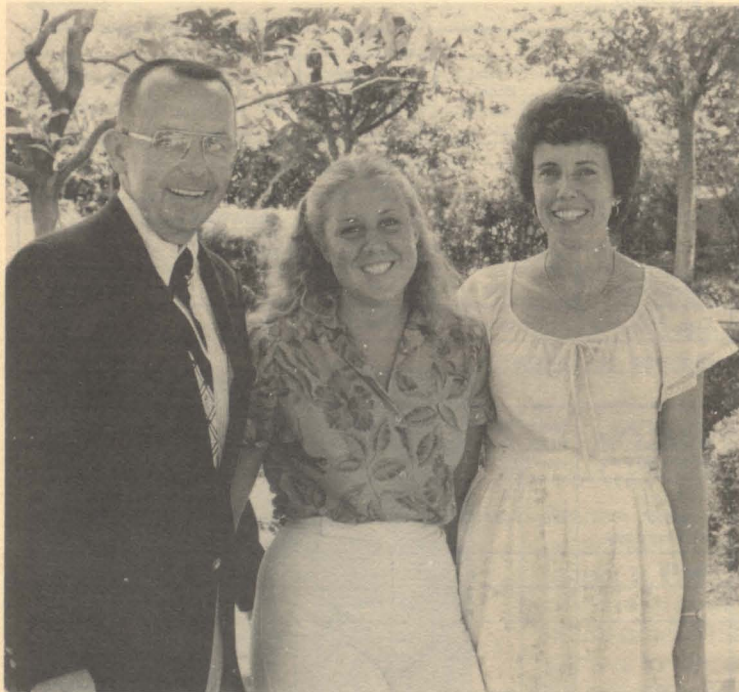

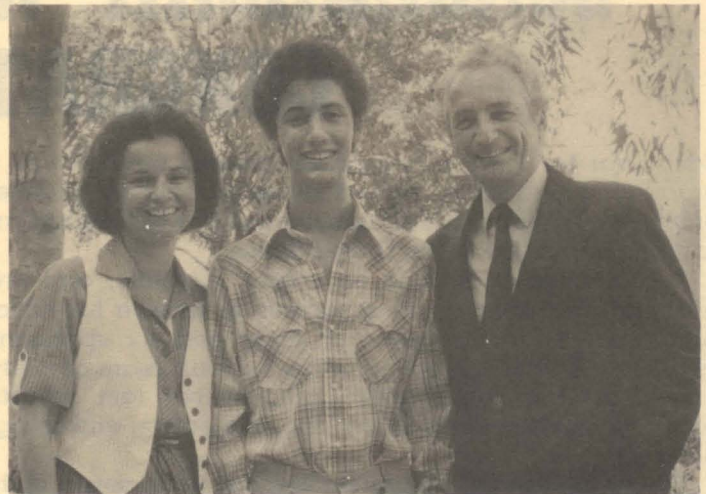

CAST MEMBERS HONORED BY SECRET SERVICE

Thanks to quick thinking and action on the part of **Deborah Karegeannes** and **Charlotte Dick** of Merchandise, a \$800,000 counterfeiting operation has been squelched.



In two separate incidents on February 11, both hostesses received counterfeit bills. Recognizing the "funny money" immediately, Debbie began following the passer until Security arrived to take over; Charlotte contacted Security promptly and they followed the passer who had handed her the counterfeit bill. Both passers were working together, and once caught, \$38,000 of counterfeit money was found on them. The passers decided to cooperate with authorities and \$820,000 of counterfeit bills were eventually recovered along with printing plates. A total of five counterfeiters are now serving time in jail.

The summer is about to begin and with it several of our summer sports leagues begin.

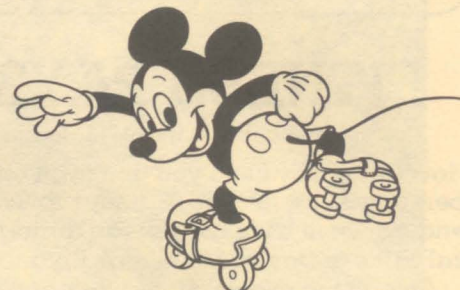

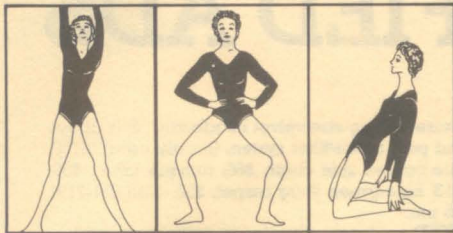
